

Daniel Jewell
(1806-1866)
of Ohio County, Ky.

Daniel Jewell, son of Sanford Jewell, came to Ohio County, Ky. from Spencer County, Ky, in 1841. He was born 9 February 1806. His children on their marriages in Ohio County reported that he was born-in Spencer County, Ky. Spencer County was created in 1824 from parts of Bullitt, Jefferson and Shelby Counties.

Sanford Jewell, Daniel's father, was born 1775-1780 and married between 1793-1800. When Daniel first appears in the tax records of Spencer County in 1828 he was listed next to Sanford, often in tax records when someone first comes of age he is listed next to the parent. Daniel named his second son Sanford. Sanford had resided in Prince William County, Va., Nelson & Spencer Counties, Ky. He died 1848 in Spencer County, Ky. His wife was Susannah Martin, she was born c1778 Va., she is listed in the 1850 census of Spencer County, Ky., she died 27 October 1858 Spencer County, Ky. Sanford Jewell's children included:

1. Eleanor, "Nelly", died before 1848, married Travis Kendall, October 1818 Nelson County, Ky..
2. Presley, born 1800 Va., died 10 August 1865 Webster County, Ky., buried Shady Grove Cemetery, Poole, Webster County, Ky., married Nancy Skinner, 18 September 1823 Bullitt County, Ky. & Martha H. (Briscoe) Bridwell, 1 October 1850 Bullitt County, Ky.
3. Levi, born 14 June 1803 Va., died 29 August 1876 Sullivan County, Ind., married Elizabeth Moffitt, 1 August 1826 Spencer County, Ky.
4. Daniel, born 9 February 1806 Ky., died 15 January 1866 Ohio County, Ky.
5. Sarah, "Sally", born 2 April 1808 Ky., died 1 April 1892 Scott County, Ind., married Henry Napper, 12 May 1825 Spencer County, Ky.
6. Moses George, born 5 June 1810 Nelson County, Ky., died 10 August 1875 Sullivan County, Ind., married Mary Cole, 24 February 1828 New Hampshire & Elizabeth Moore, 22 August 1834 Barren County, Ky.
7. Aaron, born October 1812 Ky., died October 1891 Spencer County, Ky., married Margaret Allen, c1836.
8. Barnett, born 15 February 1819 Ky., 1870 lived Webster County, Ky., died 29 January 1871 Ky., buried Shady Grove Cemetery, Poole, Webster County, Ky., married Susannah Bridwell, November 1850 Bullitt County, Ky.,
9. Matilda, born 18 November 1821 Ky., married Joshua Bennett, circa 1841.

In the 1830 census of Spencer County there were nine Jewell households listed. There appears two have been two distinct groups among, these. Samuel (aged 50-60), Robert (aged 20-30), Jacob (aged 70-80) and William Jewell (aged 50-60) are living near each other in one section of the county whereas Jesse (aged 30-40), Cud (aged 20-30), Seth (aged 50-60), Sanford (aged 50-60) and Presley (aged 20-30) are close together in another area of the county. In the tax records the same grouping of names is persistent also. Of the first group Jacob, William and Samuel were three of the four Jewells appearing in the 1820 census of Shelby County., Ky., the other was an Isaac. Sanford Jewell of the second group along with an Enos Jewell are in the 1820 census of Nelson County, Ky. Sanford along with Seth, Enock and Jesse are in the 1810 Nelson County, Ky. census. It appears likely that Daniel Jewell is of the second group who were earlier in Nelson County. Daniel is consistently listed in the tax records with this group and also the names Sanford and Presley appear upon the names of his children. If that is true Daniel Jewell may have then been born in Nelson County, Ky. and his family removed to what became Spencer County sometime between 1820 and 1824.

Daniel Jewell is not listed as a, head of a household in the 1830 Spencer County, Ky. census. In that year's tax list of Spencer County he, however, is listed. Daniel appears in the tax records of Spencer from 1828 through 1841.

Daniel Jewell on 4 March 1828 in Spencer County, Ky. married Nancy Ann Paris. Nancy Ann, daughter of Pleasant Paris & Elizabeth Overstreet, was born 18 October 1805 in Larue County, Ky. Daniel Jewell's family appeared in the 1840 census of Spencer County, Ky.

In March of 1841 a son was born in Ohio County, Ky. to Daniel and Nancy Ann. For the year 1841 Daniel is listed in the tax list of Spencer County and in 1842 he is listed for the first time in Ohio County's tax records. In the years of 1842-1844 an Aaron Jewell also appears in the Ohio County tax lists, he is probably Daniel's brother. From 1843 Daniel paid taxes on land on Barnett's Creek. No deed was recorded by him until 25 September 1847 when he paid \$538 to Newton King for 100 acres on Barrett's Creek (Ohio County deed book K, p.311).

Daniel Jewell and family are in the 1850 and 1860 censuses of Ohio County, Ky.:

Daniel Jewell died in Ohio County, Ky. at the age of 59 on 15 January 1866 and was buried in the Barnett's Creek Baptist Church Cemetery. His wife, Nancy, in the 1870 Ohio County census was living with her son, Presley Jewell. At the age of 71 Nancy Ann died on Christmas day of 1876 and was buried at the side of her husband at Barnett's Creek.

On 4 February 1867 the heirs of Daniel Jewell sold their interest in the 100 acre farm purchased by their father in 1847, to their brother, Sanford M. Jewell of Saline County, Ill, for \$700 (Ohio County deed book T, p.440). The grantors on the deed were: James H. Jewell & wife Isabella, Francis M. Jewell & wife Mary J., George W. Jewell & wife Ellen, Aaron Jewell & wife Sarah Elizabeth, Presley Jewell & wife Lucy E., John H. Jewell & wife Eliza, and James Yates & wife Matilda (late Jewell), all residents of Ohio County, Ky. On 6 May 1867 Daniel's widow, Nancy A., sold her interest in the farm to her son, Sanford M. Jewell, for \$1200 (Ohio County deed book T, p.539).

Daniel Jewell and Nancy Ann Paris were the parents of nine children, Nancy had a son, William Paris, who was born in 1823. Their children were:

1. James Henry Jewell, born c1829 Spencer County, Ky., married Isabella Neighbors, 14 January 1853 Ohio County, Ky., died after 1870. His children - James M. (1853- , married Mahala Howard), Thomas L. (c1856- , married Nancy Combs), Nancy Ann (c1858- , married Henry White), Daniel P. (c1861-), Gabriel N. (c1862-), Mary (c1867-) & Betsy J. Jewell (c1871-).
2. Sanford M. Jewell, born c1830 Spencer County, Ky., married Belinda Ann Kelly, about 1866 left Ohio County and moved to Saline County, Ill. died after 1876.
3. Levi Jewell, born 6 December 1831 Spencer County, Ky., died single 3 November 1854 of cholera in Daviess County, Ky. buried Barnett's Creek Cemetery, Ohio County, Ky.
4. Aaron Jewell, born 25 March 1833 Spencer County, Ky., married Sarah Elizabeth Hoskinson, 22 February 1857 Ohio County, Ky. died 27 March 1904 Ohio County, Ky.,

buried Barnett's Creek Cemetery, Ohio County, Ky. He and his wife had six children, five of whom died in infancy or childhood, the other a daughter never married. Their children - Nancy A. (1858-1924, single), Charles D. (c1860-died young), James W. (c1864-died young), Sarah E. (c1868-died young) and two others died infancy. The following notice of the death of Aaron Jewell was printed in the Ohio County newspaper: Hartford Herald, Wednesday, 6 April 1904 - East View, April 3 - Died at his residence at Westerfield, March 27, of pneumonia and a complication of diseases, Mr. Aaron Jewell in the seventieth year of his age. He leaves a wife and a daughter and a host of friends to mourn his loss.

5. Francis Marion Jewell, born in November 1837 Spencer County, Ky., married 1st Mildred E. Martin 5 November 1857 Ohio County, Ky. (one child) and 2nd Mary J. Rummage 26 May 1863 Ohio County, Ky., died 1867 Ohio County, Ky. His children - Matilda Catherine (1859-1896, married Aaron Trogden), Elvira (c1863- , married George W. Gossett), Georgia Ann (c1866- , married William T. Ambrose).
6. Matilda_Jewell, born -18 November 1839 Spencer County, Ky., married James Clinton Yates 16 October 1854 Ohio County, Ky., died 19 June 1899, buried Bell's Run Cemetery, Ohio County, Ky. Their children - William Daniel (1859-1936, married Mary Belle Sinnett), Georgia Ann (1860-1949, married George Washington Turner), Gentry Marion (1863-1941, married Suler Samuels) and Jephta Temple (1870-1959, married Lilly B. Yates).

8. John Harrison Jewell, born 15 March 1841 Ohio County, Ky. married Louisa Eliza Nelson, 8 February 1866, died 3 April 1925 Ohio County, Ky. buried Bell's Run Cemetery, Ohio County, Ky. Their children - Willis Bragg (1866-1939, married Nancy Sadler & Mary Jarvis), Alice Dean (1873-1921, married Barney Thompson Miller), Joel Estes (1877-1947, married Annie Georgia Graves) and Clemie Ellen (1879-1952, married Loney Mitchell, George Samuel Rhodes & James Riley Barrett). The following biography of John H. Jewell appeared in the book Kentucky: A History of the State, (J. H. Battle, W. H. Perrin & G. C. Kniffin, c.1885, Ohio County section): "John H. Jewell was born in Ohio County, Ky., near his present homestead. He is the son of David and Nancy (Freeman) Jewel, who were from Spencer County, and who were the parents of ten children. John H. began for himself at the age of twenty-one, farming; soon after he bought 105 acres unimproved, which he has increased until he now owns 211 acres, half under cultivation, and all fairly improved. February 8, 1866, Mr. Jewel was united in marriage with Louisa Nelson, which union has been blessed with four children: Willis B.,

Alice D., J.E. and Clemmie, Mrs. Jewel is a member of the Baptist Church, Mr. Jewel is a Democrat and opposed to prohibitory Liquor legislation.”

9. Presley Jewell, born 1844 Ohio County, Ky. married Lucy Ellen Whitaker 26 October 1865 Ohio County, Ky. died 15 August 1909 Henderson, Henderson County, Ky., buried Fernwood Cemetery, Henderson, Ky. Their children – Sylvester (c1866-1926), Dillis D. (c1869-), Siotha C. M. (1872-1945, married Samuel Lon Roach), Lorenzo Daniel (1873-1949, married Susan Ballard Brown) and Nora E. (c1879-).

George Washington Jewell, son of Daniel Jewell and Nancy Ann Paris, was born 17 March 1840 Spencer County, Ky. He first appeared in the Ohio County, tax records in 1859, the first three years he was listed he was still "under age".

On 20 March 1862 in Saline County, Ill. George W. Jewell married Melissa Ellen Anderson. Ellen was born 4 October 1844 in Saline County, Ill. George and Ellen's daughter, Renyce, on her marriage said that her mother was born in Saline County, Ill. and her father in Spencer County, Ky. At about the time of their marriage George's older brother, James H., was living in Illinois, where some of his children were born. About 1867 another brother, Sanford Jewell, left Ohio County and took up residence in Saline County, Ill.

On 30 April 1864 Francis M. Jewell purchased 122 acres in Ohio County from Eli Martin and on the same day sold one-half (61 acres) of the tract to his brother George W. Jewell for \$500 (Ohio County, KY deed book S-p.483). This farm George Jewell owned until 1917.

George and Ellen Jewell and their family are listed in the 1870, 1880, 1900 and 1910 censuses of Ohio County.

In the 1890 tax book of Ohio County George W. Jewell was shown as owning six tracts of land, of 62, 26, 52, 40, 110 and 47 acres, a total of 337 acres. The tract of 62 acres he bought in 1864 from his brother, Francis M. Jewell (deed book S-p.483) and sold it in 1917 to James Mayfield (deed book 57-p.204). The 26 acres he purchased in 1879 from Joseph H. Simmons (deed book 1-p.185) and sold it to Florence Bartlett in 1915 (deed book 49-p.584). The 52 acres he bought from Solomon H. Daniel in 1879 (deed book 1-p.243) and sold it to Phineas Moore in 1916 (deed book 53-p.78). The 47 acres was half of a 95½ acre tract he purchased in 1882 from W. R. Paris (deed book 3.p.213) and sold in 1906 to I. P. Barnard (deed book 31-439). The 110 acres he got a commissioners sale of the estate of Thomas Bell in 1883 (Comm. Deed book C-p.326), in 1918 he sold it to Clyde Moseley (deed book 63-p.3), And the 40 acre tract he bought at a commissioners sale of the estate of W. D. Bell in 1885 (Comm. Deed book H-p.304) and sold it to Oscar Smith in 1912 (deed book 44-p.104).

George W. Jewell lived and worked as a farmer in the Buford neighborhood. In 1903 on April 20 he bought a lot in the town of Buford, 3/4 of an acre from William Holbrook for \$250, it was located on what is now called the Old Hartford-Owensboro Road. They moved to this lot and operated a dry goods and grocery store for several years, at the time of the 1910 census they were residing at this location.

On 4 May 1918 George and Ellen Jewell left Ohio County and moved to Murray, Salt Lake County, Utah, a suburb of Salt Lake City, where several of their children were residing. The following notice appeared in the Hartford Republican newspaper (Friday, 10 May 1918, p8) – “Eastview: Mr. and Mrs. George Jewell and Herbert Mitchell and family left Saturday for Salt Lake City,, where they will make their home.”

While still residing in Ohio County George and Ellen on 26 December 1917 sold the 61 acre farm they had bought 53 years earlier, they were paid \$1200 for it. On 23 July 1918 they sold part of the 110 acre tract to D. S. French for \$30, by then they were living at 457 Vine St. in Murray, Utah, Later in 1918 on 23 November they sold their lot in Buford to A. G. Hines for \$350, they were still living at the same address. This was the last of their land in Ohio County that they sold.

During the summer of 1894 Mormon missionaries visited Ohio County, Ky. and won several converts to their faith. Among them were George W. Jewell and his family. A letter by George W. Jewell explaining his conversion to the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints was published in the newspaper, Hartford Herald (Wednesday, 29 August 1894 p.4).

On 2 February 1920 George W. Jewell died in Salt Lake City, Utah, and was buried Murray City Cemetery, Murray, UT. He was 79 years old. The following notice of his death was in the Ohio County newspaper;

Hartford Republican, Hartford, Ky., Friday, 13 February 1920:

Livia, Route 2: News has been received here of the death of Mr. G. W. Jewell in Salt Lake City, Utah. The deceased was formerly a resident of this county, having left Buford about two years ago.

Melissa Ellen Anderson Jewell died 23 March 1925 Murray, UT and was buried beside her husband. The 1900 & 1910 censuses reported that she was the mother of thirteen children, three of whom were then deceased. Seven of their children are buried in the same cemetery as their parents. The children of George W. Jewell and Melissa Ellen Anderson were:

5. Olevia Matilda Jewell, born 10 June 1871 Ohio County, Ky., married 1st James H. Ambrose, 24 October 1893 Ohio County, Ky., 2nd W. M. French, 22 September 1899 Ohio County, Ky. and 3rd Oscar Smith, 1910-1920, in 1910 she was a widow and living with parents in Ohio County, Ky., she died 21 May 1935 Murray, Salt Lake County, UT, buried Murray City Cemetery, Murray, UT.
6. Alonzo Forest Jewell, born 12 October 1873 Ohio County, Ky., married Mary Ann Hoover, 26 October 1893 Ohio County, Ky., died 20 November 1951 Louisville, Ky., buried Cave Hill Cemetery, Louisville, Ky.
7. Loretta Belle Jewell, born 8 June 1876 Ohio County, Ky., married Joel Herbert Mitchell, 4 October 1902 Hartford, Ohio County, Ky. died 24 July 1958 Salt Lake City, Salt Lake County, UT, buried Murray City Cemetery, Murray, UT.
8. Lawrence Lillian Jewell, born 31 July 1879 Ohio County, Ky., married 1st Apalona Ambrose, 23 January 1900 Ohio County, Ky., 2nd Lillia Elouise Cobia, 21 January 1928 Davis County, UT and 3rd Lula Burris, 25 August 1965 Elko County, Nev., died 14 March 1970 Salt Lake City, Salt Lake County, UT, buried Murray City Cemetery, Murray, UT.

Clarence Coatland Jewell, born 1 July 1882 Ohio County, Ky., married 1st Clemmie Ellen Bartlett, 31 October 1903 Owensboro, Daviess County, Ky., 2nd Lucinda Jane Barker, 27 November 1948 Salt Lake County, UT and Eva Petersen, c1952, died 19 December 1955 Murray, Salt Lake County, UT, buried Murray City Cemetery, Murray, UT.
10. Leslie Deritt Jewell, born 17 February 1883 Ohio County, Ky., married Roxey Harrass, 2 November 1905 Hartford, Ohio County, Ky., died 21 April 1922 Salt Lake City, Salt Lake County, UT, buried Murray City Cemetery, Murray, UT.

11. Gerogia Ellen Jewell, born 7 July 1886 Ohio County, Ky., married 1st Roscoe King and 2 May 1905, and 2nd James Sutter, died 12 June 1982 West Valley City, UT, buried Murray City Cemetery, Murray, UT.

In May 1975 a deed was recorded in Ohio County, Ky. whereby the heirs of George W. Jewell signed a coal lease on a tract of 40 acres in Ohio County (deed book 213-pp.605-613). George W. Jewell purchased this land in 1885 and a deed was recorded in 1912 by which he sold it to Oscar Smith, He however retained mineral rights to the land and his heirs in 1975 still held title to them. The 40 acres is about one-half mile southeast of Pleasant Ridge near where Highway 764 meets the Green River Parkway; the farm is designated by the name of "Oscar Smith, 40" on a 1982 plat map of Ohio County. The heirs leased the coal rights to Edward R. Sczesny & Ass. of Daviess County, Ky., for \$1.00 per ton of coal mined. The lease was signed by and notarized at the following locations:

Alonzo Forest Jewell, "Lon" (1873-1951), son of George W. Jewell and Melissa Ellen Anderson, in the 1880 Ohio County census was listed as being 7 years old. On his marriage, 26

October 1893 in Ohio County, he said he was 18. On that date he married Mary Ann Hoover. She was the daughter of Jacob F. Hoover and Arvena Herring and was born in Ohio County on 1 March 1878. Her ancestors of the Hoover, Ward and Bennett families were among the first settlers of Ohio County, Ky., all settling there over 180 years ago.

At the time of the 1900 census Annie Jewell, wife of Alonzo, and their three oldest children were living with his parents near Buford in Ohio County. Alonzo Jewell was not listed in the 1900 Ohio County census. Between 1903 and 1910 Alonzo Jewell moved his family to Daviess County, Ky. where they lived near Maceo. They were listed in the 1910 Daviess County¹ census, his occupation was listed as an engineer in a lumber mill.

In the early 1920's Alonzo and Ann Jewell and two of their daughters, Ellen and Pauline, moved to Louisville, Ky. In Louisville on 29 June 1949 Mary Ann Jewell died and Alonzo F. Jewell on 20 November 1951, they were buried at the Cave Hill Cemetery in Louisville.

In Ohio County, Ky. on 17 January 1950 a deed was recorded by the children of Alonzo and Ann Jewell by which they sold their 1/10 interest in a tract of 50 acres on Barnett's Creek, descended to them from their grandfather, Jacob F. Hoover. The land was conveyed to Jacob F. Hoover in 1894 by Elizabeth Hoover and others. The heirs of Mary Ann Hoover Jewell sold their interest to Dolphus Whittaker for \$1.00. The heirs signing the deed were: Ellen Jewell Nickelson & husband Finis of 4801 Bell View Ave., Louisville; Georgia Jewell Raymond & husband William of 504 E.17 St., Owensboro, Ky.; Pauline Jewell Pruitt a widow of 820 Febr Ave., Louisville; Gobel Jewell of Maceo, Ky.; Wilford Jewell & wife Golda of Evansville, Ind. In Ohio County deed book 110-p.308 a notarized "affidavit of descent" of the above was recorded.
