## Owensboro Newspaper Historical Articles 1842-1989

#### Compiled by Jerry Long

All available issues of any Owensboro newspapers for the years of 1842-1919 (except for issues of the Owensboro Inquirer during 1905-1919) were checked page by Jerry Long. He listed all local deaths, births and noteworthy historical events. The latter were compiled into this listing of "Historical Articles". Issues of the Owensboro newspapers after 1920 were not systematically checked page by page for historical events; historical articles in those years were listed only when they were found while researching for specific events or found while searching intermittently on a project, such as searching for an obituary for a patron. Regretfully there would be a multitude of other significant historical events noted in the newspapers not listed in this file.
