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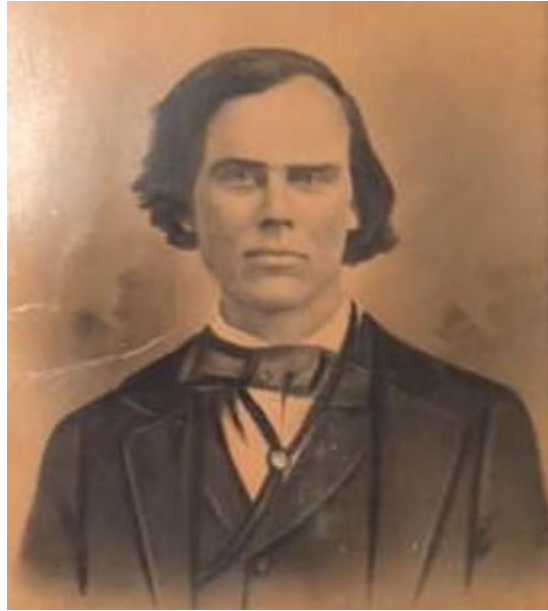
The land on which the cemetery is located was the farm of Benjamin Muffett Taul. Benjamin was the son of Samuel and Mary Elizabeth Muffett Taul (Samuel and Mary were first cousins). He was born 12 miles south of Lexington, Kentucky, on a farm near Tates Creek Road and the Kentucky River. When his father died in 1839, he inherited a large portion of the farm that had been originally owned by his grandfather, Arthur Thomas Taul, in the late 1780s and early 1790s. Benjamin married Sarah "Sally" Ann Carroll (1808-1851) in Clark County,

Kentucky on 26 January 1826. They had 10 children: Samuel "Contrary Sam" Edward, Joseph Levi, Mary Jane, Jesse C., John Richard, William Henry Harrison, Susan, Sarah Francis, Nancy Elizabeth "Puss", Telitha "Tee" Ann. When Sally died in 1851, Benjamin sold the farm and moved to Breckinridge County, Kentucky, about 12 miles southeast of Cloverport in 1852. Soon after arriving in Breckinridge County, he married Sarah A. Marlow Compton. They had two children: Berilda Alice and Thomas Leonard Chrittenden. Benjamin's sons, by Sally, all served in the Union army during the Civil War. William Henry Harrison was killed at the battle of Munfordsville, KY, 22 September 1862. John Richard served in the Green River Battalion of the Kentucky Militia while the remaining sons were enrolled the Third Kentucky Cavalry, U.S. Army. Late in the Civil War, the renowned Confederate guerilla raided Benjamin's farm and confiscated a prized race horse. He got the horse back after Sue Munday's execution in Louisville. Nancy, also known as "Aunt Puss", her husband, William B. Taul, her first cousin, and their children moved to Waynoka County, Oklahoma Territory, in the late 1890s, to homestead. Leonard, Benjamin's son by Sarah, Leonard, became a successful merchant and prominent public presence in Cloverport during his life. He was also known as Len or L.C.

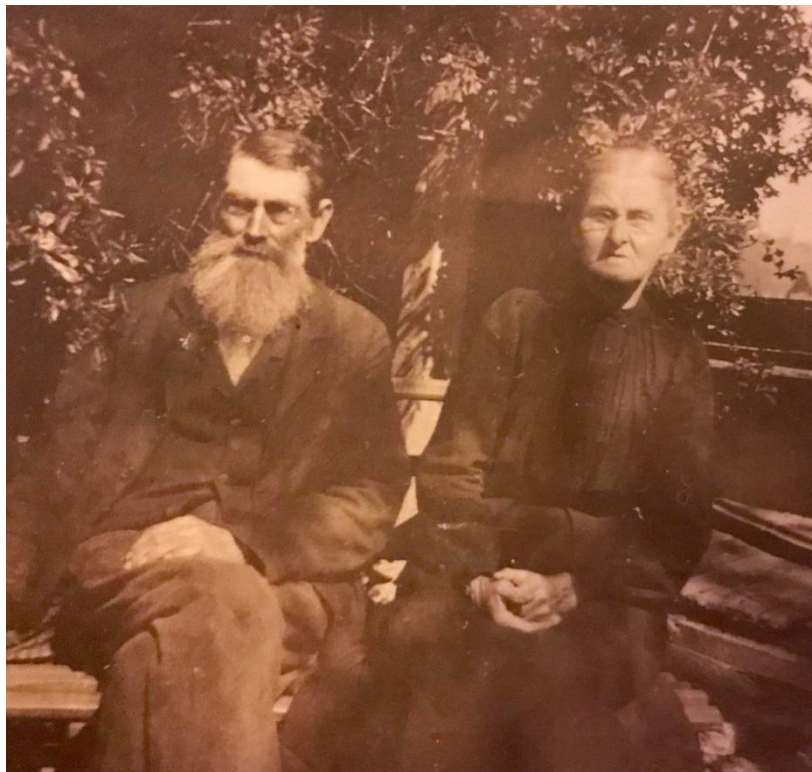
Jonas D. Wilson was the son of Joshua Wilson and Rhoda (Harris) Wilson. Jonas first married Mary Jane (Taul) in Fayette County, Kentucky, and after her death, he married Emaline (Tate). He and Mary were among several members of the Taul Family who in the 1850's moved from Fayette County to Breckinridge County, Kentucky. He served two terms in the Kentucky General Assembly as the representative from Breckinridge County, 1871-1872 (a member of the Greenback Party, but under Democratic Gov. Preston Leslie) and again 1894-1895 (a member of the Republican Party but under Democratic Governor John Young Brown). On May 28, 1897, President William McKinley appointed him postmaster of Cloverport, Kentucky, a position he held for only three years before he died in 1900.



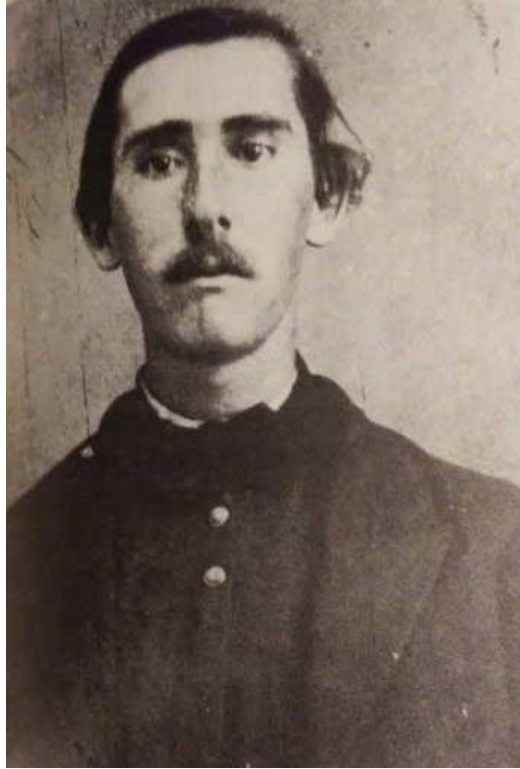
Jonas D. Wilson (1825-1900)
