WPA's Registration of Veteran's Graves for McLean County, KY

When the Great Depression hit the United States in 1929, the American economy hit rock bottom. The value of the dollar became nearly worthless and millions of Americans lost their jobs. In 1933, President Franklin D. Roosevelt introduced "The New Deal," a series of new programs designed to pick America back up on to its feet and get the economy moving again. The Works Progress Administration (WPA), founded in 1935, was one of the federal work programs. The Graves Registration Program was one of several projects of the WPA. The purpose of this public project was to learn and record burial data on men who had served our country from the American Revolution through World War I. Some of this recorded information will not be found through any other sources.

These records were not comprehensive of all veterans' graves in McLean County; they are only the ones identified by the WPA workers. Many names are misspelled and many dates are in error. However, the greatest value in this listing is in the identification of the place of burial.

The original record may include – birth and death, enlistment and discharge dates, what war served in, the organization in which veteran served along with his rank and the name of the informant who reported the information.

FITTS, Fink
 Veteran of the Civil War. Buried in Riggs Cemetery, side road off hwy 81, Calhoun. Information given by Pete Smith.

GALOWAY, Adam
 Veteran of the Civil War. Buried in Cumblan Cemetery, Poplar Grove. Information given by E. T. Matting.

GATES, Loyd W. Aug 1, 1830 Dec 17, 1890
 Veteran of the Civil War. Buried Calhoun Cemetery off hwy 136. Information given by Genetry Hicks.

GHEON, Thomas E. Dec 6, 1863 Jun 22, 1915
 Veteran of the Civil War. Buried In Mt. Zion Cemetery. Information given by R. S. Sturgeon. (There is obviously a mistake in this report. I found no Thomas E. Gheon listed

in the Report of the Adjutant General in the Union Army or the Confederate Army. If the birth date is correct, he could not be a veteran of the Civil War).

HARRISON, Thomas F. Jan 1842 1932
 Veteran of the Civil War. Enlisted Sept. 14, 1861. Served as a Saddler in Co. D 11th Reg. Ky. Inf. Discharged Dec. 17, 1864. Buried in Calhoun Cemetery, Calhoun, Kentucky. Information given by Mrs. Thomas F. Harrison. Remarks: Union soldier.

HATFIELD, William A. Feb 29, 1897 Jun 6, 1938
 Veteran of World War I. Enlisted Dec. 12, 1917. Served as a Private in 62 Rect. Cac. Buried in Oak Hill Cemetery, Livermore, Ky.

HAWISS, Carilla Nov 11, 1822 Dec 22, 1870
 Veteran of the Civil War. Buried in Calhoun Cemetery, off hwy 136. (Surname may be Hawes)

HAYETT, Jesse Jan 9, 1840 Feb 28, 1926
 Veteran of the Civil War. Report of the Adjutant General list a Jessey Hyatte as a Pvt / Corp. serving in Co C 17 Ky. Vol. Inf. Buried in Bethel Grave Yard, east of Beech Grove, hwy 56. (Jessey Hyatt is on the tombstone).

HAWISS, Carrilla Nov 11, 1822 Dec 22, 1890
 Veteran of the Civil War. Buried in Calhoun Cemetery, off hwy 136. Information given by Gentry Hicks. (No information on this name found in The Report of the Adjutant Report in either the Union or Confederate Armies. However, there is a record of Corilla Hawes, Nov. 11, 1822-Dec. 22, 1890, buried in the John Calhoun Family Graveyard, located on the north side of First Street on a hill overlooking Green River near the locks and dam in

Calhoun, KY. McLean County Cemeteries. Vol. 1. lists Corilla Hawes as the second wife of Hugh Walker.)

Veteran of the Civil War. Enlisted Sept. 10, 1861. Served as a Sergeant in Co. C 16 Ky. Vol. Inf. Buried in Oak Grove Church Cemetery near hwy 250. Information given by Jack Johnson. Added information: A G O gives name as Robert Neal; listed in McLean Co. Ky Boys in Civil War.
- HENSON, Jesse R. Aug 7, 1845 Oct 15, 1916
Veteran of the Civil War. Enlisted Dec. 24, 1862. Served as a Private in Co. C 17th Ky. Inf. Discharged Jan. 23, 1865. Buried in Bethel Cemetery, Beech Grove. Remarks: Union soldier; made his own tombstone; all information on stone that was needed.
- HERNDON, W. J. Mar 4, 1841 Oct 6, 1893
Veteran of the Civil War, Enlisted Jan 27, 1864. Served as a Private, Union soldier, in Co. C 26th Regiment Ky. Infantry. Buried in Hackett Cemetery, Livermore, Ky. Information given by B. K. Herndon, son.
- HICKMAN, William H. 1843 Oct 7, 1938
Veteran of the Civil War. Enlisted July 1861. Served as a Private in the 26th Reg. Ky. Inf. Information given by George Hickman, son.
- HICKS, H. G. Jan 8, 1821 Jan 30, 1881
Veteran of the Civil War. Enlisted Nov. 11, 1861. Served as a Pvt. in C. G. 5 Reg. Inf. Buried in Pleasant Hope Cemetery, off hwy 250, Calhoun, KY. Information given by Jackie Davis (care taker). (Tombstone reads H. V. Hicks).

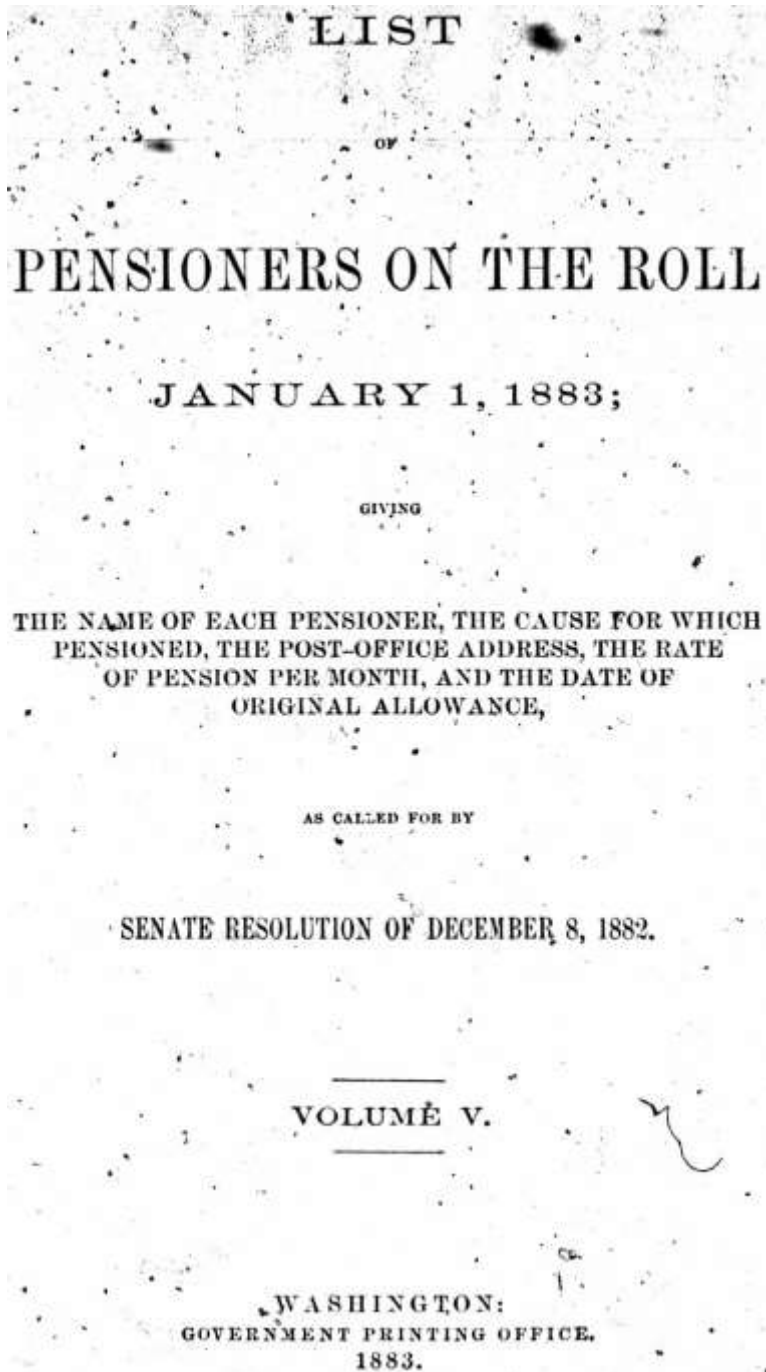

Pension Roll of 1883

On December 8, 1882, the U.S. Senate required the Secretary of Interior to submit a list of pensioners on the roll January 1, 1883. The Secretary of Interior submitted the completed list to the Senate on March 1, 1883. The 1883 Pension Roll was published that year in five volumes as "List of Pensioners on the Roll, January 1, 1883...". The majority of pensioners listed were from the Civil War. However, there were pensioners from other wars, including the War of 1812. Only a small number of individuals or their widows are mentioned regarding the Mexican War. Confederate pensions are not included in this resource.

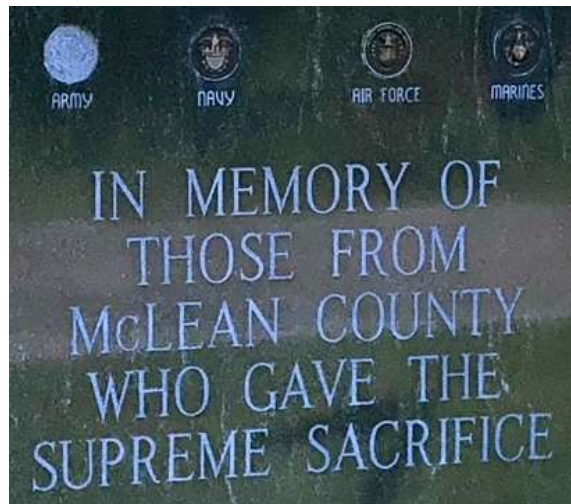

THE MEDALS

Purple Heart

The Purple Heart was established by General George Washington at Newburgh, New York, on 7 August 1782, during the Revolutionary War. It was re-established by the President of the United States in 1932.

The Purple Heart is awarded in the name of the President of the United States to any member of an Armed Force or any civilian national of the United States who, while serving under competent authority in any capacity with one of the U. S. Armed Services after 5 April 1917, has been wounded or killed, or who has died or may hereafter die after being wounded in any action against an enemy of the United States.

Distinguished Service Cross

The Distinguished Service Cross was established by Act of Congress 9 July 1918.

The Distinguished Service Cross is awarded to a person who while serving in any capacity with the Army, distinguished himself or herself by extraordinary heroism not justifying the award of a Medal of Honor; while engaged in an action against an enemy of the United States; while engaged in military operations involving conflict with an opposing or foreign force, or while serving with friendly foreign forces engaged in an armed conflict against an opposing Armed Force in which the United States is not a belligerent party. The act or acts of heroism must have been so

notable and have involved risk of life so extraordinary as to set the individual apart from his or her comrades.

Distinguished Service Medal

The Distinguished Service Medal was established by Act of Congress 9 July 1918.

The Distinguished Service Medal is awarded to any person who while serving in any capacity with the U. S. Army, has distinguished himself or herself by exceptionally meritorious service to the Government in a duty of great responsibility. The performance must be such as to merit recognition for service which is clearly exceptional. Exceptional performance of normal duty will not alone justify an award of this decoration.

Silver Star

The Silver Star was established by Act of Congress 9 July 1918.

The Silver Star is awarded to a person who, while serving in any capacity with the U. S. Army, is cited for gallantry in action against an enemy of the United States while engaged in military operations involving conflict with an opposing foreign force, or while serving with friendly foreign forces engaged in armed conflict against an opposing armed force in which the United States is not a belligerent party. The required gallantry, while of a lesser degree than that required for the Distinguished Service Cross, must nevertheless have been performed with marked distinction.

Distinguished Flying Cross

The Distinguished Flying Cross was established by Act of Congress 2 July 1926.

The Distinguished flying Cross is awarded to any person who, while serving in any capacity with the Army of the United States, distinguished himself or herself by heroism or extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial flight. The performance of the act of heroism must be evidenced by voluntary action above and beyond the call of duty. The extraordinary achievement must have resulted in an accomplishment so exceptional and outstanding as to clearly set the individual apart from his or her comrades or from other persons in similar circumstances. Awards will be made only to recognize single acts of heroism or extraordinary achievement and will not be made in recognition of sustained operational activities against an armed enemy.

Company K – January 17, 1941 to June 1941

Called into active duty on January 17, 1941, Company K of the Third Battalion of the 149th Infantry Regiment of the Kentucky National Guard, stationed at Livermore, joined the 75th Brigade, as a part of the 38th Division of the Army of the United States. By June 1941, the company was filled with new recruits and stationed at Camp Shelby, Mississippi. After training there, the company went, fought, and distinguished itself in the Pacific Theater of Operations.
