Dear Mr. Lowe:

Enclosed are chapters on what I have discovered about the Raymond and Sapp families. I am sorry it has taken so long. I could have completed a sketch of each ancestral line of descent giving only vital information and proofs in much less time. At our interview you requested a more fully developed history of each ancestral family, which takes considerable more research and composition time. I have also completed research on the Jewell and Hoover lines, the Hoover line I have been able to extend back to the immigrant ancestor in 1754. I have not yet written my notes on these families into narrative form. I thought I would wait to hear your comments about what I have completed. Is what I have done what you had in mind or have I gone overboard in research time and/or detail? Do you want me to continue and write similar chapters on the Jewell and Hoover families? Or would you rather that I write a much briefer sketch of each line of descent? Or would you like to end research with what is enclosed, if so there will be no charge for what I have already done on the Jewell and Hoover families?

Another reason I have taken so long was that I was holding out in hopes of getting access to records from Bullitt County, Ky. and possibly uncovering more about the Raymond family. I have checked for Bullitt County records at the Filson Club in Louisville and at the Kentucky Library at Western Kentucky University in Bowling Green but they only had the census and tax records. To do further research on the Raymond family one would almost have to go to either Bullitt County or the Kentucky Archives in Frankfort, Ky. (which has microfilmed copies of each counties records).

In compiling, the enclosed chapters on the Raymond and Sapp families I spent a total of 45 hours research and composition time. At the rate of \$3.50 per hour this equals \$157.00, adding to this total copying expenses of \$8.00 gives a total of \$165.00. Subtracting from this total your prepayment of \$20.00, received on Aug. 27, leaves a balance of \$145.00 due, which I request for my research I hope you find this fair. William Madison Rayman was born 4 May 1894 in Ohio County, Ky. His parents were James Harm Rayman and Elizabeth Ellen Sapp. James H. Rayman, a native of Bullitt County, Ky., was born 22 March 1852, he was the son of Joseph H. Raymond and Elizabeth Raymond. James H. Rayman's parents and brothers, William R. and John A., spelled their name "Raymond" whereas James and his children used the spelling of "Rayman". In various records the name also appears as Raymon, Raman, and Ramon.

Joseph H. Raymond was born 14 March 1822 and his wife, Elizabeth Raymond was born 29 June 1820. Both were natives of Bullitt County, Ky. Their sons, William, James and John on their marriage bonds in Ohio County, Ky. all reported that both of their parents were born in Bullitt County. Elizabeth's maiden name was identified as "Raymond" on the birth certificate of her son, James H., recorded in the vital statistics of Bullitt County in 1852, and also on the death certificate of her sons, James H. (1917) and John A, (1939).

Joseph H. Raymond and Elizabeth Raymond married about 1845. Their father may be Frederick or Jacob Raymond, who appeared in the 1830 census of Bullitt County, KY; both are listed with a male aged under five in their household. Joseph H. was no doubt both related to Andrew Raymond an early settler of Bullitt County. He was not the father of either Joseph since he had died by the time of his birth. Andrew Raymond was born before 1765, he was residing in Bullitt County when his death occurred between the years of 1812-1814. His widow, Barbara, died about 1827. He was among the early pioneers of Kentucky, having come to the "dark and bloody ground" before Kentucky became a state in 1792, which was only seventeen years after the first settlement at Harrodsburg. In the year 1792 Andrew Raymond was listed as a tax payer in Nelson County, Ky. Nelson County had been in existence since 1785 but the first available tax list is 1792, and thus Andrew Raymond may have been residing there at even an earlier date. In the 1790 censuses of the states of Virginia, Pennsylvania, Maryland, North and South Carolina, the states from which the vast majority of Kentucky's early settlers came from, no Andrew Raymond is listed. For that reason he may have already been in Kentucky by 1790.

Andrew Raymond appears in the tax lists of Nelson County, Ky. from 1792 through 1796. In 1799 he is in the Bullitt County, Ky. tax list. Bullitt County on 1 January 1797 had been formed from parts of Nelson and Jefferson Counties. Andrew Raymond may have resided in the northern section of Nelson County that became Bullitt County; he does not however appear in the first two tax lists of Bullitt County in 1797 and 1798.

Andrew Raymond appears in the 1810 census of Bullitt County. Also appearing in the same census was a John Raymond, who was born between 1775-1778, he may have been either a son or a younger brother of the older Andrew. Following Andrew Raymond's death about 1814 his wife, Barbara, takes his place in the Bullitt County tax lists, paying taxes on the same 200

acres of land. Barbara Raymond appears in the 1820 Bullitt County census. She last appears in the Bullitt county tax lists in 1826, in 1827 Frederick Raymond appears in the tax list as administrator of her estate.

In the tax lists of Bullitt County during the 1820's, at the time of the birth of Joseph (b.1822) four Raymonds appear. They are John, Jacob, Frederick and William Raymond. All were probably sons of Andrew Raymond. John Raymond was born 1775-1778, Jacob Raymond was born about 1789, Frederick Raymond about 1795, and William Raymond about 1799. John, Jacob and William Raymond all appear in the 1820 census of Bullitt County and all were married by then. Frederick Raymond was not listed as a head of a household in the 1820 Bullitt County census, he is probably the male aged 16-26 residing in the household of Barbara Raymond, widow of Andrew. If so Frederick was not yet married in 1820. William Raymond died about 1822, his wife was named Ann. Jacob and Frederick Raymond appear in the 1830 Bullitt County census, John Raymond was listed in that years tax list in Bullitt County but was not located as a head of a household in the 1830 Bullitt County census. Jacob and Frederick Raymond are enumerated in the 1840 Bullitt County census. Of the four Raymonds of the 1820's (possible father of Joseph) only Frederick is listed in the 1850 census of Bullitt County, he was age 55, born in Kentucky, wife Ann, and his occupation was listed as carpenter.

The following Raymonds were Listed in the Bullitt County, Ky. censuses of 1810, 1820, 1830, 1840 and 1850:

Joseph H, Raymond, b.1822, was not found in the 1850 census of Bullitt County, however, he must have been residing there at the time since he is listed in that years tax list of Bullitt County. He may have been missed by the census taker, or his name was misspelled in the

census, or his name was overlooked in the search of that census. Joseph H. Raymond first appears in the tax records of Bullitt County in 1847 and is listed through 1866.

Joseph H. and Elizabeth Raymond were listed in the 1860 census of Bullitt County, Ky. the census listing appears as follows:

Joseph H. & Elizabeth Raymond may have married twice. Census records suggest they married circa 1845. In Nelson County, Ky. Joseph H. Raymond is recorded as marrying Elizabeth on 23 May 1855. On two entries for this marriage she is listed as Elizabeth Raymond and as Elizabeth Ray on the other. On the 1855 marriage record he was reported to be age 31 and born Bullitt County, KY and Elizabeth as age 31 and born Bullitt County, Ky.

All of the children of Joseph H. and Elizabeth Raymond were born in Bullitt County, Ky. The marriage record of their oldest son, William R., indicates he was born there about 1846. In 1852 a birth record of their son, James H., was recorded in Bullitt County. Their son, John A., was born in Bullitt County in 1861 according to his marriage license, death certificate and obituary. Joseph and Elizabeth's daughter, Mary (b.c1849), stated on her marriage bond that she was born Louisville, Ky., Bullitt County is directly below Louisville (Jefferson County) and she may have reported that as her plate of birth because of its proximity, at the time of her birth the tax records of Bullitt County indicate that her father was a tax paying citizen of Bullitt County. Joseph and Elizabeth's daughter, Eliza Belle (b1856), on her marriage bond said only that she was born in Ky.; in the year of her birth her father paid taxes in Bullitt County.

In 1867 or 1868 Joseph H. Raymond and his family left Bullitt County and moved to Ohio County, Ky. He last appears in the Bullitt County tax lists in 1866. In 1868 he is listed in the tax records of Ohio County, the tax book of Ohio County for 1867 is missing and in the 1866 and earlier tax lists of Ohio County no Raymonds were shown as residing there. In the 1868 and 1869 Ohio County tax lists Joseph H. Raymond is the only Raymond listed, in 1870 Joseph H. and his son William R. are listed, in 1871 four Raymonds are listed, Joseph H., his sons William and James H. (he was not yet 21), and also a Frederick Raymond. Frederick Raymond may be either the Frederick, Sr. (age 55) or the Frederick, Jr. (age 27) appearing in the 1850 census of Bullitt County. By 1875 the name of Frederick Raymond disappeared from the Ohio County tax records.

Shortly after moving to Ohio County Joseph H. Raymond purchased 204 acres from George W. and Mary J. Bunger, for \$1200 (deed book U, page 237) on 2 November 1868, The land was on the waters Srovers Creek, a tributary of the Rough River, Stovers Creek extended

from a point about five miles north of Hartford, northwest to Taffy and beyond into the area between the communities of Adaburg and Bell's Run (formerly called Westerfield). In the early 1870's they lost this farm through foreclosure.

Joseph H. and Elizabeth Raymond then moved to a farm just west of Adaburg, in the community known as Taylorfield, which was named after John Peyton Taylor who had first settled there in 1823. Mrs. Elizabeth Raymond, wife of Joseph, in her own words in testimony given in the circuit court suit of John L. Evans vs. Joseph Raymond, stated that they moved onto this farm on 11 September 1876. The farm had been part of lot #9 in the John P. Taylor division. The Raymonds bought the interest of George W. Taylor in exchange for a wagon and later acquired the interest of another one of the Taylor heirs, giving a mule for it. No deed for the land was recorded at the clerk's office in Hartford. On 28 November 1882 John L. Evans brought suit in the Ohio County Circuit Court against Joseph Raymond, contesting ownership of the land, case file #3483, John L. Evans had long been acquainted with the Raymond family, he had lived with them for awhile in Bullitt County, Ky., later he also came to Ohio County where he again for a time lived with them. He claimed that during the time he lived with them they had given him the land in return for work he had done. The court decided that the Raymonds were the rightful owners of the land.

Joseph and Elizabeth Raymond's farm at Taylorfield contained 80 acres, James H. Rayman, Jr and Mrs. Oda Stinnett, the last surviving grandchildren Of Joseph H. and Elizabeth Raymond, both stated that their grandfather, Joe Raymond, operated a blacksmith shop at Taylorfield. Joseph H. Raymond also farmed, which was his occupation listed in the 1870, 1880 and 1900 censuses of Ohio County. In 1871 he raised 2500 pounds of tobacco and 300 bushels of corn on his farm.

Elizabeth Raymond, wife of Joseph H., died 12 October 1890 at the age of 70. A notice of her death appeared in the Adaburg community column of the Ohio County newspaper, it appeared as follows:

Hartford Herald, Wednesday, 29 October 1890:

Adaburgh, Oct. 25, 1890 Mrs. Elizabeth Raymon, of Adahburgh died October 12, of inflammation of the brain. She leaves a husband and four children to mourn her loss.

Elizabeth Raymond was buried at the Ralph Cemetery located about two miles northeast of their home at Taylorfield. At the time it was the nearest public cemetery. The Adaburg Baptist Church Cemetery had not yet been started; a few burials had been made at the Antioch Christian Church near their home, two stones bear an earlier date both in 1889.

Following the death of his wife Joseph H. Raymond lived with his son, John. Ada Stinnett, a daughter of John A. Raymond, said that her grandfather was living with her family when she was born in 1891 and lived with them until his death.

On 5 September 1892 John A. Raymond bought 69 2/3 acres next to the farm owned by his father. He paid Margaret Griffith of Owensboro \$150 for the land (Ohio County deed book 10, page 549). In the 1900 Ohio County census Joseph H. Raymond is listed immediately following his son. John A., both are shown as owning a farm free of mortgage. Shortly afterwards, by November of 1900, Joseph H. Raymond gave his 80 acre farm to his four surviving children. James H. Rayman, William R. Raymond and Eliza B. Clark all sold their interests in the land to their brother, John A. Raymond. James H. on 1 November 1900 sold his

interest for \$10 (Ohio County deed book 44, page 206), William R. sold his interest for one mule worth \$25 on 24 November 1900 (Ohio county deed book 44, page 205), and Eliza B. sold her share for \$40 on 10 January 1901 (Ohio County deed book 44, page 207). The two adjoining tracts gave John A. Raymond a farm of about 150 acres. John A. Raymond lived on this farm until his death in 1939 and his wife until her death in 1951. In 1962 the heirs of John A. and Judith Raymond: sold the two tracts to Dewey and Pearl Hamilton (Ohio County deed book 112, page 333). The land is presently owned by Ernest M. Foster and is shown on the Ohio County Property Plat Book of 1982 (page 8). Part of the farm had remained in the Raymond family for 86 years.

Joseph H. Raymond at the age of 80 died on 28 December 1902 at Taylorfield, he was buried in the Ralph Cemetery beside his wife (note - no obituary was published in either the Ohio County or Owensboro newspapers). His granddaughter, Oda Stinnett remembers how he always wore his hat, inside as well as outside, once her sister, Susie, took a stick and came up behind him and knocked it off, she got a tanning for it.

The farm where Joseph H. and Elizabeth Raymond lived and later their son, John A. Raymond, is located a short distance west of Adaburg in Ohio County, Ky. Adaburg is on Highway 1414, which runs northeast off of Highway 231 about four miles north of Hartford. Traveling north on Highway 1414 less than a mile past Adaburg turn left (west) onto Highway 1738. Less than one-half mile out 1738 a road turns off to the left, known as Ralph Bell's Run Road, short distance down this road in the Antioch Christian Church and Cemetery (church now abandoned). The surrounding area was known as Taylorfield. At one time the Taylorfield school (discontinued in 1930's), the church and several stores were located here. Like many small country communities, many of the families moved away and it has all but disappeared. Some of the neighbors of the Raymonds included the families of Sapp, Taylor, Patton, Crowe, Greer, Morgan, Ralph, Rhodes, Ward, Wade, Wedding and Wetserfield. Just past the Antioch Church is the old Patton family cemetery, on the right side of roadway near an abandoned house. This was the farm of John William Patton (1835-1908), a noted doctor of that area, who no doubt also had served the Raymond family. The 1890 tax list of Ohio County listed Dr. Patton as the nearest resident to Joseph H. and Elizabeth Raymond's residence. On down the road, adjoining: the Patton farm, was the farm of Joseph and Elizabeth Raymond. The Ralph Bell's Run Road intersects with Highway 764, about one mile east of Bell's Run Baptist Church. To go to the Ralph Cemetery, where Joseph and Elizabeth Raymond were buried, travel back to where 1738 intersects with 1414 near Adaburg, going north on 1414 about one-half mile turn right (east) onto Magan Road, first lane on left leads back to the Ralph Cemetery.

Joseph H. Raymond and Elizabeth Raymond had five children, who lived past childhood. They were: William R. ("Bill"), Mary S., James Harm ("Jim"), Eliza Belle and John Arnold.

William R. Raymond, son of Joseph and Elizabeth, was born 1 May about the: year 1846 in Bullitt County, Ky. On 6 February 1870 he married Nancy Lee Morgan. On his marriage bond he said he was age 23 and that he and his parents were born in Bullitt County, Ky. They were married at the residence of his wife's brother; Van Buren Morgan, who lived near Adaburg in Ohio County. Nancy Morgan was born 7 June 1854 in Daviess County, Ky., her parents were William Berry Morgan and Louisa Fuqua.

William R. Raymond, after marrying, lived and farmed in the Adaburg community for about twenty years. In the 1890's he moved his family to the southern part of Ohio County, living for awhile near Cromwell and then by 1900 he moved to McHenry, about five miles south of Hartford. For the last thirty years of his life he resided in the McHenry neighborhood and he has descendants living there today.

William R. Raymond's wife, Nancy, preceded him in death on 25 April 1926, he joined her on 16 December 1932. They were buried in the Fisher Cemetery just outside of McHenry. Among his children there appears to have been some confusion over their father's age and place of birth. On his death certificate and in his obituary it was reported that he was 96 years old, having been born 1 May 1836 in Butler County, Ky. According to his marriage license and early census records he was born in or about the year 1846 in Bullitt County, Ky., making him about 86 years old at his death. Also it was reported on his death certificate and in his obituary that his middle initial was "M.", in the census, deed and tax records his name repeatedly appeared as "William R.". On his death certificate his father was identified as "Joe Rayman" and his mother as unknown. The following obituary was published in the Ohio County newspaper following the death of William R. Raymond:

Ohio County News, Hartford, KY, Friday, 23 December 1932:

William. M. Raymond Dies Suddenly

William Raymond, retired farmer of McHenry, died suddenly at the home of his son, Joe Raymond, of that community, December 16, of high blood pressure. His age was 96 years, 7 months and 16 days, he having been born May 1, 1836. He was born in Butler County and was the son of the late Joe Raymond. He was a good and useful citizen. Deceased was married to Miss Mary Morgan in 1866, who preceded him in death about three years ago.

Immediate survivors are a daughter, Mrs. Lish Ranson, of Little Cypress; five sons, Joe, Jake, Harrison, Richard and Ed, of McHenry; one sister, Mrs. John Clark, of Evansville, Indiana; one brother, John Raymond, of Adaburg; sixteen grandchildren and seventeen great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held at the residence at 2:00 p.m., Saturday, by Esq. Q. B. Brown, Burial was in McHenry Cemetery. Pallbearers were Joe Douglas, H. L. Render, Shelton James, Arthur Stevens, Dorman Hurt and Clarence Austin.

William R. Raymond and Nancy Lee Morgan had six children: Ada, Joseph W., Edward, Richard, Jacob and Harrison. Ada Raymond was born 10 April 1872 in Ohio County, she married twice. By her first husband, Andrew Moore (married c1889), she had one daughter, Annie, who was born about 1889 in Ohio County. Annie Moore married Charles T. Baize on 15 July 1907 at Hartford, they lived and died in Ohio County. Ada Raymond married second Elisha Ranson, 1895-1896, they moved to Paducah, Ky., where she died on 3 March 1942 McCracken County, Ky.; she was buried Oak Grove Cemetery, in Paducah. They had two children, Oscar and Ida (she married John Long), both lived and died at Paducah, Ky.

Joseph W. ("Joe") Raymond, son of William R. Raymond and Nancy Morgan, was born 6 October 1873 in Ohio County, Ky. He married Emma Douglas 10 September 1900 Ohio County, Ky. They lived at McHenry, two children born to them died in infancy. He married second Martha P. Bratcher on 23 April 1948 in Hartford, Ky. He died at Neafus, Grayson County, Ky. on 6 February 1956, and was buried at the Fisher Cemetery near McHenry in Ohio County, Ky.

Adrian Edward Raymond, son of William K. Raymond and Nancy Morgan, was born about 1874 in Ohio County, Ky. He was known by the name of "Dump". On the 2 March 1901 he married Mary Ellen Austin in Ohio County, Ky. Their children were; Audrey, born about 1902 married Frank Robinson, she lived and died in Owensboro, Ky.; James "Adam", born about 1906 married Gladys Jackson, lived in Evansville, Ind.; and Margie was single when her father died in 1936. Edward Raymond lived in Owensboro, Ky., in the 1918 Owensboro City Directory he is shown as living on Jackson St. near his cousins, James H., Joseph H. and John A. Rayman. Edward Raymond was also married to Mrs. Melvina Watson of McHenry, Bessie May Davis on 28 May 1925 in Daviess County, Ky., Annie Jewell on 27 August 1927 in Owensboro, Ky., and Pearl Robinson on 5 November 1930 at Hartford, Ky. Edward Raymond died in Owensboro on 29 June 1936 and was buried in Owensboro at Elmwood Cemetery.

Richard ("Dick") Raymond, son of William R. Raymond and Nancy Morgan, was born 18 April 1878 in Ohio County, Ky. He married Mary Jane Burton on 29 September 1901 in Ohio County, Ky. They had six children: Dewey, born about 1903, was killed in the mines at McHenry; Wavy born 17 May 1904 at McHenry and died 12 October 1933 Ohio County; Clara, born about 1906, never married, died at McHenry; Lorina, born about 1909, married Carl Watson; Wendy (a son) and Jess. All of the children, except Lorine Watson, preceded their father in death, she is presently residing at McHenry, Ky. Richard Raymond married second Mrs. Lelia (Austin) Riadon on 12 October 1936 at McHenry. He died on 1 July 1953 at the Owensboro-Daviess County Hospital, he was buried in the Fisher Cemetery at McHenry.

Jacob ("Jake") Raymond, son of William R. Raymond and Nancy Morgan, was born 28 September 1880 in Ohio County, Ky. He married first Stella Brown on 12 October 1905 in Hartford, Ky. By this marriage he had the following children; Golda, born about 1906, married John Jones and Wavy Moore, she is presently living at Cecelia near Louisville, Ky.; Orville, born about 1908, lived in Hammond, Ind., where he has died since 1978; Cecil is living in Evansville, Ind.; and Alma married a Smith and is living near Leitchfield, Ky. in Grayson County. Jake Raymond married second Donna Mary Kitchens on 16 October 1923 at McHenry. Their children were: Sybil married Alton James and a second time, she is now living Louisville, Ky.; Lyndon is living at Hartford, Ky.; Danny in Hammond, Ind. and Freddie in Nashville, Tenn. Jake Raymond died on 12 November 1966 in Owensboro, Ky., and was buried in the Fisher Cemetery at McHenry.

Harrison Raymond, son of William K. Raymond and Nancy Morgan, was born 5 February 1888 in Ohio County, Ky. On 14 June 1911 at McHenry he married Tula Daugherty, They resided at McHenry and had four children: Ruby died as an infant; Clarence born 14 September 1913, is living in Whiting, Ind.; Rondal born 8 February 1920, is living at McHenry, Ky.; and Herman born 8 May 1922, is living at Beaver Dam in Ohio County, Ky. Harrison

Raymond later married Corrine Stewart. He died 2 October 1963 at the Ohio County Hospital in Hartford, Ky., and was buried in the Fisher Cemetery at McHenry.

The 1860 census lists a female, "M. E., age 6, in the home of Joseph H. Raymond and Elizabeth Raymond. On 10 February 1870 a Mary Susan Raman married Richard Abraham Bray; her age was given as 19 on her marriage license. Richard A. Bray was the son of George W. Bray and Eliza Ann Clark, he was born 1 April 1850 in Daviess County, Ky. He is listed with his parents in the 1850 Daviess County, Ky. census and in the 1860 Ohio County, Ky. census; in 1860 his family was residing in the same neighborhood as the Raymonds. Richard and Mary Bray are in the 1870 Ohio County census, they were residing in the Adaburg community not far from Joseph & Elizabeth Raymond. This Mary Susan Raymond Bray is subsequently living in Bullitt County, KY. She had a daughter, Eliza Frances Bray Clayton born 23 January 1872 and died 13 November 1947 Louisville, KY and a son, Richard Albin Bray, who was born 4 March 1873 and died 21 July 1947 Louisville, KY. Mary Susan Bray married 2nd James Buchanan Crenshaw and they had several children. Mary Susan Raymond Bray Crenshaw died in Bullitt County on 24 August 1929. Her death certificate gives a birth date of 11 July 1857 and proves that she was the daughter of Andrew James Raymond & Lucy Davis, who were married in Bullitt County on 6 September 1833. Richard A. Bray had a nephew, Richard Bray who was born 21 February 1868, the son of George William Bray and Louisa Cordelia Howard, he married Derotha Ambrose and lived at Adaburg in Ohio County. He later moved to Habit in Daviess County and lived near the family of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth Ellen Sapp, his daughter Jennie V. Bray married their son John A. Rayman.

The M. E. Raymond, daughter of Joseph H. & Elizabeth, appears to have died young prior to her mother. Her mother's death notice in 1890 says was survived by four children. If true, M. E., was then deceased. Also when her father gave his farm to his children in 1900 she was not named as a surviving heir.

James Harm Rayman, son of Joseph H. Raymond and Elizabeth Raymond, was born 22 March 1852 in Bullitt County, Ky. On his cemetery monument his year of birth appears as 1851. In the vital statistics of Bullitt County his birth was recorded in the year 1852 and his date of birth as 25 March. The vital statistic record would no doubt be accurate as far as the year. However, these records frequently contained errors regarding the actual date of birth, which appears to be true in the case of James H. Rayman's birth. His monument lists his birth date as 22 March, which was also the date reported by his son, James H. Rayman, Jr. Earlier records all seem to indicate his birth occurred in 1852, including his marriage license., the 1870 and 1880 censuses, whereas sources later in his life, the 1900 and 1910 censuses and his grave marker, all give the year 1851.

In the 1870 Ohio county, Ky. census James H. Rayman was still residing in his parents' home in the Bartlett's Precinct, of the northeastern section of the county, in the Adaburg neighborhood, he was listed as 18 years old. He first appears in the tax records of Ohio County in 1871. In the category of male tithables over 21 in the 1871 tax list a zero was entered, indicating he was not yet 21, the listing also indicated he was enrolled in the militia and owned one horse. On 25 July 1872 in Ohio County, Ky. James H. Rayman married Elizabeth Ellen Sapp, whose family also resided in the Adaburg area. She was a native of Marion County, Ky., having been

born 24 October 1857 to Bennett. Bradford Sapp and Rebecca Lake. On their marriage bond the groom reported his age as 20 and said both he and his parents were born in Bullitt County, Ky.

After their marriage they continued to reside in the vicinity of Adaburg, where they were listed in the 1880 Ohio County census. At the time of the 1890 Ohio County tax list they were still living in the same area. For awhile they resided on the farm of his brother, John A. Raymond, and worked as a day laborer. Sometime between 1894 and 1900 James H. Rayman moved his family to Daviess County, Ky., where they are listed in the 1900 census. They lived in the area of Habit about 25 miles from their former home at Adaburg and 5 miles south of Owensboro. Shortly after the 1900 census was taken they apparently returned to Ohio County for a short time. In October of 1900 when their daughter, Rebecca, married she said she was residing at Adaburg and on 1 November 1900 when James H. Rayman sold his share, in his father's farm to his brother, John, the deed indicated he was then residing in Ohio County, They shortly returned to the Habit area of Daviess County. By 1907 they moved into the nearby city of Owensboro (Daviess County), in that year James Rayman and wife Ellen were listed in the Owensboro City Directory, they were residing at 1520 Center St., and his occupation was listed as laborer. At the time of the 1910 Daviess County census they were residing at 1207 Hall St. in Owensboro, where they were renting. In 1911 they were living at 1500 East 11th St. and they later moved to 1300 Jackson St. For most of his life James H. Rayman made his living farming, after moving to Owensboro he was employed in a carriage factory, which made horse drawn buggies, Owensboro's biggest industry at that time.

The 1900 and 1910 Daviess County census listings for the family of James H. Rayman appeared as follows:

At the age of 56 Elizabeth Ellen Sapp Rayman died on her husband's birthday 22 March 1914. James Harm Rayman died three years later at the age of 65 on 15 April 1917. He died in Owensboro at his home at 1300 Jackson Street. James H. Rayman and his wife were buried at the Macedonia Baptist Church Cemetery, located about 4 miles southeast of Owensboro, at the junction of the Settle Road, Highway 1456 and Newbolt Road. The following obituary of James H. Rayman was printed in the Owensboro newspaper (no article on the death of his wife was found):

Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, Ky., Tuesday, 17 April 1917:

James H. Raymond died of pneumonia at 10 o'clock Sunday evening at his home, 1300 Jackson Street. Surviving him are four sons, James Raymond, Jr., William, John and Joe Raymond; three daughters, Mrs. Rebecca Nix, Mrs. Frances Morris and Mrs. Ella Griden. Fourteen grandchildren also survive him. The funeral was conducted from the residence at 2 o'clock Monday afternoon, with interment in the Macedonia Cemetery.

Ten children were born to the marriage of James Harm Rayman and Elizabeth Ellen Sapp. They were - Sarah Frances, Rebecca Ellen, Joseph Henry, Matilda Bell, George William, John Arnold, James Harm, William Madison, Ella and another child died in infancy. They also raised a granddaughter, Ida May Patton.

Sarah Frances Rayman, daughter of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born in July 1876 in Ohio County, Ky. Before she married she had a daughter, Ida May Patton, who was born in August 1899. Ida May was raised by her grandparents, in the 1900 census in the column of birthplace of father was listed "no father", on her marriage license her parents were listed as James and Sarah Patton. Ida May married Ernest Jarboe, she died 15 May 1935 in Owensboro and was buried at Elmwood Cemetery, she did not have any children. Sarah Frances Rayman married Joseph W. Morris on 8 November 1902 in Ohio County. They lived in the Maceo area of Daviess County, she died 10 May 1922 in Owensboro and was buried in the Maceo area, no one in the family knew the name of the cemetery or its location. They had two children; James Hiram Morris born 1903 at Maceo, was called "Buck", married Agnes Hohimer, Susie May and Allie Sapp Richardson, lived at Richmond, Ky. And Ruby Morris, who married James Deathridge, lived and died at Richmond, Ky. The following obituary of Ida May Patton Jarboe, daughter of Sarah Frances Rayman, appeared in the Owensboro newspaper:

Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, Ky., Thursday, 16 May 1935:

Mrs. Ida. Mae Jarboe, 35 years old, died after a long illness at 11:25 o'clock Wednesday morning at her residence, 1929 Hall Street. She is survived by her husband, Ernest Jarboe, a half sister, Mrs. Ruby Deathridge, of Richmond, and a half brother, James Morris, Owensboro.

Funeral services will be conducted at 4 o'clock this afternoon from the residence. Burial will be in Elmwood Cemetery.

"Rebecca" Ellen Rayman, daughter of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born 24 August 1879 in Ohio County, Ky. On 29 October 1900 in Ohio County she married William W. Nix. At various times they resided in Ohio, Hancock and Daviess Counties and in Owensboro. Her husband died 26 March 1922 in Owensboro and was buried in the Bethlehem Methodist Church Cemetery in Daviess County. They had six children: Alvin James, Ruby Zelma, George William, Elizabeth Ellen, Raymond Henry and James Ignatius Nix. Alvin J. Nix was born 24 Nov. 1902, married Daisy Withers, Verona Agnes Howard and Mary Lee Willoughby, he died in Owensboro on 30 December 1936 and was buried in Elmwood Cemetery. Ruby Nix was born 29 May 1908, married Thomas Williams and Martin E. Johnson, she died in Louisville, Ky. on 28 May 1976, and was buried in Owensboro, Ky. in the Rose Hill Cemetery. George Nix was born 7 September 1909, married Bessie Leona Epley, he is presently residing at 2008 Hail St. in Owensboro. Elizabeth Nix was born 27 May 1913, married William O'Knight, she died in Owensboro on 28 March 1983 and was buried in the Rose Hill Cemetery. Raymond Nix was born 28 March 1916, married Mary Lou Storm, he is now residing at 530 Yale Pl. in Owensboro. James Nix was born 16 December 1919, married Attiebell Halstead, he is now residing on Sutherland Lane in Daviess County, Ky. Rebecca Rayman Nix married second Clarence Chenault on 27 January 1923 in Owensboro, Ky. She died at the age of 91 in Owensboro on 26 November 1970 and was buried in Owensboro at the Rose Hill Cemetery.

Joseph ("Joe") Henry Rayman, son of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born 15 October 1881 in Ohio County, Ky. He was probably named after his grandfather. Joseph H. Raymond. He married Cora Creak on 22 December 1902 at Thruston in Daviess County and in 1904 he married second Hattie Pierce. He did not have any children. At the age of 85 he died on 21 December 1966 in Owensboro and was buried in Elmwood Cemetery.

Matilda "Bell" Rayman, daughter of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born 2 March 1884 in Ohio County, Ky. She married Arthur Chester Purcell on 7 September 1904 in Daviess County, Ky. He was the son of John A. Purcell and Julia A. Ford and was born in Daviess County on 14 April 1881. They had four children: Charles Arnold, Arthur Justice, Presley ("Pat") Madison and Ira Samuel Purcell. Charles Purcell was born 30 December 1905, married Nora Ethel Soling and Opal L. Newton, he died in Owensboro on 9 February 1977 and was buried Rose Hill Cemetery in Owensboro. Justice Purcell was born 1 January 1906, married Virgie Frantz, he is residing at the Fern Terrace Lodge Rest Home in Owensboro. Pat Purcell was born 25 July 1910, married Agnes Boling, he died 5 October 1969 in Owensboro and was buried in the Rose Hill Cemetery. Samuel Purcell was born 19 January 1913, married Irene Fuqua and Dorothy Ruark Jackson, he died 3 August 1967 in Owensboro and was buried Rose Hill Cemetery in Owensboro. Bell Rayman Purcell at the early age of 31 died on 9 September 1915 and was buried at the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church Cemetery, about one half mile from Philpot in Daviess County. Her husband, Arthur C. Purcell, remarried on 11 October 1916 in Owensboro to Mary Hohimer. They had three sons: Chester, Carl and Franklin. Arthur C. Purcell died 3 August 1955 in Owensboro and was buried Rose Hill Cemetery in Owensboro. The following notice of the death of Matilda Bell Rayman Purcell appeared in the Owensboro newspaper:

Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, Ky., Saturday, 11 September 1915:

Mrs. Arthur Purcell, of the Pleasant Valley neighborhood, died on Thursday. She was thirty-six years old and is survived by her husband. The funeral was held Friday from the Pleasant Grove Church, conducted by Rev. Hartford. Interment was in the Pleasant Grove Cemetery.

George William Rayman, son of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born in February of 1886 in Ohio County, Ky. When he was only 17 years old he died of typhoid fever in 1903. He was buried in Ohio County at the Ralph Cemetery near the resting place of his grandparents, Joseph H. and Elizabeth Raymond.

John Arnold Rayman, son of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born 29 May 1889 in Ohio County, Ky. and was named after his father's brother. He married Jenny V. Bray on 11 November 1911 in Rockport, Indiana. She was the daughter of Richard A. Bray and Derotha Ambrose, and was born 18 January 1896. John and Jenny Rayman had seven children: Nellie B., James Richard ("J.R."), John, Margie, Ellen Dee, Jack Arnold and Harold Dean. Nellie Rayman was born 10 February 1917, married Edgar Mason, and is residing at 2020 Hall St. in Owensboro, J.R. Rayman was born 11 December 1919, married Martha May, and is residing at 511 Griffith Ave. in Owensboro. John Rayman was born 11 June 1924 and died 10 December 1932, was buried in Elmwood Cemetery. Margie Rayman was born 26 February 1927 and died 7 November 1932, was buried in Elmwood Cemetery. Ellen Rayman was born 3 November 1929, married Clayton Ford, and is residing at 1911 Hall St. in Owensboro. Jack Rayman was born 25 March 1933, married Margie Estes, and is living in Owensboro. Harold Rayman was born 16 October 1935, married twice, Henrietta and Marsha, he is living at Quality, in Butler County, Ky. John A. Rayman died 9 August 1977 in Owensboro at the age of 88, his wife, Jenny V. Bray Rayman, had died on 10 December 1956, They were buried in Elmwood Cemetery in Owensboro.

James Harm ("Jim") Rayman, Jr., son of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born 27 August 1892 in Ohio County, Ky. He married Susie Pearl Arnold on 29 October 1921 in Owensboro. They did not have any children of their own, but raised two adopted sons, Calvin and Riley Byers. His wife passed away in 1981. James H. Rayman is now 94 years young and resides at his home at 2022 Bluff Ave. in Owensboro. This writer interviewed Mr. Rayman on two occasions, on the first visit he was sitting in a swing in his yard before he saw me I overheard him quietly singing to himself, and on the second visit he was in the backyard raking leaves.

William Madison ("Sill") Rayman, son of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born 4 May 1894 in Ohio County, Ky. He was named after his uncle, William Madison Sapp. He married first Mary Milburn about 1916. She was born 3 April 1898 in Daviess County, her parents were Andrew Milburn and Mattie Clark. William M. Rayman and Mary Milburn were divorced, they had had one daughter, Virginia V. ("Jenny"). Jenny Rayman, who was born 13 October 1917, married James Barnett and Jay S. Fulkerson, she died 20 May 1970 in Owensboro and was buried Elmwood Cemetery in Owensboro. Mary Milburn never remarried and died 7 September 1973 in Owensboro and was buried Elmwood Cemetery.

William M. Rayman married second Georgia Renices Jewell. They were married on 28 March 1923 in Owensboro. She was born 15 May 1903 in Ohio County, Ky., the daughter of Alonzo F. Jewell and Mary Ann Hoover. Nine children were born to them - William Grethal, Wilford Forest, Ellen Mae, Mary Grace, Monie, Johnny, Betty Jean and Carl Lee. Bill Rayman was born 15 December 1923, married Dorothy Mae Watson, he died on 30 January 1978 in Owensboro, where he was buried in Elmwood Cemetery. Forest Raymond spelled his name Raymond; he was born 10 July 1925, married Pauline Dame, lives in Owensboro at 4032 Jefferson St. Floyd Rayman was born 8 May 1928, married Betty Beamer, and lives in Owensboro. Ellen Mae Rayman was born 22 September 1929 and died on 12 June 1930 and was buried at the Macedonia Baptist Church Cemetery, the following notice of her death appeared in the Owensboro newspaper:

Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, Ky. Friday, 13 June 1930:

Death of Infant

Ellen May, nine months old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Raymond, 1402 Hall Street, died at 4 o'clock Thursday morning of complications. The funeral will be held at 10 o'clock this morning from Macedonia Church. Burial will be in the church cemetery.

Grace Rayman was born 9 May 1931, married George William Rusher and Eldred Huskisson, she is living in Owensboro. Monie Rayman was born 3 August 1933, twin, married Shirley Edward Powers, living at 600 Wing Ave. in Owensboro. Johnny Rayman was born 3 August 1933, twin, married Bonita George, residing in Lincoln, Nebraska. Betty Jean Rayman was born 21 June 1935, married Everett Smith and Jack Elroy, living in Louisville, Ky. Carl Rayman was born 4 October 1942, married Freda June Rottenbury, living on Millers Mill Road in Daviess County, Ky. William M. Rayman died 13 July 1957 in Owensboro at the age of 63, his wife, Georgia Jewell Rayman died 19 July 1979 in Owensboro at the age of 76, they were buried Elmwood Cemetery in Owensboro.

Ella Rayman, daughter of James H. Rayman and Elizabeth E. Sapp, was born 11 October 1898. She married about 1915 Benjamin William Gertin, he was born 3 May 1892 in Muhlenberg County, Ky. They had six children - Dorothy Lee, Sophie Bell, Benjamin Vinson, Mary Ann, Theresa Rose and Joan Ann. Dorothy Gertin was born 24 October 1916, married Martin Johnson, lives at 1415 Alexander Ave. in Owensboro. Sophia Gertin was born 2 July 1919, married Herbert L. Collins, living in Pennsauken, New Jersey. Ben Gertin was born 15 October 1921, married Audry May Gillians, living in Pine. Colorado. Mary Gertin was born 21 June 1924, married James Peveler, living in Owensboro. Theresa Gertin was born 5 February 1930, married Pete Bennett, living in Owensboro. Joan Gertin was born 18 April 1936, married Edward Howard, living in Owensboro. Ella Rayman Gertin died at the age of 45 on 2 March 1944 in Owensboro, her husband, Ben W. Gertin died as the result of injuries received in a tractor accident on 9 July 1952 in Owensboro; they were buried in Owensboro's Elmwood Cemetery.

Eliza Belle Raymond, daughter of Joseph H. Raymond and Elizabeth Raymond, was born 11 September of 1856 in Bullitt County, Ky. She married on 10 December 1874 John W. Clark, they were married at her parent's home in Ohio County. At the time of their marriage she was 18

years old and he was 20 years old. John W. Clark was born 9 April 1854 in Daviess County, Ky. He was raised by George W. Bray and Ann Clark, who were the parents of Richard A. Bray, who four years earlier had married Mary Susan Raymond. In the 1860 and 1870 Ohio County censuses John W. Clark was enumerated in the home of George W. and Ann Bray. On 25 November 1850. John was baptized at St. Lawrence Catholic Church near Knottsville in Daviess County. On the baptismal record his name was listed as Bray and his parents were listed as George and Elizabeth Bray. Apparently George W. Bray was not his father since John went by the name of Clark and also George W. Bray on the marriage bond of John W. Clark was identified as his guardian not his father. George W. Bray had a daughter Elizabeth, who had married Albert D. Clark in 1847 but by 1850 she was no longer living with him. It would seem that John W. was the son of Elizabeth Bray Clark.

By 1880 John W. and Eliza Belle Clark had left Ohio County and moved to Owensboro in Daviess County. They were listed in the 1880, 1900 and 1910 censuses of Daviess County, the listings appeared as follows:

John W. and Eliza Belie Clark later moved to Evansville, Indiana. They both died in Evansville. He died on 14 July 1934 and she died on 17 February 1937 at the age of 80. They were both brought back to their former home in Owensboro, Ky. and buried in the Catholic Cemetery (Mater Delorossa) on West 9th Street. They had four children, only two of whom survived their parents. A daughter, Margaret, born in June 1877 was living in 1900 but had died by 1934, Joseph H. Clark was born 23 October 1879, married Susan A. Wade on 8 January 1908 in Daviess County, died 6 October 1958 Evansville, Ind.; buried Mater Dolorosa Cemetery, Owensboro, Ky. Albin Martin Clark, called "Ab", was born 5 April 1890, married Maude Erman Clark on 20 August 1913 in Daviess County, died 10 August 1980 in Evansville, Ind.; buried St. Joseph Cemetery, Evansville, Ind. The following obituaries of John W. Clark and Eliza Belle Raymond Clark were published in the Owensboro newspaper:

Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, Ky., Sunday, 15 July 1934:

John W. Clark, formerly of Owensboro, died at his home in Evansville at 1 o'clock Saturday afternoon after a short illness. Surviving are his widow; two sons Joseph Clark and Ab M. Clark, of Evansville; five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be conducted at Evansville and the body will be brought to Owensboro for burial in the Catholic cemetery at 10 o'clock Monday morning.

Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, Ky. Friday, 19 February 1937:

Mrs. John Clark, 80, formerly of Owensboro, died at her home in Evansville at 11:45 p.m., Wednesday. She is survived by two sons Joe and Ab Clark, of Evansville, formerly of Owensboro, and her brother, J. A. Raymond, Ohio County. Funeral services will be conducted at St. Joseph's Catholic Church, Evansville, at 8 a.m. Saturday. The body will be brought to Owensboro for burial at 11 a.m., in the Catholic cemetery.

John Arnold Raymond, son of Joseph H. Raymond and Elizabeth Raymond, was born 7 May 1861 in Bullitt County, Ky. On March 17, 1889 he married Judith Ann Stewart. She was the daughter of William H. Stewart and Susan M. Miller, and was born 19 July 1867 in Ohio County, Ky. On 5 September 1892 John A. Raymond purchased a farm of 69 $\frac{2}{3}$ acres adjacent to the farm owned by his father near Adaburg. He paid Margaret Griffith of Owensboro \$150 for the land (Ohio County deed book 10, p.549). In 1900 and 1901 by buying his brothers, William R. and James H., and his sister, Eliza Belle Clark's interests, he acquired full title to the 80 acre farm owned by his father, giving him a total acreage of about 150.

John A. and Judith Raymond had five children - Gertrude, Oda, Zoda B., Susan Elizabeth and Ethel, the latter a son died at the age of 3 and was buried at the Barnett's Creek Cemetery in Ohio County, Ky., All four daughters taught in the rural schools of Ohio County. Oda Stinnett, daughter of John A. and Judith, said, that by her father owning his own farm though not well off they had it better than many other families. Their father was able to provide them with a good education. After they had completed the grades at the local schoolhouses at Taylorfield and Adaburg he sent them to Hartford to further their education.

Gertrude Raymond, daughter of John A. and Judith Raymond, was born 8 April 1890 in Ohio County, Ky. She married 21 November 1912 Ira Douglas Funk at Adaburg, Ohio County, Ky. He was born 31 January 1887. They resided at Taffy in Ohio County, where they operated a grocery store. She taught several years in the local schools, including several terms at the Taylorfield school. On 20 November 1937 her husband was killed in a truck accident. She later moved to Owensboro, where she died on 15 July 1959. She was buried at the Clear Run Cemetery in Ohio County. They had two children: Douglas Randolph and Anna Layton. Doug Funk was born 12 May 1925 and is living 2018 E. 21 St. in Owensboro. Ann Funk was born 24 February 1930, married Daniel Herschel Miller, and is living in Owensboro.

Oda Raymond, daughter of John A. and Judith Raymond, was born 10 September 1891 in Ohio County, Ky. She taught about eight years, first at Little Hickory in Ohio County and later at the schools at Habit and Knottsville in Daviess County. She married Charles Otis Stinnett of Knottsville, on 15 September 1915 in Evansville, Ind. Mrs. Stinnett is 95 years old and is a resident of the Cannel Home in Owensboro. She and her husband had four children: John Burch, Charles Raymond, Mary Ethel and Joseph Earl. John B. Stinnett was born 1917 and died 1921 of diphtheria, he was buried at St. Williams Cemetery at Knottsville, Daviess County, Ky. Charles R. Stinnett was born 13 January 1919, married Martha Sturgeon, living in Bradenton, Florida. Mary E. Stinnett was born 30 August 1924, married Frank Evans, living in Raleigh, North Carolina. Joe Stinnett was born 19 July 1926, married Lahoma Arnold, living at 2727 Allen St. in Owensboro.

Zoda B, Raymond, daughter of John A. and Judith Raymond, was born 19 May 1896 in Ohio County, Ky. She married Gilbert Lee Jolly on 9 April 1919 at Masonville in Daviess County. They lived in Owensboro and did not have any children. She died 19 February 1980 in Owensboro and was buried in Owensboro's Rose Hill Cemetery.

Susan Elizabeth Raymond, daughter of John A. and Judith Raymond, was born 27 March 1899 in Ohio County, Ky. She married Evan Gayle Owen on 15 March 1921 in Owensboro. They made their home in Owensboro and did not have any children. She died on 28 June 1959 in Owensboro and was buried there in Rose Hill Cemetery.

John Arnold Raymond died on his farm near Adaburg in Ohio County on 4 October 1939 at the age of 78. His wife, Judith Ann Stewart Raymond, died on 30 June 1951. Though members of the Bell's Run Baptist Church they were buried at the Clear Run Cemetery because of the burial of their son-in-law, Ira D. Funk, there in 1937. Following their deaths the Raymond farm went to their four daughters. In 1951 Susan Owen and Oda Stinnett sold their interests to their sisters. On 21 April 1962 Zoda Raymond Jolly, Anna Funk Miller and Douglas R. Funk sold the farm, two tracts of 69 2/3 and 80 acres, for \$2000 to Dewey and Pearl Hamilton (Ohio County deed book 112, p.333). The following obituary of John A. Raymond appeared in the Ohio County newspaper;

Ohio County News, Hartford, Ky., Friday, 13 October 1939:

Prominent Adaburg Farmer Is Called

John A. Raymond, 78, a well known and highly respected citizen died at his home in Adaburg community, October 4. He had been in poor health for several months, but his sudden death came as a shock to his family.

He was born in Bullitt County May 7, 1861 and while yet a child moved to Ohio County, where he spent the remainder of his life. He professed faith in Christ at about the age of 40 years and united with the Adaburg Baptist Church. Later, he moved his membership to Bell's Run where he remained a member until the time of death. He was married to Judith Ann Stewart March 17, 1889.

Surviving members of his family include his widow, four daughters, Mrs. Ira D. Funk and Mrs. Gilbert Jolly, Hartford, Mrs. Evan Owen, Masonville and Mrs. C. O. Stinnett, Owensboro.

Funeral services were conducted by Rev. Ashby at Clear Run Baptist Church, October 5 at 2:00 p.m. The song service was rendered by his home choir with T. O. Helm as leader. Pallbearers included: Clay Ford, Obie Helm, Allie Westerfield, Warren Midkiff, Joshua Patton and Goebel Ralph.

He was noted for his kindness and help in time of sickness and death, Before the advent of motor vehicles he conveyed 97 and helped to carry three of his fellow beings to the cemetery.

Mr. Raymond was a substantial farmer and continued in active employment in spite of his advanced years. His value to his county and community is best attested by the worth of his splendid daughters, all of whom reached high scholastic attainments and all of whom became teachers.
