
Young Family of Hancock County, KY

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Martin Young was born during 1750-1760 in North Carolina. In the 1880 census of Hancock County, KY his son, Martin, Jr., reported that his parents were born in North Carolina. Martin, Sr. was the son of John & Ann Jung. His father, John George Jung, a native of Germany, arrived in America on the ship Neptune. The ship had sailed from the port city of Rotterdam with people from the Rhineland area of Germany. The ship landed in Philadelphia, PA on 5 October 1752. It is believed that John is the same "Johann Georg Jung" who is listed in the book, <u>New World Immigrants: A consolidation of Ship Passenger Lists and Associated Data from Periodical Literature</u> (Volume II, Michael Tepper, editor, Baltimore, MD, Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1979, p42); in a list of Pennsylvania Dutch Pioneers compiled by Dr. Friedrich Krebs from the collections of the State Archives at Goblenz. According to this source Johann George was the son of Hermann Jung of Elschbach and his wife, Anna Margaretha; and he was living in the New Land by 1754. Also on the ship Neptune, was Michael Goodnight, who was later associated and interrelated to John Jung's family in North Carolina and Kentucky.

John Jung purchased land in 1764 in Mecklenburg County, NC (which in 1792 became part of Cabarrus County, NC). A great deal of information on the Young (Jung) family in North Carolina is outlined in the book, <u>Descendants of Jacob Young of Shelby County, Kentucky, including President Harry S. Truman</u>, by Elsie Spry Davis (1923-2013) of Coronado, CA (1980, pp1-15).



Martin, Jacob, John & Michael Young on 2 August 1791 sold 100 acres on Three Mile Branch in Mecklenburg County, NC to Andrew Young. The five Youngs named in the deed were sons of John Young, who had purchased the same land on 7 August 1787. In Mecklenburg County in January 1790 John Young's widow, Ann, was appointed administratrix of his estate.

Seven children of John & Ann Young (Jung) are documented. They are – Martin, Andrew, Jacob, John, Michael, Mary and Elizabeth.

- 1. Martin Young, son of John & Ann, born 1750-1760. Family record follows on page 11.
- 2. Andrew Young, son of John & Ann, born c1759 Mecklenburg County, NC. About 1789 he married Julianna Bowers. Andrew and his wife, Julianna, on 8 September 1795 sold their land on Three Mile Branch in Cabarrus County, NC to James Scott (Cabarrus County, NC deed book 5 p235). During 1795-1796 they moved to Washington County, KY. He had served in the American Revolution. In Washington County, KY on 26 August 1833 he applied for a pension for his service. The following abstract of his application was published in the book, <u>Pioneer History of Washington County, KY</u> (by Orval W. Bayley, Utica, KY, McDowell Publications, 1980, p294):

Yong or Young, Andrew S. #30,812 N. C. - Washington Co., KY 8-26-1833, age 73, states that he enlisted March 1781 as a private in a troop of Horse, commanded by Capt. Peter Burns in the county of Mecklenberg N.C. thence he marched to the south in Gen. Sumpters Brigade, Col. Hampton's regiment and Major Rutherford's Battalion. He was age 18 when he enlisted and he was in several battles including Eutaw Springs, S.C. He moved from the state of N.C. to Ky. in the year of 1798 where he has ever since been. Affidavit that John Condar, clergyman and Thomas Graves and John Paducks certify that they are acquainted with said Andrew Young.

Recorded in Washington County order book D, p280 Andrew Young testified to the truth of the statements he had made in his application and swore to the statement that he was soldier of the Revolution and served as he had stated on his declaration to the war department. He is listed in the 1810, 1820, 1830 & 1840 censuses of Washington County, KY (the latter census lists him as being a Revolutionary War pensioner). He lived along the Long Run Creek (and road) in the eastern part of the county near the Mercer County line. A great-grandson, Marcus D. Lafayette Cocanougher (1855-1932) wrote in his journal (p28):

"The next house as you go up Long or Louse Run Andrew Young's Ma's grandfather, he settled there in Dec. 1801, he bought 240 acres from James Wood and Kingkaid of Garrard Co., Ky, for which he gave 50 lbs or 85 c per acres. Andrew is now 52 year old he died in 1848 July. Ann his wife died in 46, she was a Miss Bowers, they came from Rowan County, N.C. in 1793. This house stood in John Cocanoughers field south of the graveyard on a point below the widow Lizzie Best."

The land purchase Mr. Cocanougher alluded to was recorded on 17 December 1801 in Washington County, KY deed book B, p508. Andrew Young died in Washington County, KY in 1848; his wife, Julianna had died in 1846. In Washington County will book H, pp268-270 are recorded an inventory - appraisement of his estate (recorded 15 May 1848) and a sale bill of the estate of Andrew Young, deceased (recorded 26 May 1848). In the basement of the Washington County Courthouse are file cabinets that contain the papers of the original Circuit Court suits of the county. In these is found a packet of the suit of the "Heirs of Andrew Young versus Margaret Stumpf", filed on 6 November 1849. The children and several grandchildren of Andrew Young are named in the suit; the heirs were seeking a sale of Andrew's 240 acres and division of its proceeds. It is stated that the plaintiffs were heirs of Andrew Young who had departed this life in April 1847. Andrew Young (Jr.) was appointed administrator of his father's estate on 7 May 1847. It is not clear if the death year was 1847 or 1848. Generally an inventory or sale bill follow a death within a few weeks not a whole year. Andrew's death probably was in 1848. Marcus D. L. Cocanougher in his journal gives the year as 1848. The majority of family trees on Ancestry.com give a death date of 15 May 1848, the date of the appraisement of his estate – his death was most certainly prior to this date. Andrew and his wife were buried in the Andrew Young Cemetery. The cemetery is located on the farm of W. B. Carpenter along a lane off the west side of the Long Run Road about two miles north of Highway 150. Andrew's name was carved into the sandstone marker but no dates are legible. Mr. Carpenter when I visited the site on 19 August 1986 had taken the stone from the gravesite and placed it in his nearby barn a short distance from the cemetery.

- Adam (12 March 1791 1868), twin; married Leander Hilton, 4 December 1817 Washington County, KY; children –Susannah, Margaret, Mariah, Julia Ann, Louisa & Sarah Elizabeth.
- **Rachel** (c1792 after 1851); married Peter Martin, 2 March 1813 Washington County, KY & William B. Prather, 31 October 1847 Washington County, KY; children by Peter Martin Nancy, Julianna, Sarah & others.
- Elizabeth (10 August 1794 after 1850); married Solomon Hayner, 8 August 1816 Washington County, KY; children Lucinda, Henry, John, Catherine, Nancy & James.
- Jacob (c1798 between 1831-1835); married Sarah Davis, 1 January 1824 Washington County, KY; children – Susan, Andrew Jackson, Elizabeth & Nancy Ann.
- Margaret (c1800 between 1827-1830); married Henry G. Stumpff, 26 February 1824 Washington County, KY; children Julia Ann & Mary Jane.
- Jonathan (c1803 February 1882); married Belinda Hilton, 27 November 1823 Washington County, KY & Mary Hatchett, 18 April 1834 Washington County, KY; children – Lydia Ann, Alfred, Elizabeth A., Andrew Berry, Susan Frances & adopted daughter, Harriet Williams.
- Mary (c1802 between 1847-1849); married David Wiser, 12 April 1821 Casey County, KY; children Julia Ann, Mary Ann, Phillip G., Elizabeth Ann, Nancy Jane, Ellen, Martha Ann, Hector & Amanda C.

- Andrew (c1811 after 1860; married Catherine Best, 18 March 1834 Washington County, KY; children Samuel, John, Julia Ann, Martha J., Ellen, Simon, Mary Frances & Adam.
- 3. Jacob Young, son of John & Ann, born 1764-1765. In his Revolutionary War pension application filed in Shelby County, KY in 1832 he stated he was born in Mecklenburg County, NC and is about 68 years old. He served in Captain Burns' company with his older brother, Andrew Young. By 1790 he had removed to Kentucky. In Mercer County, KY he married Rachel Goodnight (c1771-1828) on 16 December 1792. She was the daughter of Hans Michael Goodnight & Mary Landis. Michael had arrived in America in 1752 on the same ship as Jacob's father. Michael was killed by the Indiana in 1781 near Harrodsburg (KY) [See article "Michael Goodnight Killed By Indians Near Harrodsburg", by Jerry Long, Internet https://wckyhistory-genealogy.org/families/labout 1797 Jacob Young moved to Shelby County, KY, were he is enumerated in the 1810, 1820 & 1830 censuses. His wife, Rachel, died in 1828 and he married Catherine Bryant, 13 September 1830 Oldham County, KY. Jacob moved during 1830-1836 to

Jackson County, Indiana, where he died on 24 August 1836. He was buried in the Waskom Cemetery.



- Susan W. (c1817 after 1838); married John Sturgeon, 15 May 1834 Jackson County, IN.
- Andrew Jackson (born between 1810 -1820 & died after 1838).




Michael Goodnight Young (1800-1877) and Solomon Young (1815-1892) Sons of Jacob Young & Rachel Goodnight

Solomon Young (1815-1892), son of Jacob & Rachel, in 1842 sold his land in Shelby County, KY and moved to Jackson County, MO; his daughter, Martha Ellen Young Truman (1852-1947), was the mother of Harry S. Truman (1884-1972), the 33rd president of the United States.

- 4. Michael Young, son of John & Ann, born 1760-1765. In numerous family trees on the Internet he is totally confused with a Michael Young (1755-1833), who was born in North Carolina and who lived and died in Pulaski County, KY. Their two families are mistakenly mixed together. This other Michael was about ten years older and he recorded an application for a Revolutionary War pension in Pulaski County, KY in 1830. This other Michael may be related since he was of Germanic origin and also used many of the same family names. The two Michael's are totally different and were residing in different places at the same time. In his pension application in 1830 this other Michael testified he had resided with his son, Solomon Young for the "last ten or eleven years"; his son was a resident of Pulaski County, KY. The other Michael Young was a continuous resident of Pulaski County, KY from about 1812 until his death in 1833. Michael, son of John & Ann Jung, is listed in the 1800 census of Cabarrus County, NC and during 1806-1807 he moved to Washington County, KY, where his brothers, Michael & Andrew, were then residing. Michael appears continuously in the 1807-1830 tax lists and in the 1810 census of Washington County, KY. In 1829-1830 Michael left Washington County, KY and moved to Ralls County, MO, where he is listed in the 1830 federal census and where his sons, Michael, Jr. & Jacob were living and where he has numerous descendants. In the "Marcus De Lafayette Cocanougher's Journal, Washington County" it was noted that "This house was occupied back in the 1820s by Mike Young, who moved to Ralls County, Mo. in 1829." ... "Some 200 yards below this house was a cabin back in the 1820s the widow Nolin [sic – should be Moreland] lived. This house afterwards was used as a school. She married Mike Young when they with others all went to Ralls County, Mo., in 1829." (see Kentucky Ancestors, Kentucky Historical Society, Frankfort, KY, Vol. 37, No. 1, Autumn 2001, p8). Michael Young appears to have married during 1790-1798. His wife may have been a Miss Stumpf. A Michael Young married a widow, Mrs. Catherine (House) Friesland on 30 May 1805 in Cabarrus County, NC; Catherine Young was a resident of Cabarrus County, NC when her will was recorded in 1815; she left her estate to two daughters, Easther & Sarah Friesland and her will made no reference to a husband. The will suggests this marriage may not be for the Michael who was then a resident of Washington County, KY; unless they had parted when he moved to Kentucky several years previously. Michael married Mrs. Ruth Moreland, widow of Phillip Moreland, on 22 September 1823 in Washington County, KY; she had a son, George Moreland (c1808-1882, who married Ann Lewis in Ralls County, MO in 1835. Michael was the father of:
 - Elizabeth (c1794 c1866); married Fauntleroy Dye, 13 February 1815 Washington County, KY, consent on her marriage by father Michael Young; children – Mary, Ramey, Jacob, Sarah Barthenia, Mildred, Bachen, James, Lucinda, Fauntleroy & Rachel.
 - Jacob R. (c1797 c1854); married Elizabeth Stumpf, 24 May 1820 Washington County, KY; Jacob was buried Old Young Cemetery, Adair County, MO; children – Mary, George Washington, Fauntleroy, Michael, Jane, John, Harvey, America, Nancy, Jane, Francis Marion & Sarah Ann.
 - Michael, Jr. (31 September 1802 30 September 1877); married Lucinda Elizabeth Goodnight, 3 October 1829 Mercer County, KY, she was a great-niece

of Rachel Goodnight, wife of the Revolutionary War soldier, Jacob Young; Michael Jr. was buried Young Cemetery, Monroe County, MO; children – Edward, Nancy Ann, Henry, John Goodnight, Sarah Ellen, Michael Lewis, Zachariah & Margaret Jane.

- **Polly** (c1805-); married John Hilton, 13 June 1825 Washington County, KY, consent on her marriage by father Michael Young.
- Henry (1810 12 October 1861), married Sarah Lewis, 17 March 1835 Ralls County, MO; Henry was buried Monroe County, MO; children – Adam, John Wesley, Rhoda Jane, Mary Ellen, Nancy A. & Lucinda Elizabeth.
- 5. John Young, born in 1766 and died 1 February 1799 Cabarrus County, NC. In 1790 he was one of the purchasers at his father's estate sale and in 1791 he and his brothers sold land that had been acquired by their father. Elsie Spry Davis in her book wrote that Reverend Adam Nicholas Marcard, a Lutheran minister at St. John's Lutheran Church, sometimes substituted at the German Reformed Church on Coldwater Creek just outside Concord, where the Young family resided. Among Rev. Marcard church records is the obituary of John Young (Jr.): "Buried at Coldwater (gratis) February 14, 1799 John Jung (who) died on February 1, 1799 in the evening of pleurisy. He was born in 1766, and led an unhappy marriage with the widow of Christian Berberich who perished on the way to Charleston. The widow Elizabeth nee Diderich. From the marriage of eight years there is one child who is a girl." In April 1801, Adam Bowers, Jr. (the child's uncle) was appointed guardian for Elizabeth Young, "orphan child of John Young, deceased," and he held in trust for her L31.5.0. In the 1800 census of Cabarrus County, NC was the widow of John, Elizabeth Young, with her daughter. John & Elizabeth's daughter was:
 - Elizabeth (c1791 after 1860); married Michael Beaver (1784-1860) of Rowan County, NC. In 1808 Elizabeth Young and her son-in-law, Michael Beaver, of Rowan County, NC sold land formerly owned by John Young (Cabarrus County, NC deed book 7 p216)

- Elizabeth Young, daughter of John & Ann, born 1773-1780 NC and died after 1810 NC. She married Adam Bowers, Jr. in Cabarrus County, NC on 11 December 1793. Adam was born c1773 and is listed in the 1800 & 1810 censuses of Cabarrus County, NC. Adam & Elizabeth were parents of:
 - John Bowers (c1795 c1845); married Margaret Lipe, 21 March 1821 Cabarrus County, NC; children – Catherine C., Moses, Wiley, Daniel, John, Betsy, Giles & Margaret.
 - Judith Bowers (c1803 1868,) married Martin Harkey, 23 July 1823 Cabarrus County, NC; children Catherine Adeline, Mary Ann, Solomon, William, Laura Ann, Emaline, Henry H., Martin Alexander & Martha Jane.
- 7. Mary Young, daughter of John & Ann, born c1779 NC and died 1803-1810 NC. She married Peter Gonder, 15 January 1799 Cabarrus County, NC. Her husband was Peter Conder, who was born c1765-1770 NC. Numerous family trees have this Peter misidentified. Peter's father was George Conder, who is listed in the 1790 census of Mecklenburg County, NC. George about 1795 moved to Washington County, KY, where Peter was named in his father's will in 1799. Peter was a brother of Margaret Conder, wife of Martin Young. Peter remained in North Carolina for a few years after his father went to Kentucky. Peter's wife, Mary, appears to have died during 1803-1810. Peter Conder remarried on 13 August 1810 in Cabarrus County, NC. Peter married Elizabeth Goodnight. Elizabeth was born 6 February 1773 and was the daughter of Christian Goodnight & Catherine Cook. Christian is listed in the 1790 census of Mecklenburg County, NC and 1800 census of Cabarrus County, NC; he was the son of Michael Goodnight and was a half-brother of Rachel Goodnight, who married Jacob Young. In the 1810 census of Cabarrus County, NC Peter Conder is listed immediately preceding his bother-in-law, Adam Bowers, Jr., who was married to Elizabeth Young. In Peter's household were listed four individuals, two adults and two children, who were under the age of ten, a male and female. The two children were probably born to his first wife, Mary Young. The two children were not identified for this report. During 1810-1814 Peter moved to Tennessee. Peter appears in the 1820 census of Hickman County, TN, 1830 census of Montgomery County, IL, 1840 & 1850 censuses of Williamson County, IL. In 1850 Peter Conder was living in the home of a daughter, Mary Elizabeth (Conder) Tippy (1814-1886).

Martin Young, son of John & Ann, was born between 1750-1760 and died 1843-1845. He is never shown with a middle name or a middle initial. The 1810 census records that he was age 45 or older indicating he was born by 1765. The 1830 and 1840 censuses reported him as being between 70-80 and between 80-90 suggesting he was born during 1750-1760. One Martin Young was a veteran of the North Carolina line during the Revolutionary War (Colonial and State Records of North Carolina). "By virtue of the Authority vested in us, by an Act of the General Assembly, passed at Newbern, January 1792, We Hereby Certify, That the state of North Carolina, is indebted to Martin Young late a Soldier in the Continental Line of said state, the sum of twenty nine pounds eleven shillings and five pence specie, with interest from first day of August 1783, granted at Warrenton, in 1786. And "The Army Accounts of the No. Carolina

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Line" (p262) lists a Martin Young, #3254, who received 39 pounds, 8 shillings, 6 pence, as recorded in the original books and documents of the Commissioners of No. Carolina at Warrenton dated Philadelphia, 25 February 1793. It is not clear if he is the Martin of Mecklenburg and Cabarrus Counties, NC. In the 1790 census of North Carolina there is only one Martin Young listed and that is the Martin of Mecklenburg County. I have found no other Martin in the records of North Carolina during the Revolutionary War period. If Martin did serve in the Revolution why did he not apply for a Revolutionary War pension, as his brothers, Andrew & Jacob had done? Martin was still living in 1840 and by an act of 1832 all soldiers who could validate their service in the Revolution were eligible for a pension.

Martin Young married Margaret Conder about 1785-1788. They were married when "Margaret Young" was named as a daughter in the will of her father, George Conder, on 5 July 1790. Martin and his-father-in-law, George Conder, are listed in the 1790 census of Mecklenburg County, NC. This census shows that 5 individuals were in Martin's home – 3 females, one male age 16 or over and one male under 16. The one minor male is probably his son, John, and the females are his wife, Margaret, and possibly his two unmarried sisters, Elizabeth & Mary.

In February 1790 Martin Young was one of the purchasers at his father's estate sale. One of the items he purchased was a Dutch bible. On 2 August 1791 he and his brothers sold land that had been acquired by their father; recorded in July 1795 Cabarrus County, NC deed book 1 pp213-214. Martin and his wife, Margaret on 8 September 1795 sold 98 acres on Three Mile Branch in Cabarrus County, NC to James Scott (Cabarrus County, NC deed book 5 p236). A warrant for the same 98 acres was issued to Martin Young on 22 May 1780 (letter from Elsie Spry Davis to Alice Tindle, dated 26 October 1982).

Martin Young during 1795-1796 left Cabarrus County, NC and moved to Kentucky. He settled in the Long Run community of Washington County, KY near the Mercer County line (now Boyle County line). Living a short distance west of Perryville in Mercer County his brother, Jacob Young, was residing. Jacob Young had made the journey to Kentucky during 1790-1792. Martin probably came to Kentucky with his brother, Andrew, and his father-in-law, George Conder. All three appear for the first time in the tax records of Washington County in 1796. Andrew sold land in Cabarrus County, NC at the same time as Martin. George Conder sold 188 ³/₄ acres in Cabarrus County, NC on 7 September 1795 one day before Martin transferred his land. Martin Young is listed in the 1796-1808 tax lists of Washington County, KY and in the 1810 federal census of Washington County, KY. During 1805-1808 Michael Young, left Cabarrus County, NC and joined his brothers, Martin & Andrew, in the Long Run community of Washington County, KY.

Margaret Young's father, George Conder, was born 19 September 1739 in Pennsylvania. His father, Johannes Matthais Konder, was born 6 July 1706 Schweich, Rhineland-Pfaltz, Germany, arrived in America on the ship Virtuos Grace in 1737 and died about 1780 in Mecklenburg County, NC. George Conder wrote his will on 5 July 1790 while he was a resident of Mecklenburg County, NC. After removing to Kentucky his will was recorded in Washington County, KY of 3 September 1799. His will appeared as follows:

In the name of God amen. I George Conder of the state of North Carolina and County of Mecklenburg, being weak of body, but of perfect mind and memory thanks be

given unto god, calling unto mind the mortallity of body and knowing that is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto thy hands of Almighty God, that gave it and my body. I recommend to Earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Almighty power of God and as toward such worldly Estate where with it has pleased God to bless me with in this life in the first place I desire that all my lawfull debts be paid and the rest to be deposed of in the following manner and form, and the rest of my real and personal estate I leave in the hands of my beloved wife and children during her life and at her death then to be sold and equally divided amongst all my children excepting George and Margaret Young untill all my children but said George Conder & Margaret Young and if anything remains after that then it is to be equally divided amongst all my children the above George and Margaret getting an equal share of the same but in case that my beloved wife Barbara Conder should marry, then it is my will and pleasure that my real and personal estate be disposed of as above written and I do herby apoint and ordain my beloved wife Barbara Conder and my beloved sons Peter Conder and John Conder to be my whole and sole executors to this my last will testament and I do hereby utterly disalow revoke and disanul all and every other former testament or will by me made or uttered and I do hereby ratify and confirm this and no other to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninty, and the fourteenth year of our Independence. George (his X Mark) Conder witt. Benj. Patton, Wm. White, Philip Wiser, Isaac Konkright. Recorded in Washington County, KY on 3 September 1799.

On 18 August 1986 this writer went to Washington County, KY to research my Young family relatives. At the Washington County Public Library I discovered a copy of the Marcus D. Lafayette Cocanougher Journal. Mr. Cocanougher (1855-1932), lived and died in Washington County. During the early 1900's he recorded about 50 pages in a journal. He recorded notes on his relatives and other families of the Long Run community; some of the references went back to the early 1800's (see Cocanougher family sketch in the book, <u>History of Kentucky and Kentuckians</u>, Vol. II, E. Polk Johnson, Chicago & New York, The Lewis Publishing Co., 1912, pp1083-1084 and article, "Marcus De Lafayette Cocanougher's Journal, Washington County", <u>Kentucky Ancestors</u>, Kentucky Historical Society, Frankfort, KY, Vol. 37, No. 1, Autumn 2001, pp5-15). Mr. Cocanougher was a son of William Cocanougher & Elizabeth Young, grandson of John Young & Ann Lawson and great-grandson of Andrew Young & Julianna Bowers. His journal contains a wealth of information on the descendants of the latter couple. It also contained a couple of references to his great-grandfather's brothers, Martin & Margaret (Conder) Young (p31):

"Just opposite May's branch, Martin Young lived. Two lonely graves and two cedars mark the place. I believe he was a cousin of grandfather Young's, but in this I am not certain. Ma did not know. He married a Condor. She had crazy spells and was counted a witch in that day. Martin must have been an early settler. His son, John (or Wolf or Beech John) was a bear hunter. The bears disappeared from our community about 1800. John was a quick dead shot. He once killed a didapper duck as it came up out of the water. From what I can gather – and I have made close inquiries – he was the best shot among the early settlers. He was a hunter by birth. He hunted bears, panthers,

wolves, deer, turkeys and smaller animals. His father with his family, excepting John, moved to Hancock County about 1815. He (Martin) had a son George who was a Baptist preacher [ed. note – this was Rev. Martin Young, Jr. not George]. John married a Paddack, Uncle Jack Paddack's sister. John Young died at an advanced age, January 20, 1875. He lived and died on the north side of Prather's Creek near its mouth. Mr. Fountain Haydon bought his old farm."

Martin Young in 1811 left Washington County and moved to Breckinridge County, KY; he settled in the western part of the county that eighteen years later would become Hancock County, KY. On 21 January 1811 he was still in Washington County when his daughter, Elizabeth, was married and by the mid-point of that year he was in Breckinridge County. Accompanying Martin to his new home was his wife and nine children. His oldest son, (Wolf) John Young, remained in Washington County and has descendants there today. Martin Young appears in the 1811-1828 tax lists of Breckinridge County, KY and in the 1820 federal census of Breckinridge County, KY. In Breckinridge County Minute Book 2 (1813-1818, p16) at a court on Tuesday, 22 June 1813 it was noted: "It appearing to the satisfaction of the court that Martin Young is a man who from age and misfortune is unable to pay county levy. It is ordered that the said Martin Young be hereafter exempt from paying county levy in this county."

On 3 January 1829 Hancock County became the 83rd Kentucky county. It was carved out of parts of Breckinridge, Daviess and Ohio Counties. Martin's residence became part of the new county. Martin is listed in the 1829-1843 tax lists of Hancock County, KY and 1830 & 1840 federal census of Hancock County. In Hancock County order book 1(1829-1836, p68) Martin Young is listed as being insolvent. At a court of 27 November 1832 it was "ordered that Martin Young, Sr. be exonerated from the payment of his county levy (Hancock County order book 1 p.175); in several subsequent years Martin (Sr.) was also exonerated from paying the yearly county tax. Martin Young, Sr. last appears in the annual tax lists for Hancock County in 1843. His death probably occurred about this time; he was then over 80 years old. His wife, Margaret, appears to have also died between the 1840 and 1850 censuses of Hancock County. In the 1843 tax book there are two Martins – they are listed as Martin Young, Sr. and Martin Young, Jr. The latter is Rev. Martin M. Young (c1801-1882), who was then taxed on 170 acres on Blackford Creek. Martin Jr. had purchased this tract in 1839 and is readily differentiated in the tax records. Martin Sr. never is listed as owning land in Hancock County. In the 1844 tax book only one Martin Young is listed, he was taxed on 170 acres. In the 1845 tax list (Rev.) Martin M. Young, owner of 170 acres, begins to be listed as "Sen." This is probably due to the fact that his father was then deceased and "Sen. & Sr." were added to his name to differentiate him from two (younger) nephews named Martin, who were then in the county – Martin (c1823-after 1860), son of Jacob Young & Charlotte Bruner (he first appears as "Martin Young Jun." in the 1845 tax list) and Martin V. Young (1828-1862), son of Michael Young & Nancy Bruner (he first appears in the 1849 tax list).

No will, administrator or estate records for Martin Young, Sr. were found in the Hancock County records. This is probably due to his insolvent status. The 1840 census of Hancock County suggests that Martin Young (Sr.) resided in the area about seven miles south of Hawesville near where the Mt. Eden Baptist Church was later located. It is not known were Martin (Sr.) & Margaret were buried. Since he owned no land it seems likely that he was buried on the farm owned by his son, Rev. Martin Young, who at the time was the only one of his sons


that was a land owner. Rev. Martin owned land on the north side of the Truman Young Road and just east of the Hawesville & Hartford Road (now Highway 69), where the Young family cemetery is located. This cemetery was being utilized as a graveyard by 1859.

Martin Young & Margaret Conder had ten children that reached maturity. The 1810 census shows 9 children - 5 boys and 4 girls living in their home. Their oldest son, (Wolf) John Young, married in 1807 and is listed in his own home in the 1810 census. The 1810 census only lists males and females in age categories and the only name listed is the head of the household. The five male children in Martin's home in 1810 were probably – Jacob, George, Martin, Michael and Davis and the four female children were – Catherine, Elizabeth, Barbara and Nancy Susan. In the 1820 census besides Martin & his wife there were four younger male children in their home; they were possibly their sons – George, Martin, Michael & David. In the 1830 & 1840 censuses only Martin and his wife are in their home.

Mrs. Elsie Spry Davis in her the book, <u>Descendants of Jacob Young of Shelby County</u>, <u>Kentucky, including President Harry S. Truman</u>, included a chart on the family of Martin Young & Margaret Conder (p156) that listed Sinclair (St.Clair) Young as a possible child. And now on Ancestry.com regretfully there over 170 family trees that list Sinclair as a child of Martin Young & Margaret Conder. He was not a son!!!! His Young family was originally from England. Sinclair was born c1790 in Kentucky. He married Amelia Hammond in Nelson County, KY in 1821. He was a wealthy plantation owner and owned about 30 slaves. He resided along Blackford Creek during 1825-1836 in Hancock County, KY just across the Daviess County line; he had settled there when it was still part of Breckinridge County. In 1836 he sold his farm of 1,166 acres and moved to Indiana. He was the son of John Young & Elizabeth Singleton. In the will of John Young, recorded in Nelson County, KY on 9 February 1835, St.Clair Young is named as a son. St. Clair is listed in the 1830 census of Hancock County, IN. St. Clair's sister, Elizabeth Young, was the wife of Thomas Dudley Brown and they are the parents of the 31st Governor of Kentucky, John Young Brown (1835-1904).

Children of Martin Young & Margaret Conder were:

John Young, son of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born 6 February 1785-1787 North Carolina. He was known as "Wolf John Young" probably due to his notoriety as a hunter alluded to in the journal of Marcus D. Lafayette Cocanougher (<u>Kentucky Ancestors</u>, Kentucky Historical Society, Frankfort, KY, Vol. 37, No. 1, Autumn 2001, p10). John married Margaret Paddock in Washington County, KY on 13 August 1807. The daughter of William Paddock & Elizabeth Windows, she was born c1792 KY and died during 1870-1875. John first appears in the annual tax lists of Washington County in 1808. Males who had reached the age of 21 were eligible to pay the county tax levy and after reaching that age are enumerated in the county's tax records. By the fact he is reported to be 21 in 1808 it is suggested that his birth year was 1787 or earlier. Beginning in 1814 he is listed as John Sr. in the tax books to distinguish him from his first cousin, John Young (1791-1864, son of Andrew). (Wolf) John is shown as first owning land in the 1819 Washington County tax list, when he was taxed on 50 acres on Prather's Creek; in other years this land was reported to be on the Beechfork Creek of which Prather's Creek is a tributary. Marcus D. L. Cocanougher in his journal said that Wolf John "lived and died on the north side of Prather's Creek near its mouth." By 1835 his land holdings had increased to 175 acres on Prather's Creek. John is listed in the 1810, 1830, 1840, 1850 (age 68), 1860 (age 82) and 1870 (age 95) censuses of Washington County, KY. The Cocanougher Journal noted that Wolf John Young died at an advanced age on January 20, 1875.



Wolf John Young (c1785-1875) resided on north side of Prather Creek (marked in red) in the southeastern part of Washington County, KY

The following listing of the children of (Wolf) John Young & Margaret Paddock is highly speculative. No document could be found that listed their heirs. This listing is based solely on proximity and repeated interrelationships.

 Martin Young, son of John Young & Margaret Paddock, was born c1808 Washington County, KY. He is listed in the 1840, 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Washington, KY. He married Mrs. Mary Elizabeth (Johnston) Trowbridge, 26 April 1838 Washington County, KY. Mary Elizabeth, 'Eliza', daughter of James M. Johnston & Emily Savage, was born 1808 New Jersey, she married 1st Christian Hager, 24 June 1823 Mercer County, KY (they had – Mary Elizabeth Hager) and 2nd Alexander Trowbridge, 16 October 1828 Casey County, KY (they had – Margaret Ann, Nancy J. & Frances Trowbridge). Martin Young died 22 June 1890 and his wife, Eliza, died 14 March 1894. <u>Springfield Sun</u>, Springfield, KY, Monday, 23 June 1890: "Martin Young died Saturday of Bright's disease. He was 67. Burial was in Pleasant Grove Cemetery Sunday." Martin & Eliza were parents of:

- Martha Emily was born 8 July 1839 Washington County, KY; married George Washington Nix (c1842-1873), 19 January 1865 Washington County, KY, she married 2nd Algernon Buford Tapp (1839-1911), 1 September 1875 Washington County, KY. Martha Emily died 5 May 1922 Springfield Washington County, KY, where she was buried at Cemetery Hill. Her children were Mary Lucretia Nix (1869-1934, married Thomas W. Sallee); William C. Nix (1870-1943, married Julina E. Myers & Mary Palmyra Sallee); Thomas Dudley Tapp (1876-1937, married Ada Florence Colvin); & Dillard Simpson Tapp (1878-1955, married Margaret Emily Miller & Mable Terry).
- James Richard, 'Jim', was born 24 March 1841 Washington County, KY; married Emily C. Hyatt (1845-1889), 5 December 1867 Washington County, KY and Catherine A. Key (1866-1939, she married 1st William Thomas Yankee). James Richard Young died 13 December 1913 Washington County, KY, where he was buried in the Pleasant Grove Cemetery. His children were by 1st wife, Mary Susan (1869-1872); Annie E. (1870-1884); Maggie A. (c1872-); Eliza (c1873-); Edward Willis (1874-1953, married Sadie Lou Mayes & Ellen Dalena Lane); infant (1884-1884); by 2nd wife, Alvin (1892-1975, married Mary Wilford McMichael); Walter Scott (1897-1947); Mattilee (1902-2003, married Roscoe Tomlinson); & Joseph Ray (1904-1986, married Sara Fay Grayer).
- John Henry was born 19 April 1845 Washington County, KY; married Amy Ann Hilton (c1841-1890, she married 1st Stith Thomas Mayes); John Henry died 17 February 1900 Louisville, KY and was buried with his wife at the Ryder Cemetery, Lebanon, Marion County, KY. Their children were Mary Elizabeth (1865-1892, married Joseph Gray Toles); James Westley (1867-1959, married Lizzie G. Tuggle); Willard Martin (1871-1883); Sara Jane (1872-1894); Berry Hatchett (1874-1946, married Mary A. Gammons & Nancy Ila Lee Shaw); Anna Ferril (1877-1942, married James Alford Smith); Margaret Olivia (1880-1965, married Joseph F. Kyle); Amanda Burton (1880-1977, married Dolph Hughes, Robert Lee Foley & Elijah John Horn); & John Henry (1885-1946, married Laura Belle Green & Cleo Ida Staples).
- Harriet Letisha was born 15 June 1848 Washington County, KY, married John Wesley Helton (1848-1914), 18 September 1866 Washington County, KY. Harriet died 11 July 1936 Sciota, McDonough County, IL, where she was buried with her husband at the Good Hope Cemetery. Their children were Mary Frances (1867-1935, married William Reynard Sallee); Laura Bell (1869-1952, married Reuben Mallory Coyle); William Lee (1871-1872); Henry (1873-1956, married Nancy Lee Graves); John Robert (1875-1962, married Nannie Rose Gootee); Garlin H. (1877-1966, married Carrie A. Mobley); Elizabeth Ellen (1880-1967, married William Kellar Black; Charles Martin (1882-1976, married Ada Florence Mobley); Walter Barman (1884-1888); Albert Ferrill (1886-1962); Clarence Edward (1889-1980, married Nell Moriah Davis); & Haggie May (1892-1973, married Earl Franklin Norville & Harry N. Gass).

- Daughter born 1 October 1852 Washington County, KY and died 1852-1860.
- Ruth Harris was born 17 October 1854 Washington County, KY; married William Elliott Wilkerson (1848-1912), 2 October 1879 Washington County, KY. Ruth died 14 March 1920 Washington County, KY, where she was buried with her husband in the Bethlehem Baptist Church Cemetery. Their children were Mary Susan (1880-1957, married George Louis Elliott); James Daniel (1882-1944, married Cordia Elizabeth Elliott); John Martin (1885-1980, married Amanda C. Ayers); William Owen (1888-1958, married Susie Floyd Elliott); Albert Sidney Johnson (1892-1986, married Dicie Chandler); and two died infancy before 1900.

Hambleton Tapp (1900-1992) was a noted author and historian. He was the son of Thomas Dudley Tapp & Ada Florence Colvin, grandson of Algernon Buford Tapp & Martha Emily Young, great-grandson of Martin Young & Eliza Johnston, and great-great-grandson of (Wolf) John Young & Margaret Paddock:

Hambleton Tapp (1900-1992)

Hambleton Tapp joined the Kentucky Historical Society staff as assistant director and editor of The Register in July 1971, when he retired from the University of Kentucky. As state historian under Governors Julian Carroll, John Y. Brown, Jr., and Martha Layne Collins, he coauthored (with James C. Klotter) Kentucky: Decades of Discord, 1865-1900, collaborated with George M. Chinn on Kentucky: Settlement and Statehood, 1750-1800, and wrote numerous articles and reviews for various journals and newspapers.

A dedicated gentleman and scholar, Dr. Tapp could always be found at his desk working in coat and tie, even on sweltering days when the air conditioner was under repair. Occasionally, winter days found the furnace out of order. Dr. Tapp would still be at his station, wearing overcoat and gloves. Always faithful to his tasks, he still managed at least one walk a day. He avoided the elevator, preferring a brisk pace from his third-floor office to the first floor, and then back again. Colleagues agreed that Dr. Tapp would be the most likely candidate on staff to make a physical fitness video! The Springfield, Kentucky, native graduated from Centre College, received an M.A. from Peabody College, and a Ph.D. in history from the University of Kentucky. He was a teacher at Louisville Male High School, superintendent of schools at Eminence, and director of health and physical education in the Kentucky Department of Education. He joined the University of Kentucky faculty in 1948. During his time at UK, he founded and directed the Kentucky Life Museum, now known as Waveland State Shrine.

This heritage-minded citizen chaired the Daniel Boone National Forest Association, the George Rogers Clark Memorial Foundation, the Kentucky Heritage Commission, and the Kentucky Civil War Centennial Commission.

He was a founder of the Kentucky Civil War Round Table and served as its secretary until 1984, the year he retired from the Kentucky Historical Society. He was also a devoted Presbyterian and Rotarian.

Honors included an Award of Merit by the American Association for State and Local History (1979), a Distinguished Alumni Award from Centre College Alumni Association (1981), and a certificate from Governor Collins naming him a Distinguished Kentuckian (1984). In 1985, the KHS initiated a new award in Dr. Tapp's name to ensure that his influence will continue. The \$1,000 prize is presented each year to a teacher whose proposed classroom project best involves students in the study of Kentucky history.

Hambleton Tapp died on October 14, 1992. Historian, teacher, administrator, and gentleman—he will be missed.

- 2. Andrew Young, son of John Young & Margaret Paddock, was born c1810 KY and died after 1853. He married Jane Lawson, 6 February 1832 Mercer County, KY. Jane, daughter of Joshua Lawson & Elizabeth Richardson, was born c1817 Washington County, KY. Andrew is listed in the 1840 census of Washington County, KY and 1850 census of Trimble County, KY. Marcus D. L. Cocanougher in his journal (p15) "Jane Lawson married Andrew Young, son of Wolf John Young, and they moved to Trimble County, KY about 1843." In the 1852-1861 death records for Trimble County, KY it is recorded that Jane Lawson Young died on 18 February 1853. Andrew & Jane were the parents of:
 - Amanda (c1835-after 1860, married William H. Moore, 20 March 1851 Trimble County, KY.
 - **Jordan** (c1839-after 1850).
- 3. Amy Young, daughter of John Young & Margaret Paddock, was born c1816 KY. She is listed in the home of (Wolf) John & Margaret Young in the 1850, 1860 & 1870 censuses. In the 1870 census she was reported to be insane. In the 1850 census there are two persons named "Amy Young" listed within 12 households Amy age 34 in the home of Wolf John & Margaret Young and Amy Young, age 40, is listed as a head of a household and with her were two children John 6 & Margaret 4. The two children are grandchildren of Wolf John & Margaret. They appear to be children of their daughter, Amy. The two children in the 1860 census appear in the home John J. (c1833-1869, son of Wolf John) in the next household after the listing for Wolf John. The John, born c1844 is in the home of Wolf John & Margaret in the 1870 census (reports him to be an idiot)

and John, age 35, is listed in the home of Martin Young (son of Wolf John) in the 1880 census (reported to be Martin's nephew, he was single & was an idiot).

- 4. Lucretia Young, daughter of John Young & Margaret Paddock, was born 1815-1820 KY, married Joseph Nix, 5 June 1839 Washington County, KY. Bond on her marriage was by John Young. Joseph was born c1817 KY. He and his brother, Jonathan, married daughters of Wolf John Young. They were sons of James Nix, who appears in the 1820 & 1830 censuses of Washington County, KY. James married Catherine Barnes in Washington County, KY on 23 October 1810. James Nix (Sr.) last appears in the Washington County tax lists in 1839. Joseph is listed in the 1838-1851 tax lists of Washington County, KY. The descendants of Martin Young, Sr. Margaret Conder are inter-related to this Nix family numerous ways. Lucretia Nix died between 1847-1860. Lucretia & Joseph Nix were the parents of William, George W., Franklin Martin and Thomas.
 - William Nix enlisted in the Union Army (Co. E, 10th KY Infantry, on 3 October 1861, his brother George W., enrolled in the same outfit on the same day, William died on 5 August 1864 at Chattanooga, TN and was buried in the Hall Cemetery in Washington County, KY, he has a government veteran's monument, several other members of the family of Wolf John Young are also buried in the same cemetery and Wolf John may be buried in this cemetery in an unmarked grave. George W. Nix the administrator of his brother, William's estate, made a settlement of the estate on 24 August 1868, William left three heirs including, George W., who was guardian of his younger brothers, Franklin & Thomas (Washington County, KY Will Book N, pp537-538).
 - George W. Nix was born c1844 Washington County, KY, married his first cousin Martha Emily Young, daughter of Martin Young & Eliza Johnston; George W. died 15 November 1873 and was buried Hall Cemetery, Washington County, KY. George W. & Martha were the parents of – Mary Lucretia & William C.
 - Franklin Martin Nix was born 10 July 1845 Washington County, KY, he served in the Union Army during the Civil War; married Mary Ellen Collins, 3 November 1875 Breckinridge County, KY; he died 18 April 1926 Breckinridge County, KY, where he was buried Mt. Zion Methodist Church Cemetery; he & Mary had 16 children, they included – John Richard, George Fred, Jessie Allen, Lewis Taylor, Alvin Murray, Oscar M., Mary L., Martha E., Milton B., Miller E., Orvil & Robert. John Thomas Nix (1890-c1981), grandson of John Nix & Elizabeth Young, in a 1979 wrote that "the Nix's who lived in Breckinridge Co. was some distant relatives of ours."
 - Thomas Nix, born c1848, his marriage license states he was born in Washington County, KY; he is listed in the home of his uncle, John J. Young (son of Wolf John) in the 1860 Washington County, KY census and he was living in Henderson County, KY at the time of the 1870 & 1880 censuses; he married Margaret Jane (Gobin) Johnston, 23 February 1870 Owensboro, Daviess County they were divorced 1872-1876, they were parents of Martha E. & Mary Alice.

5. Elizabeth Young, 'Betsy', daughter of John Young & Margaret Paddock, was born c1820 Washington County, KY. She married a Taylor, c1833, John Nix, c1838 and Edward Barbee, 1857. Some have speculated that Elizabeth was the daughter of Martin Young (Sr.) & Margaret Conder. Margaret Conder at the time of Elizabeth's birth would have would have been age 50 or older. It is more logical that she is a granddaughter of this couple. I believe she is a daughter of (Wolf) John Young & Margaret Paddock. Prior to 1840 Elizabeth was a resident of Washington County, KY; records show that Elizabeth had two children born in Washington County in 1834 & 1839. Wolf John is the only child of Martin, Sr. that remained in Washington County. In addition to his wife in his household in the 1830 census of Washington County there are six females listed who were born during 1810-1830. These probably include his daughters, Amy, Lucretia, Martha, Nancy & Emaline. This leaves one other unidentified female born between 1815-1820 that could be his daughter. The 1850 & 1860 censuses list Elizabeth as 30 & 40. Elizabeth appears to have married first a Taylor; she had a daughter, Mary ('Polly') Taylor, who was born in April 1834. Mary Taylor married in Hancock County, KY on 25 May 1853 to Davis Young (son of Rev. Martin Young & Margaret). On her marriage record it was written that "John Nix stepfather of young lady gave consent in person" and in a listing of the marriage in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics it is recorded that Polly Taylor was born in Washington County, KY. The death certificate of John Nix, Jr. (1839-1917) lists his mother as Betsy Young and John Jr. is reported as being born in Washington County, KY on the marriage of his son in Thomas (Ohio County, KY marriage book 26, p4).

"Mrs. Elizabeth Young" married John T. Nix on 12 September 1844 in Hancock County, KY; on their marriage it was noted that "lady married before". They were married by Rev. Martin Young, a minister of the Baptist Church. John Nix was born 1810-1813 Washington County, KY. He is the son of James Nix & Catherine Barnes, who were married in Washington County, KY on 23 October 1810 and who are listed in the 1820 & 1830 censuses of Washington, KY and 1840 census of Mercer County, KY. James Nix has four males in his home, all aged 0-10 in the 1820 census. John Nix first appears in the Washington County tax lists in 1834; he is listed as "John T. Nicks" and last appears there in 1840 list. Two other sons of James & Catherine married daughters of Wolf John Young. Children of James & Catherine Nix included: John T., Josiah T. (married Lucrecia Young, 5 June 1839 Washington County, KY), James (married Jane Comstock, 13 July 1837 Washington County, KY), Jonathan (married Martha Young, 18 June 1839 Washington County, KY), Eleanor (married Elias J. Ford, 24 October 1825 Mercer County, KY), Debian Ann (married Jesse Cash, 7 December 1848 Stewart County, TN), Julia (married Elias J. Ford, 20 July 1848 Stewart County, TN) and Stephen (married Catherine Burnett Evans, 1854-1856).

John Nix is first listed in the tax lists of Hancock County, KY in 1841. In the 1850 census of Hancock County, KY their household was listed as: Nix, John (46, real estate \$750), Betsy (30), John (9), James (8), Alexander (7), Wilford W. (5), Elisah J. (2) & William H. (5 month), all born KY. The three oldest sons all were born prior to their parent's marriage in 1844; the death certificate, however, of the oldest son, John, Jr. reports he was the son of Jack Nix & Betsy Young. John Nix last appears in the Hancock County

tax lists in 1854. In 1854 John Nix sold his land in Hancock County to John Mayhall. The following advertisement by John Nix appeared in the newspaper, <u>Pick and Plow</u> (Hawesville, KY, 22 October 1853):

Any one in want of a good little farm will make it to their interest to call and see the farm offered by John Nix, as a rare bargain will be given. See notice for particulars.

Land for Sale! A SMALL tract of good land is of-fered for sale by the subscritter,is situat d about seven miles con h of Hawesvill -, and cantains Sixty-oue Acres, Of which 10 acres are in a good state of cultivation, and 7 acres cleared an! ready for fearing-remainder well imwred and watered --- mprovements underate. For particulars apply to me on the premises or my agent R. Y. Bush, of Hawesville. JOHN NIX.

In 1853 Peter R. Young & Jesse Rice, Jr. testified that "John Nix is a dangerous man and ought not to run at large as he has made several threats to kill or murder several of his neighbors and is continuously breaking the peace of the neighborhood" (Hancock County Commonwealth cases, box 154, bundle 12, file 501). John Nix, a non resident of Kentucky, on 20 March 1854 filed a suit for a divorce from Elizabeth Nix, claiming that she had abandoned him. He testified that he married Mrs. Elizabeth Young on 12 September 1844. In reply by his wife she claimed cruelty & violence on his part was why she had left their home. Capt. William Hale gave testimony on 1 September 1855 that he lived about a mile from the couple, he said John Nix is "an industrious man, he was a chairmaker by trade & cultivated a small farm, about two years ago they separated, one lived in one house and the other in another house on the same farm about 200 yards apart, the plaintiff has left the county shortly after and has not been back." Testimony of other neighbors in the suit (James W. Isom, Peter B. Young, Martin V. Young, Davis Young & Andrew L. Rice) indicates they had been acquainted with the couple since about the time of their marriage. On 6 March 1856 a divorce was granted.

John Thomas Nix (1890-c1981), of Cook Station, MO, son of John Nix (1839-1917) and grandson of John Nix & Elizabeth Young in a letter to Mrs. Idmon (Mary Ellen Nix) Anderson (1901-1989), of Bartow, FL, dated 29 September 1968 wrote that "My grandfather whose name was Jack Nix and grandmother whose maiden name was Betsy Young, had 7 children and separated. My father John Nix was the oldest and Grandpa taken the three next children in age which was boy's and left and never was heard from any more." John Nix reportedly left Hancock County with his sons, Alexander, Wilford W. and William H. Nix. They apparently went to Missouri. In the 1860 census of Chariton County, MO two of the boys are found – in the household of Jeremiah Wilson

(45, KY) & Virginia (29 VA) are Alexander Nix, 15, farm laborer, born KY) and William Nix (12, born KY). Apparently John Nix had died by 1860 or he had abandoned his sons. Alexander is listed in the 1870 & 1880 censuses of St. Francois County, MO. No further record of John Nix (Sr.) and his three sons could be found.

Elizabeth Young Nix married Edward Barbee, 5 March 1857 Hancock County, KY. They appear in the 1860 census of Breckinridge County, KY as: Barbee, Edward (51), Elizabeth (40), Philo (12) and Nix, Davis (6), all born KY. Edward, son of John & Mildred Barbee, was born c1810 Breckinridge County, KY; he also married Elizabeth Sample, 25 January 1842 Daviess County, KY and Esther T. (Hoheimer) Hendricks, 15 October 1867 Daviess County, KY. Elizabeth Young possibly had died between 1860-1867; she left no children by Edward Barbee. Edward Barbee died 14 January 1870 Breckinridge County, KY.

Elizabeth (Young) Taylor Nix had the following children:

- Mary Taylor was born in April 1834 Washington County, KY. She married Davis Young, 25 May 1853 Hancock County, KY. [See Davis Young family record on page 145]
- John Nix was born 19 January 1839 Washington County, KY. He is listed in the • 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY, 1900 & 1910 censuses of Ohio County, KY. John Nix served as a Union soldier during the Civil War; mustered in 21 March 1862 and mustered out 29 March 1865. He served in company D of the 27th KY Infantry; several Young relatives (William M. Young, Davis T. Young, Martin V. Young, John Jarboe) served in the same outfit. John Nix in 1879 was issued a pension for his service. John Nix married Margaret Ann Young, 7 January 1858 Hancock County, KY. Margaret was the daughter of Michael Young & Nancy Bruner and granddaughter of Martin Young & Margaret Conder; she was born c1836 Illinois and died between 1876-1880. John Nix married his first cousin, Mary Catherine Cash, 17 February 1886 Hancock County, KY. The daughter of Jesse Cash & Ann Debian Nix, Mary was born 11 September c1854 KY and died 14 January 1933 Ohio County, KY; she is listed in the 1860 & 1870 censuses of Hancock County, KY and 1880 census of Breckinridge County, KY. John moved to the Hell's Neck section of Ohio County, KY during 1895-1896; he died there on 7 August 1917 (his death certificate has died August 7 and his gravestone as August 17). John & his wife, Mary Catherine, were buried at the Old Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery, Ohio County, KY.

Children of John Nix & Margaret Ann Young were: Hannah Jane (22 December 1858 – May 1895, married John W. Lynch, children – John G., Charles Edward, Nora Jane, Floyd Thomas & Everett Clovis); Maria Lucretia (23 August 1863 – 1901, married Isaac Ford, children – Lula J., Rhoda A., Florence O., Walter Amos, Corda A., Cora Addie & 5 others died infancy); Mary Elizabeth (28 June 1866 – 17 May 1930, never married, she was deaf & dumb, after the death of her mother she lived with her father & stepmother); Charles Sherman (16 October

1868 – 8 March 1952, buried Bethlehem Baptist Church Cemetery, Hancock County, KY, married Mahala Jane Curry, children – Mary Elizabeth, George Clarence, Thomas Clifton, Charles Everett, Nannie Sidney, Rose Ola, John Nathan & Allie Mae); **Julia Ann** (26 March 1871 – 3 March 1925, buried Alms House Cemetery, Ohio County, KY, married her brother-in-law, John W. Lynch, they had no children); **Susan** (c1875 – after 1880); & **David** (c1876 – after 1880).

The 1900 & 1910 censuses record that Mary Catherine (Cash) was the mother of 5 children, 2 of whom were then living. John & Mary's children were: **Benjamin**, 'Benny', (28 July 1888 – died infancy); **John Thomas** (30 November 1890 – disappeared on 22 February 1981, a monument with a death date of 3 June 1986 was erected in the Carr Cemetery, Cook Station, MO, married Sarah Elizabeth Filback, a daughter of Andy Filback & Mary Elizabeth Young, granddaughter of Martin V. Young & Narcissus Angel, great-granddaughter of Michael Young, a brother of Wolf John Young, children – Gurley, Clarence, Lucille, Oscar Thomas, Clifton H. & Kenneth Ray); **Sally** (stillborn 17 January 1896); **William Sampson** (28 June 1898 – 13 June 1973, buried Old Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery, Ohio County, KY, married Sibbie D. Howerton, children – Harvey B., Junior C. & Opal Pearl).

James Nix was born in May 1842 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1850, 1860, 1880 & 1900 censuses of Hancock County, KY. During circa 1866-1872 he was residing in Indiana, where three of his children were born. He married Mary M. Chambers, 25 May 1864 Hancock County, KY. Mary, daughter of Giles Chambers & Sabrina Sellers, was born c1844 KY and died 1866-1868. James Nix

married Nancy Jane Young, 4 January 1868 Hancock County, KY. Nancy was born in September 1845 Jefferson County, IL; she was the daughter of Michael Young & Nancy Bruner and granddaughter of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder. James Nix died during 1901-1910. His wife, Nancy, is listed as a widow in the 1910 census of Daviess County, KY. Nancy died 1 June 1918 Daviess County, KY. Her death certificate gives her burial place as Bethlehem Cemetery. This is probably the Bethlehem Methodist Church Cemetery in Daviess County, KY, near where she died and where her son, William Nix (died 1922), brother, Davis T. Young (died 1907) and niece, Artiemissie Young (died 1905), were buried. At the time of the 1900 census Nancy and James Nix were residing near Patesville in Hancock County, KY. The 1900 & 1910 censuses record that 7 children had been born to Nancy, 3 of whom were then deceased.

James Nix and Mary Chambers had a daughter, Sarah Jane (c1866 – 8 January 1897, buried Pellville, KY, married William N. Nichols, children – George, Mary Belle, Mattie M., Lorainda, Walter E. & Maggie). James Nix & Nancy Jane Young were the parents of: William Wilford (16 July 1870 – 26 March 1922, buried Bethlehem Methodist Church Cemetery, Daviess County, KY, married Eva Dora Bruner, Maggie Nola Marlow & Rebecca Ellen Rayman, children by 1st wife - Clarence Arthur, by 3rd Alvin James, Ruby Zelma, George William, Elizabeth Ellen, Raymond Henry & James Ignatius); Jesse Lewis (5 May 1872 died between 1880 & 1900); Mary Margaret (11 February 1875 - 8 September 1935, buried St. Williams Cemetery, Knottsville, Daviess County, KY, married Ignatius Guy Payne, children - William Ignatius, Mary Rena, James Milburn, Emma, George Oliver, Zula Anna, Addie Bell, Bede Atrew, Joseph Guy, Lillie May and one died infancy); Hannah (April 1880 – died between 1880-1894); Henry Vincent (9 June 1883 – 23 June 1961, buried St. Williams Cemetery, Knottsville, Daviess County, KY, married Mary Camilla Payne, no children); Frank Benjamin (9 June 1883 – 8 April 1963, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, married Florence E. Jones & Flossie B. Ashworth, children – Albert, Henry Franklin, Robert Edward and James Earl).

- Alexander Nix was born c1843 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1850 census of Hancock County, KY, 1860 census of Chariton County, MO, 1870 and 1880 censuses of St. Francois County, MO. In 1860 he and his brother, William, were living with Jeremiah & Henrietta Wilson; he was reported to be a farm laborer. He married Nancy c1866 and Elizabeth Tupp, 25 January 1882 Washington County, MO. Alexander & Nancy were parents of William Thomas, John G. & J. Martha.
- Wilford W. Nix was born c1847 Hancock County, KY and is listed in the 1850 census of Hancock County, KY
- Elisha J. Nix was born c1848 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1850, 1860 & 1870 censuses of Hancock County, KY. In 1860 he was living with his brother, John. He married Sarah Jane Sanders, 21 November 1867 Hancock County, KY. Sarah was born 4 February 1848 Hancock County, KY and died during 1870-1880. She was the daughter of James T. Sanders & Nancy Ann Young and granddaughter of George & Sarah Young and great-granddaughter of

Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder. Elisha Nix died 1870-1873. On 7 February 1873 N. B. Comstock was appointed the administrator of the estate of Elisha Nix, deceased; bond was by John Nix. Elisha & Sarah were parents of – **James David Nix** (8 January 1869 – 2 February 1949; he being an orphan and having no guardian his estate was on 26 January 1875 was placed in the hands of James E. Stone, the public administration guardian; in 1880 he was living with his uncle, David Nix; in December 1907 moved to Hunter, Woodruff County, AR, where he was buried in the Cotton Plant Cemetery; married Lonia G. Peyton, children – Golda, Mary Ellen, Ruby Irene, Nila Rea, James Monroe & Delta Hall.

- David Nix, 'Davis', was born 25 December 1854 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1860, 1870, 1880, 1900, 1910, 1920 & 1940 censuses of Hancock County, KY. In 1860 he was listed as Davis Nix, age 6, and was in the home of his mother & stepfather, Edward Barbee; in 1870 he was working as a farm hand & was living with Samuel & Eliza Flowers. He married Margaret Angeline Jarboe, 29 October 1872 Hancock County, KY. She was born in February 1847 Hancock County, KY and was the daughter of William Jarboe & Mary Young and granddaughter of Rev. Martin & Margaret Young (Jr.). Angeline died 4 January 1926 Hancock County, KY. In 1940 David was living with his great-granddaughter, Eloise Young & her husband, Jesse W. Dawson. David Nix died 6 February 1947 Hancock County, KY and was buried with his wife in the Jarboe

Cemetery, Hancock County, KY (also referred to as the Dink Clark Cemetery). The 1900 & 1910 censuses reported that three children had been born to Angeline. They were the parents of – Melissa Ann (2 September c1873 – 21 February 1964, buried Mt. Hancock County's Oldest Man Dies

David Nix, of Dukes, in Hancock county, the oldest citizen of the county passed away February 5 at his home, at the age of 101 years.

Mr. Nix had long been a resident of this county and through his long and useful life has marked the changes of time and progress. Born on Christmas day of 1845 fifteen years before the beginning of the Civil War, he witnessed the marked changes that have been characteristic of America.

Living as he did through more than a century of American history he experienced four major wars in which the United States has engaged. He has witnessed the progress of the United States from a weak and unstable country, struggling to establish itself as a great nation, to the present time in which it has reached that status and today, at the time of his passing this Nation stands at the head of all the countries of the world in strength and development. One is led to wonder why one individual among so many is privileged to live as long as did Mr. Nix. We are sure no exact science can enumerate the cause of such longevity, but there must be a reason and we are sure Mr. Nix in his life had something that most of us do not possess; some physical strength beyond the average or some system of living that gave him the added years of survival.

Mr. Nix was ill but a short time before his death.

He is survived by two daughters Mrs. Ivory Corley and Mrs. Wm. Nichols, both of Dukes; four grandchildren, and several great grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted from the Dukes Presbyterian Church, February 8th at, 11:00 a. m., conducted by Rev. Arthur Carter, pastor of the Church. Interment was in the Jarboe Cemetery.

They are listed in the 1840 census of Washington County, KY and 1850 & 1860 censuses of Bullitt County, KY. She died 1860-1880. Jonathan is listed in the 1880 census of Jefferson County, KY; he was reported to be widowed. They were the parents of:
 - Martin Nix was born c1839 KY; married Mahala F. Ash, 5 April 1859 Bullitt County, KY; died 28 June 1918 Jefferson County, KY; buried Penile Cemetery, Jefferson County, KY. Children – John William (1860-1951, married Eliza Ann); Eva (1886-); and a child died infancy.
- 7. Nancy J. Young, daughter of John Young & Margaret Paddock, was born c1825 KY. In the 1860 census Nancy J Young., age 35, is listed in the home of Wolf John & Margaret and in the 1870 census she was listed in the next household after Wolf John & Margaret.

The following death notice was printed in the <u>Springfield Sun</u> (Springfield, KY, Sunday, 16 February 1910): "Mrs. Emeline Smith, one of the oldest women of the county died at the home of her son-in-law, Will Lanham, Monday morning of old age, the deceased having been eighty years of age. The funeral services were conducted by the Rev. R. L. Purdom and the remains were interred at Hilton's graveyard. Mrs. Smith leaves a husband, Mr. Steve Smith and several children." Stephen Smith died 11 January 1913 Washington County, KY. The 1900 census recorded that 8 children had been born to Emeline, all of whom were then living. Their children were:
 - Andrew J. Smith was born 11 April 1852 Washington County, KY; married Marry Lawson; he died 18 May 1919 Parker County, TX, where he was buried in the Spring Creek Cemetery.

She married her first cousin, George Washington Paddock, 20 November 1857 Washington County, KY; they are listed in the 1860 census of Washington County, KY. George, son of Samuel Paddock & Frances Jones, was born 24 December 1834 Washington County, KY; his father was a brother of Eliza Jane's mother. George W., a Union soldier during the Civil War, died during 1864-1870. In the 1870 Washington County census she is listed in the home of her brother, John J. Young's widow, Margaret Elizabeth (Ash) Young. George & Eliza's three children in the 1870 Washington County census were listed in the home of their aunt, Keziah Young Wilson; they were mistakenly listed under the Wilson name. George W. & Eliza were parents of:
 - Margaret Frances Paddock was born 22 July 1861 Washington County, KY; married Eli Mobley, 31 July 1878 Washington County, KY; she died 6 March 1940 Washington County, KY, where she was buried Peter Cemetery.
 - Samuel Allen Paddock was born c1862 Washington County, KY; he died between 1880 & 1900.
 - John Jackson Paddock was born 3 May 1865 Washington County, KY; married Missie Anderson, c1891; he died 21 March 1913 Washington County, KY, where he was buried Pleasant Grove Cemetery.

Eliza Jane (Young) Paddock married 2nd William T. Ash, 25 May 1871 Washington County, KY. The son of William N. Ash & Mary Friddle, he was born in June 1842 Bullitt County, KY and died between 1900-1910. Eliza (Young) Ash died 24 February 1914 Washington County, KY; her death certificate indicates she was buried in the Paddock Cemetery. She & William T. Ash had one child:

- Stith Thomas Ash was born 17 February 1870 Washington County, KY; married his second cousin, Sarah S. Young (1875-1945), 22 August 1892 Bullitt County, KY; Sarah was the daughter of Davis Young & Mary Taylor, of Hancock County, KY and granddaughter of Rev. Martin Young, a brother of Wolf John Young); Stith Ash died 24 June 1942 Lakeland, Jefferson County, KY, he was buried Bethlehem Baptist Church Cemetery, Washington County, KY. Children William David, Samuel R., Lettie K., Margarey, Margaret, Louvena Ellen and two children died infancy.
- 10. Keziah / Katherine Young, daughter of John Young & Margaret Paddock, was born 16 February 1832 KY, married Jeptha Wilson, 13 October 1865 Washington County, KY. Jepthy Wilson, 15, is listed in the home of Jacob & Winney Holderman in the 1860 census of Washington County, KY. Jeptha was a Union soldier during the Civil War. In the 1870 Washington County, KY census she is listed as Kate and is in the household immediately preceding that of Wolf John & Margaret Young; the three Wilson children listed in her home were actually children of her sister, Eliza Jane Young, widow of George W. Paddock. His death certificate records that Jeptha, the son of John & Julia Wilson, was born 1 September 1844 Anderson County, KY and died 22 November 1915 Washington County, KY and was buried there in the Bethlehem Baptist Church Cemetery. In the 1900 census of Washington County he is listed as Jipesy Wilson and his wife as Catheran, they were married 35 years which suggests this is Keziah / Kate Young; they were listed after the family of William Martin Young, a nephew of Kesiah. The 1900 census recorded that one child had been born to Catheran and the child was then living. Keziah appears to have died between 1900-1909. Katherine Young Wilson died 2 February 1908 in Washington County, KY and was buried there in the Bethlehem Baptist Church Cemetery. In the Springfield Sun (Springfield, KY, Wednesday, 5 February 1908) it was reported that "Mrs. Jeptha Wilson died Sunday at her home in the county after a long illness. Services were conducted Monday by Rev. Walker of the Methodist Church. Interment was in Bethlehem Cemetery". On her gravestone her name is inscribed as "Katherine Wilson". Her husband, Jeptha Wilson married 2nd Malissa E. Young (c1878-after 1945), 19 October 1909 Washington County, KY; they are listed in the 1910 census of Washington County. Keziah Young & Malissa Young (1878-after 1945) were first cousins once removed - Malissa was the daughter of Davis Young & Mary Taylor of Hancock County, KY and granddaughter of Rev. Martin Young, who was a brother of Wolf John Young. Malissa married Creed Settles, 31 May 1916 Washington County, KY; in 1945 Malissa was living Peoria, IL.
- 11. John J. Young, son of John Young & Margaret Paddock, was born c1833 Washington County. KY. He is listed in the 1850 & 1860 censuses of Washington County, KY; in 1860 he was listed in household immediately after his parents. He married Margaret Elizabeth Ash, 4 September 1860 Bullitt County, KY. The daughter of William N. Ash & Mary Friddle, she was born c1838 Bullitt County, KY. The 1870 census mortality schedule for Washington County records that John Young died in November 1869 of abscess of the brain; he was age 36 and was a farmer. His widow appears with their three children in the 1870 census of Washington County, KY; in their home was also living, John J.'s sister, Eliza Jane Young Paddock. His widow married Stith Thomas Stumph

(1844-1921), 25 May 1870 Washington County, KY. Margaret Elizabeth died 15 February 1874 and was buried Hall Cemetery, Washington County, KY. John J. & Margaret Elizabeth Young were the parents of:

- Mary E. was born 8 June 1861 Washington County, KY; married Charles S. Gowin, 26 February 1884 Washington County, KY; she died 25 July 1920 and she was buried Valley Cemetery, Spencer County, KY. Children – John William, Julia E. & Charles Wakefield.
- Mahala Frances was bon 8 December 1862 Washington County, KY; married Jeckanias Jicky Hall, 10 December 1878 Washington County, KY; she died 6 March 1945 Washington County, KY, where she was buried in the Hall Cemetery. Children Carter Thomas, Sarah Elizabeth, Charles William & Lucy.
- William Martin was born 28 April 1865 Washington County, KY; married Victoria Sallee, 7 January 1891 Washington County, KY; he died 18 April 1921 Washington County, KY, where he was buried in the Mackville Cemetery. Children Josie Elizabeth, Lillian Myrtle, Willie E., Jimmie Lee & Archie Burnette.

Catherine Young, daughter of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born c1790 in North Carolina. She was reported to be age 70 in the 1860 census of Franklin County, IL. In Breckinridge County, KY she married Jacob Bruner, Jr. on 16 November 1814. Jacob was the son of Jacob Bruner, Sr. (listed in the 1810 & 1820 censuses of Breckinridge County, KY) & Catherine Peckinpaugh. Jacob, Jr. was born c1791 KY. In the 1820 census of Breckinridge County both Jr. and Sr. are listed as household heads. Jacob, Jr. appears in the 1812-1820 tax lists of Breckinridge County. Jacob, Jr. died in 1821 in Breckinridge County, KY. In the 1822 tax list his widow, Catherine, is listed (she was taxed on one horse). On Monday, 18 June 1821 Jacob Bruner, Sr. reported to court that Mrs. Catherine Bruner, widow of his deceased son, Jacob Bruner, was unwilling to administer his estate and wished him to do so (Breckinridge County minute book 3, 1818-1823, p212). Catherine Young Bruner married John Bruner, 12 November 1823 Breckinridge County, KY; bond on their marriage was by Martin Young. John is probably the John, who was a brother of Jacob Bruner, Jr. and who was named in his father, Jacob Bruner, Sr.'s will in 1822. In Jacob, Jr.'s home in the 1820 census there are 3 children – 2 boys under 10 and 1 girl under 10. They are the three children listed below. These heirs are proven by a circuit court suit found in the Hancock County, KY Courthouse Archives Bundle 23, case file #264). In the suit Mrs. Catherine Bruner, Martin Young & his wife, Mary, formerly Bruner brought suit against the heirs of Jesse Isom, dec'd on 30 September 1846. The Isom heirs were listed as Margaret Isom and infant heirs -James, Julia Ann, David, Susanna & Franklin Isom. The plaintiffs were seeking to recover \$35 & interest due from the estate of Washington Bruner, deceased. In the will of Washington Bruner in 1843 he names a half-brother, Jesse Isom. The said Washington Bruner, son of Catherine Bruner, and brother of Mary Young, died in 1843; he was under age and was living with his half-brother, Jesse Isom, also a son of the Catherine Bruner. The Washington Bruner at his death owned a horse that was subsequently sold by Jesse Isom for \$35. Jesse Isom has since departed this life. Jesse Isom's administrator, Minor E. Pate, has since refused to pay the share due the other heirs of Washington Bruner. On 18 April 1848

the court ordered that Minor E. Pate divide the proceeds from Washington Bruner's estate as follows -2/5 to Catherine Bruner, 2/5 to Mary & Martin Young & 1/5 to heirs of Jesse Isom.

1. Jesse Isom was born c1809 Washington County, KY. At the time of his birth a William Isom was a resident of Washington County, KY, who possible is his father. Jesse married Margaret Snider, 24 February 1831 Hancock County, KY. Margaret, daughter of John Snider & Charity Barrack, was born 1800-1804 VA and died in 1878. Jesse died in November 1843 Hancock County, KY. Their children were: James William Isom (31 October 1832 - 29 August 1911 Bryan County, OK, married Mary Reynolds, children -James Frank, David H., Annie & Mary J.); Julia Ann Isom (September 1834 - 19 December 1913, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, married James C. Corley, children spelled their name Cawley; children - Susan A., John, Eldred, James Amos, Margaret H., Edward Wave, Jesse Morgan & Annie Bell); David H. Isom (1836 – 16 January 1862, he enlisted in the Union Army, Co. E, 3rd KY Cavalry on 6 November 1861 at Owensboro, KY and died of typhoid fever on 16 January 1862 at Calhoun, McLean County, KY); Susan Isom (May 1839 - after 1900, married John Calvin Corley, children – Anna, Charles & Virginia R.); and Franklin Isom (17 April 1841 – 24 July 1917, Union soldier during Civil War, buried Hale-Isom Cemetery, Hancock County, KY, married Elizabeth E. Ritchey, children - Idella, Nannie, James David, Charles Jefferson, Jesse Hardin & Lesse F.)

- 2. **Mary Bruner** was born c1816 Breckinridge County, KY. She married her first cousin, Martin Young. [See Martin Young family record on page 89]
- 3. Washington Bruner was born c1822 Breckinridge County, KY. He died single in 1843; leaving as his heirs his mother, one sister and a half-brother.

Barbara Young, daughter of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born 1794-1800. She married Jacob Bruner, 12 February 1812 Breckinridge County, KY. This appears to be Jacob Bruner, Jr., who was the son of Jacob Bruner, Sr. & Catherine Peckinpaugh, and who married Barbara's sister, Catherine Young in 1814. There were only two Jacobs (Sr. & Jr.) in the Breckinridge County, KY tax records during this period and it was not Jacob, Sr., who married Barbara, because his wife, Catherine Peckinpaugh was still living at the time. Barbara possibly died during 1812-1814 prior to Jacob Bruner (Jr.'s) remarriage.

Elizabeth Young, daughter of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born c1793 in North Carolina. She married John William McFall, 21 January 1811 Washington County, KY. Bond on her marriage was by her father, Martin Young. John McFall was born c1788 in Virginia. The following biography was published in the Tobin Township, Perry County, IN section of the book, <u>History of Warrick, Spencer and Perry Counties, Indiana</u> (Goodspeed Bros. & Co, 1885, p790):

JOHN McFALL was born in Hancock County, Ky., October 15, 1820, and is the third child of six boys and seven girls of John and Elizabeth (Young) McFall, the father a native of Virginia and the mother of Kentucky. The father when a boy came to this county, and finally married in Kentucky; and in 1835 moved to Crawford County, Ind. A few years later he came to Boyer's Bottom, this county, but in 1848 bought a quarter section in Tobin's Bottom. The father, in 1810 occupied a fort on Blue river with others as a protection against the Indians, and was only a few days too late to take part in the battle of Tippecanoe in 1811, being on the way. He died in 1865, honored and respected, his wife having preceded him July 2, 1844. Our subject remained with his father until the age of thirty years. January 1, 1850, he married Dorinda, daughter of Hoyt and Frances Humphrey, and to them nine children were born, four now living: Hoyt, Waldo, Peter and Lydia Belle, wife of William Little. He began farming for himself after marriage, and about 1853 bought a grist-mill, which he operated in connection with his farm for about eight years. He now owns sixty-four acres on section 17. August 9, 1878, Mrs. McFall died, since which Mr. McFall has lived with his son Hoyt. He is well respected, is a Republican, and was reared a Baptist.

According to this sketch in 1810 John McFall was sheltering in a fort on the Blue River. The Blue River referred to is a 57-mile-long two-forked stream that runs through Harrison, Crawford and Washington counties in Indiana. The headwaters of the North Fork arise near Salem in Washington County and flow south, and the headwaters of the South Fork arise near New Liberty and flow southwest. The two small forks converge in Fredericksburg. From the confluence, the river flows south until it joins Ohio River in the Harrison-Crawford State Forest, just upstream from Leavenworth, Indiana.

John & Elizabeth McFall soon after their marriage moved with the Young family to the Hancock County, KY area. John is listed in the 1820 census of Breckinridge County, KY, 1830 census of Hancock County, KY, 1829-1837 tax lists of Hancock County, KY, 1840 census of Crawford County, IN, 1850 & 1860 censuses of Perry County, IN. In a delinquent tax list for 1837 it was recorded that John McFall moved to Indiana. John was a farmer. Elizabeth (Young) McFall died in Perry County, IN on 2 July 1844. John McFall married Elizabeth Patterson, 15 February 1851 Hancock County, KY. She was Elizabeth M. Johnson, daughter of Elisha F. Johnson & Leodica Martin, who was born c1805 and was the widow of David B. Patterson (1802-1850); she is listed as being age 44 in the 1850 census of Hancock County, KY. In November 1853 John McFall was granted a divorce from his second wife, Elizabeth (Perry County, IN order book D p361). John married Mrs. Margaret Robinson, 23 August 1854 Perry

County, IN. Margaret was the daughter of Robert Isham Axton & Margaret Carter Dobbs; she was born 25 August 1802 Richmond County, NC; married Henry Henderson Robinson, 25 August 1802 Ohio County, KY. Her husband, Henry Robinson, was murdered on 11 May 1847 while in a canoe on the Ohio River; he and Margaret had six children – Alexander J. P., Artamissa E., James Henry Clay, Benjamin F., Redman W. & Henderson Talmond. Margaret is listed with John McFall in the 1860 census; in their home were listed three of her Robinson children who were mistakenly listed under the McFall name. Margaret Axton McFall died 11 March 1870 Perry County, IN.

The biography published in the 1885 book <u>History of Warrick, Spencer and Perry</u> <u>Counties, Indiana</u> states that John McFall died in 1865. Every tree on Ancestry.com report that he died in 1865. However, his death may actually have been in 1863 and his estate settlement in 1865. In Perry County Order Book 2 (1860-1871) it is recorded that Margaret McFall was appointed the administratrix of the estate of John McFall deceased on 1 September 1863 (see references on pages 171, 176, 179, 251 & 264). On page 290 of the same book at a Common Pleas Court session of 17 May 1865 a report by Margaret McFall, adm'x of John McFall's estate was recorded. The proceeds of his estate were ordered to be divided into eleven parts each of the following to receive 1/11th share: John McFall, DeHart McFall, Joseph McFall, George McFall, Margaret Shickles, Elizabeth Christ, Rose Ann Ranger, Julia A. Walker, heirs of Sallie Johnson deceased, heirs of Susan Minor deceased and Ruth Jarboe. The children of John William McFall and Elizabeth Young were:

- Rosanna McFall was born c1814. The 1850 census gives her birthplace as Indiana but the 1860 census has Kentucky. She married Eli Wales, 28 March 1833 Hancock County, KY. The groom's last name is hard to decipher – it could be Wales, Walls or Wells. Most genealogies have interpreted it to be Wells. However, I believe it is "Wales". Rosanna's daughter, Elizabeth, is clearly listed as Wales in the 1850 census. Rosanna married second Levi Ranger, 21 June 1843 Scott County, MO. Rosanna & Levi are listed in the 1850 & 1860 censuses of Perry County, IN (Tobin Township). Levi was born c1818 Ohio. Levi received a pension for his service in the Union army during the Civil War (Co. D, 12th KY Cavalry). Rosanna was living when her father's estate was settled in 1865. She possibly died during 1865-1868. On 17 November 1868 Rosanna's husband, Levi Ranger, married Eliza Ann (Clark) Tilly. Levi & Eliza appear in the 1870 Perry County, IN census. In 1891 Levi's widow, Eliza, was granted his military pension. Rosanna McFall was the mother of:
 - Elizabeth Wales was born c1837 IN. "Elizabeth Wales", age 13, is listed with her mother in the 1850 census of Perry County, IN.
 - Sarah Ranger was born c1844 IN. She is listed with her parents in the 1850 & 1860 censuses of Perry County, IN. She married Thomas Chambers, 3 November 1865 Perry County, IN. Born in November 1842 Hancock County, KY he was the son of Giles Chambers, Jr. & Sabrina Sellers. Thomas served in the Union army during the Civil War (27th KY Infantry). They are listed in the 1880 census of Vanderburgh County, IN. Thomas Chambers married 2nd Mahala (Lake) Perry, 8 December 1884 Perry County, IN. Thomas died 20 July 1901 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN, where he was buried in the Oak Hill Cemetery. Sarah

Ranger & Thomas Chambers were the parents of – **Cassander** (16 October 1866 – 15 August 1913, buried Oak Hill Cemetery, Evansville, IN, married Frank Fickas, children – Nora Margaret, Beatrice Victoria, Cora M., Frank J. & Ethel Elizabeth); and **Mary** (4 November 1869 – 25 September 1914, buried Oak Hill Cemetery, Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN, married Walter Ostean, children – Phrona Mahali, Walter Thomas, Tony Allen, Chester Franklin & Charlotte).

- Mary Ranger was born c1847 IN. She is listed with her parents in the 1850 census but was not listed in their home in the 1860 census.
- Jackson Ranger was born 1869 IN. He is listed with his parents in the 1850 census but was not listed in their home in the 1860 census.
- 2. Sarah McFall was born c1816. She is reported to be born in Kentucky and was age 33 in the 1850 Hancock County, KY census. She married Elisha F. Johnson, 3 October 1833 Hancock County, KY. He was the son of Elisha F. Johnson, Sr. & Leodocia Martin, who were married 14 October 1802 in Bullitt County, KY. Elisha, Jr. died 1846-1850. Sarah McFall Johnson married Marshall Angel, 9 January 1851. Marshall, son of John Angel, was born c1825 TN, married Sylvania Vaughn, 8 September 1864 Hancock County, KY, he served in the Union Army during the Civil War. He is listed in the 1870 census of Hancock County, KY. A death record in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics records that Sarah Angel died of typhoid fever on 4 January 1856 in Hancock County, KY; she was age 39, born Breckinridge County, KY and was the daughter of John & Elizabeth McFall. Sarah's children included:
 - Rhoda Jane Johnson was born c1834 KY and died after 1854. She married Thomas F. Newhouse, 20 January 1853 St. Genevieve County, MO. They had a son, Joseph Richard Newhouse (11 April 1854 TN – 27 April 1915 Louisville, KY, married Susan E. Cooper, children – Richard G., Jesse Morton, William McKinley, Robert Emerson & Anna S.).
 - Henrietta Johnson was born c1836 KY. Married James A. Sheckell (1840-1909), 11 August 1859 Crawford County, IN; the son of Silas Sheckels & Elizabeth Walker; he was a Union soldier during the Civil War; he is buried Keithsburg Greenmound Cemetery, Mercer County, IL. Henrietta Sheckell in 1900 was a resident of Mercer County, IL. Children Silas Andrew (30 April 1860 17 May 1927, married Dora A. Ellsworth); James Allen (1862 1911, married Josephine Mary Heisler); Addie Bell (14 May 1865 24 July 1933, married Thomas Lawrence Hardin); William Richard (1868 c1898, married Dora A. Ellsworth); Bertha Viola (c1876 , married Benjamin Clinton Green); and ?Adda (c1876 after 1880).
 - James L. Johnson was born c1840 Arkansas.
 - Mary A. Johnson was born c1844 Arkansas
 - Martha Virginia Johnson was born 26 March 1845 KY. She married William Rice Dunn, 4 July 1866 Crawford County, IN. The son of William Dunn & Melissa Jacintha Leas, he was born 9 July 1843 IN and died 17 March 1922 Jackson County, IN. Martha Virginia died 5 March 1912 Louisville, Jefferson County, KY; she and her husband were buried Riverview Cemetery, Seymour,

Jackson County, IN. They had three children – **Marcia Viola** (22 April 1867 – 11 September 1937, married Dr. James Morton Jenkins, children – William Irving, Jesse Morton, & Temple Burch); Dr. Jesse Temple (9 November 1868 – 1 March 1913, married Ida M. Peck); and **Bertha B.** (28 July 1871 – 14 April 1873).

- Nancy Johnson was born 3 May 1846 KY. She married John Wiseman, 23 May 1869 Crawford County, IN. He was born c1847 IL. They are listed in the 1870 census of Franklin County, Kansas. She died 1 April 1872 and was buried in the Fouts Cemetery, Franklin County, KS. Children Mae Henrietta (3 June 1870 14 November 1954 Alameda, CA, married Frank Mesa Pierce and __ Clark).
- 3. Ruth A. McFall was born 3 May 1817. The 1850 census reports she was born in Indiana and the 1860 & 1870 censuses has that she was born in Kentucky. She married Benedict Jarboe, 30 July 1838 Crawford County, IN. Benedict was born 25 July 1816 Breckinridge County, KY. He was the son of Jarrett R. Jarboe (1793-1852) & Elizabeth Jefferson and was the grandson of Benedict Jarboe (c1765-c1828) & Drucilla Coomes. His parents and grandparents former residents of Hardy County, VA moved to Breckinridge County, KY during 1814-1815. They lived in the area of Breckinridge County that became Hancock County in 1829. His father, Jarrett, is buried in the Fairview Cemetery in Hancock County, KY. Benedict, husband of Ruth McFall, is listed in the Hancock County, KY 1838-1852 tax lists and 1840 & 1850 censuses. Benedict was a farmer and is never shown as owning any land. Benedict appears to have died during 1852-1854. Several researchers report he died on 8 July 1852. Dorothy Watkins, author of the genealogy column, "Climb Your Family Tree" that was published during 1968-1989 in the Hawesville, KY newspaper, Hancock Clarion, and who was close friends with many of the Jarboes at Patesville, KY in 1973 wrote in a letter to a McFall descendant, Bettye Henze, that Benedict Jarboe was buried at the Deer Creek Church Cemetery in Perry County, IN and his wife, Ruth McFall Jarboe, was buried in the Young Cemetery on the McMahan farm in Hancock County, KY. A grandson, Arnold Jarboe (1893-1981) said that when his father, Jarrett Jarboe (1846-1921) was five years old his father, Benedict, moved to Deer Creek, in Perry County, IN and he died there and was buried there. This statement corresponds closely to Benedict's disappearance from the Hancock County, KY records. In the annual Hancock tax lists he last appears in 1852 and in 1857 his widow, Mrs. Ruth Jarboe, begins to be listed in his place. Ruth is found in the 1857-1862 tax lists and appears as a household head in the 1860 Hancock County census. In the 1870 Hancock County, KY census Ruth Jarboe, age 70, born KY was reported to be "living in the home" of her daughter-in-law, Susan (Young) Jarboe (1841-1932), who was the widow of Ruth's son, Francis; Susan was also Ruth's first cousin; she was the daughter of Rev. Martin M. Young, who was listed in the next household. Ruth was not found in the 1880 census and apparently had died by then. A grandson, Walter Jarboe (1879-1964), reported that Ruth was buried in the Young Cemetery in Hancock County. The birth dates of Benedict & Ruth Jarboe cited herein are from the Jarboe family bible that in 1983 was in the possession of Malcolm Jarboe (1903-1986) of El Paso, TX, a great-grandson of Benedict & Ruth (see book, Climb Your Family Tree (Genealogical Newspaper Columns In The Hancock Clarion, Hancock County, Kentucky, Vol. I, Dorothy Watkins, Owensboro, KY, Cook & McDowell Publications, 1980, pp64-66). Children of Benedict Jarboe & Ruth McFall were:

Elizabeth Jarboe was born 3 June 1839 Hancock County, KY. She married Francis Marion Riley, 5 September 1861 Hancock County, KY. The son of William & Eliza Riley he was born 26 September 1826 Washington County, KY. On 3 February 1846 in Perry County, IN Francis married Sarah Ann Rosencrants, who died 1854-1861. 



Mr. Sam McFall died at his home, February 4th, of typhoid pneumonia. He leaves a wife and five children and many friends to mourn his loss. He was one of the fercymen at this place, and was a man who had many friends, and was a member of the M. E. church. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. Penrod. His oldest son is absent in the South and did not reach home and does, not know that his father is gone. A kind husband, a good father and neighbor has gone to a better land. He is the first one of that family to be taken away.

After a lingering illness, Mr. Jack Mc-Fall died at the residence of his son on Millstone, Sunday, March 29, 1891, aged 72 years. He has been a resident of Millstone 50 years. For years he has been keeper of the Millstone Government light. He was known to every one as "Uncle Jack." He leaves one daughter and three sons, all married and settled here. Since his wife's death nearly twelve years ago he has made his home most of the time with his oldest son, Hart. The memory of a life devoted to duty, pure and noble in all its attributes, is a more precious inheritance to all his family and kindred than the possession of millions. "A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches." Such was his life and at his coming in Heaven, "Angels' voices sung the memory of their God, and strung their harps to bid him welcome to their midst."

History of Warrick, Spencer and Perry Counties, Indiana (Goodspeed, Bros., and Co., Publishers, Chicago - 1885 pages 811 - 812: William D. Sumner is a native of Dubois County, where he was born September 11, 1840, being the only child born to William and Susan (Comstock) Sumner, natives of Indiana. They were married in Dubois County, where the father died when our subject was but three years old. The mother was remarried again to William Mackey. She is now a widow, and resides in Troy Township, Perry County. The parents belonged to the early families who settled Dubois County. Our subject was reared from the age of six by his Uncle Thomas Taylor, of Clark Township, and continued with him until his enlistment in the army. Having received a good common school education, he enlisted July 3, 1861, in Company E, Twenty-fifth Regiment Indiana Volunteer Infantry, and was discharged at Evansville, November 21, 1862, by reason of the loss of his left forearm in the battle of Shiloh. Returning home he entered school, going some six months, and receiving a high grade of license. He followed teaching in winter for thirteen years, since which he has given his entire attention to farming and stock-raising. He owns ninety three and one-half acres of fertile land well improved. He was united in marriage to Miss Elizabeth J., daughter of William and Susan (Hills) Goble, February 9, 1865, and to these parents four children were born, all dying in infancy. He served in the Union army during the Civil War and received a pension for his service. In 1865 Mrs. Julia A. Walker received her 1/11th part in the settlement of her father's estate. John & Julia are listed in the 1870 census of Rock Island, Perry County, IN and 1880 census of Newburgh, Warrick County, IN. In 1880 they were living on Water Street in the town of Newburgh. In 1870 John was working in a coal mine and in 1880 in a coal bank. Julia

Walker died in September 1888 Vanderburgh County, IN. The Evansville Courier (11 September 1888 p1) reported that Julia A. Walker, age 59, died of general debility and the Evansville Journal (Sunday, 16 September 1888 p5) in a Newburgh community column noted that Mrs. Julia A. Walker, a former resident of Newburgh, was brought here from Evansville for burial, Monday last. John A. Walker died 1 March 1900 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN. A death record had that he died of injuries suffered in a fall, he was a resident of 1318 East Illinois Street in Evansville, he was 74, born in KY, was a coal miner and was buried in Warrick County, IN. - James A. Walker was born 8 September 1856 Breckinridge County, KY. He is probably the same person as Levi Walker, who was reported to have been born on 7 September 1856 in Breckinridge County, KY to John Walker & Julia Ann McFall in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics. James married Margaret Reiling / Rilenge, 24 December 1879 Gallatin County, IL. Margaret was born 10 August 1861 and died 11 January 1937. James A. Walker died 15 March 1942 Shelburn, Sullivan County, IN. His death certificate showed that he was a coal miner and was widowed. He and his wife, Margaret, were buried Center Ridge Cemetery, Sullivan, Sullivan County, IN. They had 7 children and he was survived by 2 sons and 2 daughters. Children Frank Dennis (26 September 1880 8 August 1964, buried Nyes Chapel Cemetery, Farmersburg, Sullivan County, IN, married Pearl South & Fannie A. Burris); Edna May (3 September

Three sons by his marriage to Elizabeth Walker were living with him at the time of 1900 census of Vanderburgh County, IN. She married Charles Edward Cosgrove, 12 July 1904 IN; he was born c1882 IN and died after 1914. Elizabeth Cosgrove is listed in the 1910, 1920, 1930 censuses of Evansville, IN. In 1930 she was employed as a cook at a public school. She died 4 April 1952 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN. She was a widow and was buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Newburgh, Warrick County, IN. - 11. George Washington McFall was born 5 February 1832 Hancock County, KY. His death certificate reports that he was the son of John McFall & Sally Young. Based on this one

record many researchers have concluded that his mother's full name was Elizabeth Sally Young. However, one record alone is not sufficient evidence to make a conclusion. Almost all death certificates have at least one error especially when what is being recalled happened many years before. George is listed in the 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Perry County, IN and 1900 census of Spencer County, IN. He served as a private in the Union army during the Civil War. He was a farmer. He married Mary C. Suddarth, 27 November 1856 Perry County, IN. Mary, daughter of John Suddarth & Candis Wright, was born 6 January 1841 IN and died 20 March 1913 Alton, Crawford County, IN, where she was buried in the Flower Point Cemetery. George died of tuberculosis on 1 January 1907 Hatfield, Spencer County, IN, where he was buried in the Ebenezer Cemetery. The 1900 census recorded that 16 children had been born to Mary, 9 of whom were then living. An obituary of Mary reported she was the mother of 16.

George McFall died very suddenly at his home here Tuesday morning. He was found dead in his bed at 2 o'clock. Coroner Weiss was called from Rockport to hold an inquest. The opinion of that official is that Mr. McFall's death resulted from natural causes, he having been afficted with lung trouble. The funeral was held Wednesday at the M. E. church and the interment was in Ebenezer cemetery. Mr. McFall was 75 years old.

Nancy Susan Young, daughter of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born c1794 in North Carolina. She married John Thomas Bruner, 23 November 1813 Breckinridge County, KY. John T., son of George Peter Bruner & Anna Maria Achenbach, was born 17 June 1787 Jefferson County, KY. John T. is listed as an heir of George in Breckinridge County deed book H, p17. His family after moving to Kentucky about 1785 first resided near Louisville. During 1795-1796 they moved to Hardin County locating in the area that became Breckinridge County, KY in 1799. John T. is listed in the Breckinridge County 1813-1828 tax lists and 1820 federal census; in most years he was listed with his middle initial, "T.", to differentiate him from two other Johns in the county. He is first listed with land in the tax records in 1825. He owned 100 acres on Blackford Creek. Blackford was in the western part of Breckinridge County that in 1829 became part of the new county of Hancock. John T. beginning in 1829 is listed in the tax records of Hancock County and appears there in the 1830, 1840, 1850 and 1860 censuses. In addition to a farm on Blackford Creek he was also taxed prior to 1863 on several slaves, during the 1830's he owned 2 slaves, in 1850 he owned 11 and in 1860 he had 16. John T. died 17 June 1862 and was buried in a cemetery on his farm off of the Hawesville – Knottsville Road near the Blackford Creek Baptist Church in Hancock County. The late family historian Henry Albert Bruner (1906-2001), author of the book, Some Descendants of Joseph Bruner and Cathrina Elizabetha Thomas (1990), of Hawesville, KY stated to this writer in 1982 that the monument of John T. Bruner was on his home place near the Blackford Creek Baptist Church. It was leaning against a tree and is the only monument now found in the family cemetery. His widow, Nancy Susan Bruner died after 1862. She is not listed in the 1870 census and apparently had died by then. In John T. Bruner's will and division of his slaves and land his heirs were named as wife, Susan, and children, John Logan Bruner, William H. Bruner, Martin Bruner, Davis M. Bruner, & George W. Bruner, Caroline Head, Catherine C. Brown, Evaline Rice, Elizabeth Jane Bruner and heirs of Martin Bruner, deceased (Hancock County Will Book 4 p48 & Division of Land book p62).


AT HAWESVILLE HOME

Hawesville, Ky., Sept. 6.-John T. Rice, aged seventy-seven, died here yesterday of cancer of the lip. The malady had barely shown itself until a year ago since which time it has eaten his upper lip and face away ravenously. His father and grandfather both died of the same trouble and he at once became dis-couraged when he began to feel the inroads of the dread disease. He had little confidence in remedies. He was born and reared in this county and has numerous relatives in this and neighboring counties. He mar-ried a Miss Emily Harrison of Meade county now dead, but a large family of adult children survive him.

Davis M. Bruner was born in Hancock county, Kentucky, February 7, 1833. He removed to Meade county, Kentucky, where he lived for many years and engaged in the occupation of farmer. He came to Tell City about a year ago and in connection with Mr. Hughes established a Mattress factory and was engaged in this business until his death. He was an exemplary man having been a member of the Baptist Church and also of the order of Free Masons the greater part of his life. Though he has suffered much with sickness this past year his death was unexpected to his numerous friends. Davis M. Bruner was a man of fine special qualities and during his short residence in Tell City, which was of honor and uprightness, he had many warm friends and no enemies. He was esteemed and respected by all and his loss, inestimable to his friends. He leaves a wife and four children to mourn his departure and cherish his memory. He has departed from his friends but his memory will ever be fresh to those who knew him best.

Okla., and the others reside here. He was a good citizen and was enthusiastic in his support of his Baptist church, Masonic fraternity and Republican party. 

Jacob Young, son of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born c1795 in North Carolina. He is listed in the 1816-1828 tax lists and 1820 census of Breckinridge County, KY. Jacob next appears in the 1829 & 1830 tax lists and 1830 census of Daviess County, KY. During 1830-1831 he moved to Jefferson County, IL, where he appears in the 1840 census. He may have been residing in the state of Indiana during 1840-1846, where four of his children were born according to the listing of his family in the 1860 census. Between 1846-1847 he returned to Kentucky. He appears in the 1847-1854 tax lists of Hancock County, KY and 1855-1860 tax lists of Daviess County, KY. In 1853, Jacob Young & wife, Frances, of Hancock County, KY sold two tracts of land, 50 & 91 acres, in Hancock County, KY and in 1857 Jacob Young & wife, Frances, of Daviess County, KY sold 91 acres in Hancock County, KY. Jacob & Frances and 4 children are listed in the 1860 census of Daviess County, KY; he was reported to be native of

North Carolina and was a farmer. In 1860 he was residing near the Blackford Creek and the Hancock County line.

Jacob Young married Charlotte Bruner, 15 November 1815 Perry County, IN. She was born 1790-1795 KY and died during 1831-1837. She may be the daughter of Jacob Bruner & Catherine Peckinpaugh. Jacob Young married 2nd Elizabeth Sanders, 5 January 1838 Jefferson County, IL. He married Frances Page, 25 July 1839 Franklin County, IL. Frances, daughter of Joel Page & Rebecca Moore, was born 27 July 1803 Woodruff, Spartanburg County, SC. Frances married first Enoch Richey, 3 June 1823 Hamilton County, IL. Frances Page Young died 1860-1863 and was buried Middle Fork Cemetery, Franklin County, IL. Two brothers of Frances married daughters of Jacob Young. Frances's son, George W. Richey married Sarah Ann Williams, 30 January 1853 Hancock County, KY; he was age 20, born Illinois and his stepfather, Jacob Young, gave consent for him to marry.

The following record of the estate of Jacob Young, deceased was recorded in Franklin County, IL on 31 December 1860 (Estate Book B page 19)

This document records that Jacob Young died on 12 December 1860 and lists the names of his 12 children. By the fact the record was recorded in Franklin County his death probably

occurred there. Henry Jackson Page (1841-1917), a grandson, of Jacob wrote that "Jacob Young died at the writers fathers house in 1863." The writer's parents, Jeremiah & Margaret (Young) Page were living in Franklin County, IL at the time of the 1860 census. Jacob's died not long after he had returned to Illinois. On 5 July 1860 he was enumerated in the census of Daviess County, KY. By 29 November 1860 he had left Kentucky. On this date his son, Jacob Young, Jr. married Eleanor Fulkerson in Hancock County, KY and on the marriage license it was written that the mother of the young man gave consent in person, his father being absent from this state (Hancock County, KY marriage book 2, p18).

Henry Jackson Page (1841-1917), grandson of Jacob & Charlotte (Bruner) Young, was a family historian. A collection of his research on the family was posthumously published in a 47-page booklet, <u>Genealogical History of the Page Family: A Record of the Descendants of Robert Page of South Carolina</u>. The following entry from the booklet appeared on pages 11-12:

Francis Page oldest Daughter of Joel and Rebecca Page Borned July 27-1803 Maried Jacob Young. They had 2 Children Jacob Young Jur. And Theophalous Young Dates of Births not Known to writer Young. Jacob was Maried in Hancock Co Ky wifes name not know she Died in Franklin Co Illinois of small Pox about the year 1863. Theophalous Young Died single. Both Jacob and Theophalous both were soldiers in the Union Army in the War between the states. during the war in 1862 Jacob Young was a Refugee From Hancock Co to Franklin Co Illinois. Jacob Young Died at the writers Fathers House in 1863. Mary had a son, John Punkney Estes (1843-1901). In 1880 Henry was living Jefferson County, IL. Children:

Martin M. & Margaret Young, of Hancock County, KY. "Jr." does not always mean son of but frequently is used to distinguish someone from another older person of the same name in the same county. He is proven to be a son of Jacob Young by Jacob's estate records that list him as an heir and also in documents proving the heirs of Rev. Martin Young he is not listed (see Hancock County, KY deed book 27, p68 & Hancock County, KY Circuit Court records, bundle 292 case file #2345). Martin married Mary Bruner, 10 February 1846 Hancock County, KY; they were married by his uncle, Rev. Martin M. Young. Mary, daughter of Jacob Bruner, Jr. & Catherine Young, was born c1816 Breckinridge County, KY and died after 1880 [see page 33]. Martin and Mary were first cousins. Martin is listed in the 1845-1854 tax lists of Hancock County, KY, 1860 census of Franklin County, IL, and 1870 & 1880 censuses of Jefferson County, IL. On 10 August 1853 he was granted land in Jefferson County, IL. Children:
 - **Catherine Young** was born 1847 Hancock County, KY. She married Thomas J. Smith, 18 December 1889 Jefferson County, IL and Ezekiel Boster, 8 February 1894 Jefferson County, IL. She died 12 April 1910 Adams County, IL. She was buried Sunset Cemetery, Quincy, Adams County, IL.
 - female **Young** was born & died 20 May 1852 Hancock County, KY.

- 7. **Catherine Young** was born 1830 IL. Three census reports give her birth place as in Illinois and one other gives Kentucky. She married Jesse Calvin Page, 7 August 1848 Franklin County, IL. Jesse, son of Joel Page & Rebecca Moore, was born 22 March 1827 Jefferson County, IL. Jesse is listed in the 1850, 1860 & 1870 censuses of Franklin County, IL. He served in the Union army during the Civil War. He died 20 July 1876 and Catherine died 26 December 1897. They were buried in the Thurmond Cemetery, Franklin County, IL. Children:
 - Malinda Page was born 1850 Franklin County, IL. She died in 1890 and was buried Thurmond Cemetery, Franklin County, IL.
 - John Page was born 29 January 1852 Franklin County, IL. He married Estella Caroline Hale, 17 February 1874 Jefferson County, IL. John died 16 April 1919 Franklin County, II, where he was buried in the Elder S. M. Williams Cemetery.
 - Sarah Ann Page was born 1854 Franklin County, IL. She married Pleasant Anderson Thacker, 26 June 1880 Franklin County, IL. She died 1896-1900.
 - Mary C. Page was born in 1858 Franklin County, IL. She died after 1880.
 - Jacob Logan Page was born 14 February 1859 Franklin County, IL. He married Nancy Overturf, 5 September 1886 Franklin County, IL. He died 10 September 1938 Dixon, Lee County, IL. He was buried Overturf Cemetery, Franklin County, IL.
 - Kissiah Frances Page was born 14 February 1859 Franklin County, IL. She married Monroe Woodson Clark. She died 1893-1900. She was buried Thurmond Cemetery, Franklin County, IL.

- 8. John H. Young, 'Blue John', was born 9 October 1831 Jefferson County, IL. He married his first cousin, Agnes Young, 21 December 1854. [See family record on page 173].
- 9. Jacob Young was born c1840 IL. He is listed in his parents' home in the 1860 census of Daviess County, KY. He married Eleanor Fulkerson, 29 November 1860 Hawesville, Hancock County, KY. Eleanor, daughter of George Washington Fulkerson & Rachel Riggs, was born 12 April 1842 Daviess County, KY. Jacob's nephew, Henry Jackson Page, wrote that Jacob, Jr.'s wife died in Franklin County, IL of smallpox about 1863. Jacob served in the Union army during the Civil War. He was mustered in the 60th Illinois Infantry on 17 February 1862; at his entry into service he was age 22, married, a farmer and resident of Benton, Franklin County, IL. While in the service he died of disease on 6 January 1865 at Louisville, Jefferson County, KY. He was buried the Cave Hill National Cemetery, Louisville, KY (US National Cemetery Interment Control Forms, Ancestry.com).
- 10. Lydia Young was born c1842 II. She is listed in her parents' home in the 1860 census of Daviess County, KY and is listed as a surviving child in Jacob Young, Sr.'s estate papers in 1860.
- 11. **Theopholis Young** was born c1844 IL. He is listed in his parents' home in the 1860 census of Daviess County, KY. He served in the Union army during the Civil War. He was mustered in the 60th Illinois Infantry on 22 February 1864; he was 20 and a resident of Benton, Franklin County, IL at the time of his enlistment. He was mustered out of service on 31 July 1865 at Louisville, KY. He died after 1866. His nephew, Henry Jackson Page, wrote that he died single.
- 12. **Rebecca Young** was born c1846 IL She is listed in her parents' home in the 1860 census of Daviess County, KY and is listed as a surviving child in Jacob Young, Sr.'s estate papers in 1860.

George Young, son of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born c1800 Washington County, KY. The 1850 census records that George Young, age 50, born KY was a farmer. He is listed in the Breckinridge County tax lists of 1824, 1827 & 1828; he is absent from the 1825 & 1826 lists. Upon the formation of Hancock County in 1829 he begins to appear in the records there. He is listed in the Hancock County, KY censuses of 1830, 1840 & 1850 and in the 1829-1851 tax lists of Hancock County, KY. He is not found in any of the Hancock County deed books. About 1825 he married Sarah; she was born c1805 KY and died after 1870. George & Sarah's marriage has not been located. It was possibly in Breckinridge County, where the marriage books prior to 1852 were lost at the time of a fire at the courthouse in 1958. In various family trees and records Sarah's maiden name is given as Sanders, Johnson, Whitener and Shelby. The death certificate of her daughter, Ruth Corley, lists her as Sallie Sanders, and on the death certificate of her son, James Thomas Young, it appears as Sarah Johnson. There indeed was a George Young, who married Sarah Shelby, but their marriage was in Virginia in 1792. Without further proof other than one single record I would not venture a conclusion as to Sarah's identity.

In Hancock County, KY Order Book 5 (pages 169-170) the following entry was made for the court session on 22 September 1851:

It is suggested in Court that George Young is a lunatic and now confined in the Lunatic asylum at Lexington and that he has some small estate in this county. It is therefore ordered that James Sanders be and is hereby appointed curator to take charge of said estate. That he sell at public sale on a credit of six months the perishable property taking bonds with good surety to himself and that he make a report of the notes taken and an inventory of the estate not sold to this court at the next. Ordered that the clerk of this court bind out David Young & James T. Young infant children of George Young, a lunatic now confined in the Lunatic asylum, to Peter Bruner Sr. until they are 21 years of age with the lawful covenants and in addition that said Bruner give to each of them a horse saddle & bridle worth \$50 at the end of the term of service each with a proviso that if said George Young should return & be restored to sound mind and be considered by the court capable of taking care of his said children & pay the said Peter Bruner the amount the amount of reasonable expenses & trouble over & above the services of said children to be judged of by the court inactions to be void.

In 1854 the Western Lunatic Asylum was established at Hopkinsville, Christian County, KY. Subsequently many of the inmates at the Eastern Lunatic Asylum in Lexington, KY were transferred to the new asylum. In the 1860 Federal census George Young was not found. In the 1870 & 1880 censuses in the listings for the Western Kentucky Lunatic Asylum there was a George Young listed. His ages were listed as 58 and 67, his place of birth was given as Kentucky and the 1880 census reported that he was married. I believe this is probably the George Young, of Hancock County, who had been committed to the Lexington Asylum in 1851. Proof possibly could be found in the ledgers of the various Kentucky lunatic asylums that are stored at the Kentucky State Library & Archives in Frankfort, KY.

In the 1852-1853, 1857-1859, 1863-1864 & 1867 Hancock County tax lists George Young's wife, Mrs. Sarah (Sally) Young, appears in his place. Sarah signed consent for the marriages of her daughters, Ruth, in 1854 and Elizabeth in 1866. Sarah Young appears in the 1870 Hancock County census; with her are her three youngest sons, David, Thomas & Adam. Sarah was not living with any of children at the time of the 1880 census and probably had died during 1870-1880.

Children of George & Sarah Young are:

 Nancy Ann Young was born c1829 Hancock County, KY. She married James T. Sanders, 23 September 1847 Hancock County, KY. George Young, father of the young lady, gave consent in person for Nancy to marry. James, son of Silas Sanders & Frances, was born in August c1824 Illinois. His parents in 1820 lived Smith County, TN, in 1830 in Marion County, IL and by 1834 they were living in Jefferson County, IL, where his widowed mother, Franky, is listed in the 1840 census. Three siblings of James also married into the Young family – Theophilus Sanders married Charlotte Young (daughter of Jacob Young & Charlotte Bruner), Lydia Sanders married Henry M. Young (son of Jacob Young & Charlotte Bruner) and John Sanders married Elizabeth Susan Young (daughter of George Young & Sarah). James T. Sanders came to Hancock County, KY circa 1846 at about the same time Nancy Young's uncle Jacob Young returned there after living several years in Illinois. James Sanders is listed in the 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880 & 1900 censuses of Hancock County, KY. Nancy Ann (Young) Sanders died during 1864-1868, James Sanders married Ruth Elmira (Bruner) Hale, 18 November 1868 Hancock County, KY. Ruth, daughter of George Washington Bruner & Mary Davis, was born 1 January 1825 Breckinridge County (later Hancock County) KY; she married first William Hale, Jr. (c1820-1861), 28 October 1841 Hancock County, KY. James Sanders died 29 August 1901 Indian Hills, Hancock County, KY. <u>Hancock Clarion</u> (Hawesville, KY, Saturday, 31 August 1901) – "Floral: Old Uncle Jimmy Sanders died Thursday of heart trouble, after a long illness. His funeral was preached by Rev. R. T. Bruner of Owensboro." By his will he left his farm and stock to his wife, Ruth. Ruth died 13 March 1919 Daviess County, KY. She was buried with her husband, James Sanders, in Hancock County in the Sanders – Hale Cemetery, off of the Indiana Hills Road a short distance west of the Hawesville – Pellville Road. The late David Arthur Sanders (1892-1985), of Fordsville, KY had a record of the names and births of the children of his grandparents, Nancy Ann Young & & James T. Sanders. Their children were:

- Sarah Jane Sanders was born 4 February 1848 Hancock County, KY. She married Elisha J. Nix, 21 November 1867 Hancock County, KY. [See Elisha J. Nix family record on page 25]
- Rhoda Frances Sanders was born 7 November 1850 Hancock County, KY. She • married David George Hale, 25 November 1868 Hancock County, KY. David, son of William Hale, Jr. & Ruth Elmira Bruner, was born 19 September 1845 Hancock County, KY. During 1883-1886 he moved to Union County, IL. David died 16 January 1940 Wolf Lake, Union County, IL. Rhoda died 18 June 1921 Wolf Lake, Union County, IL. They were buried Walker Hill Cemetery, Grand Tower, Jackson County, IL. - 2. Horace Young was born June 1831 Hancock County, KY. He married Hester V. Hale, 6 May 1854 Hancock County, KY. Hester, 'Hettie', was the daughter of Job Hale & Frances Love, who were married 28 August 1824 in Montgomery County, VA. Hester was born 15 October 1834 Montgomery County, VA and came with her parents to Hancock County, KY about 1844. On the marriage of Horace & Hester it was recorded that their ages were 23 & 19 and her father gave his consent in person. Horace was found first in the Hancock County, KY tax lists in 1855. He is missing from the annual tax lists during 1865-1868 during that time his family resided in Spencer County, IN. Horace, a farmer, is listed in the 1860, 1870, 1880 & 1900 censuses of Hancock County, KY. He purchased 59 acres in Hancock County in 1863 and when he sold the same on 8 February 1865 he was a resident of Spencer County, IN. In 1884 Horace divorced Hettie (Hancock County, KY Circuit Court suits - bundle 184, case file #1698). On 20 October 1883 in Hancock County he filed for a divorce. He testified that his wife was then a non resident of the state; in 1881 he moved his family to Leitchfield, Grayson County, KY and resided there about one year and while he was on a business trip to Hancock County his wife fled with another man. Horace's brother, Tom Young, in suit testified that when Horace went back to Grayson County to bring his family back to Hancock County in the fall of 1881 his wife refused to go with him and he heard that she left Leitchfield with Dr. Gordon and went to parts unknown. In Hancock County on 18 May 1884 Horace married his first cousin, Mrs. Susan (Young) Jarboe. Susan, daughter of Rev. Martin M. & Margaret Young, was born 15 February 1841 Hancock County, KY. Susan was the widow of Francis M. Jarboe [see Francis M. Jarboe family record on page 184]. Horace died 20 July 1903. The following death notice was published in the Owensboro Messenger (Owensboro, KY, Sunday, 26 July 1903 p3): "Hancock County - Uncle Horace Young, one of the oldest men of the community, died Monday night and was buried Tuesday in the old family burying ground near Mt. Eden." Mrs. Pearl Young Wright (1912-1998), of Owensboro in an interview in 1981 said that her grandfather, Horace Young, was buried in the Jarboe Cemetery, also called the Dink Clark Cemetery, in Hennen Hollow, near Dukes, in Hancock County. Mrs. Wright's brother, Earl Young (1917-2010), used to care for the cemetery. Horace's wife, Susan Young died 21 February 1932 Hancock County, KY, where she was buried in the Mt. Eden Baptist Church Cemetery. Hester (Hettie), wife of Horace Young, after their divorce lived with her son, Shadrack Young, in Tennessee. She is listed in his home in the 1900 census of Hawkins County, TN. In this record she was reported to be widowed and was the mother of 7 children only two were then living. She and Shadrack were buried in the Poplar Springs Cemetery, Poplar Springs, Roane County, TN. Her monument has the inscription "Hetta V. Young born 15 October 1838 and died 1912." Horace Young had 7 children by Hester Hale, and 1 child by Susan Young:

3. Ruth Angeline Young was born October c1833 Hancock County, KY. She married George M. Williams, 7 December 1854 Hancock County, KY. Her mother signed her consent for her to marry. They are listed in the 1860 census of Hancock County, KY. George Williams was born c1831 Tennessee. George died in 1864 during the Civil War at Newman, GA. Unlike many relatives of his wife, including a first cousin and her second husband, he served in the Confederate army. John W. Blackburn in the article, "The Civil War: County Men Responded to Call" (Hancock Clarion, Hawesville, KY, 75yh Anniversary Edition) wrote: "George M. Williams was wounded at Chickamauga

[fought in September 1863]. George was a Corporal in Company G of the Ninth Regiment [Orphans Brigade]. He had been in all the battles of his regiment up to Chickamauga but he was to be in no more. He was never able to report for duty and died, at Newman, Ga., the following summer." In Hancock County on 5 November 1864 his widow, Ruth A. Williams, was appointed administratrix of his estate. Ruth is listed as Angeline Williams in the 1870 census of Hancock County, KY; in her home were her four daughters, they were listed immediately after the residence of her mother, Sarah Young. Ruth is also listed in the 1880, 1900 & 1910 censuses of Hancock County. Ruth married Henry Franklin Corley, 8 March 1885 Hancock County, KY. 'Frank' Corley was the widower of Ruth's sister, Mary Young. Ruth Corley died 20 November 1917 Hancock County, KY. Her death certificate gives her place of burial as the Baker Cemetery (Patesville, Hancock County, KY). However, Teanie Corley Coon (1904-1997), reported to this writer that her grandparents, Frank Corley & Mary Young and his second wife, Ruth Young, were buried in the Jarboe Cemetery, Dink Clark farm, Hancock County, KY. The 1900 & 1910 censuses record that Ruth was the mother of 4 children, one of whom was then deceased. They were:

On his marriage it was written he was the son of George Young; this was probably added in order to distinguish him from two first cousins of the same name, who were living in the county. Eliza, daughter of Job Hale &

Frances Love, was born c1840 Montgomery County, VA. Eliza's sister, Hester V. Hale, married Martin's older brother, Horace Young. Martin is listed in the 1850, 1870, 1880, 1900 & 1910 censuses of Hancock County, KY. He first appears in the Hancock County tax lists in 1857. After his name in the 1859 Hancock tax list it was written that he was crippled. In 1880 his occupation was given as farmer and in 1900 as fur dealer. In the 1880 census following his name it was written "leg shot off". Several older relatives I interviewed recalled him as being crippled and walking on crutches. In the membership records of the Patesville Baptist Church it is recorded that Martin & Eliza Young were received as members and Eliza died 22 March 1899. In 1892 Martin purchased a lot in the town of Patesville and sold it in 1904. In 1900 Martin was living with his niece, Sarah Jane (Williams) and her husband, John Jackson Young. In 1902 he was living with his nephew, Fred Young, in the town of Patesville, Hancock County, KY. In 1902 he and Fred Young were operating a grocery – ice cream parlor in Patesville. In 1904 he went to Narrows, in Ohio County, KY to reside with his nephew, William Silus Sanders, whose son, David, recalled him living with them. In 1910 Martin was living at the Hancock County, KY Poor Farm on River Road in the northern part of the county; he was reported to be a pauper. Martin died of chronic diabetes on 29 June 1916 Hancock County, KY. His death certificate reported that he was a pauper, was the son of George Young and was buried Pellville. The informant on his death certificate was Davis Nix, who was related to him in multiple ways.

Wheat threshing is in full blast in this neighborhood.

Mr. Martin Young got his leg hurt again. He was where they were threshing wheat for Mr. Corley, and, while walking around, fell over a sack of wheat, knocking his kneecap down. He is very poorly at this writing. Dr. Rafferty is the attending physician.

Breckenridge News, Cloverport, KY, Wednesday, 29 March 1899 p5 Patesville community column:

The death angel visited our little town Tuesday night and claimed for its victim Mrs. Nart Young. She was fifty-six years and in apparantly good health. She ate a hearty supper and retired early Her husband awoke about midnight and found her drawing her last breath. It is thought apoplexy was the cause of her death. Mrs. Young was a good woman and will be missed in this place. Her bereaved husband has the sympathy of the community. Owensboro Inquirer, Owensboro, KY, Thursday, 30 March 1899 p2 Pellville community column: Mart Young's wife, near Patesville, killed herself one night last week, by taking a double dose of morphine, to cure neuralgia.

- 5. David Young, 'Davis', was born c1838 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1850 (age 12), 1860 (age 18) and 1870 censuses (age 26) of Hancock County, KY. In family trees he is frequently confused with his first cousin, Davis T. Young (son of Michael), who was about the same age; Davis T. in most records is listed with the middle initial T., which readily distinguishes him from George Young's son. In the 1860 census David and his younger brother, J. T. Young, were living at the residence of Peter Bruner and after their names was written "bound". In 1851 he and James T. Young were apprenticed to Peter Bruner, Sr. until they reached the age of 21. David did not marry in Hancock County and he was last identified in Hancock County, KY records in the 1875 tax list.
- 6. Mary Young, 'Polly', was born c1840 Hancock County, KY. She married Henry Franklin Corley, 'Frank', 22 November 1866 Hancock County, KY. They were married at her mother, Sarah Young's residence. Frank, son of Ranson Corley & Nancy Lyons, was born April 1840 Shelby County, IL. His parents were married 17 January 1830 in Hancock County, KY. Frank Corley is listed in the Hancock County, KY censuses in 1850, 1860 (spelled Cawley), 1870, 1880, 1900 & 1910. He served in the Union army during the Civil War; he enlisted in the 12th KY Calvary on 5 September 1862. Mary Young Corley died 1876-1880. Frank Corley in the 1880 census was reported to be widowed and living with him were their six children. He married his wife's sister, Ruth Angeline (Young) Williams, 8 March 1885 Hancock County, KY. Frank died 8 November 1919 Hancock County, KY. His death certificate reported he was buried Mt. Eden Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. Teanie Corley Coon (1904-1997), reported to this writer that her grandparents, Frank Corley & Mary Young and his second wife, Ruth Young, were buried in the Jarboe Cemetery, Dink Clark farm, Hancock County, KY. Also the WPA's Registration of Veterans Graves for Hancock County reports he was buried in the Jarboe Cemetery.

John Sanders, veteran of the Civil War and for many years a resident of this city, died Mondav morning after an illness extending over several weeks. Mr. Sanders was born in Jefferson county, Ill., October 14, 1834, where the family resided for several years. In the year 1866 he was united in marriage with Miss Susie Young who departed this life in 1881. To this union were born eight children, four of whom survive, viz: James Sanders and Mrs. Ella Sudduth of Salem, Mrs. Sarah Holmes of Pottsville, Ky., and George Sanders of Troy, Ky. After his marriage and removal to this city Mr. Sanders entered the employ the O. & M. Ry. Co. (new B. & 0 S-W.) and was one of the first men to take a train over the Cincinnati division. Funeral service was held on Tuesday afternoon conducted by Rev. W. T. Morris, and members of J. S. Chandler Post G. A. R. assisted in the service and officiated as active pall bearers. Interment occurred at East Lawn cemetery.

- 9. George Adam Young, 'Neezer', was born c1851 Hancock County, KY. Adam Young (age 18) is listed with his mother, Sarah Young, in 1870 census of Hancock County, KY. He is first listed in the Hancock County, KY tax lists in 1874 (appears as Nezer). He married Sarah Jane Holmes, 2 March 1878 Hancock County, KY; on his marriage record his name is given as George Young. He appears as George A. Young (age 28) in the 1880 Hancock County, KY census; wife him was his wife, Sarah Jane, their daughter, Elizabeth, and his mother-in-law, Elizabeth Holmes. His wife, Sarah Jane, was the daughter of James Holmes & Elizabeth Felker, who were married in Bullitt County, KY

on 26 September 1849. Sarah Jane was born 29 April 1860 Bullitt County, KY, came to Hancock County by 1870 and died 8 September 1884. Her monument at the Baker Cemetery, at Patesville, Hancock County, has her name as "Sara J., wife of George A. Young." Neezer Young and Mrs. Arminda (Hale) Young (1857-1938) during the 1890's lived together. She was the widow of Nathaniel Young (1839-1884), a first cousin of Neezer. In the 1897 school records of Hancock County George A. Young's daughter, Lizzie B. (age 17) was listed as a student at the Floral School also at the same time Jacob Young, son of Mrs. Arminda Young, was a student at the Floral school. Neezer Young probably died during December 1899. Funeral services for Mr. Gabbert will be conducted Monday at 2 p. m. in the Chapel of the Davis Funeral home by Rev. Joseph W. Head, pastor of the Lewisport Baptist church, with burial in the Elmwood cemetery.

Pallbearers will be employes of the Ideal Pure Milk company.

Harry Lee Gabbert in an interview on 20 June 1993 told this writer that his parents, Ira Gabbert and Elizabeth Young had five children. The two oldest, a boy and girl, were born 1900-1903 and died before 1909; they were buried Bethlehem Baptist Church Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. They were also parents of **Truman Edgar** (1 January 1904 – 17 September 1972, buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, married Minnie Ford, Dorothy Louisa Morris & Goldie Vincent); **Maude Frances** (30 May 1906 – 17 December 1983, buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, married Willis Bowman & Thurman Boling); and **Harry Lee** (3 June 1909 – 21 November 1996, buried Deanefield Baptist Church Cemetery, Ohio County, KY, married Lula Alma Haskins).

Michael Young, son of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born c1802 Washington County, KY. He is first listed as a male age 21 or older in the tax lists of Breckinridge County, KY in 1823 and appears in the annual tax records there through 1828. He appears in Hancock County, KY's first tax list in 1829. He is there in 1830 list and in the 1830 federal census. He is absent from the 1831-1843 Hancock County tax records. In Hancock County order book 1 (1829-1836), p132, at a court on 28 November 1831 a list of delinquents for county levy for 1830 was recorded and in the list was entered "Mike Young moved to Illinois." Michael appears in the 1840 census of Franklin County, IL. His brother, Jacob Young, in the 1840 census is shown in the adjoining county of Jefferson and in subsequent years members of Jacob's family were back and forth between the two counties. Records show that five of Michael's children born during the period of 1832-1844 were born in Illinois (1850 census and a marriage record in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics records that his daughter, Eliza, was born c1832 in Jefferson County, IL). Michael about 1844 returned to Hancock County, KY, where he listed in the 1844-1867 tax lists and 1850 & 1860 censuses.

Michael Young married Nancy Bruner, 26 September 1822 Breckinridge County, KY. Nancy, daughter of George Washington Bruner & Patsey Brickey, was born c1804 Breckinridge County, KY. In the 1852-1861 vital statistics recorded by the state of Kentucky there was a death record for Michael's wife. It recorded that Mrs. Nancy Young died on 14 September 1858 in Hancock County, she died of congestive chills due to consumption at the age of 53, she was a farmer's wife, born Breckinridge County, KY and was the daughter of George & Patsey Bruner. Michael Young was a farmer and the Hancock County, KY deed books show that he purchased a 59-acre farm in 1858 from Robert Triplett's executors and he sold the same in 1862 to George W. McAdams. The county's tax records show he was assessed on this land during 1852-1862. Michael Young died 28 September 1868. His death date and that of his wife, Nancy (14 September 1858), were recorded in a Nix – Young family bible. Copies of the family pages in the bible were sent by Clifton H. Nix (1925-1988), of Cook Station, MO to Mildred Frances White of Cloverport, KY and to the Hancock County Archives in Hawesville, KY. Mr. Nix is the son of John Thomas Nix & Sarah Elizabeth Filback, grandson of Andy Filback & Mary Elizabeth Young, great-grandson of Martin V. Young & Narcissa Angel and great-greatgrandson of Michael Young & Nancy Bruner.

Michael Young & Nancy Bruner had 8 children, who lived to maturity. They were:

- Peter B. Young was born c1825 Breckinridge County, KY. He was possibly named after his uncle, Peter B. Bruner (1806-1879). He first begins to be listed in the Hancock County, KY tax lists in 1846, when he was then age 21. He married his first cousin, Evaline Young, 2 September 1847 Hancock County, KY. Evaline, daughter of Rev. Martin M. & Margaret Young, was born c1828 Breckinridge County, KY; her father signed his consent for her to marry. Peter & Evaline are listed in the 1850 & 1860 Hancock County, KY censuses. Beginning in 1853 he was taxed on land on Blackford Creek and on 17 January 1865 Peter B. Young, and wife Evaline, sold their farm of 64 acres on Blackford Creek to George W. McAdams for \$800. He is last listed in the county's tax lists in 1866. Peter & Evaline Young and 8 children are listed in the 1870 census of Vanderburgh County, IN. He was a farmer. Of the children listed the first 7, thru Susan, age 3, were born in Kentucky, and the youngest, Martin, age 1, was born in Illinois. No further trace of their family was found. Peter B. & Evaline Young were parents of:
 - Eliza Jane Young was born c1848 Hancock County, KY and died after 1870.
 - Mary Margaret Young was born c1850 Hancock County, KY and died after 1870.
 - John W. Young was born 2 May 1853 Hancock County, KY and died after 1870.
 - Fannie Young was born 1 May 1856 Hancock County, KY and died after 1870.
 - Maria Ann Young was born 12 August 1858 Hancock County, KY and died 1860-1870.
 - Jane Young was born c1861 Hancock County, KY and died after 1870.

 - Martin Young was born c1868 Illinois and died after 1870.

- 2. Martin V. Young was born c1828 Breckinridge County, KY. He is first listed in the Hancock County, KY tax records in 1849 and is in the 1850 & 1860 Hancock County censuses. In most records he is listed with his middle initial 'V.' to distinguish him from two first cousins who were also named Martin and were residents of Hancock County (sons of Jacob & George). Martin V. married Narcissa Angel, 11 April 1852 Hancock County, KY. Narcissa, daughter of John & Elizabeth Angel, was born c1834 KY and died 1860-1870. Martin served as a private in the Union army during the Civil War. He enlisted in Company D of the 27th KY Infantry on 20 October 1861. He died of pneumonia at the regimental hospital at Pittsburgh Landing, TN on 26 or 30 April 1862. He was buried Shiloh National Military Park, Shiloh, Tennessee. In the same company were several residents of Hancock County, KY, including several relatives - Davis T. Young (1840-1907, his brother), ('Blue') John Young (1831-1919, 1st cousin, son of Jacob Young), William M. Young (1836-1882, 1st cousin, son of Rev. Martin Young), John Nix (1839-1917, 1st cousin once removed, grandson of Wolf John Young) and John Jarboe (1844-1862, 1st cousin once removed, grandson of Rev. Martin Young. All had enlisted on the same day. About two weeks before Martin V's death, John Jarboe had died of disease in a hospital at Evansville, IN. On 31 January 1863 Michael Young (Sr.) was appointed guardian for Michael, Elizabeth, David, Martha Jane and Sarah Ann Young, the children of his son, Martin V. Young (Hancock County, KY Guardian Bond Book, 1863 to 1874, pp1-9). Nathaniel Young was appointed guardian for Elizabeth, David, Martha Jane & Sarah Ann Young, minors, on 26 September 1874 (in the same book p391). Nathaniel Young (1839-1884, son of Rev. Martin) was a first cousin of the children's father. Martin V. Young's son, Michael, was not included in the latter document because he was then age 21 and was no longer a minor. Two of Martin V. Young's children, Michael & Mary Elizabeth, later were neighbors of two of Nathaniel Young's sons in the Old Bethel – Red Hill (Hell's Neck) section of Ohio County, KY. Narcissa, wife of Martin V. Young, was apparently deceased by 1870; she was not found in the 1870 census and in that census three of her children were living in the homes of other relatives. Children of Martin V. Young & Narcissa Angel were:
 - Michael Young was born 6 March 1853 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the • 1860 census of Hancock County, KY, 1900 census of Daviess County, KY, 1910, 1920 & 1930 censuses of Ohio County, KY. He married Minerva Jane Brumfield, 26 January 1891 Ohio County, KY. Minerva, daughter of Woodson Brumfield & Malinda A. Heavrin, was born 28 November 1872 Ohio County, KY and died 29 May 1917 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN, where she was buried in Oak Hill Cemetery. They were divorced 1910-1917. He was a farm laborer. In 1920 Michael was living with the family of Etter Young Minton. In the census he was reported to be a cousin; she was his 2nd cousin once removed and she was granddaughter of Nathaniel Young, who had been appointed Michael's guardian in 1874. In 1930 Michael was an inmate at the Ohio County Poor Farm; another resident there at the time was John Howard Long (1852-1937) a close friend of Michael. Michael died at the Hancock County, KY Infirmary and was buried in the Hawesville Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. The 1910 census records that his wife, Minerva, was the mother of 5 children, only one of whom was then living. Their children included – Lucy J. (29 January 1896 – after 1911); John D. (May

1900 – died between1900 & 1910); one infant buried Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY and two infants buried Schroader Cemetery, Red Hill, Ohio County, KY.

> Mike Young died Monday at 2 p.m., at the County Infirmary. It is understood that he was 91 years of age. His body was taken to the Sapp & Vaughan Funeral Home and remained there until 10:30 a.m., Wednesday, when it was interred in the Hawesville cemetery with a service at the grave conducted by the Rev. C. F. Allen.

Mary Elizabeth Young was born 18 May 1854 Hancock County, KY. She married Andrew Filback, 4 October 1872 Hancock County, KY. Andrew, 'Andy', son of Phillip Filback & Sophia Brashear, was born 19 September 1850 Ohio. His father was born c1820 Nassau, Germany and immigrated to the US arriving at the port of New Orleans in 1849 and died 24 February 1898. Andy is listed in the 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY (spelled as Philback), 1900, 1910 & 1920 censuses of Ohio County, KY. In Hancock County Andy's father married Mary Ann Schroader in 1867 and his sister, Wilhelmina, married George A. Schroader, in 1868. The Schroaders were from the Red Hill – Old Bethel section of Ohio County, KY (Hell's Neck). Andy & Mary during the early 1890's moved to this neighborhood. About the same time several other families from the Patesville area of Hancock County moved to the Hell's Neck area in Ohio County; including members of the Young, Nix, Lynch, Ford and Voyles families. Andy Filback died 12 April 1922 Ohio County, KY and Mary died 25 July 1934 Taylor Mines, Ohio County, KY. She and her husband were buried Edwards General Baptist Church (Voyles Chapel) Cemetery, Ohio County, KY. The 1910 census reported that Mary E. Filback was the mother of 14 children, only 4 of whom were then living. Their children included - Phillip (21 September 1873 – 12 February 1910, buried Schroader Cemetery, Ohio County, KY, married Cinderilla Jane Kessinger, children - Harry M., Harland, Elizabeth & child died infancy); Louella Elizabeth ('Lucy', 10 May 1875 – 15 March 1945, buried Edwards General Baptist Church Cemetery, Ohio County, KY, married Levi Vardaman Voyles, children: John David, James Preston, Noah, Frank B., Sarah Elizabeth, Alford Baker & Flora May; John David (13 September 1880 - 28 March 1938, buried Old Bethel Methodist Church, Ohio County, KY, married Archie Palestine Ziegler & Nellie Lee Bryant, children – Flossie Mildred, Madeline Gladys D. & Sadie); Andrew Harrison (8 August 1888 – 18 August 1961, buried Fairview Cemetery, Ohio County, KY, married Meck Marie Bryant, children - Jesse Thomas, Katie Marie, Laura Ellen, Edward B., Lucille, Harry Donald & Jo Ann); and Sarah Elizabeth (born 16 November 1891 – 23 February

1979, buried Carr Masonic Cemetery, Cook Station, Crawford County, MO, married John Thomas Nix, children – Gurley, Clarence, Lucille, Oscar, Clifton H. & Kenneth Ray.

Mrs. Mary E. Filback passed away at the home of her son, Andrew Filback, of Beaver Dam, Route 1, Friday, July 20, at the age of 80 years, 2 months, and 4 days. Her death was attributed to diseases brought about by her advanced age. She had been very ill for the past six months. Mrs. Filback was a native of Hancock county, but resided in Ohio county for many years. Her husband, Andrew Filback, died about twelve years ago.

Mrs. Filback is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Levi Voyles, and Mrs. Tom Nix, both of Beaver Dam, Route 3, and two sons, John and Andrew Filback, both of Beaver Dam Route 1. A number of grandchildren also survive.

Funeral services were conducted at the Methodist church in Edwards community, at 2:00 p. m., Saturday, July 21, by Rev. Embry. Interment was in the church cemetery.

Matthews, 21 September 1856 Hancock County, KY. In the 1852-1861 vital statistics kept by the state of Kentucky there was recorded a record of their marriage. He was reported to be 37, born Columbia, Ohio and she 24, born Jefferson County, IL. James was born c1819 Columbia, Hamilton County, OH. He married first Elizabeth Hamilton, 11 May 1851 Cincinnati, Hamilton County, OH and they were divorced in 1856. James & Elizabeth Hamilton had a daughter, Sarah J., born 7 December 1853 Hancock County, KY. James & Eliza are listed in the 1860 census of Hancock County, KY and 1870 census of Desha County, AR. Eliza is listed as a widow in the 1880 census of Desha County, AR; in her home were listed 6 sons. In 1900 she is listed in the Arkansas County, AR census. The 1900 census reported that she was the mother of 8 children.
 - John Johnson Matthews was born 22 September 1857 Hancock County, KY. He married Nannie E. Hughes, 24 July 1884 Desha County, AR. and Mary M., c1900. In 1930 he was living Indiana River County, FL. Children included Cynthia Anna, John Cecil & James Luther.
 - William Oldan Matthews was born c1860 KY. He married Nancy I. Tuttle, 30 November 1886 Omaha, NE. He died 10 May 1941 Sheridan County, WY. They had 2 children Harry W. & one other.
 - David T. Matthews was born c1862 IN and died after 1880.
 - James H. Matthews was born 1865 IN. He married Zorah Desdeona Sinkey, 23 September 1888 Desha County, AR. He died 29 November 1950 Arkansas County, AR and was buried Gillett Cemetery, Arkansas County, AR. Children – Nathaniel Webster, Frank & Claude I.
 - Thomas Reece Matthews was born 1 February 1870 AR. He married May Charlotte Moore, 25 May 1902 Arkansas County, AR. He died November 1963 Brevard County, FL. Children Charles W., Leslie Lee, Thomas Howard, Richard Stanley, Hazel P., Henry C. & Mary L.
 - Charles E. Matthews was born c1873 AR. He married Janie Blakeley, 30 August 1896 Arkansas County, AR. In 1900 he was living Arkansas County, AR.

- 5. Margaret Ann Young was born c1836 Illinois. She married John Nix, 7 January 1858 Hancock County, KY. [See John Nix family record on page 23]
- Hannah Jane Young was born c1838 Illinois. She married her 1st cousin Nathaniel Young, 4 October 1861 Hancock County, KY. [See Nathaniel Young family record on page 190]
- 7. Davis T. Young was born 15 March 1840 Illinois. Beginning in the 1866 tax list of Hancock County, KY there are three Youngs named Davis or David. Davis T. usually appears with his middle initial of 'T' to distinguish him from his two first cousins Davis, son of Rev. Martin (born 1830) & David, son of George (born c1838), who are never found with a middle initial. Davis T. is listed in the Hancock County, KY censuses in 1850 (listed with his parents, birth place listed as Illinois), 1860 (listed with father),

1870 (listed as 'D. T.', in the home of his uncle, Rev. Martin Young) & 1880. Davis T. served in the Union army during the Civil War. He enlisted in company D of the 27th KY Infantry on 20 October 1861. Enlisting in the same outfit on the same day were his brother, Martin V. Young, and cousins, Blue John Young, William M. Young, John Nix & John Jarboe. Two of the six, Martin V. Young & John Jarboe, died of disease while in the service. Davis T. was discharged from the service on 29 March 1865. On 18 August 1883 he applied for a pension for his service. In the Breckenridge News (Cloverport, KY, 15 October 1890 p3) it was noted - "Davies T. Young, Patesville, has been granted a pension. In his pension file were recorded his birth and death dates, info on his three marriages and names and birthdays of six of his living children. He married Rachel Frances Ashworth, 11 September 1870 Hancock County, KY. 'Fannie', daughter of Samuel H. Ashworth & Nancy Jane Lancaster, was born 27 December 1852 Hart County, KY and died on 10 January 1900. Davis T. married Sarah Hannah Buck, 30 December 1900 Hancock County, KY. Hannah, daughter of Squire Thomas Buck & Margaret Rich, was born 14 April 1856 TN; she married John Hard, 30 June 1875 Hancock County, KY and John T. Coon, 24 February 1881 Hancock County, KY. Hannah died 21 September 1901 Hancock County, KY, where she was buried Bethlehem Baptist Church Cemetery. Her death was mentioned in the Hancock Clarion (Hawesville, KY, Saturday, 28 September 1901 p2) - "Patesville, Mrs. Hannah Young died near here Saturday and was buried at Bethlehem Sunday." Davis T. married 3rd Martha Ellen Fulkerson, 21 November 1901 Daviess County, KY. Martha, daughter of Phillip Fulkerson & Adaline Fulkerson, was born 15 October 1872 Daviess County, KY; she married James F. Hendricks (1832-1901), 20 May 1894 Daviess County, KY; he was a Confederate veteran of the Civil War; they had four children - James Lessie, John William, Robert Lee & Minnie Mae. About 1897 Davis T. moved from Hancock County across the county line to the Scythia - Knottsville neighborhood in Daviess County, KY, where his death occurred. He died 14 December 1907 near Scythia in Daviess County, KY. He was buried at the Bethlehem Methodist Church Cemetery in Daviess County about threefourths of a mile from Scythia. His widow, Martha, died 19 July 1954 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY and was buried at the St. Williams Catholic Church Cemetery, Knottsville, Daviess County, KY.



(c1908 - 17 October 1910, buried Scherer Cemetery, Stanley, Daviess County, KY); Bessie Lee (22 April 1911 – 6 September 1987, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, KY, married Hardin Robertson); and Ruth (24 June 1917 – 6 May 1997, buried Walnut Ridge Cemetery, Jeffersonville, Clark County, IN, married Leonard Faught & William Kendrick Mulhall).
- Jacob Young was born in 1875-1876 Hancock County, KY and died 1 January 1877 Hancock County, KY. A record of his death in the 1874-1878 Kentucky Vital Statistics records that he died at the age of one year of an abscess on the liver.
- Richard Franklin Young was born 10 May 1873 Hancock County, KY. He • married Teresa Rose Payne, 26 July 1899 Thruston, Daviess County, KY. Rose, daughter of George Milburn Payne & Frances Ellen Humphrey, was born 25 February 1877 Daviess County, KY. Rose prior to her marriage had a son, William L. Head, born May 1897 Pellville, Hancock County, KY and died 2 January 1918 of pneumonia at Camp Greene, Charlotte, NC while serving in the Army; he was buried St. Williams Cemetery, Knottsville, Daviess County, KY. Rose Young died 14 March 1934 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, where she was buried in the Mater Dolorosa Cemetery. Richard F. Young married Millie Cordia Jupin, 3 September 1936 Rockport, Spencer County, IN. Millie, daughter of Gabriel C. Jupin & Catherine Ellen Dennison, was born 4 April 1881 Meade County, KY and died 24 May 1951 Spencer County, IN, where she was buried at the Mt. Zion Cemetery; Millie also married Curtzi Harshfield, 1896, James Willis Linton, 1919 & Rowen H. Bowen, 1942. Richard F. Young died 28 May 1941 Rockport, Spencer County, IN, where he was buried Sunset Hill Cemetery. His children were - Bertha Ellen (2 February 1899 - 6 October 1980, buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, married Isaac Campbell & George Offrey Bradfield); William Edward (27 September 1903 - 25 April 1995, buried Resurrection Cemetery, Daviess County, KY, married Mary Magdaline Payne); James Henry (1 March 1905 - 26 October 1989, buried Sunset Hill Cemetery, Rockport, IN, married Helen Elizabeth Bohler, Margaret

Irene Jones & Gladys Dawson); **Sarah Rosella** (4 October 1909 – 21 July 1935, buried St. Williams Cemetery, Knottsville, Daviess County, KY, married Charles D. Masterson & John William Jackson); and **Hattie May** (19 March 1911 – 21 March 1991, buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Owensboro, KY, married Robert Lee Hendricks, the son of Hattie's stepmother)

- Armintia Young was born 8 April 1880 Hancock County, KY. She married • Samuel Peter Aubrey, 26 June 1902 Daviess County Courthouse, Owensboro, KY. Samuel, son of Craven Aubrey & Mary A. Brashear, was born 31 March 1870 Hardin County, KY. He married Agnes Veach, 10 June 1897 Hawesville, Hancock County, KY; she was born 10 June 1874, died 10 July 1901 and was buried Roseville Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. Armintia Young before marrying had a son by Tom Payne – David Louis Payne (12 August 1901 – 13 March 1984, buried Owensboro Memorial Gardens, Daviess County, KY, married Aretta Kirby, Grace Pierce & Mary Mahala Lanham). Samuel Aubrey died 4 June 1956 & Armintia died 1 May 1965. Both died Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, where they were buried Elmwood Cemetery. They were parents of - John William (22 August 1903 – 18 March 1904, buried Roseville Cemetery, Hancock County, KY); Samuel Earley (20 March 1905 - 28 October 1970, buried Yelvington Cemetery, Daviess County, KY, married Eva Lewis Morris); Essie **Bell** (29 July 1908 – 7 July 1977, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, KY, married James H. Burns, LeRoy Grover Lamb & Martin Lee Pendleton); Anna (4 January 1913 – 31 December 1982, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, KY, married William David Lancaster); and Thomas Theodore (30 March 1919 – 29 March 1983, buried Lewisport Cemetery, Hancock County, KY, married Arizona Burden & Mary Helen Coomes).
- Artiemissie Young, 'Artie', was born 14 October 1887 Hancock County, KY. She died single on 30 March 1905 Daviess County, KY near Scythia (dates from father's pension file). She was buried in the nearby Bethlehem Methodist Church Cemetery in Daviess County, KY.

• **Rhoda Frances Young** was born 14 May 1891 Hancock County, KY. She married William Thomas Whistle, 27 March 1908 Daviess County, KY. William, son of William Henry Whistle, was born 14 May 1886 KY, he is listed with his

father in the 1900 census of Carlisle County, KY; he died 7 November 1918 Eldorado, Saline County, IL, where he was buried in the Wolf Creek Cemetery. Rhoda Young married Thomas Lee Awbrey, 6 April 1919 Fordsville, Ohio County, KY. Thomas, son of George Filmore Aubrey & Mary Minerva Swartz, was born 18 September 1894 Hancock County, KY and died 5 March 1973 Fordsville, Ohio County, KY, where he was buried in the Fordsville Cemetery. Rhoda & Thomas were divorced 1924-1930. Rhoda married Avner Presley Wood, 14 November 1947 Hartford, Ohio County, KY. Avner, son of William Green Henderson Wood & Palestine Whitely, was born 21 August 1884 KY, died 28 April 1956 Grayson County, KY, where he was buried Lone Star Cemetery. Rhoda married 4th Joseph King, 7 September 1957 Rockport, Spencer County, IN. Joseph, son of John King & Martha Reed, was born 25 July 1871 Perry County, IN, died 2 March 1963 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY; and was buried Sunset Hill Cemetery, Rockport, Spencer County, IN. Rhoda F. Young King died 13 January 1975 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN; she was buried Sunset Hill Cemetery, Rockport, Spencer County, IN. Rhoda & William T. Whistle were the parents of – Ora Bell (30 July 1908 – 10 February 1973, buried St. Bernard Cemetery, Rockport, Spencer County, IN, married Killian Schreiner); Evelyn (24 February 1913 – 3 August 1991, buried Evergreen Cemetery, Louisville, Jefferson County, KY, married Alfonso Rhodes); Beulah (24 February 1916 - 9 November 1918, buried Wolf Creek Cemetery, Eldorado, Saline County, IL) & T. Rhoda (born & died 25 February 1918, buried Wolf Creek Cemetery, Eldorado, Saline County, IL). Rhoda & Thomas L. Awbrey were the parents of – Eula Mae (21 February 1920 – 30 March 2019, buried Queen of Heaven Cemetery, Hillside, Cook County, IL, married Arthur Burton Sforza); Mary Frances (15 September 1922 – 27 March 1923, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, KY); Thomas William (21 February 1924 – 11 April 1924, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, KY); and Jane Magdalene (15 March 1925 – 2 February 1987, buried Sunset Memorial Park, Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN, married James Chappell).

- Elizabeth Ann Young, 'Lizzie', was born 2 June 1905 Daviess County, KY. She married William Ignatius Payne, 21 October 1920 Rockport, Spencer County, IN. They were first cousins once removed. William, born 13 June 1897 Knottsville Daviess County, KY, was the son of Ignatius Guy Payne & Mary Margaret Nix, grandson of James Nix & Nancy Jane Young and great-grandson of Michael Young & Nancy Bruner. William I. Payne died 18 July 1952 and Elizabeth died 12 December 1965. Both died Owensboro, Daviess County, KY and were buried St. Williams Cemetery, Knottsville, Daviess County, KY. Children William Marvin (18 December 1921 14 September 1995, buried Owensboro Memorial Gardens, Daviess County, KY, married Thelma Louise Johnson); and James Pauline (8 December 1925 8 April 1926, buried St. Williams Cemetery, Knottsville, Daviess County, KY).
- 8. Nancy Jane Young was born September 1844 Illinois. She married James Nix, 4 January 1868 Hancock County, KY. [See James Nix family record on page 24]

Davis / David Young, son of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born c1809 Washington County, KY. He appears in the tax books of Hancock County in 1830, 1831 & 1832 and after that he disappears from the records of the area. In an 1832 Delinquent tax list returned for Hancock County David Young is listed (Hancock County Order Book 1, p169). One reason why individuals appeared in delinquent lists was they had moved from the county and were no longer a tax paying resident. I find one David that matches up closely with the preceding and who I believe is likely the David Young formerly of Hancock County, KY. In the 1850 & 1860 censuses of Texas the following family appears:

Family trees don't agree on the parents of this David. The majority claim he is the son of a Charles W. Young (1790-1844), who appears in the 1820 & 1830 censuses of Floyd County, KY and who married Margaret McBroom in Floyd County in 1813. However, in these two census listings there is not a male of David Young's age range – for example in 1820 the only other males in the home of Charles are three under the age of 1810; Charles in addition to David is listed as having three sons born between 1813-1816. The David in the 1850 and 1860 Texas censuses appears in the 1840 census of Platte County, Missouri –in his household were listed 1 male 0-5, 1 male 20-30, 1 female 0-5, 1 female 5-10 & 1 female 20-30. The following was said of David Young's wife, Eliza in the <u>A Memorial and Biographical History of Johnson and Hill Counties, Texas</u>, (Chicago, IL, Lewis Publishing Co., 1892, p327):

The present number of members is 121, who have just completed a house of worship. Eliza Young is the oldest member of this church. She was born in Tennessee in 1812, raised in Floyd county, Kentucky, married David Young in 1834, moved to Platte county, Missouri, and finally, in 1844, to Texas; and her youngest son, J. M., is the present clerk of the Baptist church above described.

The facts noted in the preceding passage fit closely with when David Young, son of Martin Young & Margaret Conder, disappears from Hancock County, KY. David Young married Eliza Davis, daughter of John Davis, in Floyd County, KY on 18 June 1834. Since Eliza, wife of

David Young (of Texas), was from Floyd County, KY researchers have assumed that David was also originally from there. This is not necessarily so. He could have been there briefly; just long enough to meet Eliza, marry her in 1834, before moving to Missouri during 1836-1840. David Young, husband of Eliza, died during 1860-1870. Eliza appears as a widow in the 1870 census of Anderson County, TX, 1880, 1900 & 1910 censuses of Hill County, TX. Eliza Young (1813-1911) has a grave marker in the Liberty Grove Cemetery, McLennan County, TX. The 1900 census reported that 9 children had been born to her. David & Eliza's daughter, Martha Jane Young, married John Nix, 4 July 1858 Anderson County, TX. John Nix (1828-1875) in 1850 was living with David & Eliza Young. He was from Kentucky. He possibly had some relationship to the Nix family that was so interconnected with the Young family in Hancock & Washington Counties, KY.

Rev. Martin M. Young, (Jr.), son of Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, was born c1803 Washington County, KY. He first appears in the Breckinridge County, KY tax lists in 1823. After his name males tithables aged 21 was left blank and in the following year's tax list one male tithable is entered after his name. If he was not yet 21 in 1823 but was 21 in 1824 this suggests he was born c1803. Upon the formation of Hancock County from parts of Breckinridge, Daviess & Ohio Counties in 1829 Martin Young (Jr.) begins to be listed in the tax records of Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1830, 1840, 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY. In the last four his occupation is given as farmer.

The marriage record of Rev. Martin M. Young has never been located. He married Margaret about 1825; she was born 1800-1803 Kentucky. The marriage was probably recorded in Breckinridge County, KY, where he was then a resident. Unfortunately the first marriage books for the years of 1799-1852 disappeared when on 7 February 1958 there was a fire at the Breckinridge County Courthouse. I was told by the officials there that citizens were carrying records out to ensure they were not lost. Most of these found their way back to the courthouse but the earliest marriages disappeared. Some of the records were also destroyed in the fire. A partial reconstructed list of marriages was compiled from various sources. Some of the children of Martin Young, Sr. appeared in the reconstructed list but not the marriage of Martin, Jr.

Researchers have introduced several guesses that have now been accepted as facts about Rev. Martin M. Young. One of my cousins several years ago located a record of a Martin Young marrying Martha Margaret Crawford in 1825. The first names and year matched and he concluded that this was our Rev. Martin M. Young. There was indeed a couple of these names that did marry about 1825 but, however, they are listed in the 1830, 1840, 1850, 1860 & 1870 censuses of Steuben County, NY. This couple probably never stepped foot in the state of Kentucky!!! The same researcher that made this conclusion on Margaret's identity also surmised that Rev. Martin M. Young's middle name was "Matthew". He had no proof he was just guessing!!! I don't like to guess and accept what someone thinks without some documented proof. If I had to guess at his middle name I would pick – "Marion" which two of Martin's grandson were named.

In Hancock County, KY order book 2 (p187) at a court of Monday, 27 August 1838 the following entry was recorded:

On motion of Martin Young, who presented in court credentials of his ordination as a minister of the gospel and that he is in regular communion with the United Baptist Church, a license is granted him to celebrate the rites of matrimony in this state agreeably to law. Whereupon the said Young took the oath of Allegiance to this commonwealth and also executed and acknowledged bond with Absolem Wilson & N. V. Board his securities conditioned as the law requires.

Rev. Martin M. Young was affiliated with several United Baptist churches in Hancock County, KY, including Blackford, Bethlehem, West Point, and Mt. Eden. In September 1834 he served as a messenger from the Blackford Church at a conference at the Panther Creek Church. Noted in the West Point Baptist Church, Hancock County, KY minutes of – January 1842, "Also agreed to call Bro. Martin Young to take care of the church." In 1844 he was associated with the Blackford Baptist Church which was then a member of the Goshen Association. The Blackford church in 1877 became part of the newly formed Blackford Baptist Association. In the booklet, "Record of Carter Jerrel Kelley" by Rev. Carter Jerrel Kelley (1810-1880, p62), Baptist minister:

Our ordination occurred on the first Sabbath in July 1849, a little less than ten years after our union with the church. On the Saturday following we were invited to visit Bethlehem church, having been there a month previous and agreed at the earnest solicitation of some of the brethren to return and take charge of the church as pastor as soon as we should be ordained. On that day the church called and Brother M. Young who as a member of the church and an ordained minister and ourself were chosen to work conjointly.

In the Hancock County marriage books during the years of 1839 through 1879 there were 110 marriages on which Rev. Martin Young appeared as the celebrant; on some marriage entries no celebrant was entered. The following reference to Rev. Martin Young and the Blackford Association was published in the book, <u>A History of Kentucky Baptists: From 1769 to 1885</u>, Vol. II, by J. H. Spencer (Cincinnati, OH, 1885), pp645-646:

This flourishing community is located in Hancock, Ohio, and some of the adjoining counties. It was constituted at Bethlehem meetinghouse in Hancock county, on the 30th of November, 1877, of the following fourteen churches, which had been dismissed from the old Goshen confederacy, for the purpose: Pisgah, Mt. Pleasant, Blackford, Union, Hawesville, Bethlehem, Pleasant Grove, Zion, Lewis Port, Friendship, Mt. Eden, Sandy Creek, Pleasant Valley and Roseville. The ministers belonging to these churches were Martin Young, H. V. Bruner, L. C. Tichenor, J. E. Stone, Calvin Voyles, Robert T. Bruner and J. J. Keown. The next year, Panther Creek, Yelvington, Pellville, Chestnut Grove and Pleasant Ridge churches, with Elder R. R. Gabbert, were added to the Association.

One of the first acts of this Association was the appointment of a missionary board, consisting of Robert T. Bruner. George W. Brown and Wm. T. Smith, the duty of which was to make provisions for supplying the destitute within the bounds of the fraternity, with preaching. The next year, the body appointed committees to report on Home Missions, Orphans' Home, State Missions, Foreign Missions, Sabbath schools and Temperance. These objects of benevolence have been fostered by the Association, to the present time. The body has enjoyed uninterrupted harmony, and a high degree of prosperity. It began with fourteen churches, aggregating 1,320 members. In 1880, it reported twenty-one churches with 2,264 members, and, in 1882, twenty-four churches with 2,508 members. During the first five years of its existence, it reported 725 baptisms.


Martin Young was the oldest minister in this body. Of his early life nothing has been learned He was an ordained minister at Cloverport, Ky., as early as 1837, and, for many years after, was an humble preacher within the bounds of Goshen Association. He had become too old and feeble, before his church entered into the constitution of Blackford Association; but he was much beloved by the brethren for his past labors; and his simple, unaffected piety. The Lord called him home, at a great old age, in 1882.

Martin Young during the Civil War took the following oath of allegiance to the United States government. The oath was taken by many civil servants and people in positions of influence in an effort to thwart Southern sympathizers. Martin is referred to as "Sr. to distinguish him from his nephew Martin Young (son of Jacob), who was also a resident of Hancock County in 1864:

Martin Young was the first member of the Young family to acquire land in Breckinridge or Hancock Counties, KY. By a series of deeds he purchased from the heirs of Ephraim Lyons, Sr. (1783-1831) & Jesse Isom (c1810-1843) their interest in a 458 ½ acre tract (Hancock County, KY deed books 2 p436, 3 p263 & 6 p80 and circuit court bundle #40, suit #355, filed 23 April

1851, Jesse Isom widow & heirs vs. Martin Young). By the first deed Martin Young on 22 June 1839 paid \$135 to the heirs of Ephraim Lyons, Sr., deceased for their interest in one-fourth part of a 458 ¹/₂ tract. Ephraim Lyons, Sr. at a public auction at the Hancock County courthouse on 25 July 1831 had purchased the 458 ¹/₂ acre tract from the heirs of his father-in-law, John Snider, Sr. (Hancock County deed book 1 p74). John Snider, Sr. c1758-1830) on 19 July 1824 purchased the same 458 ¹/₂ acre tract from Othello Williams (Breckinridge County, KY deed book 6 p73). Snider's son-in-law, William Hale, Sr. (1787-1863) on 3 July 1824 purchased another 458 1/2 acre tract from William & Frances Williams (Breckinridge County deed book 6 p33). The Hale tract adjoined the south side of the Snider tract; both were parts of Francis Taylor's 3,000 acre patent & survey. William Hale, Sr. has a gravestone in the Hale-Isom Cemetery on his farm that is on a hill just east of Highway 69 and lying between the Truman Young Road and the Goering Road. The Young Cemetery was located nearby. The cemetery is about five miles south of Hawesville, KY and one mile south of the Mt. Eden Baptist Church; turn east off of Highway 69 onto the Truman Young Road. About a city block distance the road turns to the right, instead of making the turn go straight ahead into lane. Lane ends at former home of the late Rev. Ezra D. Meador (1905-1991). Cemetery is on his farm. At house walk east - go about 300 feet, pass barn, go around north end of pond & cemetery can be seen on a ridge under several trees. The Young Cemetery is marked in red on map below:

The Hancock County, KY tax lists show Rev. Martin Young being taxed on 170 acres on Caney Fork of the Blackford Creek during the years of 1840-1853. The tax books of 1854-1867 show he was assessed on 120 acres and the lists of 1869-1875 on 100 acres. Martin sold parts of his farm in 1853, 1865 (30 acres to William Compton) and in 1879 (19 ¹/₂ acres to T. N. Warfield); the latter tract was bordered on the south by the farm of Frank Isom (Hancock County, KY deed books 6, p282, 13 p184 & 20 p83).

Rev. Martin & Margaret Young in the 1880 census are reported to both be blind. The book, <u>A History of Kentucky Baptists: From 1769 to 1885</u>, reported that Rev. Martin Young died in 1882. Margaret Young died between 1880 & 1892. The location of their graves is not known. Most likely they were buried in the Young Cemetery. The oldest death date on a monument in the cemetery is 18 June 1859 for Mary S. Young, a daughter of Rev. Martin & Margaret's son, William M. Young. Rev. Martin's parents, Martin Young, Sr. & Margaret Conder, who died during the 1840's are also possibly buried here.

At the time of his death Rev. Martin Young still owned about 100 acres of his farm. He died intestate. Ten children of Rev. Martin M. & Margaret are proven by several deeds and a circuit court suit that were recorded in the transfer of the heirs rights to this land. The heirs named in these records were Mary Jarboe (wife of William Jarboe), Evaline Young, (Black) John Young, Davis Young, Sarah Rice (wife of Jesse Rice), William M. Young, Agnes Young (wife of John Young), Nathaniel Young, Susan Young (wife of Horace Young). At the time of the transactions two of the heirs, William & Nathaniel Young were deceased and the heirs of

William were given as - Alfred, Lou, Henry & Fanny and the heirs of Nathaniel were given as - wife, Arminda & children - William, Joseph, Jacob & Fanny. Jacob H. Young (Hancock County, KY deed books 25 p11, 27 p68, 36 p233 and circuit court suit bundle 292 case file #2345, filed in 1892). In 1894 the heirs sold their interest in the land to William Martin Young (1863-1947), son of Davis Young & Mary Taylor and grandson of Rev. Martin & Margaret Young. William Martin Young & wife, Luetta in 1937 sold the same farm of about 100 acres to their son, Truman Young (Hancock County, KY deed book 54 p168). Truman Young (1900-1983) resided in the first house on the north side of the Truman Young Road going east from Highway 69. Truman Young said in interview on 19 October 1981 that his father's farm was one mile up Blackford Creek from the Young Cemetery & Highway 69; this farm appears to be the same farm that had been owned by Rev. Martin M. Young.

Rev. Martin & Margaret Young were parents of:

1. Mary Young, 'Polly', was born 1823-1824 Breckinridge County, KY. She married William Jarboe, 2 March 1843 Hancock County, KY. On their marriage record it was written that "Martin Young father of lady gave consent in person." They were married by her father, Rev. Martin Young, minister of the gospel. William, son of Jarret R. Jarboe & Elizabeth Jefferson, was born 11 December 1816 Breckinridge County, KY. William's brother, Benedict Jarboe, married Ruth McFall, a first cousin of Mary Young. William Jarboe first appears in the Hancock County, KY tax records in 1843. In the 1850, 1860 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County he is reported to be a farmer. William Jarboe died 28 March 1900 in Hancock County, KY and his widow, Mary Young Jarboe died on 28 November 1909 in Hancock County, KY. They were buried in the Jarboe Cemetery; also referred to as the Dink Clark Cemetery. The cemetery is about two miles east of the Young Road (gravel road). Turn into first lane on right. Lane dead ends in Hennen Hollow. Cemetery is on hill behind second house (near the former homes of Leonard McManaway and Jack Jarboe).

Mrs. Mary Jarboe, widow of Billy Jarboe, died at the home of his niece, Mrs. Dempsey Basham, near Patesville Sunday at 2 o'clock, says the Hawesville Clarion. Mrs. Jarboe is supposed to have been 100 years old. Indeed, there are those of her neighbors, who believe her to be above that age. Her dissolution was brought about as a result of senile decay. The remains were buried at the ismily graveyard nearby on Monday.

Mrs. Jarboe was a most excellent Christian lady and leaves the following children: George Jarboe and Mrs. Suşan Sanders, of Owensboro; and Messrs. Dave, Martin and Nat Jarboe, Mrs. David Nix and Mrs. Dempsey Basham of the county.

William Jarboe and Mary Young were the parents of:

John Jarboe was born 12 March 1844 Hancock County, KY. He served in the Union Army during the Civil War. He died of disease in a veteran's hospital in Evansville, IN on 12 April 1862. In the Kentucky Adjutant General's Report for the Union Army it is recorded that John Jarboe was mustered into Company D of the 27th KY Volunteer Infantry on 21 March 1862 and he died at Evansville, IN on 12 April 1862. Other fellow residents of Hancock County served in the same outfit, including his relatives - Martin V. Young, Davis T. Young, William M. Young, (Blue) John Young and John Nix. His place of burial was reported as being at the Young Cemetery in the WPA's Registration of Veterans Graves for Hancock County, KY. A niece, Nannie Merle (Jarboe) Nugent (1889-1986),

however, reported that he was buried in the Jarboe Cemetery, where his parents were buried.

- Margaret Angeline Jarboe was born in February 1847 Hancock County, KY. She married David Nix, 29 October 1872 Hancock County, KY. [See David Nix family record on page 26]
- Martin Vanburen Jarboe was born 26 December 1849 Hancock County, KY. • He married Sarah Frances Johnson, 1 December 1868 Hancock County, KY. Sarah, daughter of John K. Johnson & Nancy E. Price, was born 14 May 1848 Hancock County, KY. Martin died 15 February 1919 Hancock County, KY and his wife, Sarah F. died 7 March 1929 Breckinridge County, KY. Martin & Sarah were buried at the Jarboe – Dawson Cemetery, Breckinridge County, KY. They were parents of - James A. (25 March 1871 - 10 April 1935, buried Burnett Cemetery, Hancock County, KY, married Louditha C. Burnett, no children); Mary Ida (15 November 1873 – 20 July 1955, buried Wolf Creek Cemetery, Eldorado, Saline County, IL, married Thomas Long, children – Joseph, Martin, Jessie, Ninah, James A., Bruce Marie, Ruby, Mary Kay, Iva May, Maude, Glenn & Earl); Elmina (8 May 1876 – 6 November 1898, buried Jarboe-Johnson Cemetery, Dukes, Hancock County, KY, married William H. - **David William Jarboe** was born in February 1853 Hancock County, KY. He married two sisters, who were his second cousins. They were daughters of George Williams & Ruth Angeline Young; Ruth's father, George Young, was a brother of David's grandfather, Rev. Martin M. Young. David married 1st Eliza Ann Williams, 29 October 1872 Hancock County, KY; she was born c1857 Hancock County, KY and died 1882-1900. David married 2nd Mary E. Williams, 22 March 1902 Hancock County, KY; she was born c1860 Hancock County, KY and died 20 February 1914 Hancock County, KY and was buried Jarboe Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. David W. Jarboe in 1900 was living Owensboro, Daviess County, KY. Hancock Clarion, Hawesville, KY, 22 March 1924 - "Hennen: Dave Jarboe spent Sunday with his sister, Mrs. Dave Nix, who has been ill for several days but is slowly improving." Several relatives believed David Jarboe died in Louisville, KY; they were not sure where he was buried at. David Jarboe & Eliza Williams had children - Louella (c1875 - after 1910, married Robert Denton Ijames & ____ Mattingly, children – Robert Newton & Virginia L. Eimes); Rosetta (4 August 1876 – 3 February 1951, buried Highland Cemetery, Fort Mitchell, Kenton County, KY, married James T. Sirles, children – James Rally, Sallie Mae & Edgar); Mary (c1878 – August 1880, Breckenridge News, Cloverport, KY, 18 August 1880 – "Patesville: Mr. Dave Jarber's little child is dead."); Annie B. (October 1882 – 22 January 1902, married John Albert Dennison); Magnolia (2 December 1884 – 1 July 1966, buried Riverside Cemetery, Gas City, Grant County, IN, married Gentry Richard Wright, children – Edward, Violet Irene, Arthur Vernon, Catherine Louise, Norman Denton & James Leroy); and Effie (June 1881 - 6 August 1905, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, married Richard Dennison, children – Richard).
- Susan Elizabeth Jarboe was born 2 August 1855 Hancock County, KY. She married her 2nd cousin George Lewis Sanders, 15 November 1873 Hancock County, KY. [See George Lewis Sanders family record on page 96]

They were buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Owensboro, KY. They were parents of Willie S. (3 August 1883 30 October 1895, died of typhoid fever, buried Powers Cemetery, Hancock County, KY); and Ivory (3 January 1885 12 September 1974, buried Washington Park East Cemetery, Indianapolis, Marion County, IN, married Delia Walker, children Wallace Dudley).

Funeral In Hawesville

The remains of Mrs. Frank Youug, who died in Owensboro, were brought here Tuesday for burial in the Jarboe grave yard. Mrs. Hanna J. Young died at her home on West Main street, Tuesdav afternoon at 12:20 o'clock. She was the wife of James Young and was a highly respected woman. She was 37 years of age. The remains were shipped to Hawesville yesterday and and will be interred there to-day.

2. John Young was born in 1827 Breckinridge County, KY. He was nicknamed "Black John" Young to distinguish him from his first cousin, John H. Young (1831-1919), the son of Jacob, who also resided in Hancock County, KY and who was known by the nickname "Blue John" Young. Black John married his 1st cousin Maria Jane Young, 6 January 1848 Hancock County, KY. Maria, daughter of Michael Young & Nancy Bruner, was born c1830 Hancock County, KY. Her father signed his consent for Maria to marry. They were married by the groom's father, Rev. Martin M. Young. Black John first appears in the Hancock County, KY tax records in 1848. In the 1852 tax list he is joined by (Blue) "John H. Young". In the 1859 tax list the two Johns are followed by "son of Martin" and "son of Jacob". The 1853 tax list shows that he was taxed on 100 acres on Blackford Creek; he continued to own this land the remainder of his life. The 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County report his occupation as farmer. Living in his home in 1870 were Martha Young (age 12) & Fannie Ashworth (age 19); Martha was a

daughter of Black John's 1st cousin, Martin V. Young; Fannie Ashworth married Black John's 1st cousin Davis T. Young in 1870. Black John died 8 January 1895 and his wife, Maria died between 1880-1897. His date of death is from estate settlement file of John Young, 1896, at the archives of the Hancock County Courthouse. On 24 January 1895 J. J. Rice was appointed administrator of the estate of John Young, deceased. The graves of John & Maria are unmarked. They were probably buried in the Young Cemetery. He died intestate and in order to have a division of his estate his son, Peter R. Young, filed a suit against the other heirs in the Hancock County Circuit Court. In March 1897 the court appointed commissioners to make a division. In Hancock County Division of Land book (p233) a division of the lands of John Young, deceased was filed in 1897. On 1 May 1897 the division was recorded in Hancock County deed book 28 pages 426-434. The land was divided among heirs – sons, Peter R. Young (1/3 share, 38 acres) & John D. Young, Jr. (1/3 share, 38 acres), grandchildren, Eliza Ann (wife of James R. Remington, J. H. Jarboe, Janie Jarboe & Noble Jarboe (the last four are children of deceased daughter, Nancy Ellen Jarboe, to them 1/3 share, 38 acres). Ira Remington (1890-1968), son of Eliza Ann (Jarboe) Remington (1868-1956), acquired 2 of the lots in the division of John Young's land. Ira in 1923 purchased 18 1/4 acres that had been granted to his mother and in 1929 he acquired the 38 acres that had been granted to Peter R. Young (Hancock County, KY deed books (58 p558, p560 & 626). Part of Ira Remington's farm included the Young family graveyard. In 1960 Ira Remington & wife, Stella, sold 3 tracts to Ezra Meador (Hancock County, KY deed book 66 p351). In this deed the following clause was included: "right to use Ezra Meador lane is reserved as means to get to "old Black John Young Cemetery". Florence Corley Kessans (1909-1998), said her greatgrandfather, Black John Young owned the farm where the Young Cemetery is located. (Black) John Young and Maria Jane Young had the following children:

- Nancy Ellen Young was born 1849 Hancock County, KY. She married her 2nd cousin, Jarrett R. Jarboe, 13 December 1866 Hancock County, KY. [See Jarrett R. Jarboe family record on page 43]
- Peter R. Lander Young, 'Stoge', was born 4 July 1854 Hancock County, KY. • This birth date is recorded in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics. Florence Corley Kessans (1909-1998), a granddaughter said her grandfather was called Stoge because he moved so slow. He is listed in the 1860, 1870, 1880, 1900, 1910 & 1920 censuses of Hancock County, KY. He married his 1st cousin Martha Jane Young, 29 January 1874. Martha, daughter of Martin V. Young & Narcissa Angel, was born 11 February 1857 Hancock County, KY. The 1910 census records that 9 children had been born to Martha 4 of whom were then deceased. They were - Sarah Rena (6 January 1875 - 30 December 1963, buried Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY, married Obe Corley, her 2nd cousin once removed, see page 107); daughter (1876 – 13 October 1877, died of erysipelas); Ollie D. (daughter, February 1880 – died before 1900); Owen D. (8 October 1882 - 15 November 1950, buried Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY, married Delia Corley, his 2nd cousin once removed, children – Otha & Claude Garland); Annie Mae (15 March 1885 – 2 June 1972, buried Slaughters Cemetery, Slaughters, Webster County, KY, married William Henry Jasper Gray, see page 122, & Alford K. Pleasant, child by first husband – Ruby Gray, children by

second husband – Lena Mae, Johnnie Foster, James Ralph & Leo Shannon); **Ralph** (20 September 1887 – 15 June 1913, on 30 July 1907 he stabbed his brother-in-law, Obe Corley, for beating his wife, Sarah Corley; Ralph was shot & killed by Ernest Basham, who alleged that Ralph was visiting his wife, due to Basham's claims Basham was acquitted at his trial, Ralph was buried Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY, single); and **Hubert John** (2 December 1894 – 10 October 1971, buried Lebanon National Cemetery, Lebanon, Marion County, KY, he was a teacher, married Clara M. Brown, Beatrice Mary Kennedy & Eva Marie Merrick, child by Beatrice – Dorothy).

MR. PETER R. YOUNG Mr. Peter R. Young, better known as Stoge Young, age 79 years died at his home near the Hennen school house, March 14, of complications due to advanced age. During the early part of the winter he suffered a severe attack of the flu followed by pneumonia, at that time little hope was held out for his life, but backed by a strong constitution he stemmed the tide and was up and about until a few hours before the end came. Mr. Young was born, and reared on the farm where he died. He was scrupiously honest and probably as industrious a man as could be found in the county. For several years he has suffered with his feet. Each year he raised a little patch of tobacco and during the past summer he worked his little patch of tobacco by crawling on his knees. About a year ago he lost his flome and contents by fire and since that time he and his wife have been living in a cabin on their farm and working out a living the best they could. He was a member of the Baptist Church since early boyhord. Pesides his wife he 1° sur-

vived by two daughters and two sons. Mesdames Obe Corley of Midway, and Annie Pleasant of Hennën, Messrs. Hubert Young, who is a teacher at the Indian Hill school in this county, and Owen Young of Tell City

single, was kneed last Subday night seven miles south of Hawesville, his body being found lying in the road Monday morning with a gunshot wound on the head. The story goes that young Young was too well acquainted with a neighbor's wife and it is supposed his personal popularity was the cause of his death. The authorities of Hancock county are looking after the matter.

- stillborn female born & died 29 August 1859 Hancock County, KY.
- John David Young was born c1867 Hancock County, KY. He married Susan E Remington, 9 October 1888 Hancock County. Susan, 'Sudie', daughter of James M. Remington & Artelia Miller, was born c1868 Hancock County, KY and died in 1897. Flora (Poehlein) Young Sturgeon (1901-1993), daughter-in-law of John

D. & Sudie said that Sudie died when her three sons were quite young, John D. could not care for them and they were divided among relatives, who raised them. On 3 December 1900 John David Young was tried on a writ of lunacy and was ordered to be committed to the Western Kentucky Asylum at Hopkinsville, KY. He is listed there in the 1910 census of Christian County, KY. Mrs. Sturgeon said it was rumored that relatives who were taking care of his children wanted his land and conspired to have him committed. Just before his death he was brought back to Hancock County, KY, where he died on 31 October 1910. He was buried with his wife in the Young Cemetery. John D. & Susan were the parents of three sons – **Claude Howard** (8 October 1891 – 30 April 1962, buried Elmwood Cemetery, Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, married Allie Lee Winstead); **Lonnie** (9 January 1893 – 9 April 1964, buried Greenwood Cemetery, Tell City, Perry County, IN, married Daisy Snowden); and **Herman** (10 February 1895 – 20 March 1962, buried Oak Hill Cemetery, Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN, married Flora Natella Poehlein).

Lay John Dave Young While His House Burned.



The house of John Dave Young burned to the ground at an early hour and nothing was saved except what clothing he could carry out at one trip. Mr. Young's wife is dead and his children were absent at the time visiting a brother. He was alone and is unable to say how the fire started. There was no insurance on either the building or its contents, and he is said to have had one of the best furnished houses in that whole country. Mr. Young has been grieving bitter-


Mr. Young has been grieving bitterly over the loss of his wife, who died two years ago. When the neighbors came in to the fire they found him at the graveyard nearby, lying on the grave of his wife. His pitiable condition and great grief is the talk of the entire neighborhood.

<u>Owensboro Inquirer</u>, Owensboro, KY Sunday, 6 November 1910 p4 John Dave Young Dead

Mr. J. R. Remington went to Hopdinsville Saturday, returning Sunday afternoon with John D. Young, whose critical condition we mentioned last week. He was taken to his home in the county, where he passed away at an early hour Monday morning. The remains were buried at the Young cemetery Tuesday. Mr. Young was fifty years of age and leaves three sons. His wife died many years ago. He had been in the Hopkinsville asylum about 10 years.—Hawesville Clarion.

- 3. **Evaline Young** was born c1828 Breckinridge County, KY. She married her first cousin, Peter B. Young, 2 September 1847 Hancock County, KY. She died after 1892. [See Peter B. Young family record on page 118]
- 4. Davis Young was born 29 January 1830 Hancock County, KY. He is first listed in the Hancock County tax lists in 1852. He is listed in the 1850, 1860, 1870, 1880 & 1900 censuses of Hancock County, KY. He had a first cousin, Davis T. Young (1840-1907, son of Michael), who is frequently listed with an initial 'T' to distinguish him from Davis (1830-1908), who is never found with any initial. Nothing was found that confirms that Davis Young, son of Rev. Martin Young, also had a middle initial of T. Davis married Mary Taylor on 25 May 1853 in Hancock County, KY (Hancock County marriage book 1, p75). On the marriage it was recorded that "man of age and John Nix stepfather of young lady gave consent in person." They were married at the residence of John Nix by Rev. Martin Young, the groom's father.





A record of their marriage was also recorded in the 1852-1861 Vital Statistics kept by the state of Kentucky. On this record it was reported that Davis Young was age 22 & was born Hancock County, KY and Polly Taylor was 18 & born Washington County, KY. Mary Taylor, also was called by the nickname Polly, was born in April 1834 Washington County, KY. Mary, was the daughter of Elizabeth Young, who later became the wife of John Nix. Elizabeth is believed to be a daughter of Wolf John Young, an older brother of Davis (see page 21). Wolf John Young remained in Washington County after his parents and siblings removed to what became Hancock County, KY. If Mary was a granddaughter of Wolf John Young she would have been a first cousin once removed to her husband, Davis Young. Davis served in the US home guard during the Civil War. He was mustered into company D of the Green River Battalion on 1 May 1865 as a corporal and served until 23 August 1865. Also serving in the same outfit were brothers Nathaniel & Jacob Young, nephew, Martin Jarboe, great-nephews, Francis M., Jarrett R. & George W. Jarboe & Samuel McFall. Davis Young was a farmer. Beginning with the 1857 Hancock County tax list Davis Young is reported as owning 30 acres on Blackford Creek and in 1871 he added an adjoining 102 acres. His farm was one mile north of Patesville and bordered on the farm of his father (Hancock County, KY deed book 36 p59). The 1900 census shows that he owned his own farm free of mortgage. Mary Taylor Young, wife of Davis, died in Hancock County, KY on 24 January 1892. Davis Young died in Hancock County, KY on 5 August 1908. Davis and Mary were buried in family cemetery on their farm; the cemetery is also referred to as the Holmes Cemetery.

Davis Young & Mary Taylor were parents of 12 known children:

Margaret Elizabeth Young was born 14 October 1854 Hancock County, KY. She married Marion M. Nugent, 29 December 1870 Hancock County, KY. Marion, son of Hiram M. Nugent & Amelia Williams, was born c1845 KY and died after 1870. He & Margaret had a daughter, Artemissa (c1872 – died 1878 Hancock County, KY at the age of 6. Margaret E. Young married 2nd William Hiram Holmes, 23 April 1874 Hancock County, KY. William Hiram Holmes was born 26 December 1851 Bullitt County, KY. His parents, James Holmes, Jr. & Elizabeth Felker, were married in Bullitt County, KY on 26 September 1849. James was born c1815 KY and died in 1861; he was the son of James Holmes & Susan Carpenter. Elizabeth born c1826 was the daughter of Anthony Felker & Jane Green (married Bullitt County, KY 4 January 1825). Hiram Holmes siblings included - James Preston Holmes (1850-1932) married Sarah Anne Young (a 1st cousin once removed to Davis); Joseph Holmes (1853-1876) is buried in the Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY; and Sarah Jane Holmes (1860-1884) married George Adam "Neezer" Young (1st cousin of Davis). Hiram Holmes is listed with his parents in the1860 census of Bullitt County, KY and with his widowed mother, in the 1870 census of Hancock County, KY. Hiram was a farmer and appears in the 1880, 1900, 1910, 1920 and 1930 censuses of Hancock County, KY. Margaret Young Holmes died 1886-1888 and was buried in the Davis Young Cemetery. He had engaged in farming practically all of his life, retiring only a short time ago, when his health failed. The remains were conveyed to Patesville, Hancock county, Wednesday and funeral services were conducted at 4 o'clock that afternoon at the grave in Patesville cemetery. Mr. Young is survived by his widow, two daughters, Mesdames Nora Ford, of Cannelton, Ind., and Belle Morgan, of Patesville; three sons, Ollie and Wavie, of the Sunnydale vicinity and Ira Young, of Newburg, Ind.

• James F. Young, 'Jim', was born 26 June 1859 Hancock County, KY. He married Alice Jane Richards, 8 July 1883 Hancock County, KY. The daughter of Davis Richards & Mary Jackson she was born 11 April c1857 KY (1860 is on her gravestone). Alice married first James T. Coffee, 20 November 1873 Hancock County, KY. James T. Coffee in Hancock County filed for a divorce from Alice on 2 September 1875; he claimed that she had had a child, now 15 months old, by Richard Samuel Fuqua. In the 1880 Hancock County census she is reported to be widowed. The late family historian, Ellen Mason Banks (1924-2019), whose mother, Hallie Richards, was a relative of Alice, told this writer that James T. Coffee one day got on his horse and took their only child, about two, and rode off



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

Susie & Creed had nine children – William Davis, Charles, Lonnie, Bertha, Calbert and four others died infancy. Creed Settles died 8 February 1930

Washington County, KY and was buried with his wife, Susie, at the Hillsboro Cemetery. Malissa Settles is listed in the 1920 census of Warren County, IL and 1930 census of Washington County, KY two households from her sister, Sarah (Young) Ash. In the obituary of Sarah Ash in 1945 she was reported to be survived by a sister, Mrs. Malissa Settles of Peoria, IL. Rice, in 1874 listed her as "Sarah A. Young". She married Jesse Rice, 8 January 1852 Hancock County, KY. Her father, Rev. Martin Young, performed the marriage and signed his consent for her to marry.

Jesse Rice is in the 1850, 1860 and 1870 censuses of Hancock County, KY; he was a farmer. Jesse, son of Benjamin M. Rice (1800-1881) & Eliza (1801-1867), was born c1831 Gallia County, OH. His grandparents, Jesse Rice & Elizabeth Marata, were residents of Point Pleasant Virginia (now West Virginia). Benjamin Rice is listed in the 1840 census of Gallia County, OH and by 1850 was living in Hancock County, KY. Five of Benjamin's brothers, John J., Jesse, James W., Andrew L. & Sylvester M., also came to Hancock County. Benjamin M. & Eliza were buried in the Nichols Cemetery in Hancock County. Benjamin died intestate and a circuit court suit was filed in Hancock County to settle his estate on 18 October 1881 (box #89, bundle #181, case file #1672). In the suit 8 children were named one of whom was Jesse Rice, Jr., who was then deceased. Jesse was listed in the suit and on his marriage as "Jr.' to distinguish him from his uncle of the same name. In the suit since he was deceased his widow, Sallie, and children, Jane wife of Robert McCleary, Mary Margaret wife of Henderson Johnson, Rosa Rice, William Henry Rice & Benjamin Forrest Rice were listed as heirs. Jesse Rice died 14 March 1879. His grandson, Gordon Rice (1905-1991), said Jesse was buried in Daviess County, KY off of the south side of Highway 60 between Maceo & Shady Rest and between Highways 60 & 144. Mr. Rice said he had no grave marker and that one of his cousins had visited the cemetery. Sarah Young Rice is listed as a widow in the 1880 & 1910 censuses of Hancock County, KY. In 1910 she was living with her son, Forest Rice. Gordon Rice said he remembers seeing his grandmother, Sally Rice, as a corpse; at her death she was living with his parents. She was buried in the Rice Cemetery on Middle Patesville Road in Hancock County on the farm of the late Kenneth Rice. She has no marker. His baby sister, Carrie Rice, is buried beside her mother; Carrie does have a monument. Sarah died 3 November 1910 Hancock County, KY.



He is listed in the 1860, 1870, 1880, 1910, 1920 & 1930 censuses of Hancock County, KY. In the 1900 census he appears in Cloverport, Breckinridge County, KY, where he was manager of the Johnson House Hotel. He was a farmer and served eight years as a magistrate. His granddaughter, Brownie Cahal Hicks (1913-1989) said he was 6 foot tall and was a quite a ladies' man. Mary Rice Johnson died 23 January 1932 Dukes, Hancock County, KY. Henderson Johnson died 30 December 1932 at the home of his son, Leonard, in Tell City, Perry County, IN. Henderson & Mollie were buried in the Johnson Cemetery, Dukes, Hancock County, KY.

Death in Flames. A very sad accident happened to the little tour-year-old girl of Forest Rice, while playing in the house around the fire. The little one's clothes caught from the blaze and the mother, who was absent from the room at the time, hearing the screams of the little child hastened to its assistance, but was too late to save the unfortunate little child from a burn that resulted in its death last Saturday night. The remains were interred on last Saturday evening in the Rice burying ground near Mt. Eden. Mr. Rice lives in the Mt. Eden neighborhood and is a very prominent and highly respected young farmer-Hancock Clarlon.

6. William M. Young was born in July 1836 Hancock County, KY. Only the month & year of his birth were inscribed on his tombstone. He is listed in the 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY. He was a farmer. He served as a Union soldier during the Civil War; mustered in 21 March 1862 and mustered out 29 March 1865. He served in company D of the 27th KY Infantry with several relatives and neighbors. He married Nancy Catherine Mathews, 15 March 1855 Hancock County, KY. They were married by his father, Rev. Martin M. Young. A record of their marriage in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics records his birth place as Hancock County, KY and hers as Green County, KY. Nancy, daughter of Thomas Mathews & Lucy Harlow, was born 15 May 1838 Green County, KY. Her father was listed in the 1840 census of Green County, KY and 1850 census of Hancock County, KY. Nancy died 20 July 1861 Hancock County, KY. She and two of her infant daughters have monuments in the Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY; she died six weeks after the birth of her daughter, Martha. William M. Young married Nancy's sister, Mary Elizabeth Mathews, 17 September 1865 Hancock County, KY. Mary was born 10 September 1842 KY. William M. Young died 14 July 1882 Hancock County, KY, where he has a monument in the Young Cemetery. His widow, Mary E. married William Oliver Spencer, 4 February 1884 Hancock County, KY. William, son of Cornelius Spencer & Dorothy Best, was born 8 January 1839 and died 17 April 1918 Daviess County, KY; buried Blackford Baptist Church Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. William O. Spencer was married four times – Artelia H. Hale, Mary Jane Thornton, Mary E. (Mathews) Young and Emma Dora (Lester) Best. Mary E. Young, widow of William M. Young, on 29 October 1882 purchased tracts of 50 & 12 ¹/₂ acres from Patrick & Nancy Jane Thornton (Hancock County deed book 21 p393). The land was located on the Hawesville-Pellville Road near Floral in Hancock County, KY. Patrick Thornton (c1826-after 1880), his wife, Nancy Jane Mathews (1824-1870) and their daughter, Mary Jane (Thornton) Spencer (1846-1880), wife of W. O. Spencer, were buried in the Thornton – Stephens Cemetery, just east of Floral, in Hancock County, on the Randall Stephens farm. Mary E. (Mathews), wife of William M. Young & William O.

Spencer, died 27 September 1894 Hancock County, KY, where she has a monument in the Thornton-Stephens Cemetery, near Floral. <u>Owensboro Messenger</u>, Owensboro, KY, Friday, 28 September 1894 p1 – "Died While Cooking Dinner: Mrs. William Spencer dropped dead Tuesday near Pellville, Hancock County. Death is supposed to have resulted from heart disease."



William M. Young (1836-1882)

William M. Young by his first wife, Nancy Catherine Mathews had 3 known children and by his second wife, Mary Elizabeth Young, he had 5 known children:

• Thomas Lafayette Young was born 1855-1856 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY. In the three censuses he was reported to be 4, 14 & 24 years old. He married Georgia Ann Clark, 4 July 1878 Hancock County, KY. Georgia, daughter of William M. Clark & Martha Elizabeth Tift, was born c1859 Hancock County, KY and died during 1880-1889. At a court of 3 April 1882 it was recorded that Thomas L. Young is exonerated from paying poll tax for the year 1881-1882 and thereafter, "he being disabled by losing an arm and being sickly" (Hancock County Order Book 11 p197). Thomas L. Young married second Dora Addie Spencer, 9 May 1889 Daviess County, KY at the residence of her father. Addie, daughter of William Oliver Spencer & Mary Jane Thornton, was born 20 October 1874 Daviess County, KY. Thomas L. Young died 1890-1895. In the 1896 school records for Hancock County his wife, Mrs. Addie (Spencer) Young, is shown as the guardian of their son, Herbert, age 6 and since Thomas is not listed he probably was then deceased. In the 1897 Hancock County school records Addie's father, William O. Spencer, replaces her as the guardian of her son, Herbert Young. Herbert Young in 1900 was living with his grandfather, William O. Spencer. Addie Young disappears after 1897. During that year she had been requested to leave the county.

Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, KY, 29 October 1897 p4: Caught Dead to Rights

Caught Dead to Rights Mrs. Addie Young, a grass widow who has been cavorting through the country to an extent that made her distasteful to the peace and dignity of the commonwealth, was caught dead to rights asleep in the woods lying peacefully by the side of her sweetheart Sunday night, says the Hawesville Plaindealer. She was brought to the city and lodged in jail.

Owensboro Inquirer, Owensboro, KY 28 October 1897 p1:

ON THE WARPATH. A Pellville Man Resents the Arrest of a Bad Woman.

PELLVILLE, Ky., Oct 28 .- This morning while Bee Spencer was driving home from his farm Jeff Harrison overtook him and began firing on him with a pistol. Spencer pulled his gun and began firing when his team took fright and ran off, throwing him out. He eutered his yard where Harrison attempted to get at him again. He fired another shot at Jeff, but none of the shots took effect. Harrison then started up the street, meeting Hillary Bruner. whom he proceeded at once to pound up in style. Hillary is a very small man and doubtless would have been used up if friends had not interfered. The affair all grew out of the arrest of the notorious prostitute, Addie Young, who was in company with Harrison when taken. Both Spencer and Bruner are highly respected Christian gentlemen. Further trouble is expected at any time, as there were thirteen good citizens with the sheriff when he went into the woods after the roman

Owensboro Inquirer, Owensboro, KY 19 November 1897 p6:

The Woman Came Back PELLVILLE, Nov. 17.-W. O. Spencer, the father of Mrs. Addie Young, the notorious woman who was run out of the country some weeks ago, got a letter from her purporting to be from a house of refuge in Louisville, in which she told him in affectionate words how she had reformed, and begging his The old man, who is a forgivness. devout christian, was somewhat elated over the letter, but on returning home found to his utter surprise that the said Ad had arrived about an hour before and had effectually cleaned up the premises. She had started all the occupants of his house and was reigning supreme over the entire estate. It will be remembered that this same woman was arrested a few weeks ago by a posse of mon under Miles Fuqua and landed in the Hawesville jail, after which she was tried and fined \$50 for her outrageous conduct. The fine was suspended, with the understanding that she was to leave the country. There has already been one shooting scrape on her account, and if she remains in this vicinity there will doubtless be more trouble, as the good citizens have sworn vengeance against her.

In 1909 Addie Young's father, William O. Spencer wrote his final will (Daviess County, KY Will Book F p622, will recorded 26 June 1918). He left his property to his widow, Emma, and four living children, one of whom was "Addie Young (or her heirs)". The wording suggests he did not know if Addie was living or dead. In 1924 a deed was recorded by the heirs of William O. Spencer deceased, among those named were Herbert Young & wife Arkie of Rockport, IN, his mother, Addie, was not named (Daviess County deed book 112 p467). Thomas L. Young & his first wife, Georgia Ann Clark were the parents of – Oscar Clarence

(21 May 1879 – 24 March 1951, buried Wardell Memorial Cemetery, Wardell, Pemiscot County, MO, married Minnie Jane Taylor, children – Marvin Hartley, Mabel Clarice, Benton Clarence, Merriel Chris & Lowanda Louise); and **Thomas F.** (21 June 1880 – 26 October 1881, buried Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY). Thomas L. Young and his second wife, Dora Addie Spencer were the parents of – **Herbert Lafayette** (15 August 1890 – 23 June 1959, in 1904 located in Spencer County, IN, buried Mt. Pleasant Cemetery, Griffin, Posey County, IN, married Arkie Betty Cheek, divorced 1945, Mary Sutton & Leona Fetcher, children by Arkie – Nora Alta, Goldie May, Mable Clarice, Herbert, George William, Warren G., Lorene, Irene, Juanita, Mary Edith, James Wesley & Carmelita Ruth, child by Leona – Sarah Elizabeth).

- Mary S. Young was born 20 March 1858 Hancock County, KY. She died of scarlet fever on 18 June 1859 Hancock County, KY. She has a grave marker in the Young Cemetery on the Rev. Ezra Meador farm in Hancock County, KY. Hers is the oldest marker grave in the cemetery.
- Martha E. Young was born 5 June 1861 Hancock County, KY. She died 10 April 1862 Hancock County, KY. She has a monument in the Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY.
- Marion Alfred Young was born in November 1868 Hancock County, KY. In his parents' home in the 1870 census he is listed as Alpha, age 2 and in the 1880 census as Alford, age 12. <u>Owensboro Messenger</u>, Owensboro, KY, 9 August 1889 p4 "W. O. Spencer was appointed guardian of Marion Young." In the 1900 census of Uniontown, Union County, KY he is listed as Marion A. Young (born November 1868, farm laborer, single); living with him were his brother, Henry P. & sister, Mattie Young. <u>Owensboro Inquirer</u>, Owensboro, KY, 15 July 1904 p5 "Floral: Mr. Alpha Young, of Denver, Colo., is visiting his sister, Mrs. Isiah Hoskins." <u>Hancock Clarion</u>, Hawesville, KY, 3 September 1904 "Mr. Alfred Young, who was visiting relatives in the county for past two months, returned to his home in Colorado yesterday." He was living in Colorado in 1906 when his sister, Margaret Hoskins died.
- Margaret Lucinda Young was born 3 January 1870 Hancock County, KY. In the 1870 census she was reported to be six months old. She is listed in the 1870, 1880 & censuses of Hancock County, KY. She married Isiah Hoskins, 22 March 1888 Daviess County, KY; he is also listed as Isaac and Ike. They were married at her stepfather, W. O. Spencer's, residence. Isiah was born 29 September 1866 KY out of wedlock to Martha Ellen Hoskins and was raised by his grandparents, John H. & Jane (Head) Hoskins, who he is listed with in the 1870 & 1880 censuses of Daviess County, KY. In 1896 Isiah Hoskins was the guardian for Margaret's nephew, Oscar Young, age 17. Isiah is in the 1900 & 1910 censuses of Hancock County, KY and 1920 census of Evansville, Vanderburgh County. IN; he worked as a farmer and as a night watchman at a steel plant. Margaret died 7 December 1906 and was buried Blackford Baptist Church Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. Hancock Clarion, Hawesville, KY, 4 October 1902 - "Floral: Mrs. Hoskins near here, is not expected to live but a few days." Isiah Hoskins married Mary Elizabeth (Vanvactor) Ashworth (1897-1921), 20 September 1910 Hancock County, KY; by this marriage he had a son, Austin Hoskins (1912-1978) and he

married third, Josephine Almeda Cisey (1873-1938) during 1921-1927. Isiah Hoskins died 5 August 1927 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN, where he was buried in the Oak Hill Cemetery. Margaret Lucinda Young & Isiah Hoskins were parents of – Loral (31 May 1889 – 11 September 1972, buried Rose Hill Cemetery, Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, married John Alfred Corley, children – Russell Howard, Mary Ellen, Mattie Lou, Elizabeth, Imogene & Jacquelyn); Mary Ellen (29 February 1892 – 20 January 1976, buried South Lawn Cemetery, South Bend, St. Joseph County, IN, married Oliver Morgan, child – Olive Marie); and Suelo (11 May 1897 – 11 October 1972, buried South Lawn Cemetery, South Bend, St. Joseph County, IN, married James Otway Basham & Michael Willis, child – Robert T. Basham).

- Henry Ples Young was born 1 April 1875 Hancock County, KY. His middle name was short for Pleasant; he was named after an uncle Pleasant Mathews. In 1890 his stepfather, William O. Spencer was appointed his guardian. He is listed in the 1880 census of Hancock County, KY, 1900, 1910 & 1930 censuses of Union County, KY, 1920 census of Crittenden County, KY and 1940 census of Owensboro, Daviess County, KY. He married Margaret Leona Botts, 15 December 1915 Morganfield, Union County, KY. Margaret, daughter of Charles W. Botts & Ellar Reburn, was born 9 January 1895 Union County, KY and died 17 March 1938 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY, where he was buried with his wife in the Rose Hill Cemetery. Children Clarence Franklin (1 September 1916 23 April 1997, buried Owensboro Memorial Gardens, Daviess County, KY, married

Martha J. Young, 'Mattie', was born 15 November 1877 Hancock County, KY. • In 1890 her stepfather, William O. Spencer was serving as her guardian. She is listed in the 1880 census of Hancock County, KY, 1900 & 1910 censuses of Union County, KY. In the 1900 she was listed four households after her future husband, Dr. George W. Norman. In 1901-1902 she attended the Owensboro Female College in Owensboro, KY and in 1903 was attending a school in Shelbyville, KY. She married Dr. George Wesley Norman, 8 July 1903 Hancock County, KY at the residence of her sister, Mrs. Isiah Hoskins near Pellville. Dr. Norman, son of Joseph C. Norman & Virginia Rebecca Brooks, was born 26 July 1847 Henderson County, KY. G. W. Norman is listed in the 1850, 1860, 1870 & 1880 censuses of Henderson County, KY, 1900 & 1910 censuses of Union County, KY and 1920 census of Pineville, Bell County, KY. As a teenager he joined the Confederate army during the Civil War (Raleigh's company, 10th KY Cavalry). On 13 July 1864 he participated in the Battle of Slate Riffle Hill near Hines' Mill (Dundee) in Ohio County. It was the only engagement fought in Ohio County during the war. Seven of his outfit of 35 was killed in the engagement (Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, KY, 18 July 1901). He was a graduate of the Kentucky School of Medicine in Louisville, KY in June 1888. He represented Henderson County, KY several terms in the Kentucky Legislature. He married first, Sarah Louise Moore (1840-1902), 29 April 1869 Henderson County, KY; they had 4 children – Albert C., Edward, Robert M. & Mattie. His wife, Sarah, died on 4 July 1902 in Hawesville, Hancock County, KY. Martha Young Norman died 4 March 1913 Henderson, Henderson County, KY of tuberculosis. She was buried in the Thornton - Stephens Cemetery, near Floral in Hancock County, KY, where her mother had been buried. She had no children. Dr. George W. Norman died 6 January 1924 Louisville, Jefferson County, KY and was buried with his first wife in the Hawesville Cemetery, Hancock County, KY.

They left immediately for Cannelton, Ind., where they will reside. Dr. Norman is one of the most prominent physicians in Cannelton, and at one time represented Union county, Ky., in the legislature. It has become a matter of history that Kentucky is the birth place of more men and women who have become noted for some special work or attainment than can be found in any other state. While those abroad are holding their own in the field of progress, the work done at home compares favorably with that of other states. Our people keep abreast of the times, and in no other class do we see this better exemplified than among our physicians and surgeons. They are to the front with new theories and discoveries which add appreciably to the world's store of knowledge.

Dr. George Wesley Norman, one of Kentucky's ablest physicians, considers his success in the treatment of clinical diseases due primarily to a belief that a physician could be as productive in his line of work as in any other profession. With this conviction, and a varied experience from his practice, Dr. Norman has evolved his own theory about some diseases that afflict mankind.

Dr. Norman was born and reared In Henderson county. His father, the late Rev. Joseph C. Norman, was a beloved minister in the Methodist Episcopal church, and a man of superior mental attainments. At an early ago Dr. Norman joined the Confederate army, but was captured and held a prisoner until near the close of the war, when he was released by special order from President Lincoln. After receiving a liberal education, he then graduated from the Kentucky School of Medicine in Louisville and selected one of the best locations in this county in which to practice his profession. For twenty years Dr. Norman was one of the leading spirits of Smith Mills, not alone in medicine but every activity which advanced the interest of his community. He was one of the best representatives Henderson county ever sent to Frankfort, and a number of his bills are incorporated into our constitution. It was due to his interest in the educational advancement of his state that saved the University at Lexington from being wrecked by its enemies. These labored to have the income tax which the state paid the college abolished, and have it depend upon endowments, or shift for itself. With a firmness which has always characterized him in his dealings with others, where right was questioned, the State College was saved and now ranks with the best in our country.

Mr. Norman has spent the last few years in special research, and in this work he has an efficient assistant in his wife, whose ability enables her to give the aid and encouragement so necessary in the successful prosecution of such work. After giving forty years to the study and relief of suffering humanity, Dr. Norman is now qualified in the true sense of the word to be of great service in his profession.

7. Agnes Young was born in September 1837 Hancock County, KY. Only the years of birth and death are on her gravestone and a death certificate could not be found. The 1850 census of Hancock County records her age as 12 years and the 1900 census gives her birth as September 1837. She married her first cousin, John H. Young, 21 December 1854 Hancock County, KY. On their marriage it was written that Martin Young father of lady gave consent in person. They were married by her father, Rev. Martin M. Young. John was called "Blue John" to distinguish him from Agnes' brother, (Black) John Young. Blue John, son of Jacob Young & Charlotte Bruner, was born 9 October 1831 Jefferson County, IL. A record of John & Agnes marriage was recorded in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics – it recorded that John was 22 & born Jefferson County, IL and Agnes was 17 & born Hancock County, KY. Blue John first appears in the Hancock County, tax lists in 1852; in the 1852-1854 lists he appears as "John H. Young". In the 1859 tax list after his name it is written (son of Jacob) and in the 1866, 1867 & 1868 tax lists after his name is written (Blue). John & Agnes are listed in the 1860, 1870, 1880, 1900 & 1910 censuses of Hancock County, KY. He served in the Union army during the Civil War. He enlisted in company D of the 27th KY Infantry on 20 October 1861. Enlisting in the same outfit on the same day was his brother, William M. Young, cousins, Martin V. Young, and, Davis T. Young, John Nix & John Jarboe. On 1 May 1863 he was promoted to a corporal and 29 March 1865 he was mustered out of service at Louisville, KY. He was granted a pension for his military service in 1890 (Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, KY, 17 October 1890 p4 - "John A. Clark, Fordsville, John Young, Hawesville, and Francis M. Hatler, Rosine, have been granted pensions".) In 1865 John

purchased tracts of 59 acres (from Joel C. Jackson) & 30 acres (from Martin Young, Sr.), both deeds identified him as "son of Jacob Young" (Hancock County, KY deed books 12 p529 & 13 p184). On 11 October 1870 John Young & wife Agnes, and William M. Estes & wife Cynthia E., donated one & 1/2 acre to Jesse Rice, Sr., Charles Hale & Andrew L. Rice, trustees of the United Baptist Church, called Mount Eden, it was bounded on the west by the Hawesville & Hartford Road (now Highway 69). One acre of the lot was from (Blue) John's Young farm on the north side of lot and the other 1/2 acre was from Estes' land. On this lot the Mt. Eden Baptist Church was erected. The Blue John Young farm bordered on the Mt. Eden lot. The Mt. Eden Baptist Church was officially organized in 1870. Its parent church was the Blackford Baptist Church. In the Blackford Church minutes it was noted that – Granted a request for our Minister and Deacons to help constitute a church at "Rice School House" first Saturday in March, 1870 (Mt. Eden Church). The following members were dismissed from Blackford Church by request at same business meeting to join the new church: T. H. Rice, A. L. Rice, Jesse Rice, Jr., Jesse Rice, Sr., James W. Rice, James W. Wine, James S. Rice John Nix, N. B. Comstock, Charles H. Rice Isaac E. Rice George W. Rice, D. L. Rice, Nat Young, Jesse L. Rice, Elmina Rice, Samantha J. Rice, Susan E. Wine, Eliza W. Comstock, Mary A. Hyde, Armanda Rice, Carolyn Rice, Carolyn M. Rice, Charity Rice, Elizabeth Rice, Mary Rice, Martha Lynch, Mary J. Rice. The church has always been located at its present site. Three different buildings have housed the congregation. The original building burned in March 1891. Following the fire, the church went without the service of a pastor for 2 years. During the time that construction was underway for the new house of worship the congregation met in the old Rice School house which was located on the property later owned by Calvin Young (1877-1960). A new church was dedicated in 1895. On 11 September 1937 plans for a new church were inaugurated. The old building was torn away and while construction was proceeding the congregation again met in the Rice School House. The new church, which forms the present auditorium, was built for \$2,300. It was dedicated 30 April 1939. John & Agnes Young have one of the most impressive monuments in the Mt. Eden Baptist Church Cemetery. Agnes died in 1914 and John on 15 October 1919 in Hancock County, KY. His death certificate recorded that he was born Illinois and was the son of Jacob Young.

KY. Nancy, daughter of Elza Sinclair & Martha Jane Jarboe, was born 5 December 1851 Marion County, KY. Her parents moved to Hancock County, KY from Marion County, KY about 1852; they were buried in the Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. Nancy's sister, Martha Ellen Sinclair, married Martin David Young, a second cousin of Jesse L. Young. During 1905-1910 Jesse L. Young moved from the Mt. Eden (Hennen Hollow) area of Hancock County to the Waitman-Lewisport neighborhood of Hancock County, where many of his descendants subsequently lived. Jesse L. Young died of pneumonia 29 March 1919 in Daviess County, KY near Waitman. His death certificate reports that he died on March 30th but March 29th was put on his tombstone. His wife, Nancy Jane, died on 28 January 1935 near Lewisport in Hancock County, KY. Jesse L. & Nancy J. were buried Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY.

Goering, Ky., Apr. 13.—The remains of Miss Allie Young were removed Friday from the previous resting place and laid away beside the grave of her sister in the Young cemetery.....Mr.

July 1899 Grayson County, KY. Lee & Nancy are listed in the 1900 census of Ohio County, KY, where they were residing near Jingo. Lee & Nancy were divorced 1902-1906; by their marriage they had one child – Ethel Jones (1903-1992, who married Dallas Garland Wright. Lee Jones was living when his daughter, Anne Gray, in 1915. His grandchildren had no contact with Lee Jones and did not know what happened to him. The children of Mary C. Young Jones after her death lived with their grandparents (Blue) John & Agnes Young, who are listed as their guardians in the Hancock County school records. Mary C. He married Melitta Ursley Willett, 2 November 1881 Daviess County, KY; his father signed his consent for the marriage. Melitta, daughter of George E. Willett & Nancy Jane Basey, was born 12 October 1864 Hancock County, KY. In the school records of Hancock County, KY John is listed in the years of 1894-1897 and 1902-1905. In 1900 they were living near Rosine in Ohio County, KY, where several Young relatives had located. John & Melitta were divorced 13 July 1909 Daviess County, KY; she subsequently used her maiden name (Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, KY, 27 August 1908 p2, 21 May 1909 p5, 25 June 1911 p1A, 11 July 1911 p5). Melitta married Mallie Hatfield, 24 October 1912 Rockport, Spencer County, IN; they were divorced 22 September 1914 Daviess County, KY. In 1912 Melitta was indicted in Daviess County for keeping a bawdy house (Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, KY, 7 November 1912 p2). "Mrs. Melitta U. Willett" and her sons, Lonnie C. & Ulysses are listed in the 1916 city directory of Evansville, IN. Melitta died 15 April 1916 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN, where she was buried in the Oak Hill Cemetery. John William Young married Dicey Ellen Wall, 5 June 1911 Daviess County, KY. Dicey, daughter of Benjamin Wall & Elizabeth Hall, was born 11 March 1873 Webster County, KY. Dicey had married Larkin Hensley, c1892, and William Thomas Jewell, 1903 (Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, KY, 23 April 1911 p1A). John William Young died of tuberculosis 30 March 1926 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN. His wife, Dicey, died 17 November 1938 Evansville, IN, where she & John W. Young were buried in the Park Lawn Cemetery. John William Young had 9 children by Melitta – Nancy Agnes (16 January 1883 – 12 November 1943, buried Maple Grove Cemetery, Boonville, Warrick County, IN, married William Barnett, Lemuel Coleman, Ed Hazelwood, L. However, a family bible in the possession of the late Flora Bell Young Rice (1902-2000) lists a birth date of 11 February 1879. A birth in 1879 is also supported by the age of 1 year that was recorded in the 1880 census. In the 1894 school records for Hancock County available at the Hancock County Courthouse "Martha E. Young, age 15", daughter of John Young is listed as being a student at the Rice school. Martha was also attending the Rice school during 1895-1897. Martha died 31 October 1899 Hancock County, KY.
- **Rosa Frances Young**, 'Rose', was born 1 March 1883 Hancock County, KY. The school records for Hancock County show that Rosa F. Young, daughter of John, was attending the Rice school near the Mt. Eden Church during 1894-1897.

He was a carpenter and building contractor. Rosa Rice died 12 April 1941 Pinellas County, FL, where she was buried in the Memorial Park Cemetery in St. Petersburg. William F. Rice married Emily Retta Clark (1885-1963), 17 October 1941 Hancock County, KY. Bill Rice died October 1967 Pinellas County, FL. He was buried with his two wives at the Memorial Park Cemetery in St. Petersburg, FL. Rosa F. Young & William F. Rice had no children. Tampa Bay Times, St. Petersburg, FL, Sunday, 13 April 1941 p2:

8. Susan Young was born 15 February 1841 Hancock County, KY. She is listed in her parents' home in the 1850 & 1860 censuses of Hancock County, KY. In the 1850 census she was reported to be 8 years old. She married Francis M. (Frank) Jarboe, 4 October 1861 Hancock County, KY. Consent was given by his mother, Ruth Jarboe, and her father, Rev. Martin Young, who performed the marriage. Susan's brother, Nathaniel, was married on the same day; both marriages were at the home of Martin Young. Francis, son of Benedict Jarboe & Ruth McFall, was born 8 January 1841 Hancock County, KY. Frank was the grandson of John William McFall & Elizabeth Young and was a first cousin once removed to Susan Young. In the 1850 Hancock County, KY census Francis M. Jarboe, 9, is listed with his parents. Francis M. Jarboe served in the Union army during the Civil War. He was a 2nd lieutenant in company D of the Green River Battalion, a Home Guard unit in Hancock County, KY. He was mustered into service on 1 June 1865 at Cloverport, KY and was mustered out on 23 August 1865 at Cloverport. "Susan Jarboe, widow of Franklin M. Jarboe", in 1883 applied for his Civil War pension. He appears in the annual tax lists of Hancock County in 1863 and last appears there in 1866. He died during 1866-1868. His widow "Mrs. Susan Jarboe" appears in his place in the 1868 tax list. Susan Jarboe appears as a household head in the 1870 Hancock County census; living with her were her two daughters, Virginia & Margaret, and her mother-inlaw, Ruth Jarboe. At the time of the 1880 census of Hancock County Susan Jarboe, "widowed", and her daughter, Margaret, were living in the home of her parents, Martin & Margaret Young. Susan married her first cousin, Horace Young (1831-1903), 18 May 1884 Hancock County, KY [see Horace Young family record on page 98]. Horace, Susan and their son, Owen Young are listed in the 1900 census of Hancock County, KY. In 1926 Susan was living near Patesville in Hancock County. Owensboro Inquirer, Owensboro, KY, 5 July 1929, p9 – "Patesville: Mrs. Anna Marlow, of Terre Haute, Ind. and Mrs. Susan Young, of near Hawesville, are visiting Mr. and Mrs. Arnold Jarboe." Susan Young died of apoplexy on 21 February 1932 Hancock County, KY at the home of her son, Owen Young. Owen Young on her death certificate reported her parents as Martin Young & don't know. Susan was buried in the Mt. Eden Baptist Church Cemetery in Hancock County. Her grave is marked by a concrete block next to the monument of her son, Owen Young.

Mrs. Susan Young, age 91 years, died at the home of her son, Owen Young, Sunday evening about 3 o'clock. She was twice married, the first time to Frank Jarboe. By this marriage she is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Annie Marlow, of Nashville, Tenn. Later she was married to Horace Young, by this marriage she is survived by one son, at whose home she died. She professed relig-ion at an early age and was a Baptist by belief. The funeral was conducted Monday morning at 11 o'clock by Rev. F. M. C. Jolly at the Mt. Eden Baptist church with interment in Mt Eden cemetery .--- Mt. Eden Cor.

The 1900 census recorded that Susan Young was the mother of 3 children, one of whom was then deceased. Susan was the mother of:

• Virginia Ann Jarboe was born 23 April 1863 Hancock County, KY. She married Marion Vest Marlowe, 18 September 1878 Hancock County, KY. Marion, son of Jesse G. Marlow & Isabelle Richards, was born 22 May 1858 Hancock County, KY. His surname also appears as Marlow; Marlowe is the spelling on his grave marker. Both spellings were used by his descendants. He was known by the

nickname of 'Manie'. He is listed in the 1860 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY, 1900 census of Cloverport, Breckinridge County, KY, 1910 & 1920 censuses of St. Louis, MO, 1930 census of Sikeston, Scott County, MO. Hancock Clarion, Hawesville, KY, 4 May 1901 – "Patesville: M. V. Marlow is moving back home this week. He has been living in Cloverport three years, but there is no place like home." Breckenridge News, Cloverport, KY, 20 April 1904 p8 -"Patesville: Mr. and Mrs. Blue John Young and daughter, of Mt. Eden, spent Friday night and Saturday with their relatives, Mr. and Mrs. M. V. Marlow." Owensboro Inquirer, Owensboro, KY, 22 April 1904 p6 - "Patesville, April 19: Mr. M. V. Marlow will move his family to Waverly, Tenn. He sold his property at public auction Saturday." In 1898 he was an employee of the Cincinnati Cooperage Company, in 1900 & 1910 he was a timber dealer for a stave company; in 1920 manager of a tie & timber company, in 1930 he was operating a grocery store at Sikeston, MO and in 1933 he was operating a grocery in Louisville, KY. Virginia Ann died of myrocarditis 13 August 1934 St. Louis County, MO and Marion V. Marlowe died 30 January 1943 Louisville, Jefferson County, KY. They were buried Greenwood Cemetery, Fairview Heights, St. Clair County, IL. The 1910 census recorded that 11 children had been born to Virginia, all of whom were then living. They were - Maude Marie (27 July 1879 - 26 January 1918, buried Greenwood Cemetery, Fairview Heights, St. Clair County, IL, married James David Johnson, children – Wilbur Louis, Leo M., Rolla Rock & David James); Walter Jack (28 July 1881 – 6 April 1955, buried Grove Hill Memorial Park Cemetery, Dallas, Dallas County, TX, married Hallie Warfield & Maude Mae Anderson, child by Hallie – Linn, children by Maude – Walter Jack & Robert Anderson); Lon Devere (2 August 1883 – 30 April 1944, buried Inglewood Park Cemetery, Inglewood, Los Angeles County, CA, married Ellen Marie Stevenson, children - Lon Devere & Frances Lee); Reuben W. (2 August 1886 – 14 January 1975, buried Cave Hill Cemetery, Louisville, Jefferson County, KY, married Pearl Elton Bowlds, children – Bernard Lee & Denella); Lawrence Thomas (21 March 1888 – 13 February 1968, buried Woodlawn Memorial Park Cemetery, Nashville, Davidson County, TN, married Mary Myrtle Anderson, children – Mary Ann, Elizabeth Jane, Lawrence Thomas, Jr. & Theodore Anderson); Florence C. (21 March 1890 – 27 January 1974, died San Bernardino County, CA, married Coleman Drummond Harris, children - Virginia & Robert Marlow D.); Stella V. (15 April 1892 – 22 June 1955, died Los Angeles County, CA, married Leslie Earl Sinks & Frederick Everett Senter, no children); Clara Edith (24 June 1894 – 28 April 1955, died Los Angeles County, CA, married Homer Lee Lewis, Kenneth A. Marion Vest Marlow, a retired lumber dealer, died at 11:20 a.m., Saturday, Jan. 30, at the home of a son, R. W. Marlowe in Louisville. He was 84 years of age. Surviving are five daughters, Mrs. C. D. Harris, New York

Mrs. C. D. Harris, New York City, Mrs. A. D. Andrews, Cleveland, Ohio, Mrs. Fred Genter, Mrs. Don Jennings and Mrs. W. C. Harris, all of Los Angeles, Calif.; and four sons, Walter Marlowe, Dallas, Tex., L. D. Marlowe, Los Angeles, Rigdon Marlowe, St. Louis, Mo., and R. W. Marlowe, Louisville. Funeral and burial were at East St. Louis, Ill.

Margaret Jarboe was born c1865 Hancock County, KY. In the 1870 & 1880 • Hancock County, KY censuses her ages were reported as 4 and 14. She died in April 1882 Hancock County, KY. She was not married. She had a child, Magnolia (Maggie Nola), who was born out of wedlock on 21 March 1882. On 29 June 1896 a suit was filed by Horace & Susan Young against Samuel Wheatley in the Hancock County, KY Circuit Court (bundle 190, file #1319, box 38, in the Archives of the Hancock County Courthouse). In their petition it was stated that in October 1895 Samuel Wheatley did without their consent have carnal knowledge of Magnolia Young, who is in their care. As a result Magnolia is now pregnant. She is the granddaughter of Susan Young & step-granddaughter of Horace Young. Magnolia was born out of wedlock on 21 March 1882 to the daughter of Susan Young by a former husband. When Magnolia was only about one month old her mother, Margaret, died. Susan & Horace Young have raised Magnolia as their own child. Horace & Susan requested damages in the sum of \$5,000. In the court's final decision Wheatley was ordered to pay \$50 & court costs to Horace & Susan Young. Samuel L. Wheatley, son of Thomas M. Wheatley & Catherine Gilmore, was born 12 August 1870 Hancock County, KY. Samuel married Dixie Nickleson, 21 January 1897 Hancock County, KY. Samuel L. Wheatley died 28 September 1925 Breckinridge County, KY, where he was buried in the Cloverport Cemetery. Magnolia appears with the Young surname, the name of her adoptive parents. In the Hancock County, KY school census records Magnolia Young was listed as a student at the Patesville school; Horace Young was listed as her guardian. In the list of 1894 she was reported to be age 12, in 1896 age 14, & in 1897 age 15; in the next available list (1899) she was not listed. Magnolia Young (Jarboe)'s son by Samuel Wheatley, Arnold Young, was born 17 August 1896 Hancock County, KY. Magnolia Young married William Wilford Nix, 26 September 1898 Rockport, Spencer County, IN. Magnolia used her sister's married name of Marlow on her marriage record. William W. Nix & Magnolia were 2nd cousins once removed, her great-grandfather, Martin Young, and his grandfather, Michael Young, were brothers. William W., son of James Nix & Nancy Jane Young, was born 16 July 1870 and died 26 March 1922 and

was buried Bethlehem Methodist Church Cemetery, Daviess County, KY. He also married Eva Dora Bruner (1875-1960), 18 November 1890 Hancock County, KY (divorced 1895) and Rebecca Ellen Rayman (1900-1970), 29 October 1900 Ohio County, KY. William Nix and wife, Maggie N. (born March 1882), are listed in the 1900 census of Daviess County, KY. In their home was listed a stepson, Arnold Wheatley (born August 1896). In the Patesville community column of the Hancock Clarion (Hawesville, KY) newspaper of 7 July 1900 the following item was printed - "Mrs. Nora [sic] Nix is not expected to live. She has consumption. She is with her grandmother, Mrs. Horace Young." Magnolia Nix died prior to 29 October 1900 when her husband, William W. Nix, remarried. In the 1903 & 1904 Hancock County school census records Arnold Young is listed as a student in the Patesville school. In 1903 his guardian was listed as Horace Young and in 1904 his guardian was shown as Susan Young. In both lists Arnold Young was listed as being born on 17 August 1896. Arnold Young married Elma Whitman, 26 April 1918 Mount Carmel, Wabash County, IL. He died 3 March 1969 Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN and was buried Williams Cemetery, Pike County, IN. Arnold & Elma Young were the parents of - Juanita, Theodore Roosevelt, Kingsley Lincoln, Amy Golden, Virginia Lucille, Edna Maxine, Marvin Leon, Barbara Jean, Arnold, Jackie Lynn & Glenn MacArthur).

- **Owen Young** was born 5 May 1887 Hancock County, KY and died 20 June 1943 Owensboro, Daviess County, KY. [See Owen Young family record on page 101]
- 9. Jacob Henry Young was born October c1847 Hancock County, KY. In the 1866 tax list of Hancock County "Jacob Young son of Martin" is listed and it was indicated that he was not yet age 21. The first tax list where it was shown he had attained the legal age of 21 is the 1869 list. He is listed in the Hancock County censuses of 1850 (age 3), 1860 (age 13), 1870, 1880 & 1900. Jacob served as a private in the home guard of the Union army during the Civil War. He was mustered into company D of the Green River Battalion on 1 May 1865 at Hawesville, KY and was mustered out on 23 August 1865 at Cloverport, KY. Several of his relatives served in the same unit. Jacob H. Young married Julia Ann Nix, 11 April 1869 Hancock County, KY. They were first cousins once removed. Julia Ann, daughter of John Nix & Elizabeth Young, was born October 1850 Hancock County, KY. In the 1880 census he was enumerated immediately preceding the home of his parents. In 1889 he sold his interest in land owned by his father, Martin Young (Hancock County, KY deed book 25, p11). The 1900 census records that Jacob Young was a farmer and owned a farm. Jacob H. Young died 11 June 1902 Hancock County, KY.

Owensboro Inquirer, Owensboro, KY, Friday, 13 June 1902, p5,

Patesville community column dated June 11: this week....News has just reached us that Mr. Jacob Young died at 6 o'clock this morning. He leaves a wife, two children and a host of relatives and friends to mourn their loss. Mr. Young was about 60 years old, a consistent Christian ,and a member of the Baptist church. We extend our sympathies to the bereaved ones.... Julia Nix Young was a member of the Patesville Baptist Church in Hancock County in 1894. She is listed as a widow in the 1910 & 1920 censuses of Hancock County, KY. The 1900 & 1910 censuses record that 8 children had been born to Julia but only 2 were then living. Julia Young died 14 August 1921 Hancock County, KY. <u>Owensboro Messenger</u>, Owensboro, KY, Friday, 19 August 1921 p5 – "Deanfield: Mrs. S. Clark, of this place, was called to the bedside of her mother, Mrs. Young, who was seriously ill and died Sunday morning. Mrs. Young's home was between Patesville and Hawesville."

Jacob Henry Young and Julia Ann Nix were the parents of 8 children:

• William James Young, 'Bud', was born 7 January 1874 Hancock County, KY. This birth date is recorded in the 1874-1878 Kentucky Vital Statistics. The 1900 census gives it as in June 1874. He is listed by his middle name in the 1910 census; it is hard to decipher, but looks like James. He is listed in the 1880, 1900, 1910 & 1920 Hancock County, KY censuses. In 1920 his mother was living with him. He died of uremia on 22 August 1925 Hancock County, KY. He never married. Ira Remington the informant on his death certificate reported that he was born on 15 May 1880, which is not too reliable since he was about six years off on his correct age. An obituary stated he was buried at the "Davis Young Cemetery." Since he was buried there his parents were most likely also buried there.

<u>Hancock Clarion</u>, Hawesville, KY, Saturday, 29 August 1925 p1 -"W. J. Young, age 48 years, died at his home, Saturday morning at 10 o'clock of dropsy. He had been in bad health for several years, and for the past few months had been very ill. He is survived by one sister, Mrs. Lizzie Clark. The remains were laid to rest in the Davis Young graveyard in the presence of a large crowd."

- Martin Young was born 1878-1879 Hancock County, KY and died in January 1880 Hancock County, KY. His death is recorded in the 1880 federal census mortality schedule (member of household #170). He was one year old and he died of an enlargement of the liver.
- Lillian Young was born 1880-1881 Hancock County, KY. She appears to have died during 1896-1897 or at least prior to 1900. In the Hancock County, KY school records during the years of 1894, 1895 & 1896 Jacob Young is listed as being the parent or guardian of Lillian (Lillie) Young (age 14 in 1894) and Lizzie Young (age 10 in 1894). In 1897 school census Jacob is still listed with Lizzie but Lillian no longer appears.
- Elizabeth Young, 'Lizzie', was born 13 June 1884 Hancock County, KY. In the Hancock County, KY school records she is shown as being a student at the Hennen School during the years of 1894-1904. She married Samuel R. Clark, 29 January 1909 Hancock County, KY. Sam, son of John Alfred Clark & Mary Martha Hall, was born in 27August 1887 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1900 & 1910 censuses of Hancock County, KY. Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, KY, Thursday, 26 March 1914 p6 – "Deanefield, Ky., March 25: Mr. Sam Clark, of Patesville, moved into the Joe Mills property on Thursday." Owensboro Messenger, Owensboro, KY, Wednesday, 20 May 1914 p6 -"Deanefield, Ky., May 19: Mrs. Sam Clark and mother, Mrs. Young went to Hartford on Saturday to visit Mr. John Nix." In 1917 Sam Clark was employed at the Central Coal & Iron Company at Deanfield in Ohio County, KY. Lizzie Clark and her two children are listed in the 1920 census of Ohio County, KY and 1930 census of Cannelton, Perry County, IN. The 1930 census and her death certificate reports she was still married. Her husband was last found in 1917. Lizzie died 18 March 1939 Cannelton, Perry County, IN, where she was buried in the Cliff Cemetery in Cannelton. Children - Steven Clinton (17 December 1909 - 30 April 1964, buried Cliff Cemetery, Cannelton, Perry County, IN, married Dollie A. King); and Emma Mae (21 December 1918 –24 October 2002, buried Cliff Cemetery, Cannelton, Perry County, IN, married _ Gelarden, George Hester Allen & William Howard Minton, her obituary reported no survivors).
- Martin Young was born 1890-1891 Hancock County, KY and died 1897-1900. In the 1897 census of the Hennen school in Hancock County, KY Jacob Young is listed as the parent or guardian of Liza Young, age 13, and Martin Young, age 6 and in the 1900 census Jacob is shown only with Lizzie Young, age 15.
- three others died infancy.
- 10. Nathaniel Young, 'Nat', son of Rev. Martin M. & Margaret Young, was born 25 April 1839 Hancock County, KY. He is listed in the 1850, 1860, 1870 and 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY. In the 1850 (age 10) & 1860 (age 20) censuses he was living with his parents. In the minutes of the Blackford Baptist Church in Hancock County it was recorded that on 22 December 1855 Nathaniel Young was baptized. Other relatives baptized on that day included Davis Young, Horace Young, John Nix, James Nix and George Jarboe. Nathaniel first appears in the Hancock County tax lists in 1862. He was a farmer. Nathaniel served in the Union army during the Civil War. He enlisted on 6 November 1861 in company E of the 3rd KY Cavalry, he was mustered in as a corporal at

Calhoun, KY on 13 December 1861. He was granted a certificate of disability for discharge due to an injury of the left leg by which exfoliation of the tibia has occurred and chronic inflammation. He was present during the Battle of Shiloh, TN on 6 & 7 April 1862. In December 1862 he applied for a Certificate of Disability for Discharge. He testified that:

"while in the service, aforesaid, and in the line of his duty near Columbia, Tennessee on or about the 8th day of April 1862 whilst lifting a wagon he received a bruise on his left leg between the ankle & knee joint which by exposure incidental to a camp life induced chronic inflammation of said leg, the inflammation first made its appearance near the lower extremity of the tibia since which time it has been steadily advancing upwards, attended at time with exfoliation and extrusion of a number of splinters of bone, at this time there is a swelling in front of the leg with small openings or running sores clearly indicating a disease of the bone and that this disability is permanent. That he was a farmer at time of enlistment and earning a living by said occupation, but is now unable to follow said occupation or any other that requires manual labor by which he can obtain a total subsistence. That he lived over thirty miles from a Government Surgeon and for further evidence he refers to the surgeons certificate of disability on file in the adjutant generals office, Washington City."

The surgeon noted that he was quite lame and entirely unfit for duty and he thought his disability was permanent. He was hospitalized at the general hospital in Louisville, KY. He was honorably discharged at Louisville, KY on 9 January 1863. He was described as being age 22, 5 foot 9 inches with blue eyes and dark hair. He filed for an invalid pension on 13 May 1864 due to the fact that he had been a farmer when he enlisted and is now unable to perform manual labor of that occupation. His pension was approved. He also served as a sergeant in the home guard unit, Green River Battalion (company D), from 1 May 1865 until 23 August 1865. His wife, Arminda, filed for widow's pension and it was granted on 2 October 1886. In her application she reported that her husband had also contacted disease of the lungs due to exposure at the Battle of Shiloh.

Nathaniel Young was one of the founding members of the Mt. Eden Baptist Church in Hancock County. In the minutes of Mt. Eden's parent church, Blackford Baptist Church, it was recorded that on 26 February 1870 letters of dismission were granted to 28 members to form a new church at the Rice school, which is to be constituted on the first Saturday in March next. Among them were Nathaniel Young and his cousins, Davis T. Young and John Nix. Nathaniel married Hannah Jane Young, 4 October 1861 Hancock County, KY. They were married by his father and both of their fathers gave their consent in person. They were first cousins. Hannah, daughter of Michael Young & Nancy Bruner, was born 4 September 1838 Jefferson County, IL. Hannah's birth date was recorded in a Nix – Young family bible. Copies of the family pages in the bible were sent by Clifton H. Nix (1925-1988), of Cook Station, MO to Mildred Frances White of Cloverport, KY and to the Hancock County Archives in Hawesville, KY. Hannah in her parents' home in the 1850 Hancock County census was reported to be 12 years old and born in the state of Illinois. A record of Hannah & Nathaniel's marriage was recorded in the 1852-1861 vital statistics kept by the state of Kentucky. On this record Hannah was reported to be 21 years old and born in Illinois. Hannah Jane Young died in October 1874 Hancock County, KY. Her date of death was recorded by Nathaniel's widow, Arminda, in 1886, on her application for his Civil War pension. Nathaniel Young married Arminda Etter Hale, 18 September 1875 Indian Hill, Hancock County, KY. They were married by his father at the residence of her stepfather, James Sanders.

Arminda was the daughter of William Hale, Jr. & Ruth Elmira Bruner, and granddaughter of William Hale & Catherine Snider and George Washington Bruner & Mary Davis. Arminda was born 5 January 1857 Hancock County, KY. The same date appears on a birth record in the 1852-1861 Kentucky Vital Statistics and on her death certificate. Her family in the 1860 census of Hancock County are listed in the Floral – Indian Hill area. In this census she is listed as Amanda. Her grandchildren said her name was "Arminda Etter" not Amanda. In the pension file of Nathaniel Young her name appears as Arminda Etter Young. Her uncle, Thomas Hale, was killed at his home in Hancock County, in 1863 by Confederate marauders. Another uncle, Charles Hale, of the Hancock County home guard, in 1865 in a skirmish near Patesville in Hancock County shot the notorious Confederate guerilla Bill Davison, who died a few days later; about a month before the engagement Davison had burned the Daviess County Courthouse in Owensboro, KY. Nathaniel Young in the Hancock County's deed books is never shown as buying or selling land. Being in debt he obtained a mortgage on his tobacco crops in 1876 & 1877. On 10 October 1883 being in debt to Vest & Smart of Cloverport he mortgaged to them his interest in the real estate that had been owned by his father; the same on which his father had lived at the time of his death (Hancock County, KY Mortgage Book 8, p15). Nathaniel died on 24 April 1884 in Hancock County, KY. He was buried in the Young Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. Several granddaughters reported that his first wife, Hannah Jane, and two of their infants were buried in unmarked graves near him in the Young Cemetery.

Two suits were filed in the Hancock County Circuit Court to deal with Nathaniel Young's interest in the farm of his father (case file #2345, Davis Young et al vs. heirs of William Young deceased & heirs of Nathaniel Young deceased, filed in 1901; and case file #1933 Jacob Young et al vs. Martin Young, Jr., filed in 1908). The suits resulted in deeds bring recorded in 1894 & 1908 whereby the heirs of Nathaniel Young, deceased - Arminda E., William, Joseph & Jacob Young, transferred their interest in the former farm of Nathaniel's father, Martin Young (Hancock County, KY deed books 27 p68 & 36 p233). Nathaniel's nephew, Martin Young (1863-1947, son of Davis & Mary) became the purchaser of the farm.

Arminda E. Young on 13 December 1886 purchased two tracts of land containing 70 acres from Louis Petrie & wife, Sarah E. (Hancock County, KY deed book 23 p336). She paid \$700. The land was earlier owned by Bryant & John Glover. The land is on the north side of the Indian Hill Road a short distance east of the Hawesville-Pellville Road and the Glover family cemetery that is at the northeast side of the intersection of the two roads. The abandoned house, the first house on right, was still standing in 1980. Arminda was living here on the same land in 1894 when she obtained a mortgage on the property. While she was living on the Glover place during the 1890's Neezer Young resided with her. Neezer was a nickname for George Adam Young (c1851-c1899). Neezer, the son of George & Sarah Young, was a first cousin of Nathaniel Young. Like Arminda he was

also a widower. The Hancock County school records show that in 1897 Neezer's daughter, Lizzie, and Arminda's son, Jacob, were students at the Floral school. Arminda and her siblings had earlier attended the Floral School located on the Hawesville-Pellville Road about a mile south of the Indian Hill Road

<u>History of Daviess County, Kentucky</u>, Knottsville Precinct section Inter-State Publishing Co., Chicago, IL, 1883, p598:

INDIAN HILL.

This hill is six miles east of Knottsville, and is now in Hancock County. It is oblong in shape, one and one-half miles long, and from one-fourth to one-half mile in width. It is very high, and furnishes a beautiful view of the surrounding country and of Hardinsburg, a distance of twenty-eight miles. There were formerly three ovoid or egg-shaped stone houses or huts on the hill, all in a straight line, about 250 yards equidistant; only two of them re. main. They are about twelve feet high, and have neither doors nor windows. One of them was torn away by George W. Bruner, who says that the foundation was deep in the earth. He dug down six or eight feet, but failed to reach the base, and abandoned further search. The pioneers supposed that these strange specimens of architecture were built by Indians, and, finding indications of the tomahawk in the trees there, named it the Indian Hill-a name which it will probably continue to bear until the end of time. "Uncle" Henry Hazel, who gives this information, has been on the top of the huts and looked down the aperture in the center, and found the floors covered with weeds and grass.

Arminda Young is listed in the 1900 census of Ohio County, KY; she was residing in the Old Bethel Church neighborhood in the Rosine Precinct, where she was renting. Living with her then were her sons, Joseph & Jacob and Joseph's wife, Hester. Hartford Herald, Hartford, KY, 3 April 1901 p2 - "Schroader Schoolhouse, April 1: Mrs. Arminda Young has moved into the property of Mr. Mac Warner." Hartford Herald, Hartford, KY, 4 December 1901 p3 – Schroader Schoolhouse, Dec. 1 – Mrs. Arminda Young moved from this place to Hancock county last week." About 1905 Arminda moved to the house on the west side of the Hawesville-Pellville road just south of the Indian Hill Road, that in 1980 had been the residence of Katie Glover Brandle (1889-1982) since 1916. On 13 May 1908 Arminda married William Hiram Josleyn at Floral in Hancock County, KY. William, son of Ambrose Everett Eli Josleyn & Sarah Elizabeth Watson, was born 5 August 1884 Horton, Ohio County, KY. William was a first cousin of Arminda's daughter-in-law, Hester Ann Ashford. In 1910 William & Arminda are listed together in the 1910 census of Cloverport, Breckinridge County, KY and 1920 census of Pellville District, Hancock County, KY. Living next to them in 1910 was her son, Jacob Young. The 1910 census reported that Arminda had been married twice. The 1900 & 1910

censuses recorded that she was the mother of 3 children, one of whom was deceased. William Joselyn died on 19 June 1926 at Floral in Hancock County, KY; he was buried with his parents in the Old Salem Cemetery in Hopkins County, KY. Arminda was living with her son, Joe, in Ohio County, KY at the time of the 1930 census. Arminda Joselyn died on 4 March 1938 Cloverport, Breckinridge County, KY at the home of her son, Joseph B. Young. She was buried in the Blackford Baptist Church Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. Her grave is unmarked but was in the south western corner of the cemetery near the monument of her son, Jacob H. Young. Her father, William Hale, Jr. (c1820-1861), is also buried in an unmarked grave in the same section; her mother, Ruth, was buried with her second husband, James Sanders, in the Sanders Cemetery, on the opposite side of the Indian Hill Road from the former home of Arminda (Bryant Glover place).

Owensboro Inquirer, Owensboro, KY, Thursday, 21 May 1908 p1:

Wedding of Opposites. We had a very remarkable wedding here a few days ago, bringing strongly to the front the opposites. Mrs. Arminda Young, of this place, was wedded to William Joshlyn, of Hopkins county, Rev. Ira L. Rice officiating. In age the bride was 50 and the groom 24; she weighed 220 pounds and he 115; she was a pensioner and he a peasant. They went to Hopkins county, where they will make their home.—Floral correspondent to Hancock Clarion.

MR. JAKE YOUNG'S MOTHER DIED

Mrs. Amanda Joshlyen, 86 year sold, formerly of this county, died at the home of her son, J. B. Young in Cloverport Friday, March 4. She had been in ill health for the past thirty years.

When a young woman, Mrs. Joshlyen was married to Mr. Nathaniel Young, who preceded her in death. She later married Mr. Will Joshlyen who died several years ago.

Funeral services were conducted at the Blackford church Saturday afternoon, with Rev. Norrington in charge. Burial was in the church cemetery.

She is survived by two sons, Jake Young of this county and J. B. Young of Cloverport; Twelve grandchildren and two great grandchildren. A sister, Mrs. Elmira Voyles of near this city, and a brother, David Hale of Wolf Lake, Ill., also survive.

• William David Young, 'Willie', was born 20 March 1864 Hancock County, KY. His birth date was recorded in a Nix - Young family bible. The same date was engraved on his grave marker. He is listed in the 1870 & 1880 censuses of Hancock County, KY, 1900, 1910, 1920 & 1930 censuses of Ohio County, KY. He married Amanda Martisha Wright, 12 September 1890 Ohio County, KY. Their marriage license reported he was age - 25, residence - Ohio County, occupation - farming, he & parents born Hancock County, KY. Martisha, daughter of William Thomas Wright & Henrietta Schroader, was born 14 February 1873 Ohio County, KY. He was a farmer and owned a farm at Red Hill in Ohio County. Hartford Herald, Hartford, KY, 28 September 1904 p2 - "Jingo, Sept. 26: Mr. Wm. Young has lately commenced the erection of a nice dwelling house at this place." Ohio County News, Hartford, KY, 23 November 1934 -"Red Hill: Mr. and Mrs. W. M. Young spent the week-end at Cloverport, with Mr. Young's step-mother, Mrs. Arminda Young." Ohio County News, Hartford, KY, 8 November 1935 – "Red Hill: Willie Young is visiting his brother, Jake Young and wife, of Hancock County." He and his wife died in Ohio County, KY. He died 17 July 1937 and Martisha died 15 November 1938. They were buried in the Schroader Cemetery on their farm at Red Hill in Ohio County. His wife, two sons and two infants of Mike & Minerva Young, who was a relative, were buried there.

William Young. 7.3, a farmer of Red Hill community, died at 4:30 p. m. Saturday, July 17, of tuberculosis. Mr. Young was born in Hancock county, near Cloverport. He moved to Ohio county 50 years ago and for a number of years engaged in mining at McHenry, later returning to the community, where he died. He professed faith in Christ at the age of 18 years and united with Cloverport Baptist church. He was later a member of Concord church and when Red Hill church was organized and the building completed he moved his membership there, where he could conveniently attend services. He was a consistent christian and a very influential citizen. He was married to Miss Martisha Wright and to this union nine children were born. Among surviving members of the family are four daughters, Mrs. Etta Minton, Mrs. Arminda Wakeland, of McHenry, Mrs. Fannie Midkiff and Mrs. Finis Nabours. of Red Hill; three sons. - Nancy Bell Young was born 7 May 1866 Hancock County, KY. Her birth date was recorded in a Nix Young family bible. In the 1870 census she was reported to be 4 years old. She died before the 1880 census.
- Annetta Young was born in October 1869 Hancock County, KY. The month and year of her birth are noted in the 1870 census. She died before the 1880 census.
- Joseph Benjamin Young, 'Joe', was born 9 December 1876 Hancock County, • KY. His mother reported this date on her application for her husband's Civil War pension in 1886 and he reported the same date on his registration for the World War I draft. In the 1895 & 1896 school records of Hancock County he is listed as a student at the Floral school. He married Hester Ann Ashford, 28 May 1900 at Ohio County Courthouse, Hartford, KY. On their marriage license it was recorded that he & his parents were born Hancock County, KY, age - 23, occupation farming, residence - Jingo, Ohio County, KY; bride & her mother were born Ohio County, KY, her father was born Allen County, KY, age – 17, residence – Horton, Ohio County, KY. Hester, daughter of Joseph Melvin Ashford & Thena Ann Watson, was born 7 June 1883 Rosine, Ohio County, KY. Her father was a veteran of the Union Army during the Civil War, who lost his right arm during the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. Joseph Young is listed in the 1900, 1920 & 1930 censuses of Ohio County, KY and 1910 census of Hopkins County, KY. In 1900 & 1930 he was living in the Horton neighborhood of the Rosine Precinct in Ohio County and in 1920 at Simmons in Ohio County. The 1900, 1920 & 1930 censuses reported he was working as a farmer, in 1910 he was employed as a coal miner and in 1945 he was working as a janitor at the Chrysler Corporation in Evansville, IN.

<u>Hartford Republican</u>, Hartford, KY, 5 November 1903 – "Horton: Mr. Joseph Young, of Rosine, is among the recent additions to our neighborhood."

<u>Ohio County News</u>, Hartford, KY, 25 May 1928 p2 - "Red Hill: Mr. and Mrs. Joe Young were host and hostess at a party at their home in this section Saturday night. The occasion was enjoyed very much by the young people of the community."

In 1938 when his mother died he was living in Cloverport, KY. He and Hester are listed in the 1945 city directory of Evansville, IN. Joe & Hester separated for a time during the 1930's. While he was residing at Cloverport he had another child, Mary Board, by Mamie Board. The family knew about her. He carried a picture of her in his overall pockets. Hester Ashford Young died 15 January 1955 at the Owensboro - Daviess County Hospital, Owensboro, KY; she had suffered a broken hip three days before. She was buried in the Rosine Cemetery, where her parents and grandfather, John S. Ashford, and many other relatives were buried. The Rosine Cemetery began as the Ashford family cemetery before the establishment of the town of Rosine in 1872. John S. Ashford was buried there in 1867. Joseph B. Young died at a nursing home in Evansville, Vanderburgh County, IN on 20 April 1964. He was buried beside his wife in the Rosine Cemetery. A few feet from their graves are the impressive monuments of Bill Monroe, the father of Bluegrass Music, and his Uncle Pen.

The US Social Security Records has his birth date as 24 February 1877. The 1880 census reported he was age 2 and had a deformed foot. He is listed in the 1880, 1930, 1940 censuses of Hancock County, KY, 1900 census of Ohio County, KY, and 1910 census of Cloverport, Breckinridge County, KY. In the 1895, 1896 & 1897 school records of Hancock County he is listed as a student at the Floral school.

Jacob Young enlisted in the US Army (40th Coast Artillery) in 1901; at the time he was a resident of Jingo, Ohio County, KY. He was discharged on 25 October 1902 due to disability. He received a pension for his military service. He married Mollie Jane Pate, about 1907. Mollie, daughter of Jeremiah Crawford Pate & Elizabeth Alice Seaton, was born 23 April 1879 Cloverport, Breckinridge County, KY. Mollie died 17 June 1953 Hancock County, KY. Jacob died at the VA hospital in Louisville, KY on 22 June 1962. He and Mollie were buried in the Blackford Baptist Church Cemetery, Hancock County, KY. Jacob & Mollie had a son, **Claude F.** (10 February 1903 – 24 November 1988, buried Blackford Baptist Church Cemetery, Hancock County, KY, married Clara Ellen Nix, children – Georgia Pearl, Henry Samuel, Claude F. Ulin, Mildred Dean, Victor Glenn, Shelby Wayne & Clay).
