Brownd Family of Hall's Creek

Buried at the McCord Cemetery on Hall's Creek Road in Ohio County, KY are five generations of the Brownd family. The first are John Brownd (15 May 1807 - 23 September 1877) and his wife, Elizabeth Dymond (12 July 1812 - 24 May 1878). They were both born in England and came to Ohio County in 1838. After arriving the family first spelled their name "Brown". But because there were several other John Browns in Ohio County, including John Brown (1836-1913), who was a close neighbor, they added a "d" to their name. The spelling was also possibly due to their English accent in pronouncing their name. In other records of Ohio County prior to 1900 I have seen the Brownd name also spelled (or misspelled) as: Brond, Bron, Brawnd, Braund, Brawn, Braun, Browne & Brown. In the annual tax books of Ohio County the first time I could find John Brownd (1807-1877) was in 1838. He is then listed as John Brond.

The death certificate of Mary Ann (Brownd) Pierce (1844-1924) records that her parents were John Brownd (born England) & Elisabeth Dimond (born England). John Brownd and his wife, Elizabeth Dymond, were not married in Ohio County, KY. They would have been married during the 1830's. Since both of them were born in England they might have been married there. I believe they immigrated to this country between 1832-1838. In looking for John & Elizabeth Brownd (under various spellings) in books of early immigration lists I found one entry that matches the first names, approximate ages and period of arrival. It was in the book Passenger Arrivals At the Port of Baltimore, 1820-1834, from Customs Passenger Lists (p69), by Tepper. It listed that in 1832 a Johan Braun, age 26, & Elizabeth, age 19, arrived at the port of Baltimore, Maryland. This is close to the ages of John & Elizabeth as given on their gravestones and in the 1850 census.


The adjoining farms on Hall's Creek Road in Ohio County owned by Chester Newton Brownd (1917-2001) and Benjamin F. Long (1898-1972) were part of land that was purchased by John Brownd in 1842. At the courthouse in Hartford it is recorded (deed book I, p155) that on 4 November 1842 Lucy B. Slaughter sold to John Brown 175 acres on Halls Creek. I traced the farm of my grandfather, Benjamin F. Long (1898-1972) in the deed books and found that the various transactions lead me back to this 1842 deed. The farms were originally part of a Virginia Land Grant of 8680 acres issued to May, Bannister & Company (surveyed on 27 February 1784). The property successively descended to – George May – Richard Bibb Sr. of Logan County, KY - Lucy Booker Slaughter (part of 4340-acre gift to her by her father Richard Bibb in 1807; Ohio County, KY deed book D, p351) - John Brownd in 1842 purchased 175-acre tract from Lucy Booker Slaughter (Ohio County, KY deed book I, p155) – John Manford Brownd (1851-1925) inherited farm from father, John Brownd & purchased shares of the other heirs (Ohio County, KY deed book I, p327) – John Manford & Ira Manford Brownd in 1925 sold 44 acres to John F. Autry (Ohio County, KY deed book72, p278) - John F. Autry in 1934 sold 44 acres to Albert Long (Ohio County, KY deed book 80, p456, 2/7 of John M. Brownd 160 acre homestead) -Albert Long sold to his brother, Benjamin F. Long, 44 acres in 1946 (Ohio County, KY deed book 102, p591, 2/7 of John M. Brownd 160 acre homestead) & Ada Brownd Edwards to Benjamin Long 22 acres in 1946 (Ohio County, KY deed book 103, p319, 1/7 of John M. Brownd 160 acre homestead) – in 1967 Ben F. Long & wife, Anna Mae, sold to Lexie Utley, 4 tracts, each of 22 acres, 4/7 of the John M. Brownd 160 acre homestead (Ohio County deed book 176, p189).

Chester N. Brownd at his death in 2001 owned the other 3/7 of his grandfather, John Manford Brownd's 160 acre homestead. The part of the Brownd farm owned by Benjamin F. & Anna Mae Long lay in a hollow surrounded by hills and their home was in the center of the hollow. Formerly two of the granddaughters of John & Elizabeth Brownd lived on what became the Long farm. Ada Belle Edwards (1882-1960) lived on hill overlooking the hollow and her sister, Iva Myrtle ("Mert") Ashley (1886-1970) lived on side of road leading down into the hollow. The home of Ada Brownd Edwards was torn down and used by Ben Long in the construction of their house in the hollow after moving to the farm in 1947-1948. This writer with his parents and brother visited his Long grandparents about every two weeks and spent part of my summer vacation on this farm. Ben & Anna Mae Long's daughter, Emma Jean, married Marvin Lowell Brownd (1932-1996), a great-grandson of John Brownd & Elizabeth Dymond.

I can remember my granddad, Ben Long, pointing out a grave (marked only by fieldstones) on the left side of the road, at the top of the hill leading down into the hollow. It was on the opposite side of the road from Mert Ashley's house. Just past the grave was some old timber, the remains of an old house. In recent years I spoke to James Hines (1926-2017), of Rosine, who owned an adjoining farm, about this grave. He said it was the grave of a Mr. Dymond, who had been buried there about the time of the Civil War. He had come from England with John Brownd. He said he had been told this by old Bill Pierce, who operated a store in Rosine for years, and who was a grandson of John & Elizabeth Brownd. In the 1850 census of Ohio County I found that the family of a Robert Dymond (born 1800 in England) listed only a few households from John & Elizabeth Brownd. Robert and Elizabeth are likely related.

Robert Dymond was living in Ohio County, KY by 1835 and arrived in the county about the same time as John Brownd. His family is listed in the 1840, 1850 & 1860 censuses of Ohio County. He and his wife, Mary A., and son, Edwin, are all reported to have been born in England. Robert Diamond (age 30), Mary Diamond (age 25) & Edwin Diamond (age 5) where listed as arriving in 1830 at the port of Baltimore, Maryland. These are the exact names of the Dymonds that were later found in Ohio County and their ages matches exactly. The source for the above listing was the book, Passenger Arrivals At the Port of Baltimore, 1820-1834, from Customs Passenger Lists (p132), by Tepper.

Robert & Mary A. Dymond have monuments in the Matthews (Grant) Cemetery on the north side of the Shreve-Davidson Road in Ohio County about one mile south of US Highway 54. In a listing of this cemetery it is recorded that Robert Dymond was born 4 July 1800 England and died 5 November 1861 and Mary A. Dymond was born 7 March 1805 and died 3 February 1864. Robert's occupation was given as blacksmith in the 1860 census. A death record in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics records that Robert Dymond died 5 October 1861 Ohio County, KY; he died of pneumonia at age of 62, he was a blacksmith, born England and was the son of George & Mary Dymond, who were born England. Robert had a son, Edwin Henry Dymond, who was born 2 June 1824 England, married Olive G. Axton, 22 October 1843 Ohio County, KY. Edwin died 4 April 1896 and was buried in the Petty Cemetery at Big Clifty in Grayson County, KY. Edwin & Olive's children included – Mary A., Edwin H., Sarah Ann (Kefauver) and Adolphus Dymond.

In the <u>Hartford Herald</u> of 26 September 1877 (p3) the following death notice appeared: "John Braund, an old Englishman living near Rosine, in this county, died on Sunday last, and was interred at the old Cannon grave yard. He was near seventy-five years old."

Gravestone of John Brownd (15 May 1807 - 23 September 1877) is in the McCord Cemetery, on the Hall's Creek Road. Prior to 1900 this cemetery was known as the Cannon graveyard, after the family who were first buried there (some as early as the 1840's).

John Brownd was born 15 May 1807 in England and died 23 September 1877 Ohio County, KY; his wife, Elizabeth Dymond, was born 12 July 1812 in England and died 24 May 1878 Ohio County, KY. They were buried in the McCord Cemetery, on Hall's Creek Road, in Ohio County, KY. They had the following three children:

Agnes M. Brownd, daughter of John Brownd & Elizabeth Dymond, was born 17 February 1840 Ohio County, KY. She married Robert M. Porter, 28 March 1878 Ohio County, KY. According to their marriage license he was born c1840 Spencer County, Indiana and it was his second marriage. He was the son of Felix Walker Porter & Nancy McKim and is reported to be 11 years old in the 1850 census of Spencer County, IN. He served in the Union army during the Civil War – sergeant, 24th Indiana Infantry, 31 July 1861 – 31 July 1864. He married first Emma (Prentis) Watts, 5 October 1865 Perry County, IN. He is listed with his wife, Emma, in the 1870 census of Daviess County, KY. Agnes & Robert are listed in the 1880 census of Ohio County, KY; in their home were several of Robert's children by his first wife. Agnes Brownd Porter in 1896 applied for a widow's military pension. He may be the Robert Porter (corporal, company F, 1st Indiana Heavy Artillery), who has a US military monument in the Mount Zion Cemetery, at Santa Claus in Spencer County, IN. His grave marker has no dates but on a registration for a military gravestone his death date was given as 3 August 1892. Agnes Porter is listed as a widow in the 1900 & 1910 censuses of Ohio County, KY. In the 1900 census she was reported to have been the mother of one child, who was then deceased. Agnes Brownd Porter died in Ohio County, KY on 31 March 1916 and was buried at the McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.

Mary Ann Brownd, daughter of John Brownd & Elizabeth Dymond, was born 29 May 1844 Ohio County, KY. She married Edward Pierce, 19 October 1862 Ohio County, KY. He was the son of Absalom & Ruth Pierce and born 16 February 1841 Ohio County, KY. He served in the Union army during the Civil War. Ed & Mary Ann were listed together in the 1870, 1880,

1900, 1910 & 1920 censuses of Ohio County. He was a farmer and died 6 July 1928 Rosine, Ohio County, KY. Mary Ann died 18 May 1924 Rosine, Ohio County, KY. They were buried in the Rosine Cemetery. The 1910 census recorded that Mary was the mother of 8 children, 4 of whom were then deceased.

- 2. William Cicero Pierce, born 16 December 1867 Ohio County, KY; died 10 September 1868 Ohio County, KY; buried Christian Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.
- 3. Matilda A. Pierce, born 29 May 1869 Ohio County, KY; married Cyrus Johnston, 7 December 1890 Ohio County, KY; she died 23 December 1951 Marion, IL; she was buried Lakeview Cemetery, Johnston City, Williamson County, IL.
- 4. Alger Bracton Pierce, born 25 September 1871 Ohio County, KY; married Nancy Elizabeth Vance, 26 September 1895 Ohio County, KY; he died of typhoid fever on 23 December 1904 Ohio County, KY and was buried McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.
- 5. William Hulbert Pierce, born 28 February 1874 Ohio County, KY; married Antha Jane Autry, 5 December 1895 Ohio County, KY and Nancy Elizabeth (Vance) Pierce Thomas, 7 July 1946 Ohio County, KY; he died 2 May 1967 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY and was buried Rosine Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.

- 6. John Edward Pierce, born 28 September 1877 Ohio County, KY; married Eliza Ann Hughes, 21 April 1898 Ohio County, KY; he died 3 December 1940 Daviess County, KY and was buried Rosine Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.
- 7. Ruth Viola Pierce, born 4 January 1879 Ohio County, KY; died 25 February 1879 Ohio County, KY and was buried Christian Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.
- 8. Susan Bertha Pierce, born 6 May 1880 Ohio County, KY; died of pneumonia 16 January 1900 at Horton, Ohio County, KY and was buried McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.

John Manford Brownd, son of John Brownd & Elizabeth Dymond, was born 6 September 1851 Ohio County, KY. He married Martha Emeline Warner /Wornel on 7 August 1879 Ohio County, KY. The daughter of James Henry Wornel / Warnell & Sarah M. Autry, Martha was born 13 July 1859 KY and died 27 December 1924. John & Martha are listed together in the 1880, 1900, 1910 & 1920 censuses of Ohio County, KY. John died 23 December 1925. He and Martha were buried at the McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY. The 1900 & 1910 censuses reported that they had 7 children, all of whom were then living. Their children were:

- 1. Arthur Chesterfield Brownd, born 12 August 1880 Ohio County, KY; married Martha Lucinda Brown, 4 July 1913 Ohio County, KY; he died 23 February 1940 Ohio County, KY; and he was buried Brown (Heavrin) Cemetery, Ohio County, KY. His wife had a son Lewis Brown. Arthur & Martha's children were Christine (1914-1997, married Charles E. Tucker), Lorene (1919-2004, married Adrian Lowell Burton) and Chester Newton (1917-2001, married Anna Laura Nelson Brooks).
- 2. Ada Belle Brownd, born 4 April 1882 Ohio County, KY; married George Thomas Edwards, 19 June 1902 Ohio County, KY; she died 30 January 1960 Hartford, Ohio County, KY and she was buried McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY. Their children were Anna Mae (1903-1987, married Dewey Lee Alford), Willie Bell (1908-1929, married James W. Ragland), Iva Magdaline (1910-1973, married Lawrence W. Kuykendall), Charles Ray (1913-1978, married Myrtle Dockery) and Ruby E. (1919-2010, married Fred Ardoin).
- 3. John A. Logan Brownd, born 1 October 1884 Ohio County, KY; married Annie Wilson, 3 December 1905 Ohio County, KY; he died 9 June 1959 Hartford, Ohio County, KY and he was buried McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY. He had no children.
- 4. Iva Myrtle Brownd, 'Mert', born 6 January 1886 Ohio County, KY; married George Frances Ashley, 14 June 1924 Grayson County, KY; she died 24 June 1970 Beaver Dam, Ohio County, KY and she was buried McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY. She had no children.
- 5. Joseph Luster Brownd, born 23 September 1889 Ohio County, KY; married Erma Maine Holmes, 27 December 1914 Newport, Jackson County, AR; he died 30 July 1952 Newport, Jackson County, AR and he was buried Walnut Grove Cemetery, Newport, AR.

Their children were – Joseph Luster, Jr. (1917-1988, married Mildred Frances Baker), Erma Emalyn (1922-1994) and John Ruble (1926-, married Matilda Rogers).

- 6. William Jerome Brownd, 'Dec', born 6 June 1893 Ohio County, KY; married Stella Thomas Crumes, 12 September 1914 Rosine, Ohio County, KY; he died 15 March 1965 Ohio County, KY and he was buried McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY. They were parents of Joy Lovell (1917-2009, married Rev. Ernest Lyles Griffin) and James Dexter (1923-1989, married Mildred Laverne Muffett)
- 7. Ira Manford Brownd, born 1 November 1899 Ohio County, KY; married Iva Myrtle Rudell Myers, 20 September 1919 Ohio County, KY; he died 13 April 1964 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN and he was buried McCord Cemetery, Ohio County, KY. Their children were Mildred Charity (1920-2001, married Carl Edward Nantz), Ira Manford, Jr. (1922-1924), Anna Louise (1926-2019, married Foster Dalphes Phelps), Cecil Chesley (1930-2016, married Hazel O'Dell), Marvin Lowell (1932-1996, married Emma Jean Long), William Ervin (1938-, married Arlene Ziembicki) and Meda June (1938-, married Loran Howard Leach, and Auburn Clifton McBride).
