OLD MILL CEMETERY

This cemetery is located on the West side of the Sagnate Road, better known as Mt. Hermon Church Road, on a bluff overlooking No Creek, and a few hundred yards from the intersection of that road with the Hartford-Livermore road, now Highway 136.

The exact date this plot of ground was set aside for burial purposes is not known. The oldest tombstone bears the inscription: "Nancy Stevens departed this life February 1806, Aged 3 Months." She was a daughter of Henry and Hannah (Bennett) Stevens. A descendant of the family tells me that this child was buried here because Carson Cemetery where other members of that family are buried had not yet been started.

In this cemetery lies buried "Governor" John Bennett, who was the first settler on No Creek. His grave remained unmarked until 1923, at which time his great-great-grandson, William F. Stevens, erected a monument and which has inscribed on it, "John Bennett, born 1753, died 1840." A reunion and unveiling services were held on Sunday, October 14, 1923. The principal speaker for the occasion was the Rev. Robert D. Bennett, a great-grandson. An appropriate reading was given by Miss Audrey Duncan, who was teaching at No Creek. The monument was unveiled by Miss Elsie Stevens, of the seventh generation, she being a daughter of R. B. and Ina (Stevens) Stevens.

At least four of "Gov." Bennett's children are buried here, as follows: Joseph (1792-1863), Titus (1794-1873), Obed and Elizabeth (1800-1877), who married William Sandefur and his descendants of the fifth generation. Practically all the persons buried here are descendants either by blood or marriage of John Bennett.

Here lies Captain Henry M. Bennett, of the 12th Ky. Vol. Calv., who died in 1864 while home on leave from the Union Army and his brother, Virgil P. Bennett, who also died in the Union Army. They were sons of Joseph and grandsons of "Gov." Bennett.

Also buried here are Thomas and Delilah V. (Bennett) Carson, who were the parents of seventeen children, eight of whom died in infancy or childhood, and were buried here too.

This cemetery was largely the burial place of the Southern Methodists and after Mt. Hermon Cemetery was started there have been only a few interments made here. The last burial was that of Loney Sanderfur.

The family names appearing here are as follows: Bennett, Lindley, Wallace, Sandefur, Carson, Baird, Ward, Chapman, Foster, Blain, Sorrels, Iglehart, Shown, Liles, Ellis, Kerns, Tinsley, Greer, Ford, Cooper, Rulander and Vance. There are about one hundred bodies resting in this cemetery but many are infants.

The burial ground derived its name from a grain and saw mill which stood on No Creek, near the cemetery. A house stood a short distance West of the cemetery.

OLD WATER MILL

This water mill was located at a point on No Creek about one-half mile from No Creek M. E. Church, where the present road leading from the No Creek neighborhood to Beda crosses the creek.

We do not know the exact date this mill was erected but it was built by Asa Bennett on the land of his father, John Bennett. Just how long Bennett operated it is not known. According to the deeds in County Court clerk office, Asa and Titus Bennett, brothers, sold the mill and lot, containing six acres, to Francis Sandefur. He operated it for a few years. In 1847, Francis and Mary Sandefur deeded the mill to George P. Bennett, who operated it until his death in 1855.

On March 3, 1858, the heirs of George P. Bennett, conveyed the mill and lot to Reuben Leisure, Sr. He operated it for a few years and discontinued its use as a mill. On June 2, 1874, Leisure deeded the lot to Jasper N. Sanderfur.

Both corn and wheat were ground on this mill and the flour was taken to another mill on Barnett's Creek where it underwent a process called bolting.

A saw mill was operated in connection with this mill, which was also given power by water falling over a dam. The saw was a sash-saw, moving up and down, instead of around as does the present day circle-saw.

Captain C. B. Shown, of Route 4, Hartford, relates that his great-grandfather, Nathan Bennett, whom he remembers, operated the mills at one time for his uncle, George P. Bennett, and

that he worked both day and night, as the water had to be at the proper stage to run the mills. Mr. Shown says his great-grandfather would fill the hopper with corn and then go to the saw, returning when the hopper was empty. The saw would idle while he was attending to the corn and meal. Three hundred feet of lumber could be sawed in a day on this mill.

A burying ground on the hill nearby still goes by the name of the Old Mill Cemetery.

The Old Mill Cemetery is located in Ohio County, KY on Old Mill Cemetery Road. Turn north from Ky 136 about two miles west of US 231.

The first line of each entry in the following listing is a combination of a transcription of data on the gravestones made by Sam McDowell and Gayle Romans on 17 April 1977 (published in the book, Ohio County, Kentucky Cemeteries Volume II, West-Central Kentucky Family Research Association, McDowell Publications, Hartford, KY, 1977, pp.62-65) and additional burials by Jerry Long that were documented from other sources. Following the first line of each entry are annotations about that individual by Jerry Long. Abbreviations used in the annotations are: b. = born; d. = died; s/o = son of; d/o = daughter of; c/o = child of; i/o = infant of; w/o = wife of; h/o = husband of; m. = married; ca = circa; ys = years; ms = months; ds = days. The phrase "gravestone erected in recent years" was used to indicate grave markers that were erected years after the individual's death.

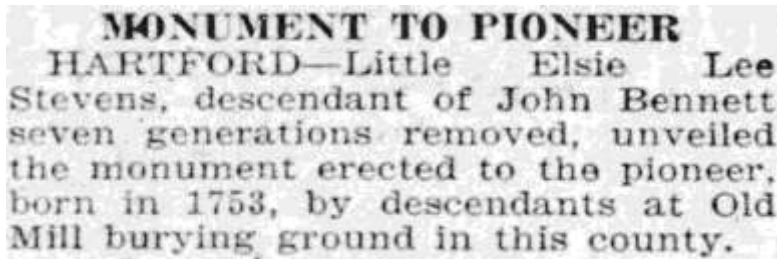
BENNETT MEMORIAL SERVICE

An interesting memorial service was held Sunday afternoon Oct. 14th. at the Old Mill burying grounds near No Creek church, commemorative of John (Governor) Bennett. Deceased was born in 1753, 45 years before the organization of Ohio County, and died in 1840. His decendants [sic] embrace a large population in the County, many of who were present. The exercises were opened with song followed by prayer and a short talk by Rev. R. D. Bennett, after which the monument, erected to his memory, was unveiled by little Miss Elsie Lee Stevens, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. B. Stevens, a decendant seven generations removed.

The program closed with a brief talk and benediction by Rev. T. T. Frazier.

Old Mills of Ohio County

.... A water mill that ground both corn and wheat was owned and operated by George P. Bennett at a point on No Creek about one-half mile from No Creek M. E. church, where the present road leading from the No Creek neighborhood to Beda crosses the creek. We do not know the exact date this mill was built or what disposition was made of it after the death of George P. Bennett in 1856. A burying ground on the hill nearby still goes by the name of the old mill graveyard. George P. Bennett was the youngest son of John Bennett, who came from Maryland to Kentucky, and who was the father of a numerous family of Kentucky Bennetts....

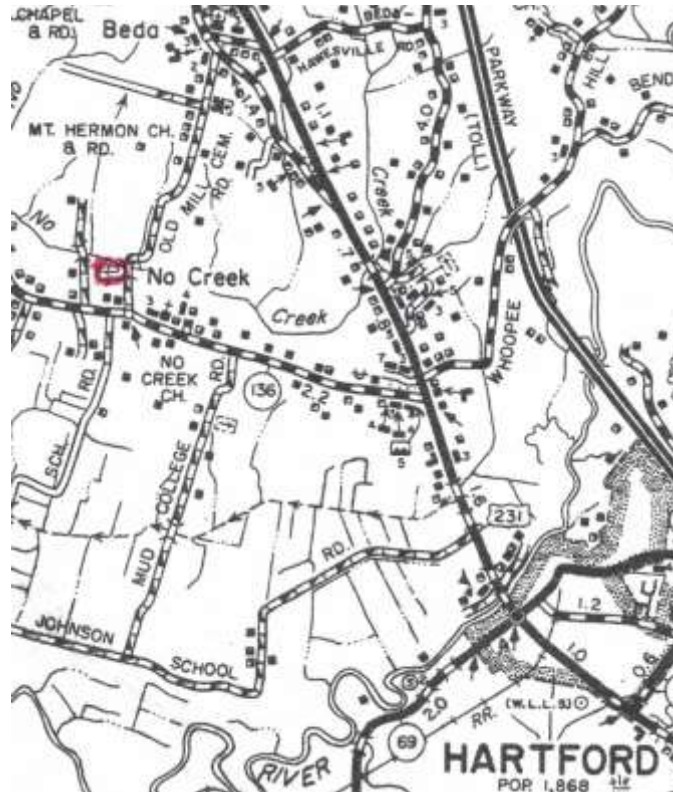
