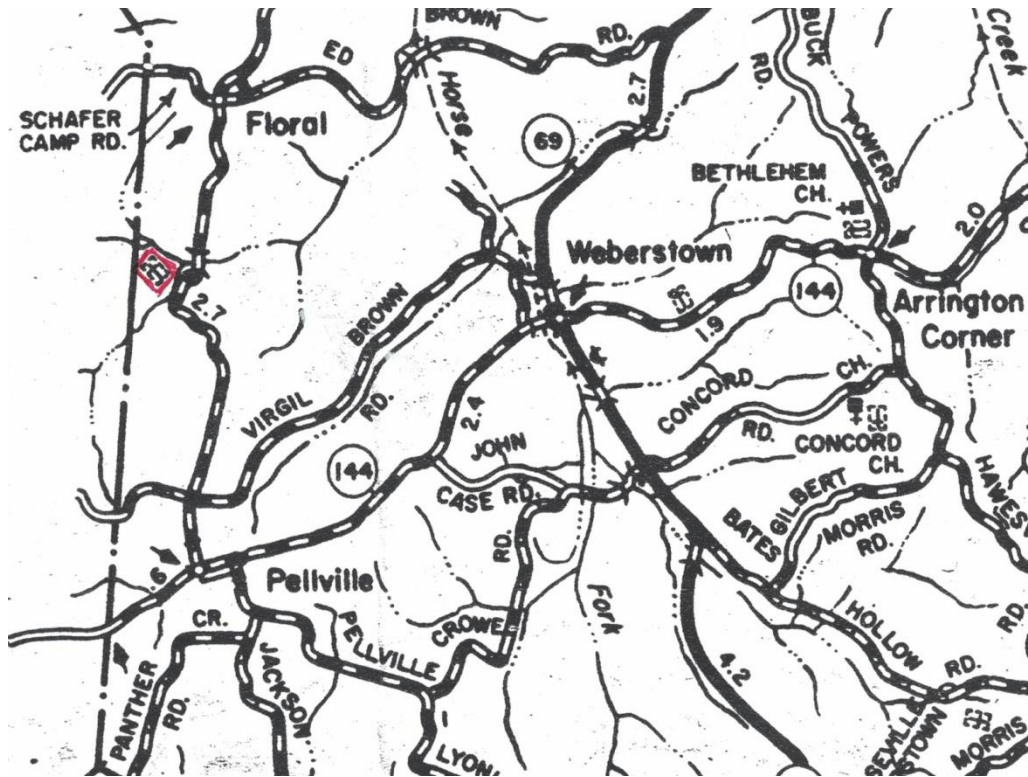


Wolf Cemetery

Hancock County, KY

Wolf Cemetery is outlined in red. On the left is the Daviess – Hancock County line.

On the west side of the Hawesville-Pellville Road. In right angle turn, about one mile north of Pellville, Ky. About 100 feet behind house. On farm formerly owned by of Hardin Puckett (1888-1991). Hardin's brother, Joshua Puckett, married Loretta Wolf (1894-1919). Copied by Jerry Long on 30 October 1983. The remains of a log house were near the back of the cemetery.

He leaves a wife and five children. The funeral will take place Tuesday morning at 9 o'clock from St. Lawrence Catholic church.

Hawesville News Notes

Hawesville, Ky., Jan. 9.—Mrs. Loretta Puckette, 35 years old, was found dead in her bed at six o'clock Tuesday morning at her home near Floral. She had been ill of "flu" for several days but was thought to be improving at nine o'clock Monday night, when her family last saw her. She is survived by her husband, Joshua Puckette and three children, the eldest eight years old and the youngest fifteen months old. Before her marriage she was Miss Loretta Wolf a sister of Corporal George Wolf, who was killed in France during the month of September. Burial took place Wednesday in the Wolf burying ground near Floral.

George Wolf was born in France on 24 June 1824. He is listed in the 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of the Pellville neighborhood of Hancock County, KY. He was a farmer. He served in the Union Army during the Civil War. He was mustered in company E of the 3rd Kentucky Calvary at Calhoun, KY on 13 December 1861. The "Report of the Adjutant General of the State of Kentucky" recorded that he was severely wounded in the right arm on 30 September 1864 resulting in his arm being amputated. He is listed in the WPA's Registration of Veterans' Graves for Hancock County, KY.

George Wolf married Anna Mary Tekel circa 1858. She was born 7 January 1830 in Prussia (Germany) and died 1 October 1885. George Wolf married Mary Weiss, 28 December 1885 Perry County, IN; he filed for a divorce in Hancock County, KY on 22 August 1887. George married Mrs. Angeline Louisa Mickel in Hancock County, KY on 13 September 1888. The daughter of Hiram M. Nugent & Amelia Williams she was born 3 January 1842 KY. Angeline married Henry Mickel, 25 November 1883 Hancock County, KY. She died 20 January 1917 Hancock County, KY, where she was buried in the Blackford Baptist Church Cemetery. Angeline and George Wolf had no children; she and her first husband had one child, Amelia J. Mickel.

George Wolf died 10 December 1893. He his wife, Anna Mary, and three of their children were buried in the Wolf family Cemetery near Floral in Hancock County, KY. George & Anna Mary had five known children:

1. George Wolf, born 18 January 1859 Hancock County, KY; died single, 2 July 1879; buried Wolf Cemetery, Hancock County, KY.
2. Anna Mary Wolf, born 24 November 1861 Hancock County, KY; married Charles T. Edwards, 27 September 1880 Hancock County, KY; she died 19 December 1936

Louisville, Jefferson County, KY; buried Midkiff Cemetery, near Sulphur Springs in Ohio County, KY.

3. Josephine Wolf, 'Tiny', born 24 November 1864 Hancock County, KY; married Jefferson Davis Harrison, 26 May 1883 Perry County, IN; she died 3 September 1894 in Pellville, Hancock County, KY; buried Pellville Cemetery, Hancock County, KY.
4. Lawrence Wolf, born 17 March 1869 Hancock County, KY; married Josephine Hoskins, 14 February 1888 St. Lawrence, Daviess County, KY; he died 21 October 1900; buried Wolf Cemetery, Hancock County, KY.
5. William Wolf, born 9 July 1871 Hancock County, KY; he died 24 November 1881; buried Wolf Cemetery, Hancock County, KY.



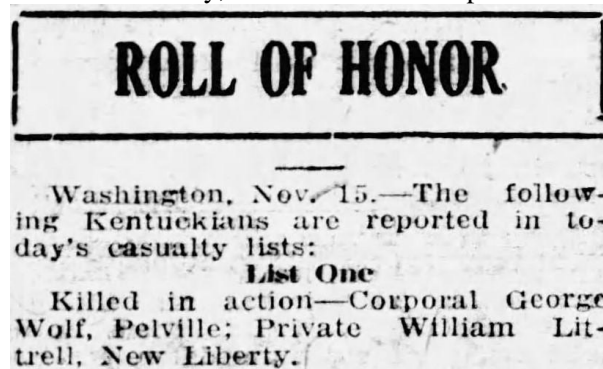

George Wolf (1896-1918) and Loretta Wolf (1894-1919) children of Lawrence Wolf and Josephine Hoskins and grandchildren of George Wolf & Anna Mary Tekel.

One of the sons of Lawrence Wolf and Josephine Hoskins, George Wolf, was born 22 December 1896 and served as a corporal during World War I – Company K, 120th Infantry, US Army. He was killed in action at Bellicourt, France on 29 September 1918. He was buried in the Somme American Cemetery at Bony, France. He was unmarried.
