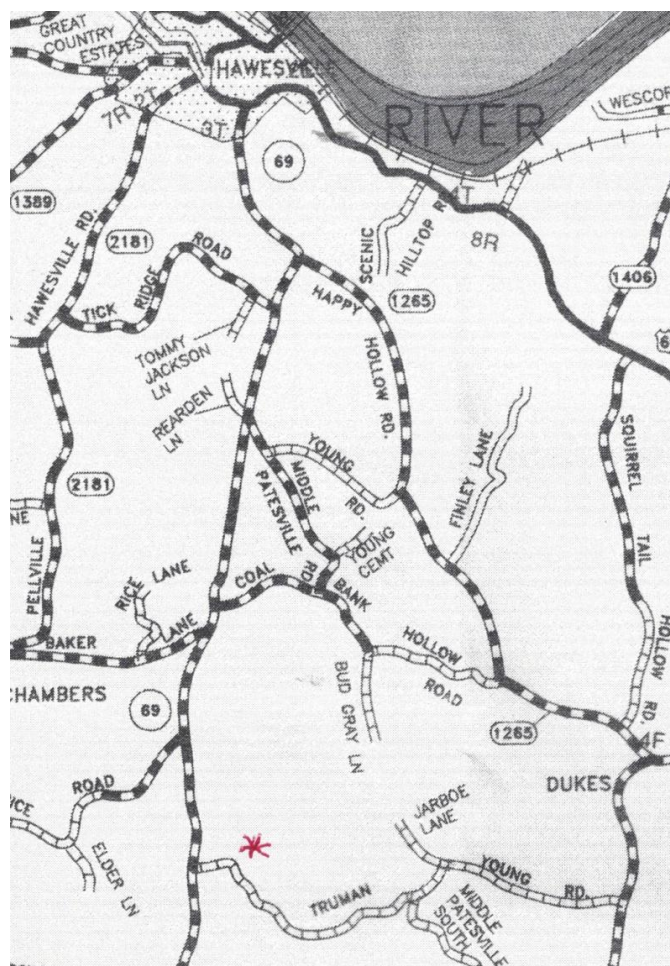


# Young Cemetery

## Hancock County, KY

About five miles south of Hawesville, KY and one mile south of the Mt. Eden Baptist Church turn east off of Highway 69 onto the Truman Young Road. About a city block distance the road turns to the right, instead of making the turn go straight ahead into lane. Lane ends at former home of the late Rev. Ezra D. Meador (1905-1991). Cemetery is on his farm. At house walk east – go about 300 feet, pass barn, go around north end of pond & cemetery can be seen on a ridge under several trees. Counted 55 other graves marked by fieldstones. Cemetery is marked in red on map below. Inscriptions in the cemetery were copied by Jerry Long on 10 March 1980 & rechecked on 29 October 1986. Information in parenthesis was on the monument. Additional biographical information was added in brackets below each entry. Additions of documented burials in unmarked graves were added in a separate list. Each of the unmarked burials are followed by a source that proves place of burial.

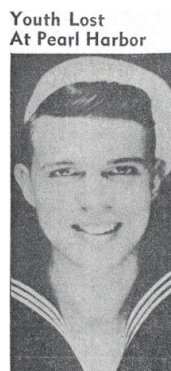
Hancock Clarion, Hawesville, KY, Saturday, 8 December 1900:

Davis Young, of the Flo-

Young is in a pitiable condition,  
brought about, it is believed, by

died and later his house and con-  
tents burned. He has brooded  
over his losses until his mind is

no way violent. He leaves three  
little children behind, as well as a  
small farm encumbered with debt.

 Mr. J. R. Remington went to Hopkinsville Saturday, returning Sunday afternoon with John D. Young, whose critical condition we mentioned last week. He was taken to his home in the county, where he passed away at an early hour Monday morning. The remains were buried at the Young cemetery Tuesday. Mr. Young was fifty years of age and leaves three sons. His wife died many years ago. He had been in the Hopkinsville asylum about 10 years.—Hawesville Clarion.

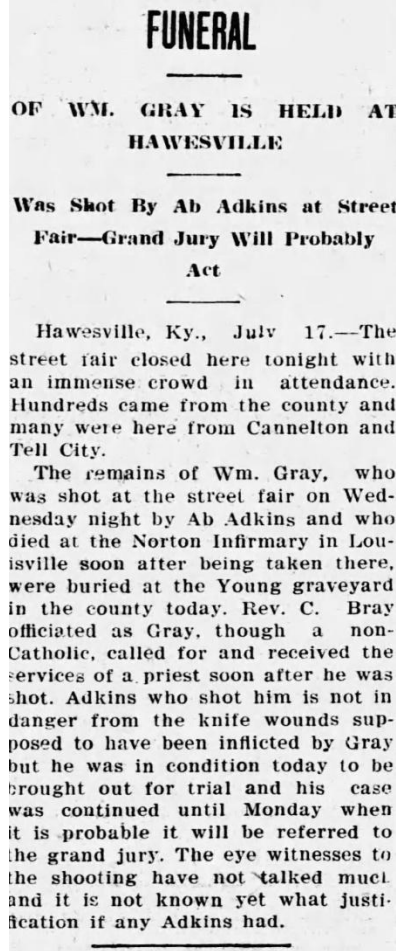

**. DAVID M. YOUNG DIES**

David M. Young died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Jesse McFarling on Washington street, at 2:30 o'clock, Wednesday morning, August 3, 1932.

Mr. Young was born in Hancock Co., Ky., October 13, 1855. He came to this city nine years ago, and has been in failing health for several years.

Surviving him are five sons and five daughters: Retus Young, of Hawesville, Ky.; Marcus, James, Herman and Ron Young, of this city; Mrs. Laura Latimer, Winslow, Ind.; Mrs. Dora Riley, of Midway, Ky.; Mrs. Lula Nichols, Mrs. Rena McFarling, and Miss Grace Young, of this city. He is also survived by two sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Philback, of Hatfield, Ky., and Mrs. Jane Young, of Hawesville, and a brother, Michael, also of Hawesville, and 32 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren.

His wife, who was Martha Ellen Sinclair, preceded him in death twelve years ago, on August 20, 1920.

The funeral services will be held this morning at 10 o'clock at the residence with continued services at the grave, Rev. A. R. Proctor, of the Baptist church, officiating. Interment will be made at the Young cemetery in Hancock county, Ky.

Accompanied by Jim Gray, Young was "riding the blinds" when he mistook Gray's advice to stay on for an advice to jump off. His father and brother were at his bedside when the end came.

**MR. PETER R. YOUNG**

Mr. Peter R. Young, better known as Stoge Young, age 79 years died at his home near the Hennen school house, March 14, of complications due to advanced age. During the early part of the winter he suffered a severe attack of the flu followed by pneumonia, at that time little hope was held out for his life, but backed by a strong constitution he stemmed the tide and was up and about until a few hours before the end came. Mr. Young was born and reared on the farm where he died. He was scrupulously honest and probably as industrious a man as could be found in the county. For several years he has suffered with his feet. Each year he raised a little patch of tobacco and during the past summer he worked his little patch of tobacco by crawling on his knees. About a year ago he lost his home and contents by fire and since that time he and his wife have been living in a cabin on their farm and working out a living the best they could. He was a member of the Baptist Church since early boyhood.

Besides his wife he is survived by two daughters and two sons. Mesdames Obe Corley of Midway, and Annie Pleasant of Hennen, Messrs. Hubert Young, who is a teacher at the Indian Hill school in this county, and Owen Young of Tell City.

Funeral services were conducted on Friday with interment in the Young Burying ground, near the home.
