

Aunt Jane Tichenor Cemetery

Ohio County, KY

Just east of Matanzas, on Highway 85, turn north into lane to Ross Carter's house (Bishop-Carter Road). Short distance past house the lane ends. Path at the edge of the woods, to the left of the barn, leads to the cemetery in woods. Jerry Long, Owensboro, KY, copied the cemetery on 22 March 1987 and rechecked it on 19 May 1987.

Kentucky: A History of the State, J. H. Battle, W. H. Perrin & G. C. Kniffin (1885, Ohio County section):

JOHN W. TICHENOR was born in Ohio County, Ky., March 21, 1847, and is a son of Sanford and Nancy J. (Wade) Tichenor, natives of Ohio and Lincoln Counties, respectively. Sanford Tichenor was educated and married in his native county. After attaining his majority, his father gave him 105 acres of wild land, near Conditt's Ferry, now Point Pleasant, where he improved a farm, upon which he resided until his death, which occurred September 18, 1882, in his sixty-fifth year. For several years he was an officer in the State militia. He and wife were members of the United Baptist Church, in which he officiated as deacon for many years.

He was also a member of the Masonic fraternity. Mrs. Nancy J. Tichenor is yet living, and resides on the old homestead. John W. Tichenor received a good common school education in youth; he lives on the farm upon which he has always resided. Soon after attaining his majority, however, his father gave him a farm of 100 acres in the same neighborhood, which he still owns, and to which he has added other lands. Mr. Tichenor is yet unmarried; he is a member of the United Baptist Church. In politics he is a Republican, and is an enterprising and successful farmer.

SQUIRE W. TICHENOR was born in Ohio County, Ky., September 14, 1849, and is a son of Sanford and Nancy J. (Wade) Tichenor, a sketch of whom will be found elsewhere. Squire W. Tichenor received a good common school education, and was employed on his father's farm until he attained his majority. His father, at his death, willed him a farm near Point Pleasant, being a part of the old home farm, and other lauds, amounting to about 100 acres. He now lives, however, on his brother's farm, in the same neighborhood. He was married December 13, 1874, to Maria Tichenor, also a native of Ohio County, and a daughter of Alney and Amelia (Rowe) Tichenor, a sketch of whom appears in this volume. Two daughters bless their union: Gerda M., and Willie L. Mr. Tichenor is also a teacher of vocal music, having been engaged in that profession a part of the time, in connection with agricultural pursuits, since 1871. He and wife have been for many years members of the United Baptist Church, in which he has held various official positions. He is a Republican and an enterprising farmer and teacher.

Mrs. Jane Tichernor died the 27th inst., after a long and painful illness. Funeral services were conducted the following day by her pastor, Rev. J. T. Casebier, at West Point church, after which her remains were laid to rest in the family burying ground near this place. "Aunt Jane," as she was usually called, will be sadly missed. She spent a long and useful life. She had been a consistent member of the Baptist church at West Point ever since it was organized in 1856. She leaves two sons and three daughters besides a host of relatives and friends to mourn her demise. Peace to her ashes. L. W. T.

In Memory of Mrs. N. J. Tichenor.

Died, at the home of her son-in-law, W. P. Render, on Sunday, January 26, 1902, Mrs. N. J. Tichenor, in her 77th year. Funeral services were conducted by Rev. J. T. Casebier at West Point church, Monday, after which her remains were interred in the family burying ground, to await the resurrection morn. Her life was that of a good and loyal woman. She was a faithful member of the Baptist church for 62 years, ever ready to contribute to the cause of Christ and to lend a helping hand in time of need. She was a true and loving companion, an affectionate mother, a kind neighbor and a friend to the troubled or afflicted. In truth, it can be said "a good woman is gone." She leaves five children, viz: J. W. and S. W. Tichenor, Mrs. T. J. Everly, Mrs. W. P. Render and Mrs. J. B. Maddox. Also 23 grandchildren and a host of relatives and friends mourn her loss. But we do not mourn as those having no hope, for we feel, though irreparable it seems, that our loss is her gain, and we look to the Lord for help and comfort in this our sad bereavement.

Although her sufferings were great, she bore them patiently, trusting in the Lord implicitly. All that loving hands could do was done for her. "She said you have done all that could be done," and requested us to meet her in heaven. Shortly before her death she joined in singing God's praises, and to-day we feel that she sings them with angels above.

CHILDREN OF JARED AND MARTHA (BENNETT) TICHENOR

Sanford, b. June 16, 1818; d. Sept. 18, 1882; m. Nancy Jane Wade, dau. Of William and Polly (Collicott) Wade, in Butler Co., Ky. in 1843. She, b. Dec. 6, 1825; d. Jan. 26, 1902. Both are buried in the cem. on the farm where they lived which is known as the Sanford Tichenor or Aunt Jane Cemetery but is most often referred to as the latter. After he attained his majority Sanford father gave him 105 acres of wild land near Condit's Ferry, now Point Pleasant, where he improved a farm, upon which he resided until his death. He bought 150 acres from his uncle, James Tichenor, in 1850 which he later deeded to his daughter, Ardena. This land was part of the land which Daniel bought from John Howell in 1790. Sanford was for several years an officer in the State Militia. He and his wife were members of the United Baptist Church, in which he officiated as a deacon for many years. He was also a member of the Masonic fraternity.

He was also a teacher of vocal music, being engaged in that profession part time, beginning in 1871, in connection with agricultural pursuits. He and his wife were members of the United Baptist Church, in which he held various official positions. He was a Republican and an enterprising farmer and teacher.
