One mile south of Dukes turn west off of Highway 144 onto the Young Road (gravel road). Turn into first lane on right. Lane dead ends in Hennen Hollow. On hill behind second house (Leonard McManaway) is the cemetery. When I visited the cemetery Otha Jack Jarboe (1909-2002) resided near the cemetery. He was the son of Nathaniel Jarboe & Filincia Basham and grandson of William Jarboe & Mary Young. Mary Young was a sister of this writer's great-great-grandfather, Nathaniel Young (1839-1884). Transcriptions on the monuments were copied by Jerry long on 27 September 1983.

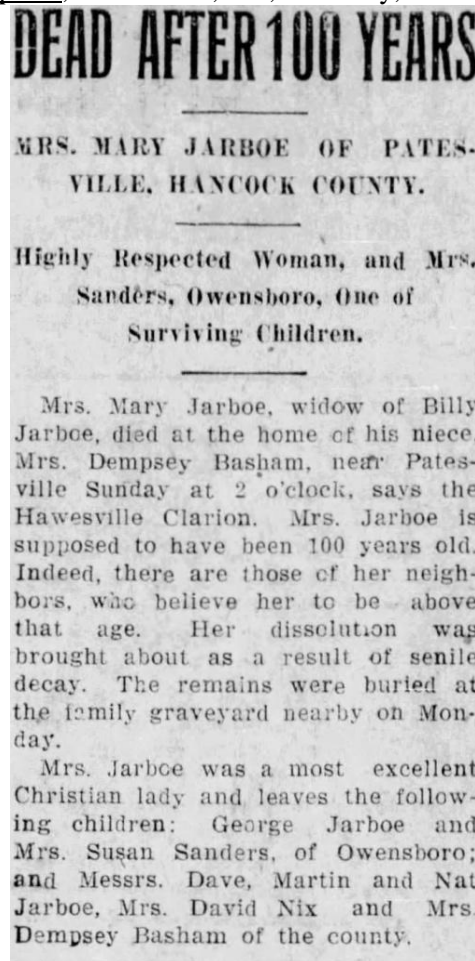

**Hancock County's
Oldest Man Dies**

David Nix, of Dukes, in Hancock county, the oldest citizen of the county passed away February 5 at his home, at the age of 101 years.

Mr. Nix had long been a resident of this county and through his long and useful life has marked the changes of time and progress. Born on Christmas day of 1845 fifteen years before the beginning of the Civil War, he witnessed the marked changes that have been characteristic of America.

Living as he did through more than a century of American history he experienced four major wars in which the United States has engaged. He has witnessed the progress of the United States from a weak and unstable country, struggling to establish itself as a great nation, to the present time in which it has reached that status and today, at the time of his passing this Nation stands at the head of all the countries of the world in strength and development.

One is led to wonder why one individual among so many is privileged to live as long as did Mr. Nix. We are sure no exact science can enumerate the cause of such longevity, but there must be a reason and we are sure Mr. Nix in his life had something that most of us do not possess; some physical strength beyond the average or some system of living that gave him the added years of survival.

Mr. Nix was ill but a short time before his death.

He is survived by two daughters Mrs. Ivory Corley and Mrs. Wm. Nichols, both of Dukes; four grandchildren, and several great grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted from the Dukes Presbyterian Church, February 8th at 11:00 a. m., conducted by Rev. Arthur Carter, pastor of the Church. Interment was in the Jarboe Cemetery.

William Jarboe was born 11 December 1816 Breckinridge County, KY. He was the son of Jarret R. Jarboe & Elizabeth Jefferson, who were married in Hardy County, VA on 3 August 1812. Jarrett R. was born 13 April 1793 Hardy County, VA and died 1 July 1852 Hancock County, KY, where he was buried in the Fairview Cemetery. William's grandparents were Benedict Jarboe & Drusilla Coomes and William Jefferson & Mary McNemar. His grandfather, Benedict Jarboe died 1828-1829 Breckinridge County, KY.

William Jarboe had siblings – Samuel (1813-1862, married Martha Alice Blandford), Benedict (1816-c1853, married Ruth McFall), Ann (c1821- , married Robert J. Smith), George Madison (1823-1897, married Malinda Richey), Cassandra (c1827- , married James Martin Arterberry) and Mary D. (c1830-1915, married William Hopper).

William Jarboe married Mary Young, 2 March 1843 Hancock County, KY. Mary was born 1823-1824 Breckinridge County, KY. She was the daughter of Rev. Martin Young & Margaret. Her father was a Baptist minister in Hancock County for about 45 years; he was the son of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, who came to Breckinridge County, KY about 1811 from Washington County, KY.

William Jarboe died 28 March 1900 in Hancock County, KY and his widow, Mary Young Jarboe died on 28 November 1909 in Hancock County, KY. William and Mary were the parents of:

1. John Jarboe was born 12 March 1844 Hancock County, KY. He served in the Union Army during the Civil War. He died in a veteran's hospital in Evansville, IN on 12 April 1862. In the Kentucky Adjutant General's Report for the Union Army it is recorded that John Jarboe was mustered into Company, D of the 27th KY Volunteer Infantry on 21 March 1862 and he died at Evansville, IN on 12 April 1862. Other fellow residents of

Hancock County served in the same outfit, including – Martin V. Young, Marshall Angel, Isaac Lyons & Bartlett Adkins. His place of burial was reported as being at the Young Cemetery in the WPA's Registration of Veterans Graves for Hancock County, KY. A niece, Nannie Merle (Jarboe) Nugent (1889-1986), however, reported that he was buried in the Jarboe Cemetery, where his parents were buried.

2. Margaret Angeline Jarboe was born in February 1847 Hancock County, KY. She married David Nix, 29 October 1872 Hancock County, KY. David, son of John & Elizabeth Nix, was born 25 December 1854 Hancock County, KY. Margaret Angeline died 4 January 1926 Hancock County, KY. David Nix died 6 February 1947 Hancock County, KY and was buried with his wife in the Jarboe Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. They were parents of – Melissa Ann (c1873-1964, married William Anderson Nichols, children – Homer, Lillie Mae, Alma, Mary Jane & Ernest), Mary Virginia (1877-1965, married Ivory Corley, children – Teanie, Vity, Sevonina, Geneva, Hilary, Julia Mae & Eliza Frances) and William Samuel (1883-1943, married Dorothy Artelia Sanders, children – Clara Ellen, Anna, Chester, Bertha Ellen, Tealie, Wavie, Virgie M., Jesse Ivory, Ruby Pauline & Helen Marie). David & Angeline Nix also raised an adopted daughter, Maggie Nichols (1897-1920's, married Oard Carlton), who was the granddaughter of David's sister, Sarah Jane Nix & her husband, William N. Nichols.

3. Martin Vanburen Jarboe was born 26 December 1849 Hancock County, KY. He married Sarah Frances Johnson, 1 December 1868 Hancock County, KY. He died 15 February 1919 Hancock County, KY and his wife, Sarah F. died 7 March 1929 Breckinridge County, KY. Martin & Sarah were buried at the Jarboe – Dawson Cemetery, Breckinridge County, KY. They were parents of – James A. (1871-1935, married Louditha C. Burnett, no children), Mary Ida (1873-1955, married Thomas Long, children – Joseph, Martin, Jessie, Ninah, James A., Bruce Marie, Ruby, Mary Kay, Iva May, Maude, Glenn & Earl), Elmina (1876-1898, married William H. Dawson, children – James Robert, Lura E. & Nannie), and Nannie Merle (1889-1986, married Oscar Franklin Nugent, children – Edith Eloise, Claude Clarence, Raymond Elwood, Audrey Louise, Sarah Frances & Opal Pauline).

4. David William Jarboe was born in February 1853 Hancock County, KY. He married two sisters, who were his second cousins. They were daughters of George Williams & Ruth Angeline Young (her father George Young was a brother of David's grandfather, Martin Young, Jr.). David married 1st Eliza Ann Williams, 29 October 1872 Hancock County, KY; she was born c1857 Hancock County, KY and died 1882-1900. David married 2nd Mary E. Williams, 22 March 1902 Hancock County, KY; she was born c1860 Hancock County, KY and died 20 February 1914 Hancock County, KY and was buried Jarboe Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. David by Eliza had children – Louella (c1875-after 1910, married Robert Denton Ijames & __ Mattingly, children – Robert Newton & Virginia L. Eimes), Rosetta (c1876-1951, married James T. Sirles, children – James Rally, Sallie Mae & Edgar), Mary (c1878-1880), Annie B. (1882-1902, married John Albert Denison), Magnolia (1884-1966, married Gentry Richard Wright, children – Edward, Violet Irene, Arthur Vernon, Catherine Louise, Norman Denton & James Leroy) and Effie (1881-1905, married Richard Dennison, children – Richard).
5. Susan Elizabeth Jarboe was born 2 August 1855 Hancock County, KY. She married George Lewis Sanders, 'Luke', 15 November 1873 Hancock County, KY. They were second cousins. Born 10 October 1854 in Hancock County, KY, George was the son of James T. Sanders & Nancy Ann Young and grandson of George & Sarah Young. George was a brother of Susan's grandfather, Rev. Martin Young, Jr. George died in 1904 and Susan died 6 August 1918 in Owensboro, Daviess County, KY. George & Susan were buried in Hancock County, KY; some relatives believed they were buried at the Young Cemetery others thought it was the Jarboe Cemetery. They were parents of – Mary Frances (1874-1937, married Cicero Dempsey Basham, children – Herbert, Anna B., William Snead, Ray Vivian and Eldred), James William (1878-1956, married Hattie Jane Mattingly, children – Garland Ray & Geneva), Eldred Harvey (1883-1959, married Nora Leeanna Nichols & Clara Edna Rowland, children – Oscar, Iveylin & 2 died infancy), David (died age 7), George (died age 2 months), Beulah Sue (1888-1962, married Noah Jack Basham, no children), Josie (1891-1977, married Virgil H. Ray, children – Leola Brownie, James Franklin, Ruth, Paul Edward), and Zena (1894-1928, married Oden Jackson, children – Leslie B., Eva Jean & Emma Lee).
6. George W. Jarboe was born 3 February 1857 Hancock County, KY. He married Martha Elizabeth Gist, 3 June 1883 Hancock County, KY. She was born 15 March 1862 Hancock County, KY to William Franklin Gist & Camilla Starks. George W. died 19 May 1927 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY and Martha died 21 July 1952 Maceo, Daviess County, KY. They were buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Owensboro, KY. They were parents of – Willie S. (1883-1895) and Ivory (1885-1974, married Delia Walker, children – Wallace Dudley).
7. Nathaniel Jarboe was born 1 May 1858 Hancock County, KY. He married Filincia Basham, 19 March 1891 Daviess County, KY. She was born 28 April 1870

Daviess County, KY to Adelbert Basham & Armilda Basham. Nathaniel died 24 January 1944 Hancock County, KY and Filinica died 26 October 1957 Hancock County, KY. They were buried at the Jarboe Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. They were parents of – Ernest (1893-1978, married Ida May Patton & Bessie May Skaggs Conley, children – William E.), Cora (1895-1901), Telia (1900-1993, married Chester Boling. children – Elizabeth, McKinley, Catherine Marie, Clara B., John N., Ernest Darrel & Kenneth), Covey (1901-1902), William (1902-1921, single), Ethel Mae (1906-1990, married George E. Taylor & Iman Edward Johnson) and Otha Jack (1909-2002, married Nettie Rose Burnett & Helen Howard, children – Oma Catherine, Jarvie Perry, Roger Glenn and Scott).

8. Hannah Jane Jarboe was born in May 1864 Hancock County, KY. She married James Franklin Young, 'Frank', 5 February 1886 Hancock County, KY. They were 2nd cousins, their grandfathers, Rev. Martin Young & George Young, were brothers and 1st cousins of Solomon Young (1815-1892), grandfather of president Harry S. Truman (1884-1972). Frank Young was born 2 March 1864 Hancock County, KY to Horace Young & Hester Hale. He married 2nd Bridgit Cordelia (Butler) Terril (1866-1914), 7 May 1908 Hancock County, KY and 3rd Martha Jane (Easton) Smith (1866-1945), 18 December 1914 Perry County, IN. Hannah Jane died 8 October 1907 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY and was buried Jarboe Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. Frank Young died 1 March 1928 South Bend, St. Joseph County, IN and was buried Easton Cemetery, Easton, Hancock County, KY. They were parents of – Leonard (1887-1958, married Clara Marie Joergler, child – James Lloyd), Floyd (1891-1901, Hancock Clarion, Hawesville, KY, Saturday, 6 July 1901 p2, "Patesville - A little son of Frank Young died near here Monday."), Clarence (1894-1975, married Marthiene Keown, child – Ada May) and Claude (1898-1969, married Esther Elizabeth Smith, children – Clara Belle, Betty Ann, Dessie Dhaise, Lloyd Edward & Claudia Odell).
