

Rice Cemetery

Hancock County, KY

About four miles south of Hawesville, KY turn east off of Highway 69 onto the Coal Bank Hollow Road. Turn at first lane on right (south), at forks in lane turn left, leads to former home of Kenneth Chester Rice (1909-1996). Cemetery is on Mr. Rice's farm about 100 feet southeast of his barn, in edge of woods along a new cut road. Mr. Rice's grandparents, Jesse L. Rice (1845-1922) & Mary Jane Freels and great-grandparent's, Jesse Rice (1810-1898) & Charity Hale are buried in the cemetery. Mr. Rice's home is on the site of the former home of his great-grandparent's, Jesse & Charity (Hale) Rice.

DEATH IN FLAMES.

Horrible Accident to a Child in Hancock County.

A very sad accident happened to the little four-year-old girl of Forest Rice, while playing in the house around the fire. The little one's clothes caught from the blaze and the mother, who was absent from the room at the time, hearing the screams of the little child hastened to its assistance, but was too late to save the unfortunate little child from a burn that resulted in its death last Saturday night. The remains were interred on last Sunday evening in the Rice burying ground near Mt. Eden. Mr Rice lives in the Mt. Eden neighborhood and is a very prominent and highly respected young farmer.—Hancock Clarion.

Hawesville, Ky., Feb. 6.—Mr. Davis Bruner, one of the most highly respected farmers and citizens of the county died very suddenly at his home near this city on Sunday afternoon. He died just like his father, one sister and two brothers had died before him. Another brother, the late Charles Bruner, was burned to death quite mysteriously in a forest fire here four years ago. Another brother was the late Rev. Robt. T. Bruner, Baptist minister of Owensboro, who also died suddenly one year ago. The deceased was one of the most zealous Democrats of the county and he was also a pillar of the Blackford Baptist church for the past fifty years. He has many relatives in Owensboro and all over western Kentucky. His wife and the following children who reside in this county survive him: Charles Bruner and Eldred Bruner, and Mrs. Forrest Rice and Mrs. Walter Flake and Mrs. Kirt Thomas of Olaton, in Ohio county and Ab Bruner, of Tell City and Jesse Bruner, of Oklahoma.

Mr. Walter Flake, aged 66, passed away after a short illness Wednesday morning, Jan. 10, at 2 a.m. Mr. Flake became ill about ten days ago and developed pneumonia which proved fatal.

He was born in Hancock county on May 22, 1873, near the Dukes community and lived all of his life in this county. He was the son of Charles and Elizabeth Flake. He was united in marriage to Miss Emma Bruner in 1899 and she preceded him in death in 1925. He is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Roy Parker of the Duncan community, Mrs. Howard Rapp and Mrs. Herbert Noble, both of this city. Also surviving him are three sisters and three brothers, namely: Mrs. Jerry Egan, Mrs. James Weatherholt, both of this county, Mrs. Howard Pleasant, of Indiana, Lud. John, and Clarence Flake, all of this county. Also seven grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted from the Goering Funeral Home at 1 p.m. Thursday by the Rev. Edwin E. Deusner, pastor of the Hawesville Baptist Church. Interment was in the Rice cemetery near Mt. Eden.

MRS. FRIELS DEAD.

She Was the Oldest Woman in Western Kentucky.

Mrs. Sarah Friels, reputed to be one of the oldest women in the state, died at her home, five miles south of Hawesville, on Thursday. Claims as to her age vary from 105 to 107, but all who know the facts admit that she must have been several years past the century mark.

It has been only a few days since the Messenger published an item about Mrs. Friels, stating her great age, and also the fact that she still retained her faculties remarkably well. She was considered an old woman forty years ago when she removed to Hancock county from Tennessee, where she was born. She was buried in the Rice burying ground Friday.

Another Centenarian.
Hancock county has at least one, if not two, centenarians left in the person of Miss Sarah Friel, who lives with a brother, Anderson ("Toad") Friel, in the Mt Eden neighborhood, says the Hancock Clarion. Her exact age is not known, as the family bible and records were burned fifty years ago. Miss Friel says she is 105, while her brother thinks she is but 103. Mr. Friel is himself 79 years of age, and thinks his estimate quite accurate, knowing the age between other children. Miss Friel was born in Tennessee and was never married. She lived for many years in Henderson, Ky., and in Davies county, but for the last fifteen years has lived in Hancock. She is now quite feeble and gets about on crutches, though her appetite is good.

She is survived by five children, William, Forrest and Wave Rice, and Mrs. Henderson Johnson of this county, and Mrs. Tom Slaughter of Breckinridge county.—Hawesville Clarion.

Rice Family of Hancock County, KY

Four brothers were buried and have monuments in the Rice Cemetery – Jesse Rice (1810-1898), James W. Rice (1814-1904), Andrew L. Rice (1820-1904) and Sylvester M. Rice (1822-1876). Two other brothers, Benjamin M. Rice (1800-1991) and John J. Rice (c1806-after 1880) also moved to Hancock County. Benjamin is buried less than a mile away in the Nichols Cemetery. It is not known where John J. Rice is buried. The six brothers were sons of Jesse Rice, Sr. & Marata / Maratta / (there are several reported spellings of her name – I believe this is her surname). Jesse, Sr. was born c1775. He is listed in the 1800 & 1810 censuses of Greene County, Pennsylvania, 1820, 1830 & 1840 censuses of Mason County, Virginia. The area where he resided became Mason County, West Virginia in 1863. He died 1846-1850 Mason County, VA and was buried Rice Cemetery, at Point Pleasant, Mason County, WV. His wife died 1822-1824. He married 2nd Sarah Katherine Gardner, 23 November 1828 Mason County, VA; she was born 16 October 1805 and died after 1850. Sarah is listed in the 1850 census of Mason County, VA; with her are seven children of Jesse & Sarah – George Wolfe (1831-1919, married Leonor Elizabeth Hardwick), Mariah (1833-1919, married John N. D. Spencer), Vincent David (1835-1921, married Jemima C. Lee & Almedia Chatlin), William Thomas (1837-1926, married Ellen O. Lee), Enos (1839-), Harrison (1844-1938, married Mary Jane Hardwick) and Richard (1845-1866). Jesse Rice, Sr. & Marata are reported to have had three daughters – Mary, Catherine & Elizabeth; one of their daughters married a Smith and died in Gallia County, OH in 1832.

The first of the Rice brothers to appear in the records of Hancock County, KY were Jesse & John, who appear in the 1831 tax list of the county. In the 1840 census of Hancock County Jesse & John are listed; in their households were listed two older males who are probably two of the other four brothers that came to the county.

Benjamin M. Rice, son of Jesse Rice, Sr. & Marata, was born 11 December 1800 PA. He is listed in the 1830 & 1840 census of Gallia County, Ohio, 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY. He married Eliza Rogers, 1820-1827. She was born 17 March 1801 PA and died 19 May 1881. Martin V. Rice, son of Benjamin & Eliza, is reported to have been born in Gallia County, Ohio on his 1859 marriage record (in KY 1852-1861 Vital Statistics). Benjamin did not marry Elizabeth Climer in Wilson County, TN in 1819; this is an entirely different couple. The death certificate of Mary Jane Nichols (1827-1911), daughter of Benjamin & Eliza, gives her mother's name as Eliza Rogers.

Benjamin M. Rice died 3 February 1881 Hancock County, KY. He and Eliza were buried Nichols Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. A circuit court suit of his heirs was filed in Hancock County on 18 October 1881 requesting a division of 190 acres owned by Benjamin Rice, deceased (box 89, bundle 181, file #1672). The suit names 8 children – 1. Mary Jane wife of Edmond S. Nichols; 2. Thomas F. Rice; 3. Jesse Rice, deceased (his heirs, widow Sallie, and children, Mary Margaret wife of Henderson Johnson, Jane wife of Robert McCleary, Rosa Rice, William Henry Rice & Benjamin Forrest Rice); 4. John Rice, deceased (his heirs James M. Rice, Laura wife of Francis M. Roach & Louisa wife of Jesse Fraser; 5. B. Wilson Rice; 6. Rachel Balis, deceased (her only heir George W. Balis); and 7. Henry H. Rice.

SUDDEN DEATH.
Of Well-Known Man Near Hawesville
of Heart Disease.
Hawesville, Ky., July 11.—Benjamin Rice, aged 55 years, was found dead on a bridge near here this morning. He was a son of the late Jesse Rice and was well known throughout the county. He never married. He was out riding on horse-back and is supposed to have fallen off as the result of heart disease and died.

Mrs. Mary E. Nichols, relict of the late Ed Nichols who died in November at the advanced age of 81, passed away at her home near town Monday morning. She was nearly 84 years of age, and was afflicted with kidney and bladder trouble. No children were left by this aged couple. Mrs. Nichols was a faithful member of the M. E. church, and the remains were laid to rest in the Nichols graveyard at their home at 10 a. m., Tuesday. Mrs. Nichols was an excellent lady, and during her last illness and death her comforts were carefully looked after by her nephew, Ed Nichols, Jr., and wife, with whom she made her home.

Mrs. Nichols was born in Ohio, and came to Hancock county when a very small girl with her father, Bennie Rice, and had lived in the county for more than sixty years.

Death of This Estimable Gentleman

Monday morning at 11:45 o'clock
Mr. Henry H. Rice died after a linger-
ing illness of grip. Death overcame
him at his home in Audubon. Mr.
Rice was sixty-nine years of age and
was a long-time citizen of Henderson
and vicinity.

Besides his wife Mr. Rice leaves
four children—Mrs. Albert Ngison,
Mrs. Schouley and Messrs. Forest
and Earnest Rice, all of this city.

The burial occurred at 4 p. m.
Monday evening at Fernwood ceme-
tery. Previous to the burial Rev.

John J. Rice, son of Jesse Rice, Sr. & Marata, was born c1806 PA. He married Emaline Moorman, 14 February 1833 Hancock County, KY. The daughter of William Moorman & Mary Burkholder, Emaline was born 10 October 1815 VA. John & Emaline are listed in the 1840, 1850, 1860 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County. It is known when they died. Their children were:

1. Martha A. Rice, born 30 May 1837 Hancock County, KY; married John L. Brown, 17 March 1859 Hancock County, KY and __ Dudgeon, 1880-1900. She died 8 February 1913 Louisville, Jefferson County, KY and was buried Greenwood Cemetery, Tell City, Perry County, IN.

The Rice Cemetery in Hancock County is located on the farm of the late Kenneth Chester Rice (1909-1996); son of Eli David Rice (1869-1944) and grandson of Jesse Lewis Rice (1845-1922). On 12 August 1986 I visited the home of Mr. Rice. Kenneth's home is located on the spot where the home of his great-grandparents, Jesse & Charity Rice, was located; it was torn down during the 1920's. Kenneth gave a large wall picture of Jesse & Charity to his first cousin, Mary Catherine Rice Raible (1915-2015), of Fairdale, KY; daughter of Retus Leslie Rice (1886-1952) & granddaughter of Jesse Lewis Rice (1845-1922). Kenneth Rice had the family bible of Jesse & Charity Rice. The bible had a copyright date of 1857 and it contained three pages of a family record. I transcribed the family record pages as:

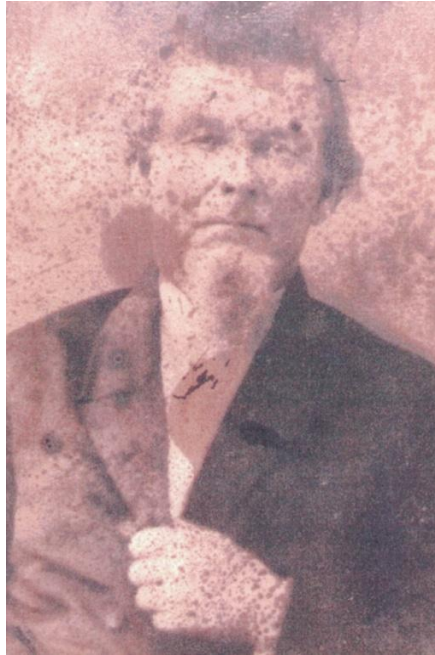

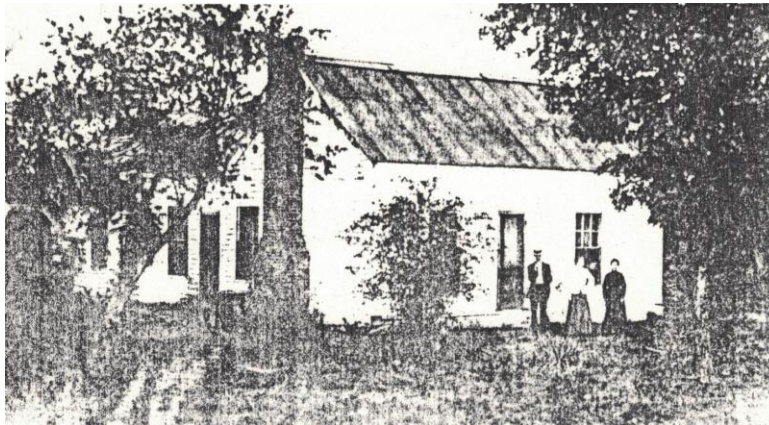

On 7 November 1990 I copied the family bible of Andrew L. & Mariah (Hale) Rice. At that time it was in the possession of Merline (White) Dunleavy (1927-2003), of Owensboro, KY. She was the wife, of Clarence Curtis Dunleavy (1925-1995), who was the son of Clarence Minor Dunleavy (1884-1971), grandson of Samantha Jane Rice Dunleavy (1854-1921), and great-grandson of Andrew L. Rice (1820-1904) & Maria Susan Hale. The bible was published by the American Bible Society of New York in 1856. In the bible there was a family record on five pages. I transcribed the record as follows:

For several months he has been suffering from a growth on his side and has been taking treatment without being relieved. It is thought that by constantly brooding over his infirmity his mind became unbalanced and that he took his life while temporarily insane.

When he was called to breakfast Monday morning he was seemingly in his usual spirits but stated that he did not want any thing to eat, after persuasion by members of the family

he consented to drink a cup of coffee. Immediately after drinking this he became very ill, and Dr. J. A. Kirk of Habit was called in. Upon his arrival he found the man pulseless and realizing the gravity of the case called in Dr. I. J. Hoover of Owensboro. When Dr. Hoover arrived Rice was near death and died shortly before noon.

The deceased is survived by a widow and nine children: Hillary, who lives at Hunter, Ark; Alva, Emory, William, Eugene, Claude, Oliver, Otto, and Amy, an unmarried daughter. .... When one month old his mother died, and he was placed with an aunt, with whom he lived until fifteen years of age. When he was about 8 years old his father moved to Chicago, where he lived until his death in 1879. The father and son only met once afterward, many years ago, before the latter came to Kansas. The former became possessed of an immense fortune, which on his death he willed to charitable institutions, probably not knowing that his son was still alive. At the age of fifteen Mr. Smith went to work on a steamboat on the Ohio river. From the place of a deck hand he worked his way up until he became the first mate of a vessel. During the war of the rebellion he was in the marine service on a gun boat in the Ohio and Mississippi rivers. On December 8, 1852, he was married at Pittsburg, Pa., to Miss Eliza Hill, of Westmoreland county, Pa. In 1864 he came to Kansas and invested his savings in land, purchasing a tract in Liberty township, near where the Netawaka road crosses Straight Creek. This he improved and resided upon until 1881, when he sold it to A. D. Walker. For nearly one year he lived in Holton, about two years in Netawaka, and then purchased land in the immediate vicinity of his old home place, on which he has since resided.... Francis M. Smith Jr., resides at home Mrs. Reuben Wolfley, of Wetmore, sister of Mrs. F. M. Smith, attended the funeral of the latter's husband on last Sunday. Mrs. Smith's other sister, Mrs. Isaiah Travis, who formerly lived in this county, was unable to be present on account of the health of Mr. Travis. They now reside in Louisville, Pottawatomie county.

Francis Marion Smith.

The following extract taken from a Holton, Kansas, paper has to do with a man largely connected in Hancock county and who formerly lived here. He was a resident of Caney Creek until about twenty five years ago, when he moved to Kansas. He was a nephew of uncle Andy Rice, at present an honored citizen of Hancock county, and was a cousin of Ben M. Rice's, as well as all of the numerous Rice family living here.

"The death of Francis Marion Smith at his home, five miles north of Holton, Friday morning, May 3rd, 1901, removes from the community a kind husband, an indulgent father and a generous friend. His death from apoplexy was almost instantaneous. He was born in Gallio county, Ohio, Feb. 14, 1832, being at the time of his death 69 years, 2 months and 19 days old.

His early life was largely spent on the river navigation of the middle west. In this line he attained the position of first mate. In 1864 he came to Jackson county, Kansas, locating on section 10 of Liberty township where he made his home till his death, with the exception of a year in Holton and two years in Netawaka.

During the civil war he was in the marine service of the U. S. Dec. 8, 1852 he was married to Miss Eliza Hill of Westmoreland county, Pa. Three children, Mrs. Lenora Hatch, Mrs. Charity Trundel and F. M. Smith Jr. came to bless their union all of whom survive him.

The funeral service was held at the house Sunday afternoon May 5th conducted by Chaplain Schleiman of the Baptist church. Mr. Smith had been a member of this church in early life. Very appropriate music was furnished by the Holton male quartette. The sympathy of friends and neighbors goes out to the bereaved."

??? The name of the first wife Jesse Rice, Sr. (c1775-c1846) is spelled numerous ways by researchers – Marata, Maratta, Marita, Maritta, Merietta, Maritti, Moratty, Marotta, Marota, and others. The majority have interpreted this to be her first name, however, it is more likely that it was her surname (last name). In family bibles of their parents the names of two of Jesse Rice, Sr.'s grandsons were spelled as Benjamin Maratta Rice (1848-1906, son of Jesse, Jr.) and Isaac Moratty Rice (1848-1904, son of Andrew). At the time it was a common practice to use a mother or grandmother's surname as a middle name in naming children. Also when Jesse Rice, Sr. was a resident of Pennsylvania there were families named Maratta or Marata living there.
