Dear Mr. Payne:

Enclosed is a copy of the obituary of James M. Payne, who died on 2 March 1939, and was buried in the Catholic Cemetery here James M. was born in Meade County, KY in 1870, and was the son of William Raymond Payne (c1844-1903) & Mary E. Rhodes (see enclosed abstracts of the 1870 & 1880 censuses of Meade County, KY). James M married Alice Gertrude McBride on 18 June 1889 at St. Paul's in Owensboro, bond on his marriage was by his father, William R. Payne. William R Payne died on 19 May 1903 in Owensboro, at the home of his son, James, who was his only surviving child William R. was buried at the Catholic Cemetery on west 9th Street., by his wife, Mary Rhodes, who had died in Owensboro on 15 January 1900. William R.'s brother, Charles A. Payne (1853-1922), did not have a son named James (see enclosed copy of his obituary). I hope this clears up some of the confusion over the James Paynes.

James M. Payne (1859-1901)

James M. Payne, son of William Meredith Payne and Jane Frances O'Bryan, was born in 1859 in Meade County, Ky. He married Mary Agnes Hill. James M. Payne and his wife are shown in the 1900 census of Daviess County, Ky. On 13 March 1901 Mary A. Payne was appointed as the administratrix of the estate of J. N. Payne deceased, recorded in Daviess County administrator bond book 11, p.159. Security on the bond was T. H. Payne, who was James M. Payne's brother, Thomas H. Payne.

In the Owensboro, Ky. City Directories from 1905 through 1926 Mary Payne, the widow of James N. Payne is listed. The following listings appeared in the editions of the Owensboro City Directory in the following years:

About 1926 Mrs. Mary A. Payne, widow of James M. Payne, left Owensboro and went to live with a daughter, Lucy Pike, in Washington, D.C. On 30 July 1937 she died at her daughter's home in Washington, D.C. Her body was: returned to Owensboro, Ky. and buried at the Catholic (Mater Dolorosa) Cemetery, on West 9th Street in Owensboro. Her grave and that of her husband are unmarked. On 1 August 1937 an obituary for Mrs. Mary Payne was published in the Owensboro Messenger newspaper, in which it was reported that she was 77 years old. She was survived by four children: James Payne of Owensboro, Paul Payne of Memphis, Tenn., Mrs. W. P. (Lucy) Pike of Washinton, D.C. and Mrs. Virginia Laas of Louisville, Ky.; and two sisters, Mrs. Ollie Miles of Stanley (Daviess County), KY and Mrs. Ida Whelan of Danville, Ill.

Virginia Payne, daughter of James M. Payne & Mary A. Hill, was born about 1885. She married Albert Laas (not recorded Daviess County, Ky.) and they resided in Louisville, Ky. In the Owensboro Messenger & Inquirer of 8 July 1950 an obituary for Virginia Payne Laas appeared. It was reported that word was received here by James Payne of his sister, Mrs. Albert Laas's death in Louisville, Ky. In the article it was stated that she was aged 65 and was formerly Miss Virginia Payne of Owensboro, her survivors were given as: her husband, one sister, Mrs. Willie Pike of Washington, D.C., two brothers, James Payne of Owensboro, Ky. and Paul Payne of Mississippi. Her funeral and burial was in Louisville, Ky.

On 21 April 1962 an obituary for James E. Payne, son of James M. Payne & Mary A. Hill, appeared in the Owensboro Messenger & Inquirer. In the article the following was reported: he died in Owensboro the previous day, was aged 65, born in Daviess County, lived at 1207 Independence Ave., employed at Smith Machine Shop for 40 years, member of the Central Presbyterian Church; he was survived by, his wife, Martine, two daughters, Mrs. Mary Holland

of Davenport, Iowa & Mrs. Wanda Lance of Blairsville, Pa., three sons, Doug & Bobby Payne of Owensboro, and Harold Payne of Dallas, Texas, also by one sister Mrs. Lucy Pike of Washington, D.C. and one brother Paul Payne of Memphis, Tenn. He was buried at Elmwood Cemetery in Owensboro. Between 1962-1979 no obituaries for Paul Payne and Lucy Payne Pike were published in the Owensboro, Ky. newspaper.

On 29 June 1988 talked to Douglas Payne, a son of James E. Payne and grandson of James M. Payne & Mary A. Hill. Mr. Payne lives in Owensboro, Ky., on 1630 Thompson Dr. (phone 683-9931). He did not know his grandfather Paynes' name or his grandmother's maiden name, and has no record of their births and deaths. He remembers his grandmother, Mary Payne. She died in 1937 and was buried at the Catholic Cemetery in Owensboro. Her grave is unmarked. He has been to the cemetery trying to locate the grave but the cemetery office reported they had no record of its location. Mr. Payne's father, James Edward Payne, was born 17 July 1896 in Daviess County, KY in the vicinity of Glenmore Distillery on East 60, and died 20 April 1962. His mother, Martine (Petrie) Payne, was both 13 July 1901 and died 8 November 1972; they are buried at Elmwood Cemetery. His dad had one brother, Paul, and two sisters, Lucy and Virginia. Paul Payne lived in Memphis, Tenn., he left Owensboro before Mr. Payne was born and he never saw him. Lucy, wife of Willie Pike, lived and died in Washington, D.C. and Virginia, wife of Albert Laas, lived and died in Louisville, Ky. Mr. Payne remembers a Charles Payne, who used to operate a Chrysler dealership in Owensboro and who was somehow related to his father and also a Mr. Payne, who worked at Home Furniture Co. in Owensboro, and who he believes was related.

Henry (Hank) David Payne, Jr.

Henry David Payne, Jr., 88, of New Orleans, died Feb. 24, 2003, in Canon Hospice at Memorial Medical Center, New Orleans, La. He had been a resident of SunRise Assisted Living Center in New Orleans, and died from complications following a fall.

He was born May 29, 1914, in Owensboro, Ky., the seventh child of Henry D. and Elizabeth C. (OFlynn) Payne. He studied civil engineering at the University of Dayton and the University of Kentucky. He owned and operated Seiler Tire Service for 20 years and had previously worked for SOHIO Pipeline and Skiles Oil Company.

Mr. Payne was a member of St. Sebastian Catholic Church, Wabash County (Illinois) Historical Society, Knights of Columbus, Shawnee Hills Recreation Association, and Sons of the American Revolution. He was active in genealogical research on the Kentucky Payne and O'Bryan families for decades.

Hank was an Eagle Scout and shared his love of the outdoors with Boy Scout Troop 283. He enjoyed camping trips in Southern Illinois and participated in the mid-summer Ozark Adventure tours through 1984.

Surviving are ex-wife Mary Elizabeth Sutherland Payne; children, Thomas (Phyllis) E. Payne of New Orleans, La., Henry David Payne III of Lubbock, Texas and Margaret Suzanne (Larry) Stoltz of Kingwood, Texas; five granddaughters, Kellie Payne, Kyle Payne Radish, Melissa, Jennifer, and Christine Stoltz; and two great granddaughters: Jordan Leigh (5) and Elizabeth Anne (1).

Preceding him in death were his parents, his brother Thomas Edward and his five sisters, Angela Hayden, Helen Gilles, Mary Louise, Agnes (Sister Agnes Miriam, s.c.n.), and Dorothy (Sister Mary Cecilia, o.s.u.).

William Meredith Payne, born 11 March 1817 Nelson County, KY. He is believed to be the son of Ignatius Payne & Eleanor Hagan. He married Jane Frances O'Bryan, circa 1841; she was the daughter of William O/Bryan & Elizabeth Kincheloe. He first appears in the Meade County, KY tax lists in 1842. He is listed in the 1850 & 1860 censuses of Meade County, KY. He died in Meade County on 13 February 1861. He and his wife, Jane are buried at St. Teresa Cemetery, Meade County, KY (1819-1864). They had twelve children seven of whom survived to adulthood. Their children included:

1. Elizabeth Ellen Payne, born 7 April 1842 KY; married Charles Ignatius Rhoades (1 April 1837- 5 October 1908), 2 February 1857 Meade County, KY; died 13 September 1905 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY; buried Mater Dolorosa Cemetery, Owensboro, KY. They had six children: Mary F. (?), Gertrude, Rosa, Minnie B., Adelia and Annie
2. William Raymond Payne, born 3 July 1844 Meade County, KY; married Maria McKaughan, 4 August 1861 Breckinridge County, KY and Mary E; Rhoades, 3 December 1867 Meade County, KY; died 19 May 1903 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY; buried Mater Dolorosa Cemetery, Owensboro, KY. He served four years in the Confederate Army during the Civil War. He was survived by one child, James Marion Payne.
3. Thomas Henry Payne, born 10 May 1846 Meade County, KY; married Elizabeth Catherine Russell (13 May 1845 - 14 August 1924), 19 February 1867 Marion County, KY; died 1 May 1904 Belleville, St. Clair County, IL; buried Mater Dolorosa Cemetery, Owensboro, KY. His children were: Julia, William Ignatius, Clara Elizabeth, Henry David, Minnie Magdalene, Jane Frances, Elizabeth and Thomas Raymond.
4. Peter Edwin Payne, born 22 February 1848 Meade County, KY; married Mary Ellen O'Bryan (29 September 1850 - 20 February 1930), 27 October 1873 Owensboro, Daviess

County, KY; died 9 September 1895; buried Mater Dolorosa Cemetery, Owensboro, KY. They had nine children six of whom were living in 1900. Their children included: Lawrence Arthur, Mary Louise, Amelia, Adele, Hugh Edwin, Anna Irene, Ellen, Martin Van Buren and Frederick J. From The Record, a newspaper for the Catholic diocese of Louisville, KY (21 September 1895: P. E. Payne, one of Owensboro's very best citizens, one on whose tomb can be justly chiseled: "Here lie the remains of an honest man, who was just and up right in all his ways, whose heart was without guile; and who was ever ready, with kind words and generous deeds, to relieve the sufferings of his fellow man." His genial and affable manners and gentlemanly bearing, together with his high sense of honor, rendered him a universal favourite...his opinion and advice were considered safe guides in every emergency and regarding his integrity, it is enough to say that his word was considered as good as his bond. He enjoyed the social circle of his friends and was always the soul of good cheer...yet the home and the family circle and the company of his children were his chief delight...He left his wife and children well provided for regarding the comforts of life...His home on the Hill, east of Owensboro, is one of the finest and most comfortable residences of Daviess County...but the best legacy he has left them and the one they have most reason to be proud of, is his unblemished character and the example of an honorable and edifying life....When St. Paul's Parish (of Owensboro, Kentucky) was established in 1887 Mr. Payne was one of the building committee...The beautiful and costly lamp that hangs in the sanctuary, and in which the vigil oil burns before the Blessed Sacrament, bears the following inscription: "From P. E. Payne to St. Paul's Church"...His funeral took place on Tuesday morning from St. Paul's Church...The vast congregation that was present on the occasion and the long funeral procession that followed...gave evidence that Mr. P.E. Payne was highly respected and esteemed in the community.

5. Lawrence M. Payne, born 1851 Meade County, KY; died 23 November 1858 Meade County, KY; buried St. Theresa Cemetery, Meade County, KY.
6. Charles Albert Payne, born 31 July 1853 Meade County, KY; he came to Daviess County, KY when he was 15; married Fannie Webb, 2 July 1877 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY and Frances Scobee Ellis (20 March 1859 - 10 August 1954), 5 December 1881 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY and; died 12 November 1922 Daviess County, KY; buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, KY. He was the father of: Charles Albert, Mildred, Marguerite and Joseph Houston.
7. Stephen B. Payne, born March 1854 Meade County, KY; died 25 August 1856; buried St. Theresa Cemetery, Meade County, KY
8. Mary H. Payne, born 28 October 1857 Meade County, KY; she was a Catholic nun, "Sister Pauletta", sister of Charity; died 13 November 1927 Covington, Kenton County, KY; buried Sisters of Charity Convent, Nazareth, Nelson County, KY.
9. James Meredith Payne, born 21 October 1859 Meade County, KY; he and his sister, Mary, were living with his mother's sister, Sarah Frances O'Bryan, and Sarah's husband, Thomas Vessels in 1870 in Concordia, Meade County, KY; married Mary Agnes Hill (4

March 1860 - 30 July 1937), 11 October 1881 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY; died March 1901 Daviess County, KY; buried Mater Dolorosa Cemetery, Owensboro, KY. They had 11 children, 6 of whom had died before 1900, the following 5 were living in 1900: Virginia Lee, Paul Edwin, Lucy, James Edward and Amelia A.

History of Daviess County, Kentucky, Inter-State Publishing Co., Chicago, 1883, pp.823-824:

P.E. PAYNE was born in Meade County, Ky., Feb. 22, 1848. His father, William M. Payne, was born in Nelson County, Ky., about 1817, and died Feb. 12, 1861. His mother, Jane (O'Bryan) Payne, was born about 1821, and died April 26, 1864. P.E. is the fourth of seven children. He came to Owensboro in March, 1867, and worked one season on the Rudd farm. In the fall he commenced to tend bar for Robert O'Bryan; worked for him eighteen months, and in the spring of 1869 went to work for M.V. Monarch. In the fall of 1874 he took a working interest in the business, and in 1880 bought a share of the business and changed the name of the firm to the Sour-mash Distilling Company, and holds the office of Secretary. They have two distilleries with a capacity of seventy barrels per day, or 900 bushels of grain. Mr. Payne was married Oct. 27, 1873, to Mary E. O'Bryan, a native of Meade County, Ky., born Sept. 29, 1850. They have three children – Louise, born March 14, 1876; Amelia, born July 18, 1878; Adele, born Sept. 21, 1880. Mr. Payne is a member of the Catholic church and Catholic Knights, No. 18, Owensboro Branch. Politically he is a Democrat.

THOMAS H. PAYNE was born in Meade County, Ky., May 10, 1846, and was a son of William M. and Jane F. (O'Bryan) Payne, natives of Marion County, Ky. His father was born in 1817, and died in 1862. His mother was born in 1818, and died in 1864. They were the parents of twelve children, seven of whom are living – William M., Thomas H., P.E., Charles A., James M., Elizabeth and Mary. After the death of his father the care of the mother and five of the children fell on Thomas H. He commenced a course of study at Gethsemane College, when he was called home by the death of his mother. He returned to the school, taking three brothers with him. They were to work a year and attend school a year. After the expiration of the two years Thomas H. went to St. Mary's and clerked in a store of his uncle, Robert O'Bryan, two years. Feb. 19, 1867, he married Lizzie C., daughter of Ignatius Russell, who was born May 13, 1845. She is a sister of Father Russell, a Catholic priest, now at Nazareth, Ky. That same year Mr. Payne came to Daviess County and followed farming till 1875, when he moved to Owensboro, where he has been trading in live-stock. He has gained the confidence of the people of Daviess and adjoining counties, and is now handling more stock than any other firm in the county in a retail way. He has five children – Julia, W. J., Clara, Henry D. and Minnie. He and family are members of the Catholic church.

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Owensboro, Kentucky, Turner Publishing Company, Paducah, KY, 1995, p306:

PAYNE, HENRY D., (1878-1941), son of Henry and Elizabeth Russell Payne was born in Owensboro. His education was at the Monks School in Marion County, KY and the Spencerian Business School in Louisville, KY. As a teenager, Henry D. Payne was employed by the E.W. Smith Furniture Co. Later he and partner James S. Leach bought the business and operated it until Mr. Payne's retirement in 1934. His father, Thomas H., was born in Meade County, a member of St. Tresea Parish, baptized by Fr. Eliza Durbin. He and his brothers to Owensboro and engaged in the whiskey industry.

Elizabeth C. O'Flynn Payne (1875-1967), the wife of Henry D. Payne, was born in Owensboro. She and her husband were members of St. Paul Parish; both are buried in the old Catholic Cemetery on West Ninth Street. Her parents were Richard and Thersa O'Flynn. Mrs. Payne was educated at the Mount St. Joseph Academy, Maple Mount. KY.

Richard O'Flynn was engaged in the tobacco industry, having operated a Stemmyery for years. Mrs. Payne's grandfather, William Coomes Jr. was an early Daviess County resident and a member of St. Lawrence Church. His Ohio River farm home was used as a chapel by visiting priests from St. Vincent in Union County prior to Stephen Church in Owensboro.

Children of Henry D. and Elizabeth C. Payne were all born in Owensboro. Angela (Mrs. F.F. Hayden); Thomas E. (wife: Elizabeth Berry); Agnes (Sr. Agnes Miriam, SCN), Nazareth, KY; Dorothy (Sr. Mary Cecilia, OSU Maple Mount KY; Mary Louise, Helen (Mrs. Paul E. Gilles), Chattanooga, TN; Henry D. Jr. (Hank), Mount Carmel, IL.

Dear Mr. Payne:

Sorry I missed you last week. The day you were at the Owensboro Library I had went to Ohio County to do some research. Enclosed is the research you requested. I had it at the library but failed to request that it be given to you if you came in when I wasn't there.

I found the death dates & obits for Charles I. Rhodes & for four of his six children. I have not yet been able to find the death dates for his wife, Elizabeth E. Payne Rhodes, and for their two oldest children: Mary F. & Gertrude. Mary F. is shown in the 1860 Meade County, KY census but I could find no later record of her. She was not with her parents in the 1880 Daviess County, KY census. I could not find their family in the 1870 KY census index; records suggest they should have been in Daviess County in 1870 but they are not in the census, the census taker may have missed them. Charles I. & Elizabeth Payne Rhodes apparently have no living descendants in Daviess County, KY. Their only descendants would be through their daughter, Minnie Rhodes Philpot, who left Owensboro circa 1910-1920. Minnie had three children, who lived in Scarsdale, New York, Cleveland, Ohio & Baltimore, Md.; Minnie probably has surviving grandchildren. Two of Charles & Elizabeth Rhodes daughters, Adelia & Annie, never married & had no children; their daughter, Rosa Rhodes Philpot, had 3 children but they all died in infancy or childhood; their daughter, Gertrude Rhodes Mercer, had a daughter, Georgia, who never married. Charles & Elizabeth Rhodes had one other grandchild, "Sister Mary Clarita", which is the way her name was given in the obits of her aunts; most likely she is the daughter of Gertrude Rhodes Mercer, but is possibly she may be Mary Rhodes' daughter. The baptismal records of either St. Stephen's or St. Paul's in Owensboro should give proof of her parents, as well as have the complete dates of birth of most of Charles & Elizabeth's children & grandchildren.

Also enclosed is what I found on the ancestry of Rev. Joseph V. Rhodes of Owensboro, and a retyped chart showing what we now have on the family of Benedict D. Coomes (Jr.) & Mattie Whitaker. For the enclosed research I will request \$25.00.

Charles I. Rhodes (1837-1908)

Charles Ignatius Rhodes was born on 1 April 1837 in Daviess County, KY. He was baptised at the St. Lawrence Catholic Church in Daviess County on 29 June 1837, his baptismal record lists his parents as James Rhodes and. Catherine Mattingly. James Rhodes was born in Nelson County, KY in 1801. He was the son of James Rhodes, Sr. & Mary Wilcox, who were

married in Nelson County, KY in 1791. James Rhodes, Sr. was the son of Abraham Rhodes, who died in St. Mary's County, Maryland in 1797. James Rhodes, Jr. married Catherine Mattingly in Washington County, KY on 18 September 1823. James & Catherine moved to Daviess County, KY in 1830-1831 and about 1840 moved to Breckinridge County, KY. Their family was listed as follows in the 1850 Breckinridge County census:

In the early 1850's James & Catherine (Mattingly) Rhodes moved their family to Meade County, KY. James died in Meade County in 1867 & Catherine in 1884. In Meade County, KY Charles I. Rhodes on 2 February 1857 married Elizabeth Ellen Payne, a daughter of William Meredith Payne & Jane Frances O'Bryan. On a record of their marriage recorded in the 1852-1861 vital statistics of Meade County, Charles Rhodes was listed as being aged 22, born in Daviess County, KY, residence Meade County and Elizabeth E. Payne was listed as being aged 16, born & residence Meade County, KY. Charles & Elizabeth at the time of the 1860 census of Meade County, KY were enumerated in the household of his parents, the census listing appeared as follows:

Charles Rhodes during the Civil War served in the Confederate Army. On 1 December 1862 he enlisted as a private in Co. E of the 10th Calvary, KY Volunteers, CSA, under the command of Col. A. R. Johnson. He enlisted in Daviess County, Ky. In the 1870 census of Meade & Daviess Counties Charles I. Rhodes was not located. His mother, Catharine Rhodes, age 70, was listed on p.316 of the 1870 Meade County census; she was living with her daughter, Mary E., wife of William R. Payne.
