

Hale – Isom Cemetery

On a wooded hill between the Truman Young and Goering Roads about one-fourth of a mile east of Highway 69. The inscriptions on the monuments in the cemetery were copied by Jerry Long on 3 April 1984 and rechecked on 24 October 1986. Twelve inscribed monuments and signs of about twelve other graves marked by fieldstones were found.

I started researching my family in 1979. After checking for my families (Young, Hale, Bruner, Snider and Pate) in all published listings of Hancock County cemeteries I on 3 April 1984 decided to go in search of any other uncharted cemeteries in the vicinity of where my ancestral families had resided. On the Truman Young Road I saw a gentleman in his front yard. It was Herman Veach (1933-2008). I stopped and asked if he knew of any cemeteries in the neighborhood. He pointed out several I already knew about but he told me of a cemetery on the hill directly south of his farm between the Truman Young Road & Goering Road. It was on the other side of Blackford Creek. To cross the creek Mr. Veach lent me a pair of boots. I crossed an open field and crossed the creek and went up a ridge and on top in the edge of woods I located the cemetery. To my surprise I shortly located the graves of my fourth great-grandparents, William Hale (Sr.) & Catharine Snider. All of those that had markers on their graves were related to me.

The Hale family resided in Virginia in very early colonial times. Thomas Hale was born about 1755. He married Agnes Price in 1780 in Montgomery County, Virginia (A Brief of Wills and Marriages in Montgomery and Fincastle Counties, Virginia, 1773-1831, Anne Lowry Worrell, 1959). Thomas served in the Montgomery County militia. He is listed in the DAR Patriot Index due to his documented service during the Revolutionary War. In the 1782 & 1790 Montgomery County tax lists Thomas Hale appears. He owned land on Tom's Creek which adjoined the land of Michael Price. In several records (deeds, court orders, militia records) Thomas appears with members of the Price & Lucas families.

Thomas Hale's will was probated in Montgomery County, VA in July 1802:

“Thomas Hale in his last sickness at the house of John Bowen in Craig’s Creek being taken sick from home and having never returned to his own habitation made the following deposition of his property & called on William Compton & Hezekiah Adkins to bear testimony that such was his will that he willed every thing to his wife, that his three little sons were to have the land; and that his wife was to do Justice to all the children and declared this should be his will.” The above nuncupative will was made and declared in presence of Hezekiah Adkins, William Compton at Montgomery July Court 1802. The nuncupative will of Thomas Hale deceased was exhibited in court and proven by the oaths of William Compton and Hezekiah Adkins and thereupon ordered to be recorded. And on motion of Agnes Hale, Edward Hale & Jacob Price, who made oaths entered into and acknowledged bond according to law administration of his estate with the said will annexed is granted them. Thomas Hale died on 9 May 1802 at the home of John Bowen while on a trip to what is now Craig County, VA, where he was buried in the Bowen Cemetery.

Thomas Hale (c1755-1802), of Montgomery County, VA, in family trees is frequently confused with Captain Thomas Hale (1742-1812), who died in Franklin County, VA, was married to Jane Armstrong and who is the subject of the book, Roots in Virginia: An account of Captain Thomas Hale, Virginia frontiersman, his descendants and related families, by Nathaniel Claiborne Hale (Philadelphia, PA, 1948).

Thomas Hale’s wife, Agnes, was the daughter of Michael Price (Preisich) and Margaret Killian; she was born about 1760. Agnes Hale is listed as a household head in the 1810, 1820 & 1830 censuses of Montgomery County, VA. In the 1810 census she was living near members of the Price family. In the 1840 census of Montgomery County, VA her sons, Jacob & Job Hale are listed. In the household of Jacob Hale in 1840 was listed a female aged 80-90. She died in 1841 in Montgomery County, VA; her will was probated there on 6 September 1841. In her will she named children – William Hale, Jacob Hale, Job Hale, Elizabeth Lucas, Hannah Lucas, Mary Lucas, Margaret All and Nancy Bowles. She stated William was her oldest son.

The children of Thomas Hale and Agnes Price were:

1. Hannah Hale, born c1784 VA; died 29 January 1860 Giles County, VA; married Thomas Lucas, 28 March 1801 Montgomery County, VA.
2. Elizabeth Hale, born c1786 VA; died 1850-1860 Giles County, VA; married Edward Lucas, 7 November 1801 Montgomery County, VA.
3. William Hale, born 3 May 1787 Montgomery County, VA; died 24 August 1863 Hancock County, KY; buried Hale – Isom Cemetery, Hancock County, KY; married Catharine Snider, 18 March 1811 Montgomery County, VA.
4. Mary Hale, ‘Polly’, born c1790 VA; died after 1835; married her first cousin David Lucas, 7 November 1809 Montgomery County, VA.
5. Jacob Hale, born 20 August c1791 VA; he is listed in the 1810, 1820, 1830 & 1840 censuses of Montgomery County, VA, the 1830 census reported he was between 30-40, his gravestone gives a birth date of 20 August 1791; died 7 September 1849 Montgomery County, VA, the 1850 Montgomery County federal census mortality schedule reported that he died of consumption at the age of 64; buried Hale Cemetery, Montgomery County, VA; married Eva Smith, c1809, and Elizabeth Hilton, 16 May 1844.

6. Margaret Hale, born c1794 VA; died 15 September 1872; buried All Cemetery, Catawba, Roanoke County, VA; married Robert All/ Aul, 10 April 1812 Montgomery County, VA.
7. Nancy Hale, born c1795 VA; died c1846 Montgomery County, VA; married Peter Bowles, 29 September 1826 Montgomery County, VA.
8. Job Hale, born 5 September 1796 Montgomery County, VA; during 1843-1844 he moved to Hancock County, KY, where his brother, William, was living; died after 1865; married Frances Love, 'Fanny', 28 August 1824 Montgomery County, VA; children – John F., Agnes Maria (married Shadrack A. Nichols & Charles Davidson), Mary Ann (married William A. M. Wine), Hester V. (married Horace Young), Eliza Ellen (married Martin Young) & Malinda.

William Hale, son of Thomas Hale and Agnes Price, was born 3 May 1787 Montgomery County, Virginia. His mother in her will wrote "I give and bequeath to my oldest son, William Hale, the sum of fifty dollars." William transferred to his mother the one-third interest in his father's land that he was granted by his father's will. In the 1810 Montgomery County, VA census William Hale's father-in-law, John Snider, Sr., and brother-in-law, Ephraim Lyons, are listed next to each other and twelve households from William's mother, Agnes Hale. In the home of Agnes in 1810 was a male aged 16-26 the age range of William Hale.

William served in the War of 1812. In a biography of William & Catharine's son, Isaac Hale, published in the book, Portrait & Biographical Album of Morgan and Scott Counties, Illinois (Chicago: Chapman Bros., Publishers, 1889) it was written – "... He [Isaac] is a native of Hancock County, Ky., and was born Aug. 24, 1823. The parents of our subject were William and Catherine (Snyder) Hale, who were probably born and reared in Virginia, and removed thence to Kentucky at an early day. The father served as a soldier in the War of 1812, and, after the conflict had ended, turned his attention to agricultural pursuits..." William is possibly the William Hale that served in the Virginia militia in the companies of J. M. Holland & P. M. Goggins (Index To War of 1812 Pension Files, Volume II: G-M, Virgil D. White, The National Historical Publishing Company, Waynesboro, TN, 1989, p899). William Hale was referred to as "Captain William Hale" in fourteen years of the annual tax books of Hancock County, KY.

In 1811 on March 18 William Hale married Catharine Snider, in Montgomery County, VA. Catharine Snider was born in Frederick County, Maryland on 13 June 1789. She was the

daughter of John Snider (c1755-1830) and Charity Barrick, their names had been anglicized from Johannes Schneider and Gertrude Berg.

Know all men by these presents that we William Hale
and John Snider are hereafter bound
unto George Monroe, ex^t Governor of Virginia for the sum
being since his succession for the use of the Commonwealth
in the just and full sum of One hundred Fifty Dollars
To which payment we and truly to be made we bind
ourselves our heirs Executors and administrators jointly
and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our
seals and dated this 18th day of March 1811

The condition of the above Obligation is such
that whereas the above bound William Hale
— — hath this day obtained a license for
his marriage with Catherine Snider
now if there shall be no lawful cause to obstruct
said marriage then the above Obligation to be
void otherwise to remain in full force and
virtue

About 1819 William Hale and his family moved to Breckinridge County, KY. During the same period several of his relatives including members of the Snider, Lyons, Newton and Obenchains also made the journey from Southwest Virginia. They settled in the Blackford Creek neighborhood in the western part of the county. This area on 3 January 1829 became part of the new county of Hancock County, which was formed out of parts of Breckinridge, Daviess and Ohio Counties. William Hale was enumerated in the 1820 census of Breckinridge County, KY, 1830, 1840, 1850 & 1860 censuses of Hancock County, KY and is listed in the 1820-1828 tax lists of Breckinridge County, KY and in the 1829-1863 tax lists of Hancock County, KY. In the 1850 & 1860 censuses his occupation was given as farmer. In 1860 he was living in the home of his son, John Hale.

William Hale first appeared in the annual tax lists of Breckinridge County, KY in 1820. Soon after arriving he settled on a 458 ½ acre farm on the Sulphur Fork of Blackford Creek. In

the tax records he was shown as paying taxes on the tract in 1821. On 3 July 1824 William Williams executed a deed whereby he sold the tract to William Hale (Breckinridge County Deed Book 6 p33). Sixteen days after William purchased his farm his father-in-law, John Snider, purchased an adjoining tract of 458 ½ acres. William was assessed taxes on his 458 ½ acres until 1856 when he sold 358 acres to his son, John Hale (Hancock County Deed Book 8 p278). William Hale, Sr. on 6 November 1860 sold the remaining 100 acres of his 458 ½ acre tract to his son, Charles Hale (Hancock County Deed Book 10 p484). On 4 October 1859 William Hale, Sr. purchased 48 acres from William D. & Jane Mayhall (Hancock County Deed Book 10 p95); he owned this 48 acres at his death. William Hale's heirs each having 1/11th share in their father's estate sold at various times their interest in this 48 acres. Minor E. Pate, a near neighbor, was appointed administrator of the estate of William Hale, Sr., deceased, on 3 September 1863.

William Hale died at the age of 76 on 24 August 1863. William Hale, his wife and their nine year old daughter, Sally, were buried on his farm. His wife, Catharine Snider Hale preceded him in death at the age of 46 on 23 December 1835. Their daughter Sally, died on 11 February 1839. The cemetery is between what is now the Truman Young Road and the Goering Road and along the east side of the Hartford-Hawesville Road (Highway 69). The farm on which the cemetery is located was later owned by Franklin ('Frank') Isom (1841-1917). Frank Isom was the son of Jesse Isom & Margaret Snider and was a nephew of William & Catharine (Snider) Hale. The death certificate of Frank Isom in 1917 reported that he was buried in the "Isom Cemetery." The home of Frank Isom on the farm is still standing in 1986 a few hundred feet east of the cemetery. Mr. Eugene Anderson who lives near the old house said that after Frank Isom died in 1917 the farm was owned by his son, Jesse H. Isom (1883-1970). Shortly after his death his heirs sold the 80-acre farm to Shelby Allen Jolly (1925-2016), whose wife, Shirley still owns it.

William Hale & Catharine Snider were the parents of:

1. Thomas Hale, born 29 Nov. 1811 VA; he was killed by Confederate nightriders at his home in Hancock County, KY on 4 April 1863; buried Hale – Moorman Cemetery, Hancock County, KY; married Elizabeth Jane Moorman, 14 November 1833 Hancock

County, KY; Elizabeth, daughter of Rev. William Moorman & Mary Burkholder, was born 26 July 1810 Botetourt County, VA and died 13 March 1898 Hancock County, KY, where she was buried with her husband in the Hale – Moorman Cemetery.

Grandma Hale, a highly respected Christian lady, died near here Sunday in her 89th year. She several children, Mrs. Joel Brown, Mrs. W. T. Smith, Mrs. Geo. W. Brown and William Hale, of this place, and Mrs. R. T. Bruner, of Owensboro, besides a host of grandchildred and great-grandchildren. She was the widow of Thomas Hale, who was killed by rebel soldiere at his home here during the war. Her remains were laid to rest in the family burying ground Monday in the presence of a very large assembly of people. Rev. R. T. Bruner, Miss Cordie Bruner, Charles Bruner and Ed Bruner and family, of Owensboro, were here to attend the funeral.

Bruner & Hannah Davis, a noted Baptist minister, born 21 March 1837 Hancock County, KY & died 14 February 1909 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, KY; children – Henry Vanmeter (died infancy), Edwin Ernest (married Bettie Viola Miller), Charles David (married Elizabeth Centennial Whilden), Martha Custis (married John William Ford), Clement Joshua (married Georgia A. 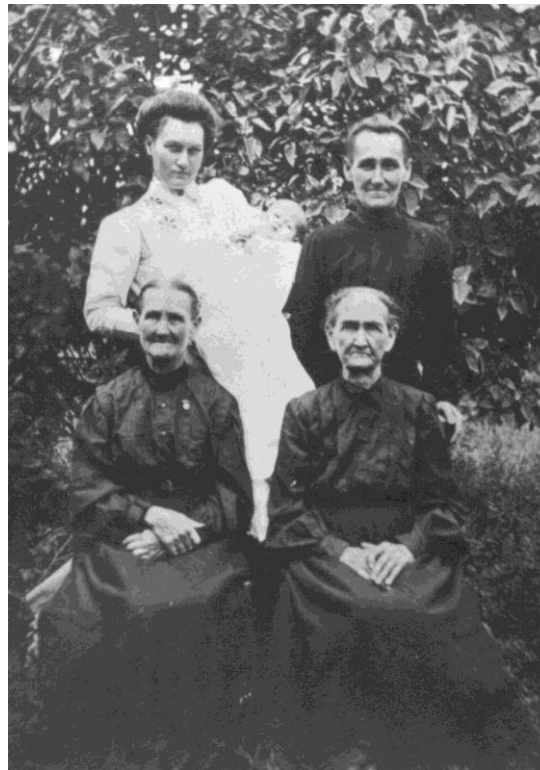

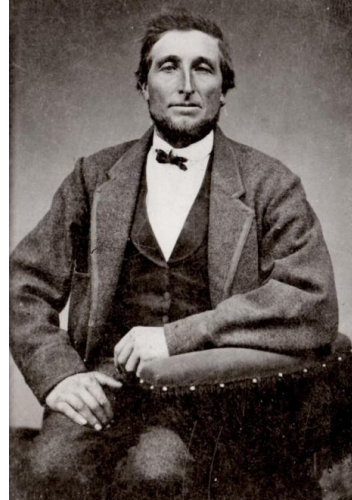

HALE, ISAAC, farmer, Sec. 31, P.O. Meredosia; Dem.; Baptist; born in Hancock County, Ky., Aug. 24, 1823; was there until 1845, farming; came to Cass County, Ill., in 1845; engaged in farming; lived one year in Schuyler County - in 1846; in 1847, he returned to Cass County, staying there until the Spring of 1859; then went to Saline County, Mo.; stayed there until Oct., 1861, when he settled in Morgan County, and has lived here ever since; enlisted March, 1865, in Co. K, 28th Regt. Ill. Inf.; was ordered to Cairo, and went down the Mississippi River to Mobile, Ala., thence to the border of Mexico, as a troop of observers on the Rio Grande; they started by gulf steamer from Mobile, July 2, 1865, going across the Gulf of Mexico; Christmas day he started, having obtained permission to return home, going down the Rio Grande; married January 9, 1845, to Lurissa Jane Lake, in Hancock County, Ky.; she was born Nov. 21, 1821, in Perry County, Indiana; is a member of the M.E. Church; they have seven children living: Minor P., born July 28, 1846, married Fannie Kessler; Mary C. born Sept. 7, 1849, married Dec. 23, 1872 to C. W. Hyde; Martha J., born June 10, 1853, married Aug. 6, 1873, to Milton Sibert; William J., born

Sept. 12, 1855; Israel L., born Oct. 7, 1857; Charles T., born Dec. 13, 1859; Harriet Ann, born Sept. 16, 1862; David H., born Oct. 14, 1851, died July 6, 1852; holds the office of school director.

Portrait & Biographical Album of Moran and Scott Counties, Illinois
(Chicago: Chapman Bros., Publishers, 1889, pp227-228):

ISAAC HALE. The snug farm of 120 acres belonging to this gentleman is pleasantly located on section 31, township 16, range 12, and comprises land which he cleared from the wilderness mostly with his own hands, building up a comfortable homestead. He has, in common with the men around him, labored early and late, and is recognized as possessing all the qualities of a useful and worthy member of his community. He is a native of Hancock County, Ky., and was born Aug. 24, 1823.

The parents of our subject were William and Catherine (Snyder) Hale, who were probably born and reared in Virginia, and removed thence to Kentucky at an early day. The father served as a soldier in the War of 1812, and, after the conflict had ended, turned his attention to agricultural pursuits. Isaac remained in Kentucky until the fall of 1845, then emigrated to this State and settled in what is now known as Cass County, where he lived until the spring of 1859. Then, crossing the Mississippi, he established himself in Saline County, Mo., where he sojourned about two and one-half years, and then, in the fall of 1861, made his way to Central Illinois and settled upon a part of the land which he now owns and occupies.

The first purchase of Mr. Hale in this county was eight acres, mostly covered with timber, which he cleared and brought to a state of cultivation. His labors, however, were interrupted by the outbreak of the Civil War, and, after watching the conflict, he finally enlisted, March 18, 1865, in Company K, 28th Illinois Infantry, and was ordered with his regiment to Mobile. In July following he was among those who crossed the Gulf of Mexico with the view of enforcing the Monroe Doctrine. The war had now closed, and he soon after returned to this county, since which time he has given his close attention to his farming interests.

Mr. Hale was married in Kentucky, Jan. 9, 1845, to Miss Lurissa J. Lake, who was born in Perry, Ind., but was reared in Kentucky. She was the daughter of Jesse and Mary Lake. This union resulted in the birth of eight children, seven of whom are living: Minor P. is a resident of Kansas; Mary C. is the wife of C. W. Hyde, of Meredosia precinct; Martha J. became the wife of Milton Sibert, of Jacksonville; William J. is a resident of Meredosia; Israel L. resides on the homestead; Charles T. makes his home at Meredosia; Harriet H. is the wife of David Buruss, of Meredosia; and David H. died when nine months old.

A man essentially the architect of his own fortune, Mr. Hale has labored under many disadvantages, but was endowed by nature with the qualities of industry and perseverance, which have placed him in a good position among his fellow men. His education, which was quite limited, was conducted in the primitive log school-house of Kentucky on the subscription plan. The temple of learning in its furnishings was widely different from the buildings of the present day, the floor being made of puncheon and the seats and desks of slabs with home-made wooden legs. Light was admitted through greased paper, which was stretched along the aperture formed by sawing out a log on one side of the building, and a huge fireplace occupied nearly one end of the structure; the chimney was built outside of earth and sticks.

The Western country at that time was less developed than the Blue Grass regions, and Mr. Hale has been the interested witness of the extraordinary changes taking place around him. He is now serving as a School Trustee in a district of well-educated and civilized people, whose children con their lessons in a shapely and well-furnished building from an abundance of books. In Mr. Hale's boyhood one book usually went through the family, and was used until worn out. He is a Democrat, politically, and in favor of all enterprises set on foot for the general good of the people. The duties of life began with him at the early age of five years, when he was set to work in the tobacco fields for his father, and from that time on knew little rest or recreation.

While with the army in Mexico Mr. hale was principally on picket duty, and was elected Corporal. The experience was a useful one, full of interest, and upon which he looks back with the feeling that it afforded him opportunities for observation of men and a section of country, and which, from actual experience, he can retain in his memory better than if he had read it from books.

Isaac Hale is listed in the Saline County, MO 1860 census and 1870, 1880 & 1900 censuses of Morgan County, IL. On 12 April 1869 Isaac Hale, of Morgan County, IL appointed his brother, Charles Hale, to act as his lawful attorney to collect & receive all monies due him from the estate of their father, William Hale, Sr., deceased (Hancock County Deed Book 17 p45).

In our last week's issue we announced the death of David Hale, of Dry Creek, which occurred on the preceding Saturday, March 29th. We had no information then that other members of the family were sick, but up to Friday last, within seven days, three more members of the family—Mrs. Hale, one son and a daughter—had gone to their long rest. The son was grown; the daughter, Miss Amanda, was a bright young lady, who had been teaching school for the past three Winters. Such a visitation is not only unusual, but is unprecedented in the history of this county. The surviving members of this terribly stricken family have the sincerest sympathy of all. We understand that the fatal disease was pronounced to be pneumonia.

In a letter from Kermit U. Hale ((1904-1971), of Boise, ID, to Reuben I. Glover, of Hawesville, KY, dated 12 May 1969, he wrote the following about a 1932 visit of his father, Joseph M. Hale (1871-1942) to Hancock County, KY: Mr Salm at the time of this writing was postmaster at Hawesville. He received a letter from a Joseph Hale of St. Louis Mo. The writer said that he was the son of David Hale who was born in Hawesville Kentucky and raised there. He left for California to the Gold fields in 1849. Later he returned to St. Louis and settled down. His father had been dead a long time, he had often heard him speak of his brothers and two sisters. He had referred to his brothers as Thomas, Charles Tom and Issac. The postmaster Mr Salm handed the letter to Mrs H.S. Kincaid who knew was related to the Hale family Mrs Kincaid remembered her father speaking of David Hale and of him leaving there many years ago. She answered his letter and asked him to visit them. The results were a few days later a man alighted from the train, and inquired as to the home of Thomas D Hale, and Judge Kincaid that he was the son of David Hale and a first cousin to Mrs Kincaid, Mrs H.L Brown and Mrs Ernest Ford, [ed. note – he was actually a first cousin once removed to them] and many others in the county. With Judge Kincaid they drove to Pellville hunting up relations he had never seen. He visited his grandfathers place

which is owned by a Mr Anderson, also the home of Thomas Hale farmm where he was Killed during the civil war by a party of men trying to steal his horses, at the house he saw the holes in the door that was punctured with bullets by the men when they fired the fusilage of shot at the owner of the house and left him dead. Mr Hale then left to visit the Mr Charles Nicobolas who was a first cousin and who be had never met. My father dictated this letter to my cousin, Vallie Cain who at that writing lived at Elvins Mo; this was in 1932

Walker, G. C. Pierce & Charles C. Roberts), Vallee Irene (married Dr. Amon M. Cain), child (died infancy), Lola (married Charles Dewitt Lemon) & Harold Hearst (married Margaret Kelly).

Hancock Clarion, Hawesville, KY, Thursday, 2 October 1952:
 “Pellville – Dr. and Mrs. A. M. Cain, of Elvins, Mo., were here a few days since looking for the house where her great uncle, Mr. Thomas Hale lived when shot by soldiers during the Civil War. The house has long since been torn away and only a pile of rocks and some silver poplar trees remain to mark the place. Mr. T. H. Brown, a grandson of Mr. Thomas Hale still has the door with the bullet hoe through it which Dr. and Mrs. Cain saw. Her grandfather was David Hale, a brother to Thomas Hale, but went to the Klondyke years while a young man but did not return to Kentucky. He settled in the west. Son, Ernest V. Hale, was the father of Mrs. Cain who is so eager to trace her relatives. Dr. and Mrs. Cain went from here to Hawesville to see Mr. Tom Hale who is also

a grandson of Mr. Thomas Hale.” [Note: Vallee Irene Hale Cain (1907-1991) was the daughter of Ernest Uriah Hale (1882-1972) and granddaughter of David Hale (1825-1890).]

Catharine Hale, born 27 March 1827 Breckinridge County, KY; died 8 March 1904 Hancock County, KY; married Joseph Nichols, 24 December 1846 Hancock County, KY; Joseph, son of Shadrack Nichols & Susanna Bruner, born 8 September 1827 Breckinridge County, KY (in part of county that became Hancock County in 1829); Joseph & Catharine are listed together in the 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880 and 1900 censuses of Hancock County, KY; they lived two miles northeast of the Mt. Eden Baptist Church; he was a farmer and owned his own farm; Joseph died 9 September 1901 Hancock County, KY and Catharine died 8 March 1904 Hancock County, KY; they were buried in the Nichols Cemetery on their farm, Middle Patesville Road, Hancock County, KY; in the 1900 census it is recorded that fifteen children had been born to them, three of whom were then deceased, also listed in their home in the 1900 census was an adopted son, George Wise (born 1885).
