

# Graves - Hines Cemetery

## Ohio County, KY

Going from Pleasant Ridge to Bells Run, stop at the first lane on north side of Highway 764. About 50 feet or so east of the Green River Parkway. Walk up hill & back into woods, parallel to the parkway, about 150 yards. Cemetery was copied by Jerry Long, Owensboro, KY, on 27 March 1989. Found five engraved monuments & two field-stones.

**Leslie V. Graves Dead.**

Leslie V. Graves died at the residence of his father near Pleasant Ridge, Wednesday morning, September 24th, of consumption. His death was not unexpected, but nevertheless sad. He was a young man of more than ordinary ability. While a student in Hartford College, he gave promise of a bright and useful career. Before his admission to the bar in Hartford, he taught several schools, in all of which he was universally admired and respected. His short career as an attorney at this bar was promising and encouraging, but the dread precursor of death, consumption, sapped the vitals of his physical life and sent the spirit back to its God. His short life is worthy of emulation by all young men.
