Courier-Journal: Mrs. Emily A. Nall died, at her residence in Hartford, on Friday, April 6, 1883, in the seventy-first year of her age. She was daughter of Charles Henderson, who came to Hartford about the time of the organization of Ohio county in 1798, and who was for forty years clerk of the circuit and county courts. Her mother's maiden name was Rogers. Her education was completed at Science Hill Academy, Shelbyville, Ky., at the second session of Mrs. Julia A. Tevis' celebrated school at that place. In early life she married John G. Nall, a popular and successful merchant of Hartford. Her husband died many years ago and she has since lived at the old homestead. Of her seven children three only survive her, Eugene Nall, of Jeffersonville, Ind.; Col. Ion B. Nall, editor of the Farmers' Home Journal, Louisville, and Mrs. Dr. J. E. Pendleton, of Hartford. In early life Mrs. Nall devoted much of her time to literature and the study of the fine arts. Many of the readers of the old Louisville Journal will remember her contributions to that paper in the days of Prentice, when she formed a bright star in a very select constellation of which Kentucky's greatest poet was the presiding genius. Among the many souvenirs of the old days are found several letters from Prentice, kindly acknowledging the value of the articles and soliciting more from the same justly esteemed pen.

She had the appreciation of a true artist of nature for art, and many of the specimens of decoration and other paintings, after a lapse of fifty years, are much finer than many which are raved over at this day.

In the community where she lived no lady was ever more highly or deservedly esteemed, and, although her illness was of long duration, her death was a sad surprise to her very many friends, who regarded their loss as irreparable.

#### DEATH OF EUGENE NALL.

A Well-Known Citizen of Owensboro Passes Away After Years of Helpless Suffering.

Mr. Eugene Nall died at his home on Crittenden street, between Main and Third, last night at 6:30 o'clock. He had been an invalid for a long time, and his death was not unexpected. The funeral will take place from his late residence at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon.

Eugene Nall was born in Hartford, Ky., June 18th, 1839, and was consequently in his fifty-second year. He was a son of John G. Nall, one of the pioneer settlers of Hartford. In his early manhood he removed to Jeffersonville, Ind., where he was in business for a number of years. Seven years ago he removed to this city, and has since lived here. Six years since he suffered a stroke of paralysis that left him almost helpless physically, and he has since remained in that condition. He was a brother of Col. I. B. Nall, editor of the Farmers Home Journal, and of Mrs. Dr. J. E. Pendleton, of Hartford. He leaves a wife and five children. Mr. Nall's condition had prevented him from being an active citizen, but he was a good man, possessed of an honest heart and cultivated mind.

Mrs. Ida Pendleton died at her residence in Hartford early last Saturday morning after a long illness of consumption. She was the widow of the late Dr. John E. Pendleton and a woman of high accomplishments and much popularity. Her remains were taken to Memphis, Tenn., for interment, accompanied by her son and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Holmes Cummings, and others.

#### COL. ION B. NALL DIES IN TENNESSEE

One Time Kentucky Commissioner Of Agriculture—Has Relatives Here.

Col. Ion Beverly Nall, who was born in Hartford seventy-six years ago, died at the soldiers home in Johnson City, Tenn., a few days ago. Death resulted from a paralytic stroke.

He was lieutenant-colonel of the Forty-seventh Kentucky Regiment during the Civil War, for 25 years one of the editors and owners of the Farmers Home Journal. He was with Gen. John B. Castleman a joint founder of the American Saddle Horse Breeders Association.

Col. Nall was an uncle of Misses Margaret, Jessie and Poppie Nall, of this city, and at one time lived in the house now occupied by them.

The Misses Nall have had no direct word from his family, and at press hour it was not known when and where he would be buried.

#### COL. ION B. NALL HAS PASSED AWAY

Col. Ion Beverly Nall, who died at the Soldiers Home, Johnson City, Tenn., some days since, was born and reared in Hartford, his age was 76 years. Deceased enlisted as a private in the Union Army, at the breaking out of the War, from which Co. F 17th, Ky., Inf., he rose to the rank of Lieut. Col., which position he held when mustered out at the close of the War. For a quarter of a Century or more Col. Nall was Editor of the Farmers Home Journal and under his management it grew to be one of the foremost Agricultural Journals circulating in this part of the Country. Besides many other more distant relatives residing here Col. Nall had four nieces and one nephew, Mrs. H. P. Taylor, D. E. B. Pendleton, and Misses Jessie, Margaret and Poppie Nall.
