Just before reaching the Clear Run Baptist Church there is a house on the left with a porch even with the roadway a little past this there is a hill on the right side of the road. Wm. Hoover, living in Bartlett's precinct, died March 17, after a long and severe attack of typhoid, in the 68th year of his age. He leaves a wife, three grown daughters, a grown son and a host of friends and relatives.

--Wm. Hoover, living in the Bartlett precinct, died last Wednesday of typhoid. Mr. Hoover was a substantial citizen, and the community will miss him. His daughter is quite sick with same disease, and her recovery is very doubtful. His son died a few weeks since of typhoid.

Mr. G. V. Hoover, second son of James C. Hoover, of this neighborhood, was sustained injuries from the timbers of a falling shed some months ago, died on Sunday morning from the effects, and was interred near Clear Run church on the day following. He was a moral and upright young man about twenty years of age, devoted to the will of his parents, and bore the agonies of his suffering with that mild indifference illustrative of the realization of the sweetest hopes of a brighter beyond.

Mahala Ann Hoover.

The subject of this sketch was born October 20, 1807, in Culpepper county, Virginia, and died December 12, 1887. In 1815 she moved with her parents to Ohio county, and in 1828 she was married to Jonathan Hoover, one of the early settlers of this county, and lived a peaceable, quiet life. In February, 1884, her husband was called home to rest with loved ones. She was a loving companion, a pious mother and a devoted christian. She professed religion when quite young, and united with the Baptist church at Barnett's Creek, where she held her membership until May, 1886, at which time she moved her membership to Clear Run church, and remained a member until her death. During her illness, she often expressed a willingness to go to a better world. A short time before her death she told me she was traveling, and asked where, she said "to a new home, and I'll soon be there, to a beautiful home where there's no sickness nor sorrow, and I'm willing to go when the Lord sees fit to take me. All I mind is leaving my children." Then she fell asleep in Jesus, to awake on the Resurrection morn.
