Davies County, Ky.

Alternative names: McCormick - Elliott, Boehm

Location: About five miles south of Owensboro on east bank overlooking Hwy 231 between Hwy 298 and Masonville. On hill among the trees.

Notes: Farm in 1971 owned by Alphonso Lashbrook. In 1876 owner of the farm was Francis McCormick. Copied on 14 October 1987 by Jerry Long, Owensboro, Ky.

History of Daviess County, Kentucky (Inter-State Publishing Co., Chicago, 1883):

FRANCIS McCORMICK (deceased) was born in Prince William County, Va., Feb. 22, 1801. He was a son of John and Elizabeth (Cundiff) McCormick. He was the oldest of eight children. Francis was but two years old when he came with his parents to Ohio County, Ky., and settled near South Carrollton, on the Green River. He was noted far and near for his kindness and "Old Virginia" hospitality. He first married Miss Priscilla Newton, July 17, 1823. She was born in Virginia. They had seven children--John, born Aug. 2, 1826, married Sally Newton; James K., born Feb. 3, 1828, married Martha Walker; Mary A., born Jan. 13, 1831 (first married James

Yewell; he died and she married Nathaniel Kimberlin; she died July 4, 1876); Dianna N., born May 2, 1834, is the wife of S. E. Boehm; Elizabeth, born April 21, 1836, married John Elliott; Enos, born Sept. 18, 1838, married Mattie Cundiff; Benjamin, born March 12, 1840, married Margaret A. Skinner. The mother died Aug. 13, 1841. Mr. McCormick then married Mrs. Roberts, whose maiden name was Nancy Walker, Oct. 3, 1842. She was born in Mercer County, Ky., Dec. 25, 1812. She was a daughter of Hugh and Maria (Fry) Walker, natives of Virginia. Mr. and Mrs. McCormick had a family of six children--Martha, born April 7, 1845, is the wife of A. R. Yeiser, and resides on their farm in Masonville Precinct; William H., born April 5, 1847, married Miss Leander Lewis, June 22, 1882 (she was born in Daviess County, Ky., daughter of Robert M. and Eliza T. (McKay) Lewis); Priscilla, born June 17, 1849, is the wife of Wiliam Kimberlin (they reside in Murray Precinct); Daniel A., born June 7, 1852, is unmarried; Emmett B., physician and surgeon of Masonville, was born Nov. 1, 1854. Dr. McCormick remained on the old homestead farm, attending school until 1878, when he began the study of medicine at the Hospital College of Medicine at Louisville, where he graduated Feb. 24, 1881. He then returned to Daviess County and located in Masonville, where he has since practiced his profession. He is one of the leading physicians and surgeons of Daviess County, where he has been identified all his life. In politics he is a Democrat, and a strong supporter of that party. Clara, the youngest of the children, was born Aug. 14, 1856, and is the wife of Benjamin F. Field, and resides on their farm in Murray Precinct, Daviess County. Mr. McCormick was connected with the Methodist Episcopal church for twenty years. He was burried on the old farm, where he died Oct. 14, 1876. He was always a supporter of the Democratic party, and was one of the leading and representative men and citizens of Daviess County. Mrs. McCormick is still living. She has been a member of the Methodist Episcopal church for the past forty years.

ENOS MCCORMICK, son of Francis and Priscilla (Newton) McCormick, was born in Masonville Precinct, Daviess Co., Ky., Sept. 18, 1838. His educational advantages were limited, but he attended the Bloomington, Ind., University a short time. April 2, 1867, he married Martha J. Cundiff, a native of Muhlenberg County, Ky., born Jan. 26, 1847. In the winter of 1867-'8 Mr. McCormick bought a farm near Green Brier church where he lived three years. In 1871 he bought his present farm in Upper Town Precinct, where he has sixty-five acres under a good state of cultivation. Mr. and Mrs. McCormick have three children – George, born April 2, 1874; Thomas F., July 10, 1876; Maggie B., Dec. 7, 1881. They have lost four children – John, born May 25, 1870, died March 22, 1871; James O., born May 8, 1871, died June 30, 1876; Elsie M., born March 28, 1880, died Jan. 16, 1881; Ellis, born Oct. 13, 1878, died Nov. 20, 1881. Mrs. McCormick's parents, Thomas F. and Margaret Ann (Stone) Cundiff, came to Daviess County in 1845 and settled on a farm in Masonville, where her father died April 1, 1877, and where her mother still lives. They had a family of nine children, five sons and four daughters.

JAMES K. MC CORMICK, born Feb. 3, 1828, in Masonville Precinct, Daviess Co., Ky., was a son of Francis and Priscilla (Newton) McCormick. His father was a native of Culpeper County, Va., born Feb. 22, 1801, and came to Nelson County, Ky., when he was four years old, with his parents. He came to Daviess County in 1825, where he died in 1876. His mother was

born in Daviess County, and was a daughter of Benj. Newton, an early settler of this county. She died in 1840. There was a family of seven children – John, James, Enos, Ben, Mary Ann (deceased), Diana, Elizabeth. Mr. McCormick married for his second wife Mrs. Nancy (Walker) Roberts, who still lives in Masonville. They had six children – Martha, William, Priscilla, Daniel H., Emmitt, Clara P. James K. McCormick was married in 1849 to Martha, daughter of Hugh Walker, a native of Todd County, Ky., who came to Daviess County when nine years of age. They have one child – Amelia, now Mrs. George H. Lewis. Two children are deceased – Francis, at the age of twenty months, and Susan, aged fourteen years. In 1865 Mr. McCormick bought his farm in Murray Precinct, now annexed to Owensboro, consisting of 119 acres, under a good state of cultivation.
