Dear Mrs. Johnson:

Enclosed is what I have found in my research on the Patterson family and Benjamin Tolbert Igleheart. Included are family group sheets for your great-great-grandparents, Archibald Patterson & Deborah Bridwell, and for his parents, Jonathan Patterson & Rebecca Leforce, as well as sources. I was, successful in tracing Jonathan Patterson from the time of his marriage in 1805 in Mercer County, KY, until his death in 1863 in Muhlenberg County, KY, in between he had also resided in Nelson, Shelby, Bullitt & Spencer Counties, KY.

Jonathan Patterson is proven to be Archibald's father by a death record of the latter recorded in Ohio County, KY in 1875. Also, Jonathan is listed as the father of Jonathan H. Patterson (born 1816), a brother of Archibald, in the 1885 book, Kentucky: A History of the State, (J. H. Battle, W. H. Perrin & G. C. Kniffin). Jonathan H. & Archibald are proven to be brothers by the 1880 Ohio County census (p.548), in which Archibald's son, William T., was listed as being a nephew of Jonathan H. (Jr.). Jonathan Patterson, Sr. (born c1784) is the son of a Revolutionary War soldier, William Patterson. I believe this William to be Major William Patterson of Shelby County, KY, who was in Shelby County by 1792 and was still there in 1820. In the tax lists of Shelby County Major William is listed as owning a tract of 300 acres in Ohio County, KY on Rough Creek. - possibly this is why three sons of Jonathan Patterson later moved to Ohio County. I have not found any documented proof that Major William Patterson of Shelby County is the father of Jonathan, it is now only a theory.

After exhausting local sources I had hoped to do some research on the Patterson family at the Filson Club in Louisville. However, I have not yet been able to find the opportunity. Recognizing that I had exceeded your time request I decided to go on and send what I have found.

I have also enclosed data on Benjamin Tolbert Igleheart. Among these pages are: listings for him in the 1870, 1880, 1900 & 1910 censuses, copies of his marriages and of his obituary from the Hartford Herald (11 December 1912). He did marry a third time. In Muhlenberg County, KY he married Mrs. Lou (Welborn) Davis on 24 January 1894. They were living together at the time of the 1900 census but by 1910 had separated. They did not get a formal divorce - none was filed in

Ohio or Muhlenberg Counties. Apparently at some point they decided to live separately and simply went their separate ways. This often was the case when no future marriages were intended or when no property rights were involved. I have sent data on the family of Mrs. Lou (Welborn) Davis (1853-1929), she had three children, all by her first husband.

In addition to doing research here at the Owensboro library for this report I also did some work at the courthouses in Ohio and Muhlenberg Counties. For my research time and expenses I will request a total of \$186.60: 30 hours research at \$5.50/hr= 165.00, 65 xerox copies at .10 each= 6.50, 9 microfilm copies at .20 each= 1.80, gas mileage= 12.00, postage= 1.30, total = \$186.60

I hope I did not go overboard in the time I spent. Once I get started I can never find a stopping point.

Would you please check your Threlkel(d) family data for a couple of names? In Lincoln County, KY on 9 March 1785 Mary Threlkeld married Nathaniel Burrus, a brother of one of my ancestors. She was born in 1770 (where?) to John Threlkeld & Margaret (maiden name?) and died in Mercer County, KY on 10 October 1853. Mother of my family members, Laura A. Hale, married J. M. "Roe" Threlkel, in Mclean County, KY on 22 December 1891. His monument in the Threlkel Cemetery in Butler County, KY, has that he was born. 24 December 1867 & died 6 August 1900, his widow in 1949 was living Louisville, KY. I would like to find out who his parents were and whether or not he had any children. I thought I would ask just in case you might have any published (indexed) books on the Threlkeld family.

I welcome any questions about any of the enclosed data. In the future I will keep an eye out for any new information on the Patterson family. After working on the family I am now curious to see how it was Thank you for your patronage.

In the 1790 Kentucky Census (tax lists) no Leforce is listed; in 1795 Randolph & William Leforce are in Clark County, KY, in 1800 David, Robinson & William are in Clark County, in the 1810 Kentucky Census index three Laforce are listed - William in Woodford County, Jane & Robinson in Clark County. In none of the preceding is the surname of "LaPhawn" found.

Note: William Patterson, who appears in the Shelby County tax lists of 1792-1808 by himself and is still listed there in the 1820 tax records, appears to be a Revolutionary War soldier - in the

1819 tax book he is referred to as Major William Patterson. He is in the Shelby County censuses in 1810 (p210) & 1820. The tax records show him as owning three tracts of land - 164 acres on Brashears Creek in Shelby County, 300 acres on Severns Valley Creek in Hardin County, & 300 acres on Rough Creek in Ohio County (the latter was surveyed and patented by Joseph Barnett, an early Ohio County land surveyor & land speculator). This researcher believes that Major William Patterson is likely the father of Jonathan Patterson (c1784-1863), who married in Mercer County, KY in 1805 and who subsequently resided in Nelson, Shelby, Bullitt, Spencer & Muhlenberg Counties, KY, and who had three sons that later settled in Ohio County, KY.

- Book 8-p26 28 August 1865, A. Patterson, administrator of the estate of Jonathan Patterson, deceased, presented a settlement of the estate.
- Book 8-p31 25 September 1865, A. Patterson presented additional settlement papers of the estate of Jonathan Patterson, deceased.

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Kentucky: A History of the State, J. H. Battle, W. G. Perrin & G. C. Kniffin, 1885:

JONATHAN H. PATTERSON, Ohio County, was born in Spencer County, Ky., December 16, 1816, and is a son of Jonathan and Rebecca (LaPhawn) Patterson, the former a native of Pennsylvania, and the latter of Kentucky, and of Irish and French descent, respectively. When a young man, Jonathan Patterson came from Pennsylvania to Kentucky, where he was afterward married. Soon after that event he bought wild land in Spencer County, Ky., where he subsequently improved a farm, upon which he resided for many years. In 1854 he sold out and removed to Muhlenburgh County, Ky., where he bought another farm upon which he resided until his death which occurred on his seventy-sixth birthday. He was a member of Dunker's Church, and his wife of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. His father, William Patterson, was a veteran of the Revolutionary war. having served under Gen. Washington in that struggle, in one of the battles of which he received a severe wound. Jonathan H. Patterson received such a common school education as the times afforded. He was employed on his father's farm, until he attained his majority, after which he was employed as a laborer on a farm for about eight years. He then bought a partially improved farm of 100 acres, upon which he still resides, near Condit's Ferry, now Point Pleasant. He was married in 1847 to Mary O. Mathues, a native of Spencer County, Ky. Mr. Patterson and wife are members of the United Baptist Church. Politically he is a Democrat.

LANGSTON M. PATTERSON, Ohio County, was born in Spencer County, Ky., August 15, 1831 and is a son of Archibald and Deborah (Bridewell) Patterson, a sketch of whom will be found elsewhere in this volume. Langston M. Patterson received a common school education, and remained on his father's farm until he reached his majority, after which he farmed on his wife's place in Jefferson County, Ky., for four years; he then bought a farm in McLean County, remaining four years. In 1866 he sold his farm in McLean County and came to Point Pleasant, Ohio County, where he engaged in general merchandising and in the tobacco trade, erecting a large stemmery at that place. After about twelve years he discontinued the mercantile

business but still continued the tobacco business in connection with farming, owning a well improved farm, near Point Pleasant, of about 180 acres. He was married May 16, 1854, to Susan A. Farnsley, a native of Jefferson County, Ky. Two sons and two daughters have blessed their union: Bion M., Ada L., Ethel M. and Leon L. Mr. Patterson is a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. In politics he is a Democrat.

GEOEGE W. PATTERSON, Ohio County, was born in Bullitt County, Ky., January 25, 1N40, and is a son of Archibald and Deborah (Bridewell) Patterson, natives of Kentucky, of Irish and French descent, respectively. Archibald Patterson was married in Spencer County, and after that event he bought wild land in the same county, where he commenced to improve a farm. Soon afterward, however, he lost the farm through a defective title. He then removed to Meade County, Ky., where he bought a farm upon which he resided for several years, when he sold out and removed to Jefferson County, Ky., remaining three years. In March, 1855, he came to Ohio County and bought a farm near Point Pleasant, upon which he resided until his death in August, 1876, in his sixty- seventh year. He was to some extent engaged in the live-stock trade, having, in early life driven two droves of horses and mules to Georgia; he also taught school in early life. He and wife were members of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. George W. Patterson received a fair common school education and was employed on his father's farm until he attained his majority, after which he leased and rented lands for four years. He then bought a partially improved farm of 160 acres, near Point Pleasant, upon which he still resides, and where he is extensively engaged in aggricultural pursuits. The farm is now well improved, he also owns valuable property in Dallas, Tex. He was married, December 25, 1866, to Rebecca A. Patterson, a native of Spencer County, Ky. One son and one daughter gladden their home— Effie D. and Elio T. Mr. and Mrs. Patterson have been for many years members of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, in which he has held various official positions. He is a Democrat.

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History of Howard and Cooper Cos., Mo., National Historical Society, St. Louis, 1883, pp.397-398:

JAMES W. A. PATTERSON,

like many of the early settlers of Howard county, is a native of Kentucky, and was born in Shelby county, May 22, 1808. His father, William Patterson, and his grandfather, James Patterson, were both natives of Virginia and of Scotch extraction. The father of James came to Kentucky in 1792; he died in 1821. His mother's maiden name was Mary Allen. She was born near Harper's Ferry, in Virginia; her death occurred in 1854. The subject of this sketch in 1824, was apprenticed to learn the tanner's trade, and served four years. In 1828 he came to Boonville, Cooper county, Missouri, and worked at his trade a few months and then removed to Fayette and become a partner of William Givens in the tannery business. After the death of his partner he continued the business until 1837, and then engaged in farming until 1842, when he resumed his former occupation, doing an extensive business until 1854. He then returned to his farm where he has since lived and accumulated a competency. During the war he remained at home, but in common with others he suffered very greatly, pecuniarily estimating his loss at \$40,000. His landed estate before dividing with his children was about 1,000 acres; his homestead comprises 452 acres. In 1868, he was elected to represent the county in the state legislature and filled the position with credit to himself and to the satisfaction of his constituents. He was married,

January 6, 1836, to Miss Jane Turner, who was born in Howard county, March 3, 1816. Mrs. Patterson's father, James Turner, was a native of Madison county, Kentucky. He came to Old Franklin in 1809. The family of Mr. and Mrs. Patterson consists of five children living: Elizabeth, now Mrs. Berkley; Mary J., now Mrs. Jordan; Laura R., Robert A., James W. One son, William, is deceased.

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Jonathan Patterson, born c1784 South Carolina, died 1863 Muhlenberg County, KY, married Rebecca LeForce, 3 October 1805 Mercer County, KY, she was born c1790 KY and died 1865-1870. Jonathan was son of William Patterson, a Revolutionary War soldier, who came to Kentucky in 1792 and died in 1821 Their children included:

1. Archibald Patterson, born 17 February 1809.
2. James Patterson, born c1841 KY; married Amanda Richie, 22 November 1836 Spencer County, KY; lived Muhlenberg County, KY in 1860.
3. Jonathan H. Patterson, born 16 December 1816 KY; married Mary O. Mathues, 1847 lived Ohio County, KY in 1885.
4. Morgan Patterson (?), born c1820 KY; died after 1843.
5. Alfred Patterson, born 1823 Spencer County, KY; married Lucinda Richie, 18 August 1841 Bullitt County, KY and Amanda J. Melton, 11 January 1881 Ohio County, KY; died 1886.
6. Griffin Patterson, born c1827 Spencer County, KY; married Catherine Richie, 13 August 1850 Spencer County, KY; lived Muhlenberg County, KY in 1860.
7. Reason Patterson, born c1830 Spencer County, KY; lived Spencer County, KY in 1852.
8. Hardin Patterson, born c1831 Spencer County, KY; died after 1850.

Archibald Patterson, son of Jonathan Patterson & Rebecca Leforce, was born 17 February 1809 Nelson County, KY; married Deborah Bridwell, 16 October 1830 Nelson County, KY. Deborah, the daughter of Daniel Bridwell & Rebecca Cromwell, was born 22 September 1813 Nelson County, KY and died 3 October 1898. Archibald Patterson died 27 August 1875 Ohio County, KY. He and Deborah were buried at the Patterson-Igleheart Cemetery at Matanzas in Ohio County, KY. They were the parents of:

2. Barnet Patterson, born 15 December 1833 KY; married Elizabeth Perkins, 30 November 1859 Muhlenberg County, KY; died 23 September 1886 Dawson, Hopkins County, KY; buried Patterson-Igleheart Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.
3. Alexander B. Patterson, born 13 March 1838 Bullitt County, KY; married Martha Elizabeth Woodward, 25 February 1864 Ohio County, KY; died c1870 Ohio County, KY.
4. George Washington Patterson, born 25 January 1840 Bullitt County, KY; married Rebecca A. Patterson, 25 December 1866 McLean County, KY; died 9 January 1928 Dallas, Dallas County, TX; buried Dallas, TX.
5. Matilda Catherine Patterson, born 25 July 1842 Bullitt County, KY; married Benjamin Tolbert Igleheart, 6 December 1860 Ohio County, KY; died 24 October 1874 Ohio County, KY; buried Patterson-Igleheart Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.
