

McNemer Cemetery

Daviness County, KY

About two miles southeast of Sorgho. Turn south off of Highway 56 onto the Hayden Bridge Road. Turn at Stephens Road, the second road on the left, About one-half mile the cemetery is on the left about 150 feet from roadway on the farm of the late Ed Stephens. Philip McNemer is shown on the 1876 Historical Atlas Map of Daviness County as owning a 85 and 155-acre tracts of land a short distance south of Sorgho. Gravestones were copied on 13 December 2011 by Grady Ebelhar, of Sorgho.

An Illustrated Historical Atlas Map of Daviess County, KY., Leo McDonough & Co., 1876, p.26, Lowertown Precinct, Phillip McNemer, is shown with two lots of land a short distance south of Sorghotown [now Sorgho], 155 acres along south side of Glenn's Bridge Road and 85 acres along the Hayden Bridge Road:

—At the regular annual banquet of the Fat Men's Club, Phil McNemer, of Sorghotown, was elected president, Mort Field, vice-president, and James Kennady, secretary. Squire John Goodwin has held the office of president two terms, and was faithful "in small things as well as great." He retires "full of years and full of honors." The banquet of the club at the Planters' hotel was the grandest they have yet given. Among other distinguished guests who were present were Senator David Davis, of Illinois; Col. W. H. Yost, of Greenville, Ky., and Senator Thurman, of Ohio. The club is non-political, and is intended to be representative of the fat men of Daviess county. The next meeting will be held one year hence, unless the president sees proper to call a special meeting in the meantime.

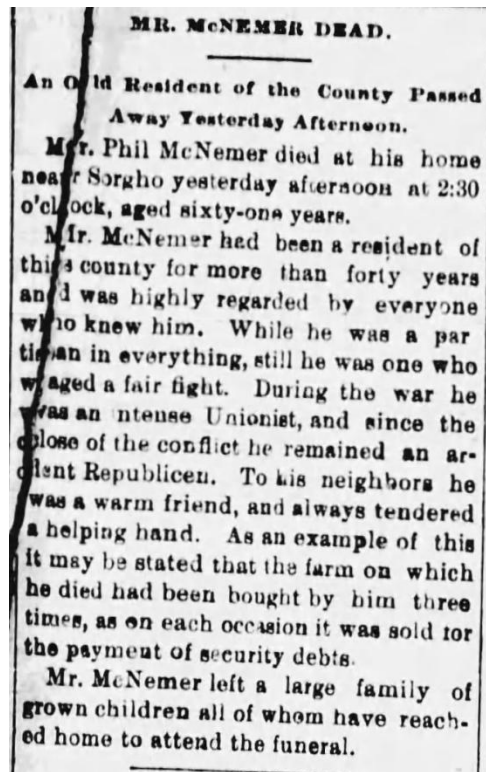

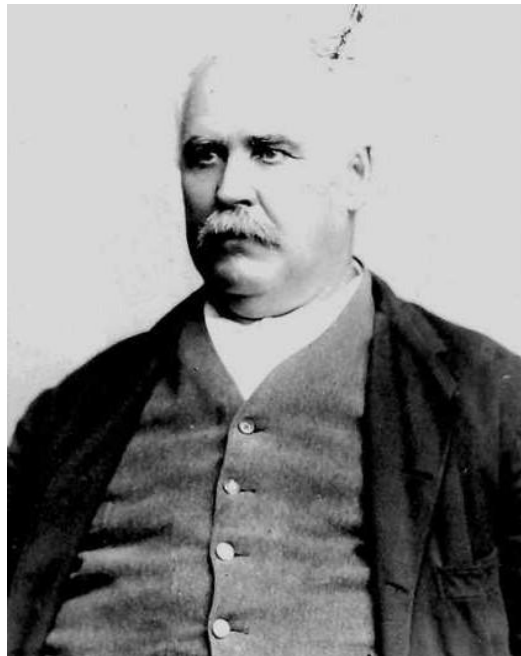

My brother W. Keith reports,

"Philip McNamer's name first appears on the Daviess County, Kentucky tax rolls in 1817. He was in the Militia company headed by a man by the name of Hollinghead. He had one male child under 20 years of age. Apparently Philip, Jr. and Eveline were born between 1817 and 1820 because on the 1820 census two male children under 20 years of age and 1 female child under 20 are listed. His economic fortunes seemed to rise and fall according to the number of horses he had; sometimes one and at other times three. In 1830 he acquired 72 acres of land on the Blackford watercourse. His name disappeared from the tax roles in 1842. His heirs, Hiram McNamer, Philip McNamer, Jr., and America Eveline (McNamer) Hagan sold the farm on June 1, 1846 to Ted or Ned Shaw for \$126. At the time of the sale Hiram was living in South Elkhorn, Illinois; Philip, Jr. was living in Daviess County, Ky.; and America Eveline and her husband Charles Hagan were living in Spencer County, Indiana."
